

# JAGUARS FINISH INAUGURAL SEASON WITH 4-12 RECORD AND SECOND PICK IN 1996 DRAFT

**1995 IN REVIEW:** The Jacksonville Jaguars finished their historic inaugural season with a 4-12 record in their inaugural season and the second pick in the 1996 college draft.

Along the way, the Jaguars:

■ Broke the previous record for most victories by an expansion team. The Jaguars won four games; no previous expansion team had ever won more than three, a feat accomplished by five teams. The Carolina Panthers won seven games this season.

■ Became the first expansion team ever to finish with a .500 record in its division. The Jaguars went 4-4 in the AFC Central Division. Previously, the quickest any expansion team had gone .500 was in its third season.

■ Became the first expansion team since 1966 to sweep an opponent. The Jaguars defeated the Cleveland Browns twice this year (23-15 on October 22 and 24-21 on December 24). The only other expansion team to sweep an opponent was the 1966 Miami Dolphins, who beat the Houston Oilers twice.

**1996 COLLEGE DRAFT ORDER:** The Jaguars will choose second in the 1996 college draft after the New York Jets. The Jaguars have 11 picks in the draft. The Jaguars and Carolina Panthers were originally awarded 14 draft choices: their own original pick in each of seven rounds, as well as one extra bonus pick in the third, fourth and fifth rounds and two extra bonus picks in the sixth and seventh rounds. **EXPANSION DIVISION RECORDS:** The Jaguars finished with a record of 4-4 in the AFC Central to become the first expansion team to record a .500 divisional record in their inaugural season. No other expansion team has ever finished .500 in its division until at least its third season. Following is a list of expansion teams ranked by earliest .500 divisional year:

**BARKER WAS NFL'S TOP NET PUNTER IN 1995:** Jaguars P Bryan Barker had the highest net punting average in the NFL this season with a mark of 38.634 yards — two one-thousands of a yard better than Cincinnati's Lee Johnson. That's a difference of about 1/16th of an inch per punt.

Barker thus became the first Jaguars player to lead the NFL in a major statistical category.

Barker's average is far above his previous best of 36.3 yards in 1994, which led the NFC when he was with Philadelphia. The Jaguars allowed their opponents to return 45 punts for a total of only 323 yards — a 7.2-yard average that was 5th best in the NFL. For the season, Barker punted 82 times for an average of 43.8 yards, tied for 4th best in the NFL and above his career best of 43.3 in 1993 while with Kansas City.

In Pro Bowl balloting, Barker was selected as the AFC's first alternate behind San Diego's Darren Bennett.

**STATS AND SUCH:** The Jaguars offense did not have the same starting lineup twice this season — 16 different starting combinations in 16 games. The defense had 12 different starting combinations. ... The Jaguars offense finished the season ranked 28th in total offense, its highest ranking of the season. The defense ranked 21st. ... The Jaguars lost 8 games by 10 points or fewer. ... The Jaguars were minus-4 on the turnover table (24 takeaways and 28 giveaways). ... Jacksonville finished 1st in the NFL in net punting average and 5th in gross punting average. ... The Jaguars ranked 9th in the league in rushing average per carry. ... The Jaguars threw at least one touchdown pass in 14 of 16 games. ... The Jaguars won 3 of the 5 games in which they held opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing. Jacksonville lost to the Jets (79 yards) and Colts (91 yards), but beat the Oilers (91), Steelers (68) and Browns (89). ... The Jaguars were 2-6 at home, 2-6 on the road, 4-4 vs. the AFC Central, 4-1 when scoring first, 4-3 when scoring on their first possession, 4-1 when leading at halftime, 0-2 when tied at halftime, 0-9 when trailing at halftime, 2-1 when leading after three quarters, 2-11 when trailing after three quarters, 3-4 when scoring 20-plus points, and 3-3 when allowing 20 or fewer points. The Jaguars were also 2-4 when they had a time of possession of 30:00-plus, 2-2 when they made no turnovers, 0-3 when they had no takeaways, 3-3 when they had a plus-turnover ratio, 1-2 with an even turnover ratio, and 0-7 when they had a minus-turnover ratio. ... The Jaguars outscored their opponents in the fourth (116-100) quarter, while being outscored in the first (64-75), second (67-138) and third (28-91) quarters. ... The longest current streaks for consecutive games started belong to CB Mickey Washington (36 games), C Dave Widell (33) and DT Kelvin Pritchett (31).

■ With an 82.6 passer rating, Mark Brunell ranked 7th among AFC quarterbacks and 15th in the NFL, the highest ranking ever for a quarterback of an expansion team. He completed 201 of 346 passes (58.1%) for 2,168 yards, 15 touchdowns and only 7 interceptions. His interception total tied for second fewest in the AFC and the NFL. Brunell also led all quarterbacks in rushing with 480 yards (ranking 2nd on the team) and led all NFL rushers with an average of 7.2 yards per carry. He scored 4 rushing touchdowns to lead the team, and he ranked as the Jaguars' rushing leader for the first 6 weeks of the season, as well as in games 9 through 12.

■ James Stewart led the Jaguars with 525 rushing yards, despite missing 2 games and playing sparingly in several others because of injuries. He ranked 18th in the AFC in rushing.

■ Pete Mitchell finished 2nd among NFL rookie tight ends in receptions with 41 catches, just one behind Indianapolis' Ken Dilger. Eight tight ends were drafted in front of Mitchell, who was selected by Miami in the fourth round of the 1995 draft before being traded to Jacksonville seven days before the start of the regular season for WR Mike Williams. Mitchell caught only 11 passes in the first half of the season, but he finished as the Jaguars' second-leading receiver with 41 catches for 527 yards, a 12.9-yard average and 2 touchdowns. He set team single-game records with 10 catches for 161 yards at Tampa Bay.

■ Willie Jackson and Jimmy Smith tied for the team lead with 5 touchdowns, but Jackson also scored on a 2-point conversion to give him 32 points. Jackson led the Jaguars in receiving with 53 catches for a team-high 589 yards. Smith's 13.1-yard average per reception led the team.

■ Mike Hollis led the Jaguars in scoring with 87 points. He ranked 12th in the AFC and 25th in the NFL. For the season, Hollis hit on 27 of 28 extra points and 20 of 27 field goals (74.1%).

■ Bryan Barker led the NFL in net punting with a 38.6-yard average, slightly ahead of Cincinnati's Lee Johnson.

■ Desmond Howard ranked 5th in the AFC and tied for 8th in the NFL with a 10.3-yard average on punt returns.

■ Jimmy Smith led the team in kickoff returns with a 22.5-yard average (24 for 540 yards). Smith scored on an 89-yard return after a lateral against Denver. Eight players returned kickoffs for the Jaguars this season, and in the season finale, TE Pete Mitchell was back for kickoffs, too.

■ MLB Bryan Schwartz led the team in tackles the last 5 games of the season and 8 of the last 9 games. Despite starting only 9 games, Schwartz was the Jaguars' leading tackler for the season with 161 (88 solos).

■ Harry Colon led the Jaguars with 3 interceptions, while Mickey Washington was the only Jaguar to score a touchdown off an interception. The Jaguars had 13 interceptions to their opponents' 15. Only 10 teams threw fewer interceptions than the Jaguars.

■ Joel Smeenge led the team with 4 sacks, followed by Don Davey (3), Jeff Lageman (3) and Ernie Logan (3).

**JAGUARS HAVE NFL'S BIGGEST OFFENSIVE LINE:** The Jaguars have the tallest starting offensive line in the NFL and among the heaviest.

The Jaguars' final starting offensive line averaged 6-6.2 inches in height and weighed 308 pounds. Only the Dallas Cowboys, New York Jets and Washington Redskins weighed more than the Jaguars.

In fact, Jacksonville's smallest starting offensive lineman (LG Shawn Bouwens, who is 6-5, 293) is taller than the average lineman on all but five teams in the NFL.

"Size matters, but what's important is production," says Jaguars head coach Tom Coughlin. "Size is an advantage in certain situations, and you'd like it to be a major plus."

Jacksonville has three starters who are 6-7, and in the entire NFL there are only 13 players who are 6-7 or taller. Here is a breakdown:

**ABOUT THE STADIUM:** The new Jacksonville Municipal Stadium drew rave reviews in 1995 . In 8 regular-season home games, the average attendance was 69,352. Here are comments made about the stadium:

NBC broadcaster Don Criqui: "There isn't a better football facility in America than Jacksonville Municipal Stadium. I've never seen a better facility. The natural field is a perfect playing surface."

Jaguars coach Tom Coughlin: "When you stand at the base of this stadium, it's a magnificent stadium. It's the most beautiful place I've ever played in. This has to be one of the greatest stadiums in the country, bar none. Playing on grass, the weather, a brand new stadium. A great city. People who have waited years for a football team. I don't think there's a hotter place in the country than Jacksonville, Florida. This is tremendous."

Steelers owner Dan Rooney: "(Jacksonville is) the most enthusiastic place I've ever seen. (The stadium has) been an impetus to the community like you've never seen. You could say that's money well spent."

Rams coach Rich Brooks: "This is a great stadium to play football in. The seats are close to the field, and the noise is very, very loud. We tried an audible and screwed it up because of the noise."

Jaguars owner Wayne Weaver — "I think we've raised the bar on how stadiums are going to be built in the future. The two magnificent Stadium Clubs are unique in any stadium. This stadium is already a candidate to host a Super Bowl game; all we need is the hotel rooms."

Packers RB Edgar Bennett, a native of Jacksonville: "It's a beautiful stadium. You've got to tip your hats off to them. It's real nice. Definitely an upgrade."

Bengals general manager Mike Brown: "There are a lot of things to impress us about this stadium. The club seat arrangement, the sight lines — really everything about it."

Jaguars president David Seldin: "I think our stadium is the finest in the National Football League. It's much better than I envisioned it in 1993. The magic is in the detail. A lot of the richness that makes this place extra special are things that we did while building it that we didn't know we were going to do when we started."

Colts offensive coordinator Lindy Infante, who was the head coach of the USFL Jacksonville Bulls in 1984-85: "I was curious to see the new stadium because I've heard so many good things about it. It really is outstanding. The people of Jacksonville have a lot of be proud of."

# MORE JAGUARS “FIRSTS”

## Summary of First-Year and “First-Time Players

Heading into their inaugural season, the Jaguars had two major preseason objectives:

- 1) Build the nucleus of the team through the draft
- 2) Establish the foundation of the team with an average age of 26 years

■ The 13 rookies on the active roster at the end of the season was the most for any NFL team, and the total of 18 rookies and first-year players was also the most for any NFL team.

■ The average age of the Jaguars' roster for the final game was 25.53 years. That included 38 players between the ages of 22 and 26 and 15 players 27 to 31. Nineteen players were younger than 25.

■ The offense had 16 different starting combinations for the 16 games, and the defense had 12 different combinations.

■ The Jaguars drafted 10 players in their first draft and all 10 of them are still with the team — 8 of them contributed as rookies and the other 2 finished the season injured reserve. In addition, 3 other rookies were on the roster and contributed.

**JAGUARS DEFENSE:** The Jaguars allowed 404 points in 16 games, an average of 25.3 points per game. That ranked second when compared to the eight previous expansions teams in NFL history. The fewest points allowed is an average of 21.4 by the 1968 Cincinnati Bengals. Here is a statistical breakdown:
