- Caught 18 passes for San Francisco in 2016, including two touchdowns.
- Selected by his teammates as the 2015 Oakland Raiders recipient of the Ed Block Courage Award. This award honors those players who exemplify commitment to the principles of sportsmanship and courage.
- Chosen by his teammates as Raiders Nominee for the NFLPA Byron "Whizzer" White Award in 2014 for his community service.
- Notched career highs with 60 catches, 888 yards, and four touchdowns with the Raiders in 2013.
- Despite signing as an undrafted free agent in 2012 by Oakland, he started the season opener as a rookie on Monday Night Football against San Diego. He caught four passes, including his first career TD from Carson Palmer and a two-point conversion.
- Was a part of a Temple squad in 2011 that won their first bowl game since 1979.



After missing the entire 2017 season due to a toe injury suffered in the Bills second preseason game, veteran ROD STREATER is back in Buffalo in 2018. Originally signed as a rookie free agent by Oakland in 2012, Streater played his first four NFL seasons with the Raiders before signing with Kansas City as an unrestricted free agent in 2016. Before that season started though, the Temple University product was traded to San Francisco, where he played in all 16 games for the 49ers.

Streater's father, Kevin, "has always been there for me. He is my biggest supporter, especially for football. I had a few friends growing up that didn't have a father in their life and it made me appreciate it that much more."
