JAGUARS' FIFTH SEASON ENDS IN AFC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

SECOND STRAIGHT DIVISION TITLE, STAUNCH DEFENSE HIGHLIGHT TEAM'S FIFTH YEAR IN THE NFL

In each of their five seasons in the NFL, the Jacksonville Jaguars have taken a step forward, and 1999 was no different. Although the Jaguars' season came to an end with a loss to the Tennessee Titans in the AFC Championship game, the Jaguars did have another stellar season. They won their second consecutive AFC Central Division championship and completed the regular season with the best record in the NFL and a defense that allowed the fewest points in the league.

The Jaguars are not only the most successful expansion franchise in NFL history, but in the last three-and-a-half seasons they have won more games than any other NFL team. The Jaguars finished 15-3 in 1999, defeating every team they faced except one — the Tennessee Titans, who won all three games against the Jaguars and became AFC champions.

Here are just a few of the milestones reached by the 1999 Jaguars:

- Had the best regular-season record in the NFL at 14-2
- Won their second consecutive AFC Central Division championship
- Won a team-record 14 regular-season games, tied for the fourth most in NFL history
- Became one of only two teams to qualify for the playoffs each of the last four seasons (along with Minnesota)
- Won seven of eight games at home for the fourth straight year in the regular season, improving to 30-10 at ALLTEL Stadium
- Won a team-record seven games on the road, to finish with the best road mark in the NFL
- Became the NFL's first expansion team to qualify for the playoffs four times in its first five years
- Won eight of 10 games in the division
- Improved the franchise's five-year record in the regular season to 49-31, which is the best winning percentage (.613) of the 31 NFL teams
- Scored a team-record 396 points (sixth in the league)
- Led the AFC with a plus-179 point differential
- Won 11 consecutive games during the regular season, tied for the sixth longest streak in NFL history
- Led the NFL for fewest points allowed (217), the 12th-lowest total since the advent of the 16-game season in 1978
- The defense ranked fourth in the NFL in yards allowed, the team's highest ranking ever
- Set a team record with 57 sacks, tied for the NFL lead
- Tied the team record with 30 takeaways and led the NFL for fewest turnovers (18, the team's fewest ever)
- WR Jimmy Smith led the NFL in receiving with 116 catches, and he finished second with 1,636 receiving yards
- Became only the second team in NFL history to lead the league in rushing and have the leading receiver
- CB Aaron Beasley set a team record with six interceptions
- Led the NFL in rushing with 2,091 yards
- Had an NFL-high seven players voted to the Pro Bowl
- Averaged 67,511 in attendance (69,047 including two playoff games)
- Defeated the Miami Dolphins 62-7 in the AFC Divisional Playoffs for the second-biggest victory in NFL postseason history. Their 62 points represented not only the most points ever scored by a Jacksonville team, but the most scored by a team in the AFC playoffs and the second-most ever in NFL postseason history.
- Hosted the AFC Championship game at ALLTEL Stadium for the first time
- With four playoff appearances in their first five seasons, tied the San Diego Chargers for the second-most playoff berths in a franchise's first five years. The Chargers reached the playoffs four times from 1960 to '64 in the first five years of the American Football League. The Cleveland Browns earned five playoff berths in their first five seasons in the NFL (1950-54), but they originally were formed as charter members of the All-American Football Conference in 1946 before three of that league's teams were merged into the NFL in 1950. No previous NFL expansion franchise had ever made the playoffs more than once in its first five seasons.

ABOUT THOSE 14 VICTORIES: With 14 wins during the regular season, the Jaguars tied for the fourth-most victories in NFL history:

The game vs. the Cardinals will be the first meeting between the two teams. After the 2000 season, the only team the Jaguars will never have faced will be the San Diego Chargers.

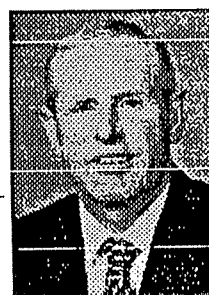
In the 2000 preseason, the Jaguars will host the New York Giants and Atlanta Falcons, and they will travel to face the Carolina Panthers and Kansas City Chiefs. Dates and times have not been set.

FINAL 1999 AFC CENTRAL DIVISION STANDINGS: The Jaguars finished the 1999 regular season with a 14-2 record — the best mark in the NFL — and won their second consecutive AFC Central Division championship. INJURY UPDATE: Eight players ended the 1999 season on injured reserve. The team's offseason conditioning program will begin in March. The eight players are: RB Tavian Banks, OT Tony Boselli, DE Eric Curry, G/OT Todd Fordham, S Mike Logan, MLB Tom McManus, MLB Bryan Schwartz and LB Erik Storz.

THE COACH: Jacksonville head coach Tom Coughlin (49-31 in regular season, 4-4 in postseason) has led the Jaguars to two consecutive AFC Central Division championships and two appearances in the AFC Championship game. The Jaguars have made the playoffs each of the last four seasons — a first for an NFL expansion team and one of only two teams in the NFL to do so (along with Minnesota). In 1998, Coughlin guided them to the AFC Central Division championship with an 11-5 record. They defeated the New England Patriots in a Wild-Card game before losing to the New York Jets in the Divisional playoffs. In 1997, the Jaguars were 11-5 and finished second in the AFC Central, and they were defeated by Denver in the Wild-Card playoffs. In their second season in 1996, the Jaguars advanced all the way to the AFC Championship game, finishing the regular season in second place in the division with a 9-7 record. In the playoffs, the Jaguars upset the Bills and Broncos on the road before losing at New England. In 1995, the Jaguars finished with four victories in their inaugural season. Coughlin became head coach of the Jaguars on February 21, 1994 following three successful seasons as head coach at Boston College. He compiled a record of 21-13-1 from 1991 to '93 at Boston College, and had two appearances in bowl games and a ranking of 13th in the final AP poll of 1993. A veteran of 30 years of coaching, he was previously an NFL assistant coach with the New York Giants (wide receivers, 1988-90), Green Bay Packers (wide receivers and passing game coordinator 1986-87) and Philadelphia Eagles (wide receivers, 1984-85).



COUGHLIN RANKED AMONG LEAGUE'S TOP COACHES: During the 1999 regular season, Jaguars head coach Tom Coughlin had eight victories in 10 games vs. AFC Central teams and seven wins in eight home games. Coughlin has the second-best record of all current NFL coaches in division games and the third-best record in home games (minimum of 16 home games). Records include all teams coached by an individual during the regular season.

THE TEAL IS REAL . . . Since November 24, 1996, when the Jaguars began their run to the '96 playoffs, their record is the best in the NFL, with four more victories than any other team in that time. . . . WITH THE BEST RECORD AT HOME . . . The Jaguars went 7-1 at ALLTEL Stadium each of the last four seasons, giving them a 28-4 record, tied with Green Bay for the best mark at home in that time. The Jaguars have lost only three home games since the second week of the 1996 season and have won 29 of their last 33 home games dating back to December 24, 1995, in their inaugural season (three of those losses have been to the Tennessee Titans). . . . AND THE BEST RECORD ON THE ROAD . . . The Jaguars have the best road record in the NFL and they are one of only three NFL teams with a better than .500 mark on the road dating back to November 24, 1996. The Jaguars have a 17-9 record away from home during that time (they have also won two postseason road games since 1996). Their 7-1 road record this season was the best in the league and they have now won 13 of their last 18 games away from home. The Jaguars' all-time regular-season road record is 19-21. Here are the four best road teams in the NFL since November 24, 1996:

LAST WEEK: The Jaguars were defeated 33-14 by the Tennessee Titans in the AFC Championship game at ALLTEL Stadium: After leading 14-10 at halftime, Jacksonville was outscored 23-0 in the second half. The Jaguars suffered six turnovers (their most since midway through the 1996 season), they had 100 yards in penalties (the most since November 1997) and they were shut out in the second half of a game for the first time since November 17, 1996.

NOTES FROM THE AFC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME: The Jaguars outgained the Titans 360 yards to 289 and had more first downs, 20 to 17, though they had less time of possession (28:24 to 31:36). . . . It marked the second time the Jaguars have had more yards than their opponent in an AFC Championship game but lost. In 1996, Jacksonville outgained the New England Patriots 289 to 234. In two conference title games, the Jaguars have allowed only 523 yards, an average of 262 per game. . . . Jacksonville has won 30 of its past 35 games at home (including playoffs). . . . Fred Taylor rushed for 110 yards on 19 carries (5.8-yard average), his third 100-yard game in four postseason outings, breaking the team record he held with Natrone Means. He has 493 rushing yards in four career playoff games, breaking the team's postseason mark of 398 held by Means (1996-97). . . . James Stewart scored his second postseason touchdown on a 33-yard run, his longest in the postseason. . . . Mark Brunell completed 19 of 38 passes for 226 yards, one TD and two interceptions. . . . Keenan McCardell led the team with six catches for 67 yards. . . . Jimmy Smith had five receptions for 92 yards, just missing his third straight 100-yard receiving game in the postseason, which would have tied the NFL record. . . . Kyle Brady tied his personal high with five catches, while also setting a personal postseason best with 44 yards, including his first postseason TD on a seven-yard pass from Brunell. . . . The Jaguars allowed 177 rushing yards, the most they've given up since 12/28/98 vs. Pittsburgh. Steve McNair rushed for 91 of those yards, the most ever by an opposing quarterback vs. the Jaguars. . . . The Jaguars' six turnovers tied for the most ever by the Jaguar in a game (also: 10/20/96 at St. Louis), and the 100 penalty yards were the most by the Jaguars since 11/30/97 vs. Baltimore. . . . The safety given up by Jacksonville was the first since 11/12/95 vs. Seattle. . . . CB Fernando Bryant's interception was the first of his postseason career. . . . DE Tony Brackens recorded the only sack by a Jacksonville player, his fourth postseason sack. He also forced and recovered a fumble (both marking his second in the postseason). . . . LB Kevin Hardy forced his third postseason fumble. . . . WLB Kevin Hardy led the team with 15 tackles (7 solo), followed by MLB Lonnie Marts with 14 tackles (7 solo). . . . The attendance of 75,206 set a Jaguars record, breaking the mark of 75,173 set a week earlier, 1/15/00 vs. Miami. . . . Mark Brunell, Ben Coleman, Leon Searcy, Jimmy Smith and Keenan McCardell have started all eight Jacksonville postseason games. In addition, Bryan Barker, Mike Hollis, Reggie Barlow, Aaron Beasley and Kevin Hardy have played in all eight games. . . . Every player who dressed played except QB Jay Fiedler. Friday's inactives were: OT Joe Patton, DE Chris White, Anthony Cesario and DT Kevin Landolt; Sunday's inactives were: RB Stacey Mack, MLB Chester Burnett, WR Lenzie Jackson and QB Jonathan Quinn (3rd QB). . . . Jaguars captains were OT Leon Searcy, LB Kevin Hardy, S Carnell Lake and CB Dave Thomas, and the team's honorary captain was Jeff Lageman.

FROM COACH TOM COUGHLIN ON THE TITANS GAME: "I didn't think that was our best game by any means. I give Tennessee a lot of credit. Any team that can come in here and beat us twice in one year I take my hat off to. The penalties, the turnovers, you're not going to win football games that way. It's a game we're not very proud of, but you're not going to win unless you play much better than we played. There's frustration, yes, disappointment, yes. But I'm proud of these players. They battled and their hearts are in the right place. There's four teams left, you're playing for the right to go to the Super Bowl. But when you make mistakes, you deny yourself the opportunity."

"We had a great opportunity here, playing at home for the AFC Championship. For whatever reason we didn't play as well as we anticipated we would. The turnovers and the missed opportunities and the mistakes in the kicking game were too much for us to overcome. It's difficult for us to swallow because we knew exactly what the formula was to defeat this team. Yet this is three games against Tennessee this year and we're minus-seven in turnovers. When we play them, we find the way to make the errors."

(on the loss) "The whole day is frustrating. I don't know how much more it can be frustrating. I never expected that to happen today."

(on comparing the loss to the 1996 AFC Championship loss to New England) "They're all the same. They hurt. You carry it for the rest of the year. That's the way it is. There's only going to be one team that's excited."

FROM QB MARK BRUNELL: (on how he played) "We lost. I played bad. That's the way it works in this business. If the quarterback plays well, there's a 90 percent chance you're going to win. My job is to win, and it didn't happen today. Regardless of any numbers, we didn't play good enough today."

"We didn't play as well as we wanted to. You have to give a lot of credit to Tennessee. They played tough and made very few mistakes. They made the plays when they had to make them, particularly (Steve) McNair on those big runs."

(on losing to Tennessee three in a row) "They're a very good football team. They run the ball well, they play solid defense, their quarterback makes plays when he has to. I don't think there's matchup problems because I think we match up to them. We certainly have great talent on our team. When it's time to win the game, they do it."

(on comparing the loss to the AFC Championship loss in 1996) "It's about the same. They're both losses. They both hurt. They're both big games. I felt pretty much the same as I did back then."

FROM TE KYLE BRADY: (on the way the season ended) "Obviously, we would like to be playing for one more week, but this is a great bunch of guys who showed a lot of heart the whole way through. Sometimes it turns out this way."

(on the mental mistakes) "It was just not the kind of day we had planned on. We did not plan to play that sloppy, and you can't play that sloppy in a game like this and win."

(on if the season was a disappointment because the team didn't make the Super Bowl) "Every team is shooting for the Super Bowl, and for the ones who come up short, it is a disappointment — no matter if it's three games short or one game short."

FROM LB KEVIN HARDY: (on the loss) "It's obviously real tough. All season long this team has been playing hard and winning a lot of ballgames. We lost to one team all year. Unfortunately, they beat us three times in a row — this being the biggest."

(on significance of making the AFC championship game) "This is the second time for me and a lot of guys on this team to make it to this point and be unsuccessful. We'll have to have another strong offseason — it's hard to think about it right now. It's going to be hard for the next couple of weeks, but we'll have to get over it."

DEFENSE RANKED NO. 4: After 10 straight weeks having the No. 1-ranked defense in the NFL during the middle of the season, the Jaguars slipped to No. 4 in the NFL in the regular season behind Buffalo, Baltimore and Tampa Bay. However, the Jaguars allowed only 217 points — an average of only 13.6 points per game — to lead the NFL. That easily broke the team record of 19.9 points per game allowed in 1997.

SMITH MOVES INTO ELITE COMPANY: Jaguars WR Jimmy Smith had one of the finest seasons ever for an NFL receiver in 1999. He ranked sixth on the NFL's all-time single-season list for receptions (116), sixth on the list for receiving yards (1,636) and tied for fourth for most 100-yard receiving games (9). 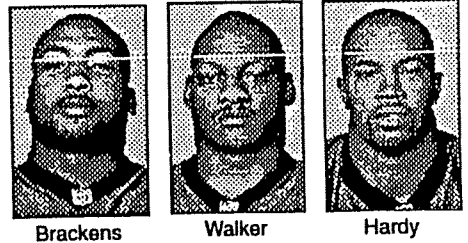

SMITH HAS FOUR CONSECUTIVE 1,000-YARD SEASONS: Jaguars WR Jimmy Smith has surpassed the 1,000-yard mark receiving four straight seasons, a feat accomplished by only 10 other players in NFL history and which ties him for sixth all-time behind Jerry Rice (11 straight 1,000-yard seasons), Lance Alworth and Tim Brown (7 straight), Cris Carter (6 straight) and Michael Irvin (5 straight). Here's the list:

THE SACK ATTACK: The Jaguars made three sacks in their season finale vs. Cincinnati and finished the year with a team-record 57, tied for the NFL lead with St. Louis. The previous team record was 48 sacks in 1997. They were the only team in the league with three players with 10 or more sacks each. Leading the way for the Jaguars are DE Tony Brackens, DT Gary Walker and WLB Kevin Hardy, all of whom set career bests this season.

Brackens led the team and tied for third in the AFC with 12.0 sacks. He broke Clyde Simmons' team record of 8.5 sacks set in 1997, as well as Joel Smeenge's team record for career sacks with 29.5. Brackens' previous best was seven sacks in both 1996 and '97. Brackens also had two interceptions (one returned for a touchdown), 76 tackles (fifth on the team) and eight forced fumbles (breaking his team record of six set in 1997). In four NFL seasons, Brackens has forced 20 fumbles, and his 12 takeaways tied the team record set by Chris Hudson (1995-98).

Hardy finished tied for sixth in the AFC with 10.5 sacks. His previous career high was 5.5 sacks in his rookie season of 1996. He led the Jaguars with 153 tackles and had 24 QB pressures, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

Walker had 10.0 sacks, breaking his personal best set in 1997 when he was with the Tennessee Oilers. He tied for eighth in the AFC in sacks and was fourth in the NFL for most sacks among defensive tackles behind Denver's Trevor Pryce (13.0), Tampa Bay's Warren Sapp (12.5) and San Francisco's Bryant Young (11.0). This season, Walker had 71 tackles (tied for sixth on the team) and tied for the club-high with 26 QB pressures (with Joel Smeenge).

One reason for the Jaguars' success this season was their sack differential. In 1998, the Jaguars recorded 30 sacks on defense while allowing 39 on offense for a minus-9 sack ratio. This season, the Jaguars recorded 57 defensive sacks, while their offense allowed 36 sacks for a plus-21 sack ratio that was the fourth-best mark in the NFL. Following are the top six teams in sack ratio:

The Jaguars also forced 30 turnovers to tie their previous mark of 30 takeaways set in 1998. Their plus-12 ratio tied for fourth in the NFL in 1999. Jonathan Quinn won his first start at home, on December 28, 1998 vs. Pittsburgh, while Mark Brunell lost his first home start, on September 24, 1995 vs. Green Bay. Rob Johnson is the only one of the seven quarterbacks who never started a home game. For all of the above except Beuerlein, the first NFL start as a Jaguar was also the player's first start in the NFL.

JAGUARS SEND NFL-HIGH SEVEN TO PRO BOWL: An NFL-high seven members of the Jacksonville Jaguars were named to the AFC Pro Bowl squad, including an AFC-best five starters. Voted to start were OT Tony Boselli, DE Tony Brackens, LB Kevin Hardy, FS Camell Lake, and WR Jimmy Smith, with QB Mark Brunell and OT Leon Searcy also making the 42-man squad. After four years without a defensive Pro Bowl selection, the Jaguars have three this season. The defense improved from 25th overall at the end of the 1998 season to fourth overall and gave up the fewest points in the NFL.

Boselli marked his fourth selection to the Pro Bowl and was voted the starter for the third consecutive year. He started all 16 games this season at left tackle but was injured in the season finale and replaced on the Pro Bowl squad. ... Brackens is starting in his first Pro Bowl appearance. He led the team with 12.0 sacks, and he also had 10 tackles for loss, eight forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown. ... Hardy is also starting in his first Pro Bowl appearance. He led the Jaguars with 153 tackles and had 10.5 sacks, second on the team. ... Lake earned his fifth trip to the Pro Bowl as a starter and first as a free safety, having been selected from 1994 to '97 as a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers as the starter at strong safety. He had 3.5 sacks and tied for sixth on the team with 71 total tackles. ... Smith is making his third appearance and second consecutive start. He finished first in the NFL with 116 receptions and second with 1,636 yards, both career highs. ... Brunell returns to the Pro Bowl after being named the game's MVP in 1997 and starting for the AFC in 1998. He started the first 15 games of the season and has the fifth-best career winning percentage of active quarterbacks (64.7%). ... Searcy makes his first Pro Bowl appearance after being selected as first alternate the past two seasons. He started all 16 games this season and has missed only one game in his three seasons in Jacksonville.

JAGUARS AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS: The Jaguars finished the season ranked seventh in the NFL in total offense (1st rushing, 12th passing), and they were 4th in defense (6th rushing and 3rd passing). ... The Jaguars scored 396 points, second in the AFC and sixth in the NFL. ... The Jaguars' 217 points allowed were the fewest in the NFL. ... The Jaguars' offense led the AFC with 331 first downs and was third in the NFL behind Washington (338) and St. Louis (335). Jacksonville was fourth in the NFL in third down percentage (92 of 230, 40.0 percent), and the defense was ninth in the NFL in opponent's third-down conversions (72 of 215, 33.5 percent). ... The Jaguars' plus-12 difference in turnovers-takeaways tied for fourth in the NFL, and their 18 turnovers were the league's fewest. ... The Jaguars' 57 sacks tied for first in the league with St. Louis. ... PK Mike Hollis was fourth in the NFL in scoring with 130 points, four shy of his team record. ... James Stewart's 13 touchdowns tied for second in the AFC and tied for third in the NFL, and his 13 TD runs tied for the AFC lead. ... QB Mark Brunell finished fourth in the AFC in passing with a 82.0 rating. His 2.0 interception percentage was the lowest in the NFL. ... WR Jimmy Smith led the NFL in receiving with 116 catches, and he was second in the NFL in receiving yards (a career-high 1,636). Keenan McCardell was sixth in the AFC with 78 catches, and he was 15th in the AFC with 891 receiving yards. Smith made first downs on 86 of his 116 receptions, and his 33 catches on third down topped the league. ... James Stewart finished ninth in the AFC in rushing with 931 yards, despite starting only seven games. Fred Taylor was 12th in the AFC with 732 rushing yards, and his 4.6-yard average tied for fourth among running backs in the AFC. ... Smith was fifth in the AFC with 1,636 total yards, and Stewart was 16th with 1,039 yards. ... P Bryan Barker finished fifth in the AFC in net punting (36.9) and ninth in gross punting (41.8), but his 32 kicks inside the 20 tied for fourth in the NFL (and he put 41 percent of his kicks inside the 20, the highest in the league). ... Reggie Barlow was fourth in the AFC with a 10.9-yard average on punt returns. ... CB Aaron Beasley tied for fourth in the AFC with a team-record six interceptions (one shy of the NFL lead), and his 200 interception yards led the league. ... DE Tony Brackens tied for third in the AFC with 12.0 sacks, LB Kevin Hardy tied for sixth with 10.5 sacks, and DT Gary Walker tied for eighth with 10.0 sacks. The Jaguars were the only team in the NFL with three players with 10 or more sacks. ... Steve Lindsey led the NFL with 22 touchbacks on 86 kickoffs, two ahead of Miami's Olindo Mare. The Jaguars were second in the AFC with their opponents starting drives after kickoffs from the 26.4-yard line.

1999 STATS AND SUCH: The Jaguars did not have an opposing player pass for 300 yards all season, and they gave up only one 100-yard rusher (Tennessee's Eddie George) and two 100-yard receivers (Carolina's Muhsin Muhammad and Cleveland's Darren Chiaverini). ... The Jaguars registered four or more sacks in a game nine times this season and held the opponent under 100 total rushing yards 11 times in 16 games. ... The Jaguars did not allow a touchdown in five of their 16 games this season and held six opponents to just one score (either a field goal or a TD). ... The Jaguars allowed only six rushing touchdowns this season.

A total of 12 players (five on offense and nine on defense) started all 16 games this year: WR Jimmy Smith, OTs Tony Boselli and Leon Searcy, C John Wade, DTs Gary Walker and Seth Payne, LBs Lonnie Marts and Kevin Hardy, CBs Aaron Beasley and Fernando Bryant, and Ss Donovan Darius and Camell Lake. ... The offense used 12 different starting lineup combinations in 16 games, and the defense had a different starting lineup in six of the 16 games. ... Mark Brunell is 44-24 as a starter in regular-season games, 48-28 overall. ... PK Mike Hollis has scored in 65 consecutive regular-season games (and all eight in the playoffs). He now has 576 points in his five years with the Jaguars. ... In 16 games, the Jaguars had 23 plays of 30 or more yards. They had 29 plays of 30-plus yards in 1998, 22 in 1997, 26 in 1996 and 12 in 1995. ... Of the Jaguars' 320 completed passes, 210 were to wide receivers, 68 to running backs, 51 to tight ends and one to an offensive lineman. ... Jaguars opponents began 49 possessions inside their own 20 and they scored on only three of those drives (3 TDs). The Jaguars began 34 possessions inside their own 20 and scored on 10 of them (5 TDs, 5 FGs). On 63 drives inside the opponent's 20, the Jaguars scored 29 TDs and 20 FGs. Their opponents had 36 trips inside the red zone and made 18 TDs and 11 FGs, 3 turnovers and 1 punt. ... The Jaguars used turnovers to score 106 points, while their opponents scored 41 points off turnovers. ... In five seasons, the Jaguars are 12 for 18 on two-point conversions (4 for 5 this year), while their opponents are 3 for 16 (0 for 2 this year). ... The Jaguars were 5 for 10 on fourth-down conversions this season; their opponents were 5 for 20. ... In five seasons, the Jaguars have a winning record in every month. They are 1-0 in August, 10-9 in September, 11-9 in October, 14-6 in November, 12-7 in December and 1-0 in January. ... This season, the Jaguars outscored their opponents in all four quarters: first (61-44), second (109-81), third (103-40) and fourth (123-49). The Jaguars scored in 51 of the 64 quarters they played this season.

The youngest player is CB Corey Chamblin (22 years, 8 months), and the oldest is P Bryan Barker (35). ... Eleven rookies are on the roster, including seven of the eight draft choices (CB Fernando Bryant, DT Larry Smith, G Anthony Cesario, DT Kevin Landolt, CB Jason Craft, DT Emarlos Leroy and DE Chris White). FB Stacey Mack is the only undrafted rookie to make the opening day roster, WR Lenzie Jackson was an undrafted rookie who spent the first nine weeks on the Jaguars' practice squad before being activated, CB Corey Chamblin was an undrafted rookie who spent training camp with Baltimore, and LB Corey Terry was drafted by Indianapolis and signed off Pittsburgh's practice squad. ... More than half of the players (33) have four years or less of NFL experience, and only seven players are in their eighth season or more. ... There are 23 players who were new to the team this year, and 30 who were with the team before this year. In addition to the 11 rookies, the other 12 new players were TE Kyle Brady (transition free agent from New York Jets); DT Gary Walker (unrestricted free agent from Tennessee); S Camell Lake (unrestricted free agent from Pittsburgh); QB Jay Fiedler, G Steve Ingram, LB Lonnie Marts, OT Joe Patton, G Zack Wiegert and S Rayna Stewart (veteran free agents); LB Chester Burnett and PK Steve Lindsey (first-year free agents) and DE Regan Upshaw (trade). ... The Jaguars have 11 players who were first-round selections in the college draft, including seven of their own picks: OT Leon Searcy (1992, Pittsburgh), DE Eric Curry (1993, Tampa Bay), OT Tony Boselli (IR - 1995, Jaguars), TE Kyle Brady (1995, N.Y. Jets), RB James Stewart (1995, Jaguars), LB Kevin Hardy (1996, Jaguars), DE Regan Upshaw (1996 Buccaneers), DT Renaldo Wynn (1997, Jaguars), RB Fred Taylor (1998, Jaguars), S Donovan Darius (1998, Jaguars) and CB Fernando Bryant (1999, Jaguars).

In five seasons, three Jaguars have played in all 88 games (regular season and postseason) in franchise history: WR Jimmy Smith, PK Mike Hollis and P Bryan Barker. ... The longest streak of consecutive starts is held by WLB Kevin Hardy (33), followed by WR Jimmy Smith (21) and OTs Tony Boselli and Leon Searcy (both with 19). ... The longest current streaks of overall starts are FS Camell Lake (48; 16 for Jacksonville and 32 for Pittsburgh) and DT Gary Walker (39; 16 for Jacksonville and 23 for Tennessee). ... Eight players have played in 100 or more games during their careers: S Camell Lake (170), P Bryan Barker (151), DE Joel Smeenge (144), LB Lonnie Marts (140), LB Bryce Paup (138), OT Leon Searcy (126), G Ben Coleman (102) and WR Keenan McCardell (100). ... Lake has 170 career starts, followed by Paup (113), Searcy (111) and Marts (105). ... OT Tony Boselli has started 71 games for the Jaguars, followed by QB Mark Brunell (68) and G Ben Coleman (65).
