THE OVERVIEW

The Jacksonville Jaguars host the Atlanta Falcons in Week 3 of the 2018 preseason at TIAA Bank Field on Saturday, Aug. 25. Jacksonville has played Atlanta more than any other team in the preseason (13 times), posting an 8-5 record versus the Falcons.

In 2017, the two teams met in Week 3 of the preseason in Atlanta and Jacksonville claimed a 13-7 victory.

JAGUARS BATTLE FOR PRESEASON WIN

After two joint practices with Minnesota, Jacksonville left Minneapolis with a 14-10 victory against the Vikings on Aug. 18. The Jaguars defense limited the Vikings to 238 total yards and finished with 4.0 sacks.

"We got better and played against a good group up here, especially against their wide receivers," Pro Bowl CB **A.J. Bouye** said. "We made a lot of plays and it showed today. We finished the game well and that shows you the type of young guys that we have on the back end ... Our coach gives us goals every day, but we are so locked in and focused as a unit that we are always trying to get better and get each other better."

Jacksonville scored its first TD on a 1-yard run by RB **Leonard Fournette** on fourth-and-goal after QB **Blake Bortles** scrambled for a 14-yard gain on third down from the 15-yard line.

In the fourth quarter, the Jaguars defense made a timely stop, setting up WR **Rashad Greene Sr.**'s 56-yard punt return, which he brought back to the Vikings 4-yard line. On the ensuing possession, **Brandon Wilds**, which gave the Jaguars a 14-10 lead on a 1-yard rushing TD.

On the Vikings' final drive, Jaguars S **Jarrod Wilson** sealed the victory when he strip-sacked Vikings QB **Kyle Slotter** on fourth down.

PRESEASON QUICK HITS

- The Jaguars rank third in the 2018 preseason in average time of possession (33:17). Jacksonville has sustained multiple long drives, including a 15-play, 79-yard drive (7:02) by the first-team offense in Week 1 vs. New Orleans.
- Jacksonville has had four different players return punts in the 2018 preseason - WR **Rashad Greene Sr.**, WR **Jaydon Mickens**, WR **Dede Westbrook** and WR **Shane Wynn**. Greene Sr. leads the Jaguars with a 28.5 yard return average on two punt returns.
- After finishing second in sacks in 2017 (55), Jacksonville has continued its trend of getting to the QB in the 2018 preseason. The Jaguars rank third in sacks (7.0) and sack yards (42) and have had seven different players record a sack.
- QB **Cody Kessler** is one of just nine quarterbacks with a QB rating above 100 in the 2018 preseason. Kessler has completed 25 of 33 passes for one TD and has recorded a 102.0 rating in Jacksonville's two games.
- RB **T.J. Yeldon** leads the Jaguars in rushing yards (54) and receiving yards (73) in the 2018 preseason.

ROSTER CUTS LOOMING

Prior to 4 p.m. ET on Sept. 1, clubs must reduce their rosters to a maximum of 53 players on the active/inactive list. Clubs that have players listed as active/physically unable to perform (PUP) or active/non-football injury or illness must also place those players on one of the following selections: reserve/physically unable to perform (PUP) or reserve/non-football injury or illness, whichever is applicable. Other options include requesting waivers, terminating contracts, trading contracts or continuing to count those players on the active roster.

LOOKING BACK AT 2017

BY THE NUMBERS

4

RB **Leonard Fournette** scored a franchise-record four rushing TDs in the 2017 postseason, marking the most rushing touchdowns a rookie has scored in the NFL postseason since **Jamal Lewis** also rushed for four TDs in 2000.

+7

Head Coach **Doug Marrone** helped lead the Jaguars to a 10-6 record in 2017 after the team went 3-13 in 2016, which tied for the league's biggest win/loss improvement (+7) among first-year head coaches (tied with the Rams' **Sean McVay**).

55

The Jaguars produced 55 sacks in 2017, which was the second-most sacks in the NFL and the second-most in franchise history (57 in 1999). DE **Calais Campbell** led the team with a career- and franchise-high 14.5 sacks.

+96

Jacksonville ranked third in the NFL in point differential at home, finishing the 2017 season with a +96 point differential in the team's nine home games, including the postseason.

QB **Blake Bortles** needs to throw 10 TDs in 2018 to become the second QB in Jaguars history to throw for at least 100 TDs. Bortles ranks third in franchise history in career passing yards (14,928), pass attempts (2,229) and pass completions (1,318).

WR **Keelan Cole's** 17.8 yards per catch avg. in 2017 was the highest single-season average (min. 32 receptions) in franchise history and was second in the NFL behind Lions WR **Marvin Jones Jr.** (18.0).

The Jaguars 2018 schedule features seven opponents that made the 2017 postseason, including the Super Bowl LII champions, the Philadelphia Eagles. Jacksonville also faces off against every team they played in the 2017 postseason: New England (Week 2), Pittsburgh (Week 11) and Buffalo (Week 12).

DE **Yannick Ngakoue** is the only player to record at least 20.0 sacks and 10 forced fumbles over the past two seasons (2016-17). In 2017, Ngakoue registered a league-leading six forced fumbles, which ranked second in single-season franchise history (Tony Brackens, eight 1999).

CB **Jalen Ramsey** and CB **A.J. Bouye** are the only two players in the NFL to have totaled at least 110 tackles, 30 passes defensed and five INTs since the start of the 2016 season.

In 2017, the Jaguars led the league with 23 players on their Week 1 roster who entered the NFL as undrafted rookies, including CB **A.J. Bouye**, WR **Keelan Cole** and S **Barry Church**.

2017 JAGUARS PLAYOFF NOTES

- In 2017, under Head Coach **Doug Marrone**, the Jaguars reached the playoffs for the first time in a decade and hosted a playoff game for the first time in 18 years, defeating the Buffalo Bills, 10-3, in an AFC Wild Card matchup.
- Jacksonville ranked first among teams in the 2017 playoffs in rushing yards per game (140.0) and takeaways (five). In the regular season, the Jaguars finished first and second, respectively, in those categories.
- LB **Telvin Smith** totaled a league-high 35 tackles in the playoffs, becoming just the fourth player in the NFL since 2000 to post 35 or more tackles in a single postseason.
- QB **Blake Bortles** rushed 10 times for 88 yards against the Bills, the most rushing yards by any player in the game and the most by a Jaguars QB in a regular season or postseason game in franchise history. Bortles is one of just five quarterbacks in the NFL since 2000 to throw for 500 yards (594) and rush for 100 (121) in a single postseason.

HEAD COACH DOUG MARRONE

HEAD COACH



Doug Marrone was named the fifth head coach of the Jaguars on Jan. 9, 2017 after previously serving as the team's interim head coach for the final two games of the 2016 season. Marrone was originally hired as the team's assistant head coach-offense/offensive line coach on Jan. 20, 2015, following a two-year stint as the head coach for the Buffalo Bills (2013-14).

In his first full season as the team's head coach, Marrone finished the 2017 regular season with a 10-6 record, which was tied for the league's biggest win/loss improvement (+7) among first-year head coaches (tied with the Rams' **Sean McVay**). Marrone led the team to an AFC South division title, which was the team's first division title since winning the AFC Central in 1999. The Jaguars finished the 2017 season with the top-ranked rushing offense (141.4 yards per game) and the league's best pass defense (169.0 passing yards allowed per game) en route to their first playoff berth in a decade. Under Marrone's tutelage, the Jaguars hosted a playoff game for the first time in 18 years, defeating the Buffalo Bills, 10-3, in the AFC Wild Card. The team advanced to the AFC Championship for the first time since 1999 after defeating the Pittsburgh Steelers, 45-42, in the AFC Divisional round, ultimately falling to the New England Patriots, 20-24.

Marrone's 2017 squad featured six Pro Bowl selections (CB **A.J. Bouye**, DE **Calais Campbell**, DT **Malik Jackson**, DE **Yannick Ngakoue**, CB **Jalen Ramsey** and LB **Telvin Smith**), while Bouye (second-team), Campbell (first-team), Ramsey (first-team) and Smith (second-team) were all named to the AP All-Pro teams.

In 2016, Marrone's offensive line allowed 34 sacks, 17 fewer than the previous season (51) and 37 fewer than in 2014 (71). The Jaguars' 34 sacks allowed were the fewest sacks allowed by the team since it yielded 31 sacks in 2007. In 2017, the Jaguars set a franchise record with 24 sacks allowed.

In his first season with the Jaguars in 2015, Marrone helped the offensive line provide protection for QB **Blake Bortles**, who set single-season franchise records with 355 completions, 606 pass attempts, 4,428 yards and 35 touchdowns. In addition, Marrone's squad blocked for rookie RB **T.J. Yeldon**, who accounted for 740 rushing yards and 279 receiving yards in 2015, becoming the first Jaguars rookie to surpass 1,000 scrimmage yards since **Maurice Jones-Drew** (1,377) in 2006. Yeldon also placed third among AFC RBs in 2016 with 84.9 scrimmage yards per game.

Prior to joining the Jaguars, Marrone compiled a 15-17 mark as the head coach of the Bills, including a 9-7 mark in 2014, the team's most wins since 2004. He became only the third coach in Bills history to win 15 games in his first two seasons (**Marv Levy**, 19; **Wade Phillips**, 21). The Bills had six Pro Bowl selections during Marrone's two seasons.

The Bills had three different players with 60 receptions in 2014 for the first time in team history (**Fred Jackson**, 65; **Sammy Watkins**, 62; **Robert Woods**, 61) and the club produced six individual 100-yard receiving games. Watkins set team rookie records for receptions and receiving yards (982). The Bills ranked sixth in the NFL in 2014 with a plus-seven turnover differential.

In 2013, Marrone's offensive unit led the AFC and finished second in the NFL in rushing (144.2 avg.), while also leading the league with a 95.5 pct. red zone efficiency mark. Rookie quarterback **E.J. Manuel** started 10 games and set team rookie records for passing touchdowns (11) and completions (180).

Prior to joining the Bills, Marrone spent four seasons (2009-12) as the head coach of

his alma mater, Syracuse, where he led the program to a 21-17 record in his final three seasons. He guided the Orange to an 8-5 mark in 2010 and 2012 and both seasons culminated with a New Era Pinstripe Bowl championship. The Orange set several school records in 2012, including total yards (5,681), passing yards (3,619) and first downs (300). Marrone earned the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Region 1 Coach of the Year honors in 2011 and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award.

Marrone spent seven seasons in the NFL (2002-08) before becoming a collegiate head coach. From 2006-08, Marrone served as the offensive coordinator for the New Orleans Saints. He directed an offense that led the NFL in total offense (391.5 avg. in 2006; 410.7 avg. in 2008) and passing yards per game (281.4 avg. in 2006; 311.1 in 2008) in two different seasons (2006-08). The Saints' offensive line held their opponents to the fewest sacks allowed in the NFL in 2006 (16) and tied for the fewest sacks in the NFL from 2006-08 with 52 despite leading the NFL with 1,868 passing attempts during that span. QB **Drew Brees** captured the NFL passing title in 2006 (4,418 yards) and 2008 (5,069) and became just the second passer in NFL history to eclipse 5,000 passing yards (**Dan Marino**, 1984).

Prior to Marrone's arrival in New Orleans, the franchise had never had a 4,000-yard passer or registered more than 5,700 yards of offense. Brees eclipsed 4,000 passing yards and the offense posted more than 5,700 yards in each of Marrone's three seasons with the Saints. The Saints established a team record with an NFL-best 6,264 yards of offense in 2006, 5,780 in 2007 (4th in the NFL) and led the NFL again in 2008 with 6,571 yards.

In Marrone's first season as an NFL offensive coordinator in 2006, LT **Jammal Brown** was voted to the All-Pro team and to the Pro Bowl in his first year at the position, while OG **Jahri Evans** was a unanimous All-Rookie selection. The Saints ranked fourth in the NFL in 2007 in total offense and set an NFL record for completions (440) and had franchise bests for passing first downs (222), attempts (652), touchdown passes (28) and completion percentage (67.5). In 2008, the Saints led the NFL in total offense while setting team records for points (463), total yards (6,571), net passing yards (4,977), touchdowns (57) and first downs (354).

Marrone was the offensive line coach of the New York Jets from 2002-05 and the team made two postseason appearances (2002, 2004) with him on the staff. In 2004, the Jets produced the NFL's third-best rushing offense (149.3 avg.) and **Curtis Martin** led the NFL with 1,697 rushing yards.

Before arriving in New York, Marrone served as tight ends/tackles coach at the University of Tennessee in 2001. He spent the 2000 season at the University of Georgia as offensive line coach after spending the previous five seasons (1995-99) at Georgia Tech where he was part of three consecutive bowl appearances. He was director of football operations for the Yellow Jackets in 1995 before coaching the tight ends in 1996 and offensive line from 1997-99.

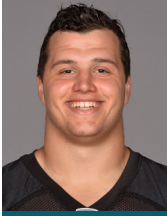
Marrone began his coaching career in 1992 at Cortland (N.Y.) State as the school's tight ends coach before stints as the offensive line coach at U.S. Coast Guard Academy (1993) and Northeastern University in 1994. A native of Bronx, N.Y., Marrone was a sixth-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Raiders in 1986 and played two years in the NFL. He played with the Miami Dolphins in 1987 and with the Saints in 1989. He also had playing stints with Pittsburgh, Dallas and Minnesota before closing his career with the NFL Europe's London Monarchs from 1991-92. Marrone was a three-year letterman at Syracuse. He returned to Syracuse and graduated in 1991 with a degree in liberal arts.

Doug and his wife, Helen, have two daughters, Madeline and Annie, and a son, Mack.

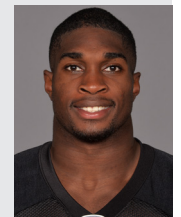

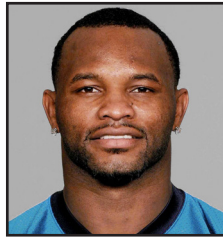

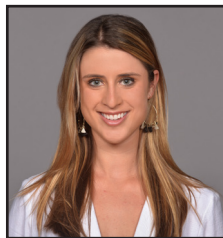
