## JAGUARS END FOURTH SEASON WITH FIRST DIVISION TITLE

The 1998 Jacksonville Jaguars took another step forward in their fourth season, winning their first AFC Central championship and advancing to the playoffs for the third straight year. Although the season ended with a loss on the road to the New York Jets in the divisional playoffs, the Jaguars also hosted their first playoff game at ALLTEL Stadium, a victory over the New England Patriots. In four years, no NFL expansion team has ever been as successful as the Jaguars.

Here are just a few of the milestones reached by the 1998 Jaguars:

- Won their first AFC Central Division championship, dethroning Pittsburgh after a four-year run
- Won 11 games in the regular season for the second straight year
- Became the NFL's first expansion team to qualify for the playoffs three times in its first four seasons
- Became one of only six teams to qualify for the playoffs each of the last three seasons (joining Denver, New England, Green Bay, San Francisco and Minnesota)
- Won their first-ever playoff game at ALLTEL Stadium when they defeated the New England Patriots on January 3
- Finished six games over .500 for the second time in team history (11-5, .688)
- Won seven of eight games at home for the third straight year in the regular season
- Won six of eight games within the division for the second straight year
- Went 4-4 on the road for the second straight year
- Improved the franchise's four-year record in the regular season to 35-29
- Improved their mark to 9-6 in December over four seasons
- Scored 392 points, just two points off the team record set in 1997
- Scored a team-record 47 touchdowns, breaking the mark of 43 in 1997
- PK Mike Hollis became the most accurate field goal kicker in NFL history (102 of 125 for 81.60 percent)
- Rookie RB Fred Taylor rushed for a team-record 1,223 yards and scored 17 touchdowns
- WR Jimmy Smith had his third consecutive 1,000-yard receiving season and a team-record eight touchdown receptions
- The team rushed for a club-record 2,210 yards, breaking the old mark of 1,720 set in 1997
- QB Mark Brunell threw for a team-record 20 touchdowns, breaking his old mark of 19 set in 1996. The team had 24 TD passes, breaking the mark of 20 set in 1997
- Reggie Barlow led the AFC in punt returns, averaging 12.9 yards per return.
- Averaged 70,184 in attendance, breaking the record of 69,693 in 1995

That means in five NFL seasons, the Jaguars will have played 28 of the league's 30 other teams. After the 1999 season, the Jaguars will have not played only two teams: San Diego Chargers and Arizona Cardinals.

The Denver Broncos will come to Jacksonville for the first time ever in the regular season or postseason (the teams did play a 1995 preseason game in Jacksonville). The Jaguars have already been to Denver five times in four years, including preseason and postseason, which is the most games in any city the Jaguars have played on the road. Interestingly, the Jaguars have not played any games in nine other NFL cities.

In the 1999 preseason, the Jaguars will host the Carolina Panthers and Kansas City Chiefs and they will travel to face the Dallas Cowboys and New York Giants. Dates and times have not been set.

**FINAL 1998 AFC CENTRAL STANDINGS:** The Jacksonville Jaguars finished the 1998 regular season with an 11-5 record and won the AFC Central Division championship. They also became the first expansion team to qualify for the playoffs three times in their first four seasons. Here are the final 1997 regular-season AFC Central Division standings:

**INJURY UPDATE:** A total of 13 players ended the season on injured reserve. The team's offseason conditioning program will begin in March. The 13 players are: LB Brant Boyer (neck), C Michael Cheever (back), DT Don Davey (knee), TE Rich Griffith (knee), LB James Hamilton (knee), DE Jeff Lageman (biceps), QB Jamie Martin (knee), G/OT Jeff Novak (back), DT Seth Payne (shoulder), S Tawambi Settles (knee), RB James Stewart (knee), DE Jabbar Threats (knee), DT Renaldo Wynn (groin).

**THE COACH:** Jacksonville head coach Tom Coughlin has led the Jaguars to the playoffs each of the last three seasons — a first for an NFL expansion team and one of only six teams in the NFL to do so — and the 1998 AFC Central Division championship. In 1997, the Jaguars finished 11-5 and lost the AFC Central Division championship on the fifth tiebreaker to Pittsburgh. The Jaguars were defeated by Denver in the Wild-Card playoffs. In their second season in 1996, the Jaguars advanced all the way to the AFC Championship game, finishing the regular season in second place in the division with a 9-7 record. In the playoffs, the Jaguars upset the Bills and Broncos on the road before losing at New England. In 1995, Coughlin's Jaguars finished with four victories in their inaugural season. He became head coach of the Jaguars on February 21, 1994 following three successful seasons as head coach at Boston College. Coughlin compiled a record of 21-13-1 from 1991 to '93 at Boston College, and had two appearances in bowl games and a ranking of 13th in the final AP poll of 1993. A veteran of 27 years of coaching, he was previously an NFL assistant coach with the New York Giants (wide receivers, 1988-90), Green Bay Packers (wide receivers and passing game coordinator 1986-87) and Philadelphia Eagles (wide receivers, 1984-85). He has a record of 35-29 during the regular season and 3-3 in the postseason.



**COUGHLIN RANKED AMONG LEAGUE'S TOP COACHES:** With every victory, Jaguars head coach Tom Coughlin moves up on two lists when compared to other elite active NFL head coaches. In 1998, Coughlin had six victories in eight games vs. AFC Central teams and seven wins in eight home games. Coughlin has the fifth-best record of all current NFL coaches in division games and the fifth-best record in home games (minimum of 16 home games). Records include all teams coached by an individual during the regular season.

**THE TEAL IS REAL . . .** Since November 24, 1996, when the Jaguars began their run to the '96 playoffs, their record is tied for the fourth best in the NFL behind Denver, San Francisco and Green Bay. The Jaguars have won 27 of their last 37 regular-season games. Here's a look at the league's best records since November 24, 1996:

**. . . WITH THE FOURTH-BEST RECORD AT HOME . . .** The Jaguars have gone 7-1 at ALLTEL Stadium each of the last three seasons during the regular season, which gives them a 21-3 record, which is the fourth-best mark at home over the last three seasons. The Jaguars have lost only two home games since the second week of the 1996 season and have won 22 of their last 25 home games dating back to December 24, 1995, in their inaugural season. Here are the best regular-season home records in the NFL since the start of the 1996 season:

**... AND THE FOURTH-BEST RECORD ON THE ROAD ...** The Jaguars are one of only five NFL teams with a .500 or better mark on the road dating back to November 24, 1996. The Jaguars' 10-8 record away from home during that time is the fourth-best mark in the NFL, behind only Minnesota, San Francisco and Green Bay (the Jaguars have also won two post-season road games in that time). Here are the only teams in the league with a .500 or better record on the road since November 24, 1996:

**THE FIRST FOUR SEASONS:** Of the 10 expansion teams in NFL history, the Jaguars have the most victories through four seasons. The Jaguars have 35 victories in four full seasons, compared to 30 for Carolina and 25 for Seattle. Here's how NFL expansion teams fared in their first four seasons:

**LAST WEEK:** The Jaguars' 1998 season came to an end at Giants Stadium when they were defeated by the New York Jets 34-24. The Jaguars fell behind 17-0 but fought back and trailed 31-24 with two minutes left and 99 yards to go, but a comeback was not to be. Mark Brunell threw three touchdown passes but also was intercepted three times, and the Jaguars turned two takeaways into miscues that thwarted their efforts. Jimmy Smith scored two touchdowns and had the team's first 100-yard receiving game in the postseason, and Keenan McCardell added a touchdown.

**NOTES FROM THE JETS GAME:** The loss gives the Jaguars a 3-3 postseason record in four seasons. ... The 26-degree temperature at kickoff marked the team's coldest game ever. The 1996 AFC Championship game at New England was 27 degrees. ... The Jaguars went 2-4 on artificial turf this season after going 3-11 in their first three seasons (and never getting more than one turf win a year). ... **Mark Brunell's interceptions were his first since November 22** at Pittsburgh, when he was also intercepted three times. ... Brunell's 52-yard TD pass to Jimmy Smith on the final play of the first half is the longest pass in Jaguars postseason history. ... **It was Brunell's first three-TD game in the postseason**, as Smith's two scores marked the first two-TD game by a Jaguar. Brunell completed only 12 of 31 passes for 156 yards; his completions and yardage totals were postseason lows. **Smith has scored five postseason touchdowns, breaking the team record** of three he shared with Natrone Means. ... Fred Taylor led the team with 86 yards on 20 carries. He moved into fifth place in all-time rookie rushing in the postseason. In two games this year, Taylor rushed for 248 yards on 52 carries. Among rookies, he trails only Washington's Timmy Smith (342 yards in 1987), Dallas' Duane Thomas (313 in 1970), Cincinnati's Ickey Woods (307 in 1988) and Houston's Earl Campbell (264 in 1978). ... **Reggie Barlow's 88-yard kickoff return was a postseason record**, bettering his 58-yarder last year at Denver. He returned three kickoffs for 118 yards, tying his postseason record set last year. ... Chris Hudson's 47-yard fumble return was a postseason record. ... Donovan Darius' interception was only the fourth by the Jaguars in six postseason games. ... **Mike Hollis added a 37-yard field goal for his 13th consecutive field goal in the postseason**, extending his team record and pulling to within three of the NFL's postseason record held by Gary Anderson. Hollis also improved his field goal percentage to .933 (14 of 15), which is the NFL postseason record. ... The Jaguars were outgained (251 yards to 429), had fewer first downs (14 to 29, tied for the most ever allowed by Jacksonville) and less time of possession (20:44 to 39:16). The second-quarter possession times were 14:09 by New York and 51 seconds by Jacksonville. ... The Jets converted 10 of 14 third downs (a season-high 71 percent), while the Jaguars were just 4 of 12 (33 percent). ... The Jaguars also had two takeaways and four turnovers, dropping to plus-11 for the season. ... The Jaguars had two sacks in the game, by Kevin Hardy and Eric Curry. **Hardy led the team with a postseason-record 23 tackles** (14 solo), followed by S Donovan Darius with 15 tackles (13 solo). ... Bryan Barker punted three times for a 37.0-yard average, with no touchbacks and one inside the 20. He had one punt returned for four yards. ... The only players who dressed but did not play were QB Jonathan Quinn and G Rich Tylski ... RB Tavian Banks, who was playing for the first time in 12 weeks, started in the backfield alongside Fred Taylor. ... Friday's inactives were: CB Cordell Taylor, S Mike Logan, LB Reggie Lowe and G/OT Todd Fordham; Sunday's inactives were: RB George Jones, G Mark Nori, DE Tony Brackens and QB Will Furrer (third QB). ... Jaguars captains were OT Tony Boselli, WR Keenan McCardell, DT John Jurkovic and LB Kevin Hardy.

**FROM COACH TOM COUGHLIN:** "The guys that make the plays advance, the ones that make the mistakes go home. The one thing that I am very proud of is that these guys fought their tails off. It was dismal for awhile; it didn't look like we could stop them. It didn't look like we could move the ball. And then all of a sudden it is a heck of a football game and we have got a chance. I will tell you this; there is a lot of courage and a lot of fight on this team. There was no one out there thinking anything except win. I am very proud of the courage and fortitude that these people displayed.

"I am very sorry that this season is over. We had some adversity and we fought our way through it. We've battled back and did some good things. I am really proud of this group; they have accomplished a lot. We won the AFC Central Division title. We had 12 wins. We've been in the playoffs three straight years. It has been a successful season. Now is it the extent of where we wanted to go? Of course not. We'd like to still be playing — that's what it's all about. You want to be more of a factor in the playoffs and in the hunt for the Super Bowl title.

(on the offseason) "Now it's on to evaluating and talking to the players — congratulating them on their winning the division, but telling them there is another level and we're not there. We need to really look at ourselves in humility and in honesty and realize that there are levels of maturity and execution that we have to gain that are preventing us from accomplishing all that we want to in a given season."

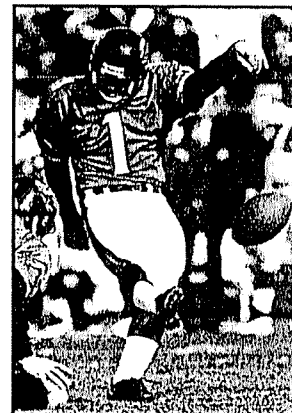
**FROM QB MARK BRUNELL:** "We were on the sidelines quite a bit. You have to give a lot of credit to the Jets' offense. They kept the ball, they threw it and they ran it. They did an incredible job. On the other side, we had opportunities to put points on the board but we didn't.

(on mistakes in the game) "We made some foolish, foolish plays, some foolish throws and some foolish decisions out there. But you have to be able to bounce back. During the course of the game there are adverse situations and we just didn't bounce back or take advantage of the opportunities given to us.

(on getting to the next step) "There are certain factors. You have to stay healthy. You have to be consistent in every aspect of the game. I think we were inconsistent for a lot of the year. We never had the numbers that you need to become a dominant football team. I think we are still headed in the right direction. We have the talent. We have to stay healthy. I think this organization has an incredible future. We are going to get there someday."

**FROM OT LEON SEARCY:** "We will just keep trying to reach our potential, which is to win a championship. There is no quit in this team. We are very disappointed. Nobody was ready to go home. We lost to a very good ballclub. We just have to work hard this off-season and come back next year ready to win a championship."

**HOLLIS IS NFL'S MOST ACCURATE FIELD GOAL KICKER OF ALL TIME:** Jaguars PK Mike Hollis was successful on his last 13 field goals attempts during the regular season, and he finished the year as the most accurate field goal kicker in NFL history (there is a minimum of 100 field goals to qualify for the all-time list). Hollis' percentage of 81.60 ranks first, and only four other kickers in NFL history have a percentage better than 80 percent. Hollis has also converted his last 13 field goals in the postseason, and he is 14 of 15 overall in the playoffs. Here's a look at the NFL's career field goal accuracy chart:

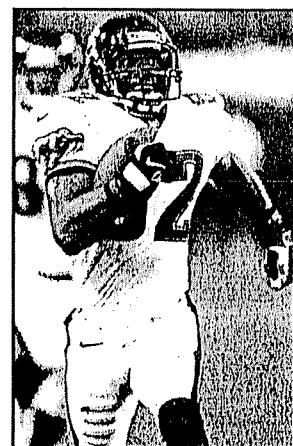

**HOLLIS IS MOST ACCURATE FIELD GOAL KICKER IN POSTSEASON, TOO:** Not only is Jaguars PK Mike Hollis the most accurate field goal kicker in NFL history during the regular season, but he's also the most accurate in the postseason. With five field goals in five attempts in this year's playoffs, Hollis is now 14 of 15 for his postseason career, a .933 percentage that broke the record of .909 held by Chuck Nelson, who converted 10 of 11 field goals for the Rams and Vikings.

**SMITH LEADS ALL RECEIVERS IN YARDAGE:** Over the last three seasons, Jaguars WR Jimmy Smith has amassed more receiving yardage than any receiver in the NFL, and teammate Keenan McCardell ranks ninth. Here's the list:

**TAYLOR MADE TO BE A RECORD SETTER:** Jaguars rookie RB Fred Taylor, who already holds 29 team records, has quickly turned into one of the top big-play performers in the NFL. Taylor, who was selected by the Jaguars with the ninth overall pick in this year's draft, started the 1998 season as the backup to James Stewart, who rushed for more than 100 yards in the season's first two games before being injured early in Game 3. Despite missing approximately 10 quarters of action because of injuries, Taylor accomplished the following:

- Scored 17 touchdowns in the regular season, which tied him for the third most ever by a rookie in NFL history. The record is 22 held by Gale Sayers (1965), followed by Eric Dickerson with 20 (1983). Randy Moss also had 17 this year.
- Scored 14 rushing touchdowns this season, tied for the third most by a rookie in NFL history. The record is 18 by Eric Dickerson (1983), followed by Ickey Woods with 15 (1988). Gale Sayers (1965), Barry Sanders (1989) and Curtis Martin (1995) also had 14.
- Had six 100-yard games this season, the team single-season record
- Has the top five rushing performances in Jaguars history (183, 128, 128, 118 and 116 yards)
- Has the three longest runs in Jaguars history (77, 70 and 52 yards, as well as a 49-yarder)
- Has the longest pass reception in Jaguars history (78 yards)
- Was the only player in the NFL with TDs of more than 75 yards both running and receiving this year
- Scored touchdowns in 12 of the last 15 games in which he played (including postseason)
- Tied for the second-most TDs in the NFL in 1998
- Finished sixth in the AFC in rushing with 1,223 yards and led all rookie rushers despite starting only 12 games
- Finished fourth in the AFC with 1,644 total yards from scrimmage
- Had a 4.6-yard rushing average, fifth in the NFL
- In the Wild-Card game vs. New England, rushed 33 times for 162 yards and one touchdown. His rushing total



marked the third-most yards in a postseason game by a rookie in NFL history. Ranking one and two are Timmy Smith of the Redskins (204 vs Denver on 1/31/88) and Paul Lowe of the L.A. Chargers (165 vs. Houston on 1/1/61). His 162 yards was also the second most in Jaguars postseason history (Natrone Means rushed for 175 yards on 12/28/96 at Buffalo). His 33 carries also broke Means' postseason record of 31 carries at Buffalo and topped Taylor's regular-season mark of 32 carries on 12/6/98 vs. Detroit.

→ Moved into fifth place in all-time rookie rushing in the postseason. In two games, Taylor rushed for 248 yards on 52 carries. Among rookies, he trails only Washington's Timmy Smith (342 yards in 1987), Dallas' Duane Thomas (313 in 1970), Cincinnati's Ickey Woods (307 in 1988) and Houston's Earl Campbell (264 in 1978).

#### ROOKIE OF THE YEAR?

Even though Minnesota's Randy Moss was voted NFL Rookie of the year by the Associated Press, a comparison of statistics between Taylor and Moss shows that Taylor actually outperformed the Vikings' receiver this season. Here's a quick look:

**TAYLOR CAN GO LONG:** In his first three games as the main ballcarrier, Taylor had runs of 52, 49 and 77 yards, making him only the 11th player in the NFL since 1950 to have runs of 40 or more yards in three consecutive games. The other 10 players were: Lenny Moore (1956), Jim Brown (1958), Clarence Peaks (1960), Curtis McClinton (1962), Gale Sayers (1965), Franco Harris (1972), O.J. Simpson (1976), Ottis Anderson (1980), Bo Jackson (1990) and Barry Sanders (1997).

Taylor did not start the season's first two games when Stewart was rushing for 100 yards in back-to-back games; he did not play on October 18 at Buffalo because of a shoulder injury; he missed more than a quarter of the October 25 game at Denver with a mild concussion; and he missed three quarters of the Week 13 game at Cincinnati after reagravating his shoulder injury. Taylor was named NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month in both September and December and he was the Miller Lite NFL Player of the Week for his November 15 performance vs. Tampa Bay.

#### WHAT THEY SAY ABOUT FRED TAYLOR:

■ Jaguars OT offensive tackle Tony Boselli — "We all know he can go all the way at any time. If we sustain our blocks and give him a little crease, he's going to make something big happen. He has the speed to go the distance. He can make people miss, and he has power, too."

■ Lions WR Herman Moore — "Taylor is a very elusive back. He's almost like Barry (Sanders). He makes people miss."

■ Jaguars head coach Tom Coughlin — "He has the ability to rush the football and be a contributor in the passing game. It was something he was looking forward to, an opportunity to play with some consistency, and he got it."

■ Steelers head coach Bill Cowher — "Fred, once he gets into the crease, he's looking to get to the sidelines. He has outstanding speed. I've been very impressed with Fred Taylor, what I have seen of him so far. He has outstanding speed. You see people on video having good angles, suddenly disappearing. He's a very dangerous runner."

■ Fred Taylor when asked how he thought he matched up with Barry Sanders — "Barry has been doing this for a long time. When I've been around and have been doing it as long as he has, I might be able to better answer that question."

**BARLOW IS SPECIAL ON KICK RETURNS:** Reggie Barlow led the AFC in punt returns and finished seventh in kickoff returns. Barlow was voted as the first alternate kick returner for the AFC Pro Bowl squad this year, behind Jermaine Lewis. In the Jaguars' loss to the Jets in the divisional playoffs, Barlow returned a kickoff 88 yards. Here's a look at Barlow's statistics for both punt returns and kickoff returns this year:

Barlow

On October 25 at Denver, Barlow returned six kickoffs for a team-record 206 yards, including a 91-yarder that set up a touchdown and is the second longest in team history to his 92-yarder last season. He also had a 75-yard punt return for a touchdown nullified because of a penalty against Tennessee.

Also, in the final two months of the season, Mike Logan was on a tear. He had a 96-yard return for a touchdown called back because of a penalty at Baltimore, and he has returns of 51 and 53 yards. For the season, Logan returned 18 kickoffs for 414 yards, a 23.0-yard average. In addition, rookie Tavian Banks returned a kickoff 65 yards in Week 2 against Kansas City and had a 26.6-yard average on five kickoff returns.

As a team, the Jaguars were second in the NFL in punt returns with a 12.9-yard average and their 22.4-yard average on kickoff returns set a team record (bettering the mark of 21.8 in 1996).

**THE COMEBACK CAT:** Since the Jaguars' inaugural season of 1995, QB Mark Brunell has led the Jaguars to 11 come-from-behind victories in the fourth quarter, including four times this year. Here's a recap:

**BRUNELL'S TOUCHDOWN TARGETS:** With a personal-best four TD passes in his last complete game on November 29 at Cincinnati, Mark Brunell has thrown 72 TD passes in four seasons in Jacksonville. Here are the 14 players who have caught them: Jimmy Smith (17), Keenan McCardell (13), Willie Jackson (10), Pete Mitchell (7), Damon Jones (6), James Stewart (5), Ernest Givins (3), Cedric Tillman (3), Fred Taylor (2), Andre Rison (2), Derek Brown (1), Ty Hallock (1), Desmond Howard (1), Natrone Means (1).



**JAGUARS AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the 1998 regular season, the Jaguars ranked 10th in the NFL in total offense (5th rushing, 20th passing), and they ranked 25th in defense (22nd rushing and 23rd passing). ... **The Jaguars scored 392 points, an average of 24.5 per game, fourth in the conference behind Denver (31.3), New York Jets (26.0) and Buffalo (25.0)** and eighth in the NFL. ... The Jaguars' offense ranked seventh in the NFL in third down percentage (94 of 220, 42.7 percent) and the defense was 11th in the NFL in opponent's third-down conversions (81 of 222, 36.5 percent). A year ago in third down percentage, the Jaguars ranked 12th on offense (39.2 percent) and last on defense (45.1 percent). ... The Jaguars were second in the AFC and seventh in the NFL with an average of 5.45 yards on first downs. Denver led the NFL with 6.36 yards. ... The Jaguars' plus-10 difference in turnovers-takeaways was tied for second in the AFC and fifth in the NFL. ... **RB Fred Taylor tied for second in the NFL with 17 touchdowns behind Denver's Terrell Davis (23)** with Minnesota's Randy Moss (17)... Mike Hollis was seventh in the AFC in scoring with 108 points. ... QB Mark Brunell finished fourth in the AFC in passing with a 89.9 rating. Brunell's 20 TD passes was fifth in the AFC, and he ranked second in fourth-quarter passing with a 90.7 mark and fifth in third-down passing with an 88.1 rating. ... WR Jimmy Smith was seventh in the AFC with 78 receptions, and Keenan McCardell was tied for 15th in the AFC with 64 catches. Smith's 1,182 yards was third in the AFC, and McCardell's 892 yards was 13th. McCardell's 22 catches on third downs tied for ninth in the AFC and Smith's 19 tied for tied for 16th. ... **Fred Taylor finished sixth in the AFC with 1,223 yards rushing, and his 4.6-yard rushing average was seventh in the NFL.** Taylor was also fourth in the AFC with 1,644 total yards from scrimmage, while Smith was 14th with 1,182 total yards. ... Reggie Barlow was first in the AFC in punt returns (12.9-yard average) and seventh in kickoff returns (24.9 yards). ... P Bryan Barker was third in the NFL in net punting (38.5) and sixth in gross punting (45.0). ... The Jaguars ranked third in the AFC in scoring inside the 20, with 31 TDs in 55 possessions (56.4 percent).

**1998 STATS AND SUCH:** The Jaguars broke their team record with 29 plays of 30 or more yards. They had 22 plays of 30-plus yards in 1997, 26 in 1996 and 12 in 1995. ... The Jaguars outscored their opponents in the first quarter (100-42) and third quarter (81-53), and were outscored in the second quarter (127-138) and fourth quarter (84-105). ... The offense used 12 different starting lineup combinations in the 16 games, and the defense had a different starting lineup in 10 of the 16 games. ... **Only six players (three on both offense and defense) started all 16 regular-season games:** C Quentin Neujahr (who missed the playoffs with an injury), G Ben Coleman, TE Pete Mitchell, DT John Jurkovic, LB Kevin Hardy and LB Bryce Paup. ... Of the Jaguars' 269 completed passes this season, 156 were to wide receivers, 46 to tight ends and 67 to running backs. ... Jaguars opponents began 45 possessions inside their own 20, and they scored on only four of those drives (2 TD, 2 FG). The Jaguars began 37 possessions inside their own 20, and they scored on 6 of them (5 TD, 1 FG). On 55 drives inside the opponent's 20, the Jaguars scored 31 TDs and 18 FGs. Their opponents had had 50 trips inside the red zone and scored 23 TDs and 20 FGs. ... The Jaguars used turnovers to score 92 points, while their opponents scored only 62 points off turnovers. ... In four seasons, the Jaguars are 8 for 13 on two-point conversions (1 for 2 this year), while their opponents are 3 for 14 (1 for 6 this year). ... The Jaguars were 4 for 8 on fourth-down conversions; their opponents were 10 for 20 this season. ... In four seasons, the Jaguars are 1-0 in August, 8-8 in September, 7-9 in October, 10-6 in November and 9-6 in December. ... **Mark Brunell is 31-22 as a starter in regular-season games, 34-25 overall.** ... PK Mike Hollis has scored in 49 consecutive regular-season games (and all six in the playoffs). He now has 450 points in his four years with the Jaguars.

The average age of the 53-man roster as of January 11 was 26.40 years old. There were 23 players 25 or younger, 23 players between 26 and 29 years old, and seven players 30 or older. The youngest player is RB Fred Taylor (23 years, 0 months), and the oldest is P Bryan Barker (34). ... Eleven rookies are on the roster, including eight of the 11 draft choices (RB Fred Taylor, S Donovan Darius, CB Cordell Taylor, QB Jonathan Quinn, RB Tavian Banks, C/G John Wade, DE Lamanzer Williams and WR Alvis Whitted) ... More than half of the players (37) have four years or less of NFL experience, and only 6 players are in their eighth season or more. ... There are 21 players who are new to the team this year, and 32 who were with the team before this year. In addition to the eight draft choices, the other 13 new players are C Quentin Neujahr (restricted free agent from Baltimore); LB Bryce Paup (unrestricted free agent from Buffalo); QB Will Furrer, DEs Fernando Smith and Eric Curry, RB George Jones, TE Troy Sadowski and LB Eddie Mason (veteran free agents); RB Chris Howard, LB Reggie Lowe and LB Erik Storz (rookie free agents); FB Zack Crockett (claimed off waivers); and S Blaine McElmurry (claimed off a practice squad). ... **The Jaguars have 11 players who were first-round selections in the college draft,** including six of their own picks: DE Jeff Lageman, who is on I.R. (1989, New York Jets), DT Kelvin Pritchett (1991, Dallas Cowboys, but traded to Detroit on Draft Day), OT Leon Searcy (1992, Pittsburgh Steelers), CB Deon Figures (1993, Pittsburgh Steelers), DE Eric Curry (1993, Tampa Bay), OT Tony Boselli (1995, Jaguars), RB James Stewart, who is on I.R. (1995, Jaguars), LB Kevin Hardy (1996, Jaguars), DT Renaldo Wynn (1997, Jaguars), RB Fred Taylor (1998, Jaguars) and S Donovan Darius (1998, Jaguars).

**In three seasons, four Jaguars have played in all 70 games (regular season and postseason) in franchise history: WR Jimmy Smith, TE Pete Mitchell, PK Mike Hollis and P Bryan Barker.** ... The longest current string of consecutive starts is held by G Ben Coleman (47), followed by TE Pete Mitchell (28). ... Seven players have played in 100 or more games during their careers: P Bryan Barker (135), DE Joel Smeenge (129), LB Bryce Paup (123), DT Kelvin Pritchett (116), OT Leon Searcy (111), DT John Jurkovic (104) and TE/LS Troy Sadowski (101). ... Paup has 99 career starts, followed by Searcy (95) and Jurkovic (86). ... OT Tony Boselli has started 55 games for the Jaguars, followed by QB Mark Brunell (53) and G Ben Coleman (52).
