**FANS SHOW SUPPORT:** The Jaguars did not have a home game blacked out in 2011 for the second consecutive season. The Jaguars have a current streak of 17 straight regular season games not blacked out dating back to the 2009 season finale.

## REBIRTH OF JAGUARS IN 2012 CLUB FINISHES 5-11 IN 2011

The Jacksonville Jaguars finished the 2011 season with a 5-11 record, 3-3 in the AFC South, and enter the offseason with a new owner and head coach. **Shahid Khan** was approved as the new owner of the Jaguars on December 14 and the transaction became official on January 4. **Wayne and Delores Weaver** and their partners were awarded the franchise on November 30, 1993 and spent the past 17 seasons leading the franchise.

Khan welcomed in a rebirth of the franchise with the hiring of **Mike Mularkey** as head coach on January 11, 2012. Mularkey has 18 years of NFL coaching experience including two seasons as a head coach and eight as an offensive coordinator.

**Jack Del Rio**, the Jaguars head coach for the past nine seasons, was dismissed on November 29. Defensive coordinator **Mel Tucker** served as interim head coach for the final five games and posted a 2-3 record. Tucker was retained by Mularkey as assistant head coach/defensive coordinator.

**NFL RUSHING TITLE FOR JONES-DREW:** RB **Maurice Jones-Drew** became the first player in franchise history to lead the NFL in rushing as he set a single-season franchise record in 2011 with 1,606 yards on 343 carries. Jones-Drew, who earned Pro Bowl and Associated Press first-team honors, accounted for an NFL-best and franchise-record 47.7 percent of the Jaguars offense in 2011. In addition, he established a single-season franchise record with 1,980 yards from scrimmage (1,606 rushing, 374 receiving), the second-most in the NFL in 2011.

**DEFENSE EMERGES IN 2011:** One of the highlights for the Jaguars in 2011 was the consistent play of the club's defense. The Jaguars finished sixth in the NFL in total defense (313.0-yard avg.), the highest ranking for the club since 2006 (2nd). The Jaguars ranked ninth in rushing (104.2) and eighth in passing (208.8) and were one of only four teams (Baltimore, Houston, Pittsburgh) to finish in the top nine in both rushing and passing defense.

Under the direction of defensive coordinator **Mel Tucker**, the Jaguars improved in nearly every statistical category from a year ago. The Jaguars finished the 2010 season ranked 28th in defense and the jump to sixth in 2011 was the second-largest improvement in the NFL. One of the main areas of focus for the club was eliminating the 'big play.' The Jaguars tied for third in the NFL in fewest plays of 20-plus yards allowed (51) and ranked second for fewest completions of 20-plus yards (43).

The unit ranked in the top 10 in 16 of the 17 weeks in 2011 despite using 14 different starting lineups in 16 games because of injuries. Only five players started all 16 games on defense and only eight players played in all 16 games. The linebacker duo of **Paul Posluszny** and **Daryl Smith** paced the Jaguars defense. Posluszny finished with a career-high 192 tackles, the second-most in team history for a season, and recorded double-digit tackles in 11 of 16 games. Smith, who holds the franchise record with 1,084 tackles, set the single-season franchise record with 15 tackles for loss. DE **Jeremy Mincey** led the team with a career-high eight sacks and 45 quarterback pressures.

**ROSTER TURNOVER DUE TO INJURIES:** The Jaguars led the NFL with 25 players on injured reserve including five starters. The defense was decimated by injuries in the second half of the season as the unit lost its starting cornerbacks (**Rashean Mathis**, **Derek Cox**), a starting linebacker (**Clint Session**) and starting defensive end (**Matt Roth**) in consecutive weeks to season-ending injuries. The Jaguars had 17 players on their roster at the end of the season who were not on the 53-man roster on Kickoff Weekend.

**GABBERT ERA BEGINS:** The Jaguars moved up in the first round to select QB **Blaine Gabbert** with the 10th overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft. Gabbert played in 15 games and started the last 14 games, the most starts by a rookie quarterback in team history. Gabbert, the youngest quarterback to start in 2011, was the youngest quarterback to start at least 13 games in NFL history.



## REBIRTH OF THE JAGUARS

### SHAHID KHAN TAKES OVER JAGUARS

Jaguars owner **Wayne Weaver** announced on November 29 he reached an agreement to sell the franchise to **Shahid Khan**, a successful Illinois businessman. The transaction was approved by the National Football League and the team owners on Dec. 14, and became official on Wednesday, Jan. 4.

In 1967, at the age of 16, Khan left his native Pakistan to attend the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He began working for Flex-N-Gate Corporation in 1970, while still an engineering student. Following his graduation from the University of Illinois in 1971 with a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Engineering, Mr. Khan continued to work at Flex-N-Gate until 1978, when he left the company to start a new venture.

Helped by a Small Business Administration loan, he began a new business designing and manufacturing innovative lightweight, continuous metal bumper systems, with no seams to corrode or rust. Today, nearly two-thirds of all North American pick-up trucks and sport utilities have bumper systems based on Khan's designs and are manufactured and supplied by a Flex-N-Gate company.

Khan purchased the original Flex-N-Gate company in 1980. Since then, the Flex-N-Gate Group has been consistently profitable while enjoying impressive growth under his active ownership and guidance. The Flex-N-Gate Group today employs more than 13,000 associates at 48 manufacturing plants and nine product development and engineering facilities in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Spain and Argentina, with annual sales exceeding \$3 billion.

### WEAVERS BID FAREWELL TO JAGUARS

The Jaguars season finale on January 1 against Indianapolis was the final game for **Wayne and Delores Weaver** as owners of the Jaguars. **Shahid Khan** assumed ownership of the team on Jan. 4. The Weavers and their partners were awarded the franchise on Nov. 30, 1993.

Here are additional notes on the Weavers:

- Wayne Weaver served on four NFL committees: Business Ventures, Investment, Finance, and Compensation.

- Delores Barr Weaver served on two NFL committees: NFL Charities and NFL Giving.

- The Weavers, through the Weaver Family Foundation, have contributed more than \$22.6 million to Jacksonville agencies and organizations since 1995.

- The Jaguars Foundation has awarded more than \$14.6 million in grants to area non-profit agencies since 1995.

- In the Weavers' 17 seasons the Jaguars had a regular season record of 138-134 and were 143-140 including postseason. The Jaguars had six playoff berths, two division titles, and 11 playoff games.

- Twenty Jaguars players have been named to the Pro Bowl.

- The Weavers were owners for 352 games in franchise history – including 69 pre-season, 272 regular season and 11 postseason – and the Weavers were at every game.

### MIKE MULARKEY NAMED HEAD COACH

**Mike Mularkey** was named head coach of the Jaguars on January 11, 2012. Mularkey has 18 years of NFL coaching experience including two seasons as a head coach and eight as an offensive coordinator. In five of the eight seasons he was a coordinator Mularkey's team went to the playoffs. Prior to Jacksonville, his previous coaching stops were at Tampa Bay, Pittsburgh, Buffalo, Miami and Atlanta. Mularkey is the fourth head coach in Jaguars history, including Mel Tucker who served as interim head coach for the final five games of the 2011 season.

A veteran of 27 years in the NFL, Mularkey played nine seasons as a tight end for the Minnesota Vikings and Pittsburgh Steelers. The Ft. Lauderdale, Florida native attended the University of Florida, where he played tight end before being drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 1983.

Mularkey, 50, spent the past four seasons (2008-11) as offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons, a team that advanced to the postseason in three of those four seasons. The Falcons produced a 43-21 mark in Mularkey's tenure, the fifth-best record in the NFL. The Falcons produced the top two single-season totals in team history for yards per game during Mularkey's tenure (2008, 2011).

In three of the four seasons under Mularkey, the Falcons offense produced a 3,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher in the same year. Under Mularkey's tutelage since 2008, quarterback Matt Ryan ranked seventh in passing yards (14,238) and sixth in touchdown passes (95), and had the league's fifth-lowest interception percentage (2.3).

Prior to joining the Falcons, Mularkey spent two seasons with the Miami Dolphins, as offensive coordinator in 2006 and tight ends coach in 2007.

Mularkey served as head coach of the Buffalo Bills from 2004-05, leading the club to a 14-18 overall record. In his first season he directed the Bills to their first winning season in five years with a 9-7 record as the club tallied wins in nine of its final 12 games. The 2004 campaign is the last time the Bills have posted a winning record.

From 1996-2003, Mularkey spent eight seasons on the Pittsburgh Steelers coaching staff under head coach Bill Cowher, including the last three years as offensive coordinator. Mularkey spent his first five seasons in Pittsburgh as the club's tight ends coach where he helped mold Mark Bruener into one of the best run-blocking tight ends in the league.

Mularkey entered the NFL coaching ranks in 1994 with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as quality control coach before he was promoted to tight ends coach the following season. Mularkey began his coaching career in 1993 at Concordia College where he oversaw the offensive line.

The three coaches Mularkey was exposed to as an NFL player were Bill Walsh, Bud Grant and Chuck Noll.

Drafted in the ninth round by the San Francisco 49ers in 1983, Mularkey played nine seasons in the NFL. He was released by the 49ers at the end of his first training camp and was signed by Minnesota. He spent the next six seasons with the Vikings before being signed as a Plan B free agent in 1989 by the Steelers, where he played for three seasons. Mularkey concluded his career with 102 receptions for 1,222 yards and nine touchdowns in 114 games played.

A graduate of Northeast High School in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, Mularkey played quarterback and earned a scholarship to the University of Florida. He was a three-year letterman at tight end for the Gators from 1979-82. He and his wife, Betsy, have two sons, Patrick, a strength assistant with the Jaguars, and Shane, a student at the University of North Carolina.

## TIDBITS ON MULARKEY

Under the direction of **Mike Mularkey**, the Atlanta Falcons ranked among the NFL's best the last four years (2008-11). Here's a look at where the Falcons ranked in the NFC and the NFL from 2008-11:

■ The 2011 Falcons set a single-season franchise record for yards per game (376.6), the 10th-highest in the NFL, and passing yards per game (262.0). For only the second time in team history, the Falcons had a 4,000-yard passer (**Matt Ryan**, 4,177), a 1,000-yard rusher (**Michael Turner**, 1,340) and 1,000-yard receiver (**Roddy White**, 1,296). In addition, White, Gonzalez and **Julio Jones** were one of only four trios to each have 800 or more receiving yards.

■ Ryan set single-season franchise marks in 2011 for passing yards (4,177) and 300-yard passing games (six) and ranked eighth in the NFL with a 92.2 passer rating. He threw for at least one touchdown in 15 straight games and concluded the regular season with 166 passes without being intercepted and 77 consecutive pass plays without being sacked.

■ Ryan has thrown for 29 and 28 touchdown passes the last two seasons, two of the four highest marks in team history. Only **Joe Flacco** (44) produced more wins than Ryan (43) in his first four seasons as a starter in NFL history.

■ During Mularkey's tenure wide receiver **Roddy White** posted an NFL-best 5,220 receiving yards and ranked second with 388 receptions. Running back **Michael Turner** rushed for the third-most yards per game (89.5 avg.) and the second-most touchdowns (50) during that span. After joining the Falcons in 2009, veteran tight end **Tony Gonzalez** caught 19 touchdown passes and recorded 233 receptions in three seasons.

■ Six offensive players were named to the Pro Bowl for the Falcons in 2010 including Ryan for the first time. Ryan established a team record with 357 completions and threw for 3,705 yards with 28 touchdowns and only nine interceptions. While White led the NFL in receptions with 115, Turner led the NFC with 1,389 rushing yards.

## NFL HEAD COACHES WITH PLAYING EXPERIENCE

**Mike Mularkey** had the fifth-longest playing tenure in the NFL among the league's 10 current head coaches who played in the NFL. Mularkey played nine seasons in the NFL with Minnesota (1983-88) and Pittsburgh (1989-91). Here are the 10 current head coaches with NFL playing experience:

## OFFENSIVE MAKEOVER

**Mike Mularkey** hired **Bob Bratkowski** as offensive coordinator for the Jaguars on January 13, 2012. Bratkowski brings 20 years of NFL coaching experience including 14 as an offensive coordinator. He previously worked with Mularkey on two coaching staffs, in Atlanta last season and in Pittsburgh from 1999-2000. Now in his 35th year in coaching, Bratkowski coached 14 seasons at the college level before entering the NFL in 1992.

**Greg Olson** was named assistant head coach/quarterbacks coach for the Jaguars on January 16, 2012. Olson has 25 years of coaching experience including 10 in the NFL and 15 at the collegiate level. His resume includes six seasons as an offensive coordinator in the NFL with Detroit (2005), St. Louis (2006-07) and Tampa Bay (2009-11).

## 2011 SEASON IN REVIEW

### 2012 NFL DRAFT

The Jaguars have the 7th pick in the 2012 NFL Draft. The NFL Draft will be a three-day event with the first round on Thursday, April 26 at 7:30 p.m. EST. Rounds 2-3 are scheduled for Friday, April 27 at 6:30 p.m. EST, and rounds 4-7 will be held on Saturday, April 28 at 10:00 a.m. EST.

The winner of the Super Bowl will select last and the other Super Bowl participant next-to-last. The Jaguars currently hold one pick in each of the first seven rounds including the seventh overall selection in the first round. Additionally, the Jaguars could be granted more picks in Rounds 3-7 as compensatory selections, based on net unrestricted free agency losses in 2011.

### TALE OF TWO HALVES

The Jaguars defense played consistently during the season which shows with their sixth-place ranking and proved to be dominant in three particular halves. Here's the list:

#### October 16 at Pittsburgh

- The Jaguars shut out the Steelers for the remainder of the game after allowing 17 points on their first three possessions.
- The Steelers totaled 226 yards and 10 first downs on their first three drives of the game. In their eight ensuing possessions, they managed only 144 yards, five first downs and were forced to punt six times.
- In the second half, the Jaguars outscored the Steelers 10-0 and held the Steelers to only 55 total yards and three first downs. The Steelers punted on all five possessions in the second half.

#### October 24 vs. Baltimore

- The Jaguars did not allow a first down in the first half and limited the Ravens to only 16 total yards on nine possessions. The Ravens punted eight times and had a lost fumble on their nine possessions. The Jaguars led 6-0 at the half on two field goals by **Josh Scobee**. The Ravens did not pick up a first down until 5:29 remaining in the third quarter.
- The Jaguars allowed only 16 total yards (15 rushing, 1 passing) in the first half, the fewest by an opponent in franchise history and fewest in Ravens history.
- The Jaguars defense did not allow a first down in the first half for the first time in team history. The last time the Ravens went without a first down in the first half was Sept. 18, 2005 at Tennessee.

#### November 27 vs. Houston

- The Jaguars trailed 20-10 at halftime and gave up 168 total yards (72 rushing, 96 passing) in the first half.
- In the second half, the Texans gained only 47 yards (31 passing, 16 rushing) and punted on seven of eight possessions including five three-and-outs. The Texans kneeled down on the final three plays to end the game.

### DEFENSE LOOMS LARGE IN WIN

Baltimore entered week seven averaging 367.2 yards per game and had scored 29 points in four of five games. The Jaguars limited the Ravens to 146 total yards (34 rushing, 112 passing) and only seven points. **The 146 yards were the second-fewest allowed in the NFL in 2011.** In 13 total possessions, the Ravens had nine three-and-outs, a lost fumble, an interception, a missed field goal and one touchdown (2:02 left in game).

### PRESSURING THE QUARTERBACK

The Jaguars finished with 31 sacks in 2011, eclipsing their total for 2010 (26). The 31 sacks were the most since 2007 (37). The Jaguars had at least two sacks in 10 games including a season-high five sacks on 11/13 at Indianapolis.

A franchise-record 16 different players combined for the club's 31 sacks with 20.5 sacks coming from the linemen. Only nine players had a sack in 2010.

DE **Jeremy Mincey** led the club with a career-high 8.0 sacks while DE **Matt Roth** and LB **Daryl Smith** ranked second with 3.5 sacks.

### ALL THREE PHASES CONTRIBUTE IN WIN

All three units for the Jaguars contributed to the win against Tampa Bay on 12/11 as the club had touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams for only the second time in team history (Nov. 1, 1998 at Baltimore).

**Maurice Jones-Drew** scored all four of the club's offensive touchdowns with two one-yard runs and two five-yard receptions. 2011 Pro Bowl special teamer **Montell Owens** forced two fumbles on punt returns. Second-year pro TE **Colin Cloherty** recovered one of the fumbles and returned it eight yards for a touchdown. With two minutes remaining in the first half, LB **Daryl Smith** sacked **Josh Freeman** and forced a fumble that was recovered by DT **Nate Collins** in the end zone.

### FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Five Jaguars scored their first career touchdown in a four-game stretch. Four of the five touchdowns were non-offensive scores.

- On the Texans' second play from scrimmage on 11/27 **Arian Foster** fumbled when hit by **Paul Posluszny**, and CB **Ashton Youboty** scooped the ball and scored from 38 yards out. It was Youboty's first start in only his second game with the Jaguars. He was placed on injured reserve on Dec. 26 after suffering a hamstring injury at Tennessee.

- First-year TE **Colin Cloherty**, playing his first game as a Jaguar and his fourth in the NFL, scooped up a fumble by Buccaneers punt returner **Preston Parker** in the second quarter on 12/11 and raced eight yards to the end zone for his first career touchdown. Cloherty was signed to the Jaguars 53-man roster on Dec. 9 after spending three weeks on the club's practice squad.

- DT **Nate Collins** recovered a **Josh Freeman** fumble in the end zone in the second quarter against Tampa Bay for his first career touchdown. Collins became only the second defensive lineman in team history to score a touchdown during the regular season, joining **Tony Brackens** who had a 16-yard interception return at Baltimore on November 28, 1999.

- TE **Zach Potter** scooped up a blocked punt on 12/15 at Atlanta and ran 46 yards for his first career score. It was tied for the second-longest blocked punt return for a score in the NFL since 1970. It was the Jaguars first blocked punt returned for a touchdown since Nov. 1, 1998 at Baltimore (Alvis Whitted, 24 yards).

- First-year WR **Chastin West** scored his first career touchdown on a 16-yard reception from **Blaire Gabbert** in the fourth quarter at Atlanta. He scored the Jaguars only touchdown in the season-finale against Indianapolis with a 23-yard catch from Gabbert in the first quarter.



## TEAM NOTES

### NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

The Jaguars had four non-offensive touchdowns in 2011, tied for the second-most in franchise history (6, 1999; 4, 1998 and 2007) and tied for the ninth-most in the NFL in 2011. All four touchdowns came in a four-game stretch.

The Jaguars had two fumble recoveries on special teams for scores in back-to-back games. Defensively, CB **Ashton Youboty** had a 38-yard fumble return for a score against Houston on 11/27 and DT **Nate Collins** recovered a fumble in the end zone on 12/11 vs. Tampa Bay.

### WINNING FORMULA

The Jaguars won five games in 2011 and there are several similarities in each of the five wins. Here's a look at some statistics from the Jaguars five wins:

- Averaged 148.4 rushing yards and 39.6 rushing attempts in the wins. The Jaguars outrushed their opponents in all five wins (163 vs. Tennessee; 132 vs. Baltimore; 141 at Indianapolis; 116 vs. Tampa Bay; 190 vs. Indianapolis).
- The Jaguars were even or won the turnover differential in each of the five wins. The Jaguars won the sack differential in four of the five wins.
- In 60 possessions, the defense allowed only nine scoring drives, forced 30 punts and 31 three-and-outs which included four interceptions and four fumbles.
- Held opponents under 85 rushing yards in four of the five wins (43, Tennessee; 34 Baltimore; 84 Indianapolis; 110 Tampa Bay; 56 Indianapolis). Opponents were held to only 245.6 total yards with Indianapolis' 298 yards in the season finale the most.
- Controlled the ball for at least 30:48 in all five wins (39:38 vs. Tennessee; 36:15 vs. Baltimore; 35:21 at Indianapolis; 32:49 vs. Tampa Bay; 30:48 vs. Indianapolis).
- RB **Maurice Jones-Drew** had at least 24 carries and 85 rushing yards in all five wins including three 100-yard rushing games. Jones-Drew averaged 26.2 carries and 114.0 rushing yards and had six touchdowns in the five wins.
- K **Josh Scobee** connected on 12 of 13 field goals in the wins including seven of eight from 40-plus yards.

### TOUGH START TO SEASON

The Jaguars finished the first half of their season with a 2-6 record. Seven of the Jaguars' first eight opponents finished the 2011 season at .500 or above including three division champions and the club had five straight games against 2011 playoff teams. The combined record of the Jaguars first eight opponents was 79-49 (61.7 pct.).

### SCORING BARRAGE

# MAURICE JONES-DREW

## JONES-DREW WINS NFL RUSHING TITLE

**Maurice Jones-Drew** became the first player in franchise history to lead the NFL in rushing as he finished with a franchise-record 1,606 yards on 343 carries (4.7 avg.). Jones-Drew won the rushing title by 242 yards, the second-largest margin since 1997 (Chris Johnson, 590 yards, 2009).

Jones-Drew joined Mark Brunell (4,367 passing yards, 1996) and Jimmy Smith (116 receptions, 1999) as the only players in franchise history to lead the NFL in one of the main statistical offensive categories. In the previous 16 seasons, the Jaguars never had a player finish in the top three in the NFL in rushing yards.

Jones-Drew was only the fifth player since 1990 to lead the NFL in rushing while his team finished with a record below .500. The 1,606 yards were the most rushing yards on a five-win team since 1978. He was only the fourth player since 1978 (16-game schedule) to win the NFL rushing title while his team finished last in passing offense (**George Rogers**, 1981; **Eric Dickerson**, 1986; **Jamal Lewis**, 2003). Jones-Drew and Lewis are the only players since 1995 to rush for 1,500-plus yards while his team finished last in passing offense.

Maurice Jones-Drew was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third straight year and was named to the Associated Press 2011 NFL All-Pro first-team. Jones-Drew was a finalist for the FedEx Ground Player of the Year.

Jones-Drew is the fourth player in franchise history to be voted to the Pro Bowl in three consecutive seasons, joining **Tony Boselli** (1996-2000), **Jimmy Smith** (1997-2001) and **Marcus Stroud** (2003-05).

## JONES-DREW AMONG NFL'S BEST

RB **Maurice Jones-Drew** finished the 2011 season with the seventh-most rushing yards by an active player with 6,854. Jones-Drew joined **Fred Taylor** (11,271) at Indianapolis on 11/13 as the only players in franchise history with 6,000 career rushing yards. Jones-Drew became the eighth active player to reach that milestone.

Taylor reached 6,000 career rushing yards in his 70th career game on his 1,309th carry. During that span, Taylor had 40 games with 20-plus carries and six games with 30-plus carries. To reach 6,000, Jones-Drew needed 1,311 carries with only 27 games with 20-plus carries and three games with 30 or more carries.

# BLAINE GABBERT

## GABBERT CONCLUDES 1ST SEASON

2011 first-round pick **Blaine Gabbert** was named the Jaguars starting quarterback on Sept. 21. Gabbert played in 15 games and started the last 14 completing 210 of 413 passes for 2,214 yards with 12 touchdowns and 11 interceptions for a 65.4 rating. He had touchdown pass in 10 of his 14 starts. His 14 starts were the most by a rookie quarterback in team history, surpassing Byron Leftwich (13 starts) in 2003.

Here are additional highlights on Gabbert:

- Concluded his rookie season on 1/1 vs. Indianapolis, completing 11 of 19 passes for 92 yards with one touchdown for an 88.0 passer rating. Hooked up with WR **Chastin West** for a 23-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter.
- Matched his career-high with two touchdown passes in the second consecutive game in the win over Tampa Bay on 12/11. Was 19 of 33 passing for 217 yards, the second-most yards of his career. Completed a 62-yard pass to TE **Mercedes Lewis** in the second quarter, the longest completion of his career.
- Tossed a career-high two touchdown passes on Monday night against San Diego and finished 19 of 33 passing for 195 yards for a 82.3 rating, his highest rating as a starter. Both of his touchdown passes came in the second quarter to **Maurice Jones-Drew** (nine yards) and **Cecil Shorts** (five yards). He was 11 of 15 passing for 139 yards for a 113.6 passer rating in the first half.
- Completed a career-high 22 of 41 passes for 210 yards at Cleveland on 11/20. Directed an 18-play, 92-yard drive that resulted in a **Maurice Jones-Drew** touchdown run in the second quarter. The 18-play drive was tied for the second-longest in team history for plays and was the longest of the season for plays, yards and time.
- Earned his first road and division win as a starter on 11/13 at Indianapolis, completing 14 of 21 passes for 118 yards with one touchdown and one interception for a 77.1 passer rating.
- Completed 9 of 20 passes for 93 yards against Baltimore on Monday night in week seven for his first career win as a starter. Engineered a 17-play scoring drive for the second consecutive week.
- Posted a career-high 91.5 passer rating in week five against Cincinnati as he completed 15 of 28 passes for 221 yards and one touchdown. The Bengals entered the game with the NFL's top-ranked defense. Hooked up with WR **Jason Hill** for a 74-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter.
- In his first career start at EverBank Field, he finished with 196 passing yards and one touchdown in week four against New Orleans. He completed 16 of 42 passes, tied for the most attempts by a rookie in franchise history.
- Made his first career start in week three at Carolina and finished 12 of 21 passing for 139 yards with one touchdown and one interception for a 73.3 rating. He recorded his first career touchdown pass on a 36-yard toss to WR **Mike Thomas** as time expired in the first half.
- Made NFL debut in week two against the Jets in the fourth quarter. In two offensive series against the Jets, he finished five of six passing for 52 yards for a 102.8 passer rating. He became the first rookie quarterback to see action for the Jaguars since Byron Leftwich in 2003.
- At age 22 (he turned 22 on Oct. 15), Gabbert is the youngest player on the Jaguars roster.

## WELCOME TO THE NFL!

The Jaguars inserted rookie **Blaine Gabbert** into the lineup in week three at Carolina. In 14 career starts, Gabbert faced seven of the top 12 defenses in the NFL based on the final rankings including a stretch of four straight games against defenses ranked in the top seven.

Gabbert's first career win as a starter came against the Baltimore Ravens, the third-ranked defense in the NFL.

LB **Daryl Smith** concluded his eighth season with the Jaguars after being selected in the second round of the 2004 draft. Smith has started 122 of 124 games and missed only three games due to injuries.

Smith owns the Jaguars record with 1,084 tackles including 166 in 2011, the second-most of his career. He led the team with a franchise-record 15 tackles for loss and added 3.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles and 11 quarterback pressures. Saying that fourth-year DE **Jeremy Mincey** had a breakout season in 2011 might be an understatement. Mincey produced career-best totals in tackles (101), sacks (8.0), forced fumbles (4), tackles for loss (7), passes defended (6) and quarterback pressures (45).

It was no secret the Jaguars wanted to upgrade their defense in 2011 and they found a safety who had plenty of experience playing in a top-10 defense. The Jaguars signed sixth-year pro **Dawan Landry** who spent the previous five seasons with the Baltimore Ravens.

Landry, a teammate of Jaguars LB **Daryl Smith** at Georgia Tech, registered a career-best 115 tackles in his first season with the Jaguars. He was the only defensive back to start all 16 games.

### MAKING AN IMPACT

The Jaguars added five unrestricted free agents to the defensive side of the ball and DB **Dwight Lowery** was acquired in a trade with the New York Jets. The six new players on defense combined for eight interceptions, 10 sacks, five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and 485 tackles

■ **LB Paul Posluszny** started all 16 games for only the second time in his career and led the team with a career-high 192 tackles, the second-most in franchise history for a season. Added two sacks, two interceptions, nine tackles for loss and one forced fumble.

■ **DE Matt Roth** started nine games and missed the final six games with a concussion. Tied for second on the team with 3.5 sacks and added 13 quarterback pressures, four tackles for loss and one fumble recovery.

■ **S Dawan Landry** was the only member of the secondary to start all 16 games. Posted a career-high 115 tackles, third-most on the team, and had two interceptions, five passes defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

■ **CB Drew Coleman** played all 16 games at nickel back and made four starts and tied for the team-lead with two interceptions. Finished with two sacks and two forced fumbles on defense and one on special teams. Sealed the Jaguars victory over Baltimore on Monday Night Football with a fourth-quarter interception of **Joe Flacco**.

■ **DB Dwight Lowery** played in 13 games with 11 starts and was inactive for three of the last four games with a shoulder injury. Finished with 47 tackles, two interceptions, one sack, 10 passes defensed and one fumble recovery.

■ **LB Clint Session** played in nine games with six starts before suffering a head injury on 11/20 at Cleveland. He was placed on injured reserve on Nov. 25. In nine games, he produced 44 tackles, one sack, three tackles for loss and one forced fumble.

Third-year CB **William Middleton** was inserted into the starting lineup to replace Mathis and he started two games before he was placed on injured reserve with a knee injury on Dec. 3. 2011 undrafted rookie **Kevin Rutland** started three games at CB and third-year pro **Morgan Trent** started the final two games. Sixth-year pro **Ashton Youboty**, who was signed on Nov. 15, started five games but was placed on injured reserve on Dec. 26. Starting safety **Dwight Lowery** was inactive (shoulder) in three of the last four games and saw action for only one snap on 12/15 at Atlanta.

In addition, the Jaguars were without the services of DT **Terrance Knighton** for three games with an ankle injury.
