JAGUARS FINISH 2002 SEASON WITH 6-10 RECORD

NEW ERA WILL BEGIN WITH NEW COACH AFTER TOM COUGHLIN'S EIGHTH AND FINAL SEASON

2002 IN REVIEW: The Jacksonville Jaguars finished the 2002 season with a 6-10 record, their third consecutive losing season. Following a 3-1 start — including victories over the New York Jets and Philadelphia Eagles that made the Jaguars one of the surprise teams in the league — the team lost nine of its final 12 games. The Jaguars have finished 6-10 each of the last two seasons, following a 7-9 campaign in 2000.

On December 30, the day after the season-ending loss at Indianapolis, Jaguars owner Wayne Weaver asked Tom Coughlin to step down as head coach. "Nine years ago we launched what has been called the most successful expansion franchise in NFL history, going to the playoffs four times in our first five years, two AFC Central championships and a whisper away twice from the Super Bowl in two AFC Championship games. The person most responsible for that was Tom Coughlin," said Weaver. "But there's a point in this business where you have to say we need innovative new ideas, new fresh approaches and we have to move in different directions. I'm committed to continuing to build a winning team and winning championships. That's always been our goal here, and I'm still very committed to that."

Weaver plans to hire a new head coach by the end of January, as well as a person in charge of the personnel department. "I'm optimistic that we're going to start rebuilding this football team," Weaver added. "But we have a lot of holes to fill. We have a lot of changes to make to get back to competing at the very highest level. Do I think we can do that? Absolutely."

In 2002, the Jaguars finished 3-5 at home, 3-5 on the road and 1-5 against division opponents in the AFC South. Eight of their 10 losses in 2002 were by a touchdown or less (their two biggest losses were to the Tennessee Titans by 9 and 18 points), with five of the other losses by a field goal or less. Jacksonville was 6-2 when scoring more than 20 points. Defensively, they allowed an average of only 19.7 points per game that was the fourth-lowest mark in the AFC. They scored an average of 26.3 points a game in their six wins and only 16.6 points in their 10 losses.

In the last six seasons, the Jaguars have the 10th-best record in the NFL, a 55-41 mark that is 10 games behind the Green Bay Packers. The Jaguars also are tied with the NFL's seventh-best home record, 38-18 dating back to 1996, and they are tied with the NFL's fourth-best road record with a 26-24 mark going back to the 1996 season.

Here's a summary of the 2002 Jacksonville Jaguars:

- Finished third in the AFC South Division with a 6-10 record
- Lost eight of the 10 games by a touchdown or less, five of them by a total of 10 points
- Were the only team in the NFL to face seven of the 12 playoffs teams during the 2002 regular season, and the only team to play nine of its 16 games against playoff teams
- The franchise's eight-year record in the regular season moved to 68-60
- Won three of eight games at ALLTEL Stadium. In eight years, they are 40-24 at home
- Won three games on the road. Over the last seven seasons, they are 26-24 on the road
- Won only 1 of 6 games in the new AFC South
- The offense ranked 25th in the NFL in yards gained (10th rushing, 28th passing)
- The defense ranked 20th in the NFL in yards allowed (25th rushing, 14th passing)
- Allowed only 315 points (19.7 per game), fourth lowest in the AFC
- Scored 328 points (20.5 per game)
- Were the only team with a losing record to score more points than they allowed
- P Chris Hanson was selected to his first Pro Bowl
- RB Fred Taylor started all 16 games and rushed for 1,314 yards, the second-highest season total in franchise history
- Are one of only 10 teams that have been in the playoffs at least four of the last seven seasons. Five teams have been in the playoffs five times since 1996 (Green Bay, Miami, Minnesota, San Francisco and Tampa Bay) and five teams have been in the playoffs four times since 1996 (Jacksonville, Denver, New England, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia).
- Averaged 56,277 in home attendance in 2002, and average 65,070 in eight seasons
- WR Jimmy Smith caught 80 passes for 1,027 yards and posted his seventh consecutive 1,000-yard season, tying for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history
- FS Marlon McCree made six interceptions and tied the team single-season record
- Will select eighth in the 2003 NFL Draft (April 26-27), their highest position since 1996, when they drafted LB Kevin Hardy with the second overall choice

For the second time, the Jaguars will host the other two Florida teams. In 1998, they won both intrastate games by 28-21 vs. the Miami Dolphins and 29-24 vs. the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The Jaguars will face the San Diego Chargers for the first time and will have played every team in the NFL at the end of the 2003 season. They will also have played 18 games against the Tennessee Titans (19 including playoffs), the most against any NFL team. However, they will not face the Pittsburgh Steelers or Cincinnati Bengals for the first time ever.

The preseason schedule is now set by the NFL office and will also be announced in the spring.

FINAL 2002 AFC SOUTH DIVISION STANDINGS: The Jaguars finished the 2002 regular season with a 6-10 record and in third place in the first year of the AFC South. Tennessee and Indianapolis both advanced to the playoffs.

ANATOMY OF 10 LOSSES: The Jaguars lost 10 games this season, with five of those losses by a total of 10 points. Here's a quick recap:

STATISTICAL ANOMOLY I: In the six seasons from 1997 to 2002, only four teams with losing records scored more points than they allowed, and the Jaguars did it three of the four times — each of the last three years, in fact.

STATISTICAL ANOMALY II: Despite finishing with a 6-10 record each of the last two seasons, the Jaguars allowed the third-fewest points in the AFC in that time. The Jaguars allowed only 609 points in 2001 and 2002 combined, more than only the Pittsburgh Steelers (23-8-1 record, 557 points allowed) and Miami Dolphins (20-12 record, 591 points allowed). The Oakland Raiders, for example, went 21-11 the last two years but allowed 631 points.

INJURY UPDATE: The Jaguars finished the season with eight players on injured reserve: CB Robert Bean (hamstring), DE Tony Brackens (knee), G/OT Derrick Chambers (neck), OL Aaron Koch (knee), FB Patrick Washington (knee), G/OT Zach Wiegert (knee), OT Maurice Williams (leg), and OT Chris Ziemann (knee). Brackens, Washington, Wiegert and Williams were starters and missed a total of 33 games.

LAST GAME: The Jaguars lost their season finale 20-13 to the Indianapolis Colts in the RCA Dome and finished their eighth season with a 6-10 record. Rookie David Garrard replaced an injured Mark Brunell and became the eighth player to start a game at quarterback for the Jaguars. He led the Jaguars to a 13-10 lead early in the fourth quarter before the Colts scored the final 10 points to win. On Jacksonville's final drive, Garrard led the Jaguars to Indianapolis' 38-yard line, but the game ended with an incomplete Hail Mary pass in the end zone that could have tied the score. Garrard completed 13 of 26 passes for 135 yards and ran for 44 yards. Fred Taylor rushed for 73 yards and scored the Jaguars' lone touchdown, and Danny Boyd kicked two field goals, as the Jaguars lost their season finale for the third straight year. The Jaguars' defense held Colts All-Pro WR Marvin Harrison to a season-low 28 yards on six receptions, and Peyton Manning threw for only 146 yards on 28 passes. Once again, penalties and mistakes doomed the Jaguars. A roughing the punter penalty on Elvis Joseph led to the Colts' first score in the final period, and personal fouls on John Henderson and Akin Ayodele preceded Indianapolis' winning touchdown. The Jaguars finished the season with a 3-5 record on the road and 1-5 in the new AFC South, snapping a streak of seven straight .500-or-better seasons in the division.

NOTES FROM THE COLTS GAME: The Jaguars and Colts opened and closed the season against each other, with the Colts winning both games by 3 and 7 points. ... The Jaguars' record in domes fell to 4-6. ... The Jaguars had more first downs (20 to 18), but fewer yards (266 to 272) and less time of possession (29:29 to 30:31). They converted 6 of 13 third downs (46 percent), while the Colts were 5 of 13 (38 percent). ... The Jaguars had one turnover and one takeaway and finished the season plus-12 (tied for second in the AFC). ... The Jaguars are 3-5 in games in which a quarterback made his first start as a Jaguar (Winners: Rob Johnson, Steve Matthews, Jay Fiedler; losers: Steve Beuerlein, Mark Brunell, Jamie Martin, Jonathan Quinn, David Garrard). They are 5-9 when the starting quarterback is not Mark Brunell. ... Fred Taylor led the team with 73 yards rushing on 15 carries (4.9 average). He finished the season with 1,314 yards rushing, the second-highest total in team history (record 1,399 in 2000) after playing in all 16 games for the first time. Taylor also totaled 1,722 total yards from scrimmage, setting a Jaguars single-season record (previous: 1,644 yards in 1998). ... Pete Mitchell led the team with four receptions for 32 yards, followed by Jimmy Smith with three catches for 35 yards. During the game, Smith moved into 18th place on the NFL's all-time receiving list, passing Hall of Famer Ozzie Newsome (662). But Smith finished the game with 664 career receptions and was passed by Indianapolis' Marvin Harrison (665). With 9,287 receiving yards, Smith also moved into the top 20 on the NFL's all-time receiving yardage list, passing Hall of Famer Raymond Berry (9,275). Smith also surpassed 1,000 yards receiving for the seventh consecutive season, tying for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history with Hall of Famer Lance Alworth. ... Chris Hanson punted three times for a 40.7-yard average, with no touchbacks, one inside the 20, and a long of 48. He had three kicks returned for 34 yards and a net average of 29.3. ... PK Danny Boyd scored seven points, on one extra point and two field goals (32, 23 yards). ... After going 38 consecutive games with at least one sack, the Jaguars failed to get a sack for the second straight game. Indianapolis got three sacks. ... SLB Danny Clark led the team with 14 tackles (5 solo), followed by WLB T.J. Slaughter with 10 tackles (4 solo). ... Every player saw action except G/C Drew Inzer and QB Kent Graham. The inactive players were: S James Boyd, LB Bobby Brooks, OT Dave Kadela, G/OT Leander Jordan, WR Jimmy Redmond, DE Javor Mills, DT Clenton Ballard and QB Mark Brunell (third QB).

JAGUARS HAVE SEVENTH-BEST HOME RECORD AND THIRD-BEST ROAD RECORD SINCE 1996: After the Jaguars went 7-1 at ALLTEL Stadium four times from 1996 to '99, they have a 38-18 record that is tied for the seventh-best mark at home since the start of the 1996 season. On the road, the Jaguars are tied with the fourth-best record and they are one of only seven NFL teams with a better-than-.500 mark on the road dating back to November 24, 1996.

DYNAMIC DUO: Defensive tackles John Henderson and Marcus Stroud, in only their first and second years in the league respectively, had the eighth-most sacks by a defensive line tandem in the AFC with 13 sacks in 2002. - LB Akin Ayodele (3rd round, 89th pick) — Played in every game, starting three times. Made 108 tackles (51 solo), with three sacks, two forced fumbles and an interception. Had a team-high 13 QB pressures and was second with 13 special teams tackles.
- QB David Garrard (4th round, 108th pick) — Started season's final game against Indianapolis and played in three others. Completed 23 of 46 passes for 231 yards and one touchdown. Showed quickness on the ground with 139 yards rushing and two TDs.
- TE Chris Luzar (4th round, 118th pick) — Played in 12 games, primarily as a blocker in short-yardage and goal-line situations and on special teams. Caught one pass for five yards. Groomed to be the Jaguars' tight end of the future.
- DT Clenton Ballard (6th round, 180th pick) — Inactive for all 16 games behind John Henderson, Marcus Stroud and Larry Smith.
- CB Steve Smith (7th round, 247th pick) — Elevated from the practice squad and played on special teams in the final four games.
- DE Javor Mills (undrafted) — Played in eight of last 10 games as reserve and on special teams. Made one tackle on defense, five on special teams.

JAGUARS AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS: The Jaguars finished 25th in the NFL in total offense (10th rushing, 28th passing), and they were 20th in defense (25th rushing and 14th passing). They allowed 315 points, the fourth-lowest total in the AFC. ... The offense was 14th in the AFC with 275 first downs and 15th in the conference in third-down percentage (71 of 207, 34.3 percent). The defense was 8th in allowing 324 first downs and ninth in the AFC in opponent's third-down conversions (83 of 212, 39.2 percent). ... The Jaguars finished plus-12 on the turnover table, tied for second in the AFC and tied for fifth in the NFL. ... The Jaguars were eighth in the AFC with a 54.9 percent rate on scoring touchdowns inside the red zone (28 of 51). Defensively, the Jaguars were fifth in the AFC with opponents scoring touchdowns on 49.1 percent of red zone opportunities (26 of 53). ... QB Mark Brunell was seventh in the AFC in passing with a 85.7 passer rating. His seven interceptions were the second-fewest in the conference and tied his career low as a starter. ... RB Stacey Mack tied for 12th in the AFC with 54 points off nine touchdowns, with RB Fred Taylor ranked 16th with 52 points (eight TDs, 2 X2) and WR Jimmy Smith tied for 22nd with 44 points (7 TDs, 1 X2). ... Taylor ranked seventh in the AFC with 1,314 rushing yards and Mack was 21st with 436 rushing yards. Taylor also was ninth in the AFC with 1,722 yards from scrimmage. ... WR Jimmy Smith ranked 11th in the AFC in receiving with 80 receptions, and his 1,027 receiving yards was tied for ninth. ... Chris Hanson led the AFC in both gross punting (44.2) and net punting (37.6). He had the most downed punts (18) in the NFL. ... Bobby Shaw was fourth in the AFC with a 12.4 average on punt returns. ... Elvis Joseph was 16th in the AFC with a 20.8 average on kickoff returns. ... S Marlon McCree tied for second in the AFC with six interceptions. ... John Henderson and Marcus Stroud both had 6.5 sacks and tied for 19th in the AFC.

Jacksonville opened the season with 10 new starters: C John Wade, RG Chris Naeole, WR Patrick Johnson, LDE Marco Coleman, DTs Larry Smith and Marcus Stroud, SLB Danny Clark, MLB Wali Rainer, WLB Eric Westmoreland and RCB Jason Craft (Zach Wiegert also moved from RG to LT). There were no rookies in the starting lineup on Opening Day for the first time since 1997, although Ayodele started three games at strongside linebacker, DT John Henderson started the last 13 games, and OT Mike Pearson started the last 11 games. ... A total of 12 players started every game during the 2002 season (six on offense and six on defense): WR Jimmy Smith, Gs Brad Meester and Chris Naeole, C John Wade, TE Kyle Brady, RB Fred Taylor, DE Marco Coleman, DT Marcus Stroud, LB Danny Clark, CBs Fernando Bryant and Jason Craft and S Marlon McCree.

Mark Brunell is 63-51 in 114 regular-season starts, 67-55 overall. He has won more games under head coach Tom Coughlin than any current NFL quarterback under his head coach. ... In 16 games, the offense used eight different starting line-up combinations and the defense used seven different starting combinations. ... The Jaguars had 16 plays of 30 or more yards this season. They had only 11 plays of 30-plus yards in 2001, 26 in 2000, 23 in 1999, 29 in 1998, 22 in 1997, 26 in 1996 and 12 in 1995. The Jaguars allowed 14 30-plus plays this season... Of the Jaguars' 268 completed passes, 138 were to wide receivers, 69 to tight ends and 61 to running backs. ... The Jaguars finished the year 18 for 26 on fourth-down conversions; their opponents were 11 for 20. ... On 51 drives inside the opponent's 20, the Jaguars scored 28 touchdowns and 17 field goals (and six drives with no points). Their opponents had 53 trips inside the red zone and came away with 26 touchdowns and 16 field goals (and 11 drives with no points). ... The longest streak of consecutive starts is held by G Brad Meester (48), followed by TE Kyle Brady (46) and WR Jimmy Smith (39). ... Five players have played in 100 or more games during their careers: DE Marco Coleman (171), WR Jimmy Smith (134), TE Kyle Brady (124), QB Mark Brunell (119) and TE Pete Mitchell (114). ... Coleman leads with 169 career starts, followed by Brady (118), Brunell (114) and Smith (106).
