JAGUARS FINISH 5-11; WILL DRAFT 8TH IN 2009

SEVERAL PLAYERS PRODUCE CAREER-HIGH NUMBERS

2008 IN REVIEW: The Jacksonville Jaguars finished under .500 for only the sixth time in the franchise's history. The Jaguars concluded the season with 15 players on injured reserve including seven starters (CB Rashean Mathis, G Vince Manuwai, G/OT Maurice Williams, RB Fred Taylor, FB/RB Greg Jones, LB Daryl Smith, WR Jerry Porter) and three key special teams performers (P Adam Podlesh, CB Scott Starks, DB Chad Nkang). Only four players started all 16 games for the club (LT Khalif Barnes, RT Tony Pashos, QB David Garrard, DB Brian Williams).

Jack Del Rio completed his sixth season as head coach with a regular season record of 50-46. Jaguars owner Wayne Weaver announced on December 23 that James Harris, the team's vice president/player personnel since 2003, resigned effective at the end of the season. Weaver promoted Gene Smith to the position of general manager. Smith has served in several roles in the Jaguars personnel department since 1994.

2008 TEAM/INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS

- The Jaguars defense ranked 17th in the NFL (330.9) and tied for 13th in rushing defense (106.8). The offense ranked 20th in the NFL (319.1) and ranked 15th in passing offense (208.3).
- The Jaguars led the NFL in fourth down attempts for the second consecutive season as they converted 14 of 24 attempts (58.3).
- RB/KR Maurice Jones-Drew led the team in rushing yards (824), touchdowns (14), yards from scrimmage (1,389) and all-purpose yards (1,739). Jones-Drew finished with a career-high 62 receptions for 565 yards, the most receiving yards among all NFL running backs, and finished tied for sixth in the NFL with 14 touchdowns (12 rushing, 2 receiving).
- QB David Garrard registered career-high passing numbers in his second season as the starter. Garrard completed 335 of 535 passes for 3,620 yards with 15 TDs/13 INTs for a 81.7 passer rating. Garrard recorded his first two 300-yard passing games including a career-high 329 yards against Indianapolis on 12/18. In addition, Garrard had a career-high 73 rushes for 322 yards. The 73 rushes were the second-most by a Jaguars quarterback in team history (80, Mark Brunell, 1996).
- WR Matt Jones led the team with a career-high 65 receptions for 761 yards along with two touchdowns and two 100-yard receiving games in only 12 games.
- RB Fred Taylor moved into 16th place in NFL history for most rushing yards with 11,271. Taylor started the first 13 games but was placed on injured reserve for the first time in his career after injuring his thumb on 12/7 at Chicago. Took over the franchise record with his 70th career touchdown.
- The Jaguars had five selections in the 2008 draft and four of the players finished the season on the roster. First round pick Derrick Harvey played in all 16 games with nine starts and led the team with 29 quarterback pressures along with 3.5 sacks.
- S Gerald Sensabaugh and CB Rashean Mathis tied for the team-lead with four interceptions apiece. Mathis returned two of the interceptions for touchdowns. LB Mike Peterson led the team with 139 tackles while LB Daryl Smith finished with 130 tackles despite missing the final two games.

2009 SCHEDULE STORYLINES

- Features four teams that qualified for the 2008 postseason (Indianapolis, Tennessee, Miami, Arizona), all at home. In addition, the Jaguars will play 10 games against teams that finished .500 or better in 2008.
- The Jaguars face two non-division foes for the second consecutive season in Buffalo and Cleveland. The Jaguars will travel to Cleveland while the Bills will make their second straight trip to Jacksonville. The Jaguars and Bills will meet for the third consecutive season and the fifth time in the last six seasons.
- The Jaguars will travel to San Francisco for the first time. The Jaguars own a 2-0 record against the 49ers with home wins in 1999 and 2005.
- The Jaguars will play New England for the fifth time in seven seasons under head coach Jack Del Rio including postseason games.
- St. Louis will visit Jacksonville for the first time. The Rams are the only NFL team to never play a regular season game in Jacksonville.
- The Jaguars will play two games on the West Coast for the first time since 2004 as they travel to San Francisco and Seattle. The Jaguars finished 1-1 in 2004 with a 34-21 loss at San Diego and a 13-6 win in the regular season finale at Oakland.

2009 NFL DRAFT

The 2009 NFL Draft will be held on April 25-26. The Jaguars own the eighth pick.

The Jaguars selected defensive end Derrick Harvey with the eighth overall pick in 2008. The Jaguars traded their first round pick (26th) along with two third round picks (71st, 89th) and a fourth round pick (125th) to Baltimore to move up to select Harvey. The Jaguars have traded their original first round pick the last two seasons.

If the Jaguars select 8th, it would tie for the fourth-highest draft pick in team history. Tony Boselli was selected with the second overall pick in the club's inaugural draft in 1995 and Kevin Hardy was the second overall pick in the 1996 draft. Byron Leftwich was the seventh overall pick in the 2003 draft.

JAGUARS ON PRIME TIME

The Jacksonville Jaguars' 2008 season was highlighted by three nationally televised prime time games on NBC, ESPN and NFL Network. In addition, the Jaguars had 11 games televised on CBS and two on FOX. **It marked the first time in franchise history the club was featured on five different networks.** The Jaguars' schedule featured a Sunday Night game at home on NBC against Pittsburgh on October 5, a Monday Night Game on ESPN on December 1 at Houston and a Thursday Night home game against Indianapolis on NFL Network on December 18. The Jaguars' three nationally televised prime times were tied for the third-most in team history (4, 1999 and 2000) and most since 2000.

GENE SMITH PROMOTED TO GENERAL MANAGER

Jacksonville Jaguars owner Wayne Weaver announced on December 23 that James Harris, the team's vice president/player personnel since 2003, resigned effective at the end of the regular season. Harris, a veteran of more than 30 years in the NFL, is known throughout the league as "Shack." Weaver promoted Gene Smith to the position of general manager.

Smith, 44, has served in several roles in the Jaguars' personnel department since 1994. One of 15 current staff members who joined the organization in its first year, Smith came to Jacksonville as the team's scouting representative for the BLESTO scouting organization. He became a Jaguars college scout in 1996, and was promoted in 2000 to director of college scouting. Last January, Smith was promoted to the position of executive director/college and pro personnel.

In three other promotions Terry McDonough was named Director, Player Personnel, Tim Mingey was named Assistant Director, College Personnel, and Andy Dengler was named National Scout.

RB Fred Taylor	Injured his thumb on 12/7 at Chicago and was placed on injured reserve for the first time in his career. Missed the final three games. Ranks 16th in NFL history with 11,271 rushing yards. Has played in 140 games with 136 starts.
LB Daryl Smith	Injured his groin on 12/14 against Green Bay and was placed on injured reserve two days later. Missed the final two games. Ranked second on the team with 130 tackles along with 2.5 sacks, four tackles for loss and one forced fumble. Has started 74 of 76 games and surpassed 100 tackles in four straight seasons.
CB Rashean Mathis	Suffered knee injury at Houston on 12/1 in Monday night game and was placed on injured reserve on 12/5. Missed the final four games. Tied for team lead with four interceptions, two returned for touchdowns.
FB/RB Greg Jones	Placed on injured reserve on 12/10 after injuring his ankle on 12/1 at Houston. Missed the final four games.
G Vince Manuwai	Injured his knee in the season-opener at Tennessee and was placed on injured reserve for the final 15 games. Has played in 79 games with 78 starts in six seasons.
G/OT Maurice Williams	Earned the starting RG spot in training camp before suffering a biceps injury in the season-opener at Tennessee. Was placed on injured reserve on 9/10 and missed the final 15 games. Has played in 101 games with 96 starts.
WR Jerry Porter	Missed all of training camp and the preseason following hamstring surgery. Started six of 10 games this season after signing as an unrestricted free agent. Injured his groin at Chicago on 12/7 and missed the final three games.
CB Scott Starks	Missed the first two games with a pectoral injury and then suffered a torn ACL in week three at Indianapolis on 9/21. Was placed on injured reserve on 9/24 and missed the final 13 games. Played key role on special teams with 44 career tackles.
DB Chad Nkang	Placed on injured reserve after suffering a shoulder injury at Chicago and missed the final three games. He started the season on the PUP list after injuring his wrist in the offseason and was activated on 10/25. Set a franchise record with 30 special teams tackles as a rookie in 2007 and had seven tackles in seven games in 2008.
DT John Henderson	Was inactive at Detroit on 11/9 and against Tennessee on 11/16 with knee injury.
P Adam Podlesh	Suffered a knee injury on 11/23 vs. Minnesota and was placed on injured reserve two days later and missed the final five games. Was selected in the fourth round of the 2007 draft. Returned to the Jaguars on 9/17 after recovering from surgery last season. Suffered a broken hand in pregame warmups against Cleveland 10/26 and was placed on injured reserve on 10/30 following surgery. Has played in 154 games with 150 starts including 87 starts for the Jaguars.
G Chris Naeole	Third-year pro suffered a toe injury on 12/1 at Houston and missed the final four games. Has played in 25 games since joining the club as a rookie free agent in 2005.
DT Tony McDaniel	Was inactive with a groin injury on 9/21 at Indianapolis and 9/28 vs. Houston.
LB Justin Durant	Missed all of the preseason and the first six games after suffering a biceps injury in training camp. Returned to the starting lineup on 10/26 vs. Cleveland. Has started 129 games for the Jaguars since being selected in the second round of the 2000 draft.
C Brad Meester	Left in the fourth quarter at Indianapolis on 9/21 with a knee contusion and missed next three games. The 2007 first round pick led the team as a rookie with five interceptions.

INSIDE THE STAT SHEET

- 17 different players had receptions for the Jaguars, tying for the most since 2004. Nine different players had touchdown receptions for the second consecutive season.
- The Jaguars led the NFL in fourth down attempts for the second consecutive season. The Jaguars converted 14 of 24 attempts (58.3 pct.). The Jaguars led the NFL in 2007 with 33 fourth down attempts and 19 conversions. The 33 attempts were the most in the NFL since 1996 when New England had 34 attempts.
- The Jaguars ranked tied for 13th in the NFL with 42 completions of 20-plus yards (5 TDs).
- In 16 possessions to start the second half, the Jaguars finished tied for fifth in the NFL with 42 points scored (6 TDs). On the other side, the defense allowed 30 points (3 TDs, 3 FGs).
- The Jaguars own a 33-6 record since 2003 when they score 20-plus points and control the ball for 30 minutes or more including a 4-0 mark in 2008. Defensively, the Jaguars have won 12 of their last 14 games when recording two or more interceptions.
- The Jaguars had an interception in seven of the last nine games.
- The Jaguars scored 25 of their 32 offensive touchdowns on first or second down.
- The defense forced 42 three-and-out drives by their opponents, tied for the 13th-most in the NFL.
- The Jaguars controlled the ball more than their opponents in nine of 16 games. They had a 30-plus time of possession in 10 of 16 games. In addition, they ranked tied for 11th in the NFL with 30 10-play drives.
- In 45 trips to the red zone, the Jaguars scored 34 times (25 TDs, 9 FGs).
- 18 of the Jaguars' 29 sacks came in the second half.
- The defense forced 47 negative rushes (non-kneeldowns), tied for the fifth-most in the NFL.
- Opposing offense's converted 41.0 pct. on third down (82 of 200)
- The Jaguars had their first eight games decided by seven points or less and 10 games overall. The Jaguars ranked ninth in the NFL with an average margin of defeat of 9.55 points.
- The defense allowed only 65 points following 24 turnovers, the 11th-fewest points allowed following turnovers.
- The Jaguars finished tied for 10th in the NFL with 198 plays of 10-plus yards (46 rushes, 152 completions).
- The Jaguars had only 39 negative rushes for minus-67 yards, the sixth fewest in the NFL.
- Opponents converted 45.5 percent of fourth down attempts (5 of 11).
- Opponents converted 15 of 25 (60.0 pct.) third-and-one plays.

JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS HEAD COACH JACK DEL RIO

JACK DEL RIO COMPLETES SIXTH SEASON: Jack Del Rio completed his sixth season as the Jaguars' head coach with a regular season record of 50-46. Del Rio was named to the post on January 17, 2003, becoming the second head coach in Jaguars history. In 2007, the Jaguars posted an 11-5 regular season record to earn the second playoff berth in three years, in addition to the franchise's first playoff win since the 1999 season. The Jaguars defense has thrived under the guidance of Del Rio as they rank sixth in the NFL over the past six seasons in yards allowed (305.2), fifth in points allowed (19.0) while the offense is fourth in rushing yards (131.1) and tied for third in fewest turnovers (138).

Del Rio completed his 23rd year in the NFL, his 12th as a coach. Del Rio spent 11 years as an NFL linebacker and had a stand-out college career at the University of Southern California. He previously coached in New Orleans (1997-98), Baltimore (1999-2001), and Carolina (2002). He was the Panthers' defensive coordinator, and in his only season with the club the defense improved from 31st in the NFL to second, the biggest one-season defensive improvement in NFL history. Del Rio was the linebackers coach for three seasons in Baltimore, where the Ravens' defense also ranked second each season. He helped the team win Super Bowl XXXV over the New York Giants and coached the Ravens' talented linebackers, overseeing the development of Peter Boulware, Jamie Sharper and Ray Lewis, the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in 2000 and the MVP of Super Bowl XXXV. Prior to coaching, Del Rio played 11 seasons in the NFL, with New Orleans (1985-86), Kansas City (1987-88), Dallas (1989-1991) and Minnesota (1992-95), playing in the Pro Bowl following the 1994 season.

Del Rio was a starter at linebacker for Southern California (1981-84), where he earned All-America honors, was a runner-up for the Lombardi Award and co-MVP of the 1985 Rose Bowl. Del Rio is one of three NFL head coaches (Jeff Fisher, Mike Holmgren) who graduated from USC. Del Rio has learned from some of the best coaches in all of football. He was recruited to USC and played for John Robinson, and in the NFL he played under Bum Phillips, Jim Mora, Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Green. As an assistant coach, he has worked for Hall of Famer Mike Ditka and Super Bowl winner Brian Billick, as well as Super Bowl participant John Fox. Among other notable coaches Del Rio has worked with are Dom Capers, Tony Dungy, Dave Wannstedt, Monte Kiffin, Mike Tice, Tom Moore, Norv Turner and Butch Davis. Drafted by baseball's Toronto Blue Jays, Del Rio batted .340 while playing catcher on USC's baseball team in 1983 and 1984 with future stars Randy Johnson and Mark McGwire. He was a third-round choice by the New Orleans Saints in 1985 and was named to the NFL's All-Rookie team.

NFL HEAD COACHES WITH NFL PLAYING EXPERIENCE: Jack Del Rio has the second-longest playing tenure in the NFL among current head coaches. Del Rio played 11 seasons in the NFL with New Orleans (1985-86), Kansas City (1987-88), Dallas (1989-91) and Minnesota (1992-95). LEADING BACK: RB/KR Maurice Jones-Drew led the team in rushing yards (824), rushes (197), touchdowns (14), yards from scrimmage (1,389) and all-purpose yards (1,739). **Jones-Drew led all NFL running backs in receiving yards, ranked second in receptions, and ranked second on the team with a career-high 62 receptions for 565 yards and two touchdowns.** In addition, he ranked tied for third in the AFC with 74 first downs made (47 rush, 27 rec.).

JONES-DREW ENJOYS THE END ZONE: Maurice Jones-Drew finished tied for sixth in the NFL, third in the AFC, with 14 touchdowns (12 rushing, 2 receiving). Additional notes include:

- Recorded multiple touchdowns in eight career games and the Jaguars own a 6-2 record in those games. He recorded multiple touchdowns in four games in 2008. He scored two rushing touchdowns against Tennessee on 11/16 and tied his career-high with three total touchdowns at Detroit on 11/9 as he recorded a career-high three rushing touchdowns.

- Ranked second in franchise history with 34 career rushing touchdowns in 47 games.

- Became the first player in franchise history to have at least nine rushing touchdowns in three consecutive seasons.

WHERE MAURICE JONES-DREW RANKS IN JAGUARS HISTORY:

- Averages 83.8 yards from scrimmage and 127.7 all-purpose yards per games in 47 career games.

- Ranked third with 40 career touchdowns and 25 of his 40 touchdowns have come after November 1.

- First player in franchise history to have 740-plus rushing yards and 1,100 yards from scrimmage in each of his first three seasons.

- Fourth in career all-purpose yards (6,003) and fifth in career yards from scrimmage (3,941). The 3,941 yards from scrimmage rank 10th in the NFL since 2006. Surpassed 5,000 career all-purpose yards at Detroit on 11/6, marking only the fourth player in franchise history to accomplish the feat, and he went over the 6,000-yard mark in the season finale at Baltimore.

- First among all Jaguars running backs with 4.8 career average per rush.

- Jones-Drew, who has the most receptions by a Jaguar since 2006, has a streak of 35 consecutive games with a reception.

- Was the only player in the NFL with 2,000-plus combined yards in 2006 and 2007.** He has recorded seven career 100-yard rushing games and eight games with 200-plus all-purpose yards. He ranked fifth in the AFC in 2008 with 1,739 combined yards.

- Was one of six running backs selected in the first two rounds of the 2006 draft. **Jones-Drew, the 60th overall pick, leads the group in several statistical categories including 40 total touchdowns, 3,941 yards from scrimmage and 6,003 total yards.**

- Owens four of the franchise's top eight marks for all-purpose yards including a team-record 303 against Indianapolis on 12/10/06. Finished with 233 all-purpose yards on 11/23 against Minnesota, the fourth-highest total of his career. Owns the top two marks for single-season all-purpose yards with 2,250 in 2006 and 2,014 in 2007 and his 1,739 yards in 2008 ranks fourth in team history.

- Tied with Fred Taylor for most consecutive games scoring a touchdown with eight and holds club record with eight consecutive games with a rushing touchdown.

- Ranked third with 2,533 career rushing yards and second behind Taylor for most rushing yards by a rookie with 941 in 2006.

CAREER DAY IN THE PASSING GAME: Maurice Jones-Drew finished with a career-high nine receptions and 113 receiving yards on 11/23 against Minnesota and became the first running back in franchise history to finish with 100-plus receiving yards. Jones-Drew tied Fred Taylor (9 rec., 9/20/98 vs. Baltimore) for the most receptions by a running back in franchise history. Jones-Drew was one of seven running backs in 2008 with 100-plus receiving yards in a game and one of only four running backs with nine or more receptions in a game.

JONES FINISHES SEASON WITH CAREER-HIGH NUMBERS:

WR Matt Jones led the team with a career-high 65 receptions for 761 yards and two touchdowns in 12 games including two 100-yard receiving games. Jones missed the final three games of the season after being suspended for three games for violating the NFL Substance Abuse Policy. Jones missed the Tennessee game on 11/16 with a thigh injury.

■ Had five-plus receptions in nine of his 12 games and seven-plus receptions in four of his last seven games. 47 of his 65 receptions resulted in first downs.

■ Led the team in receiving yards in six of the first eight games. Recorded four of his five highest career reception totals in 2008.

■ Recorded his second 100-yard receiving game of the season at Houston on 12/1 as he tied his career-high with eight receptions for 104 yards, his sixth career 100-yard receiving game.

■ Registered eight receptions in three career games including on 10/26 against Cleveland where he finished with eight receptions for 117 yards and one touchdown.

■ Career totals include 166 receptions for 2,153 yards and 15 touchdowns in 54 games (15 starts). Has 15 career touchdown receptions, four in each of his first three seasons, and ranks fourth in franchise history with a 13.0 average per reception.

■ Played four seasons with the Jaguars after being selected with the 18th overall pick in 2005. He played quarterback at Arkansas for four seasons before converting to wide receiver in the NFL.

■ Was one of six receivers selected in the first round of the 2005 draft. Ranks third among the group with 15 touchdowns and fourth with 166 career receptions.

GARRARD LEADS THE WAY: In the five Jaguars wins in 2008, David Garrard completed 103 of 146 passes (70.5 pct.) for 1,155 yards with six touchdowns and only one interception for a 104.7 passer rating. Garrard had a 100-plus passer rating in four of the five wins including a 105.4 rating on 12/14 against Green Bay.

300-YARD PASSING GAMES: QB David Garrard did not record a 300-yard passing day in his first 50 games in the NFL, but had two 300-yard passing games in the final six games of the season. Garrard threw for a career-high 329 yards against Indianapolis on 12/18, finishing 28 of 41 with one touchdown and one interception for a 90.4 rating. He reached the 300-yard mark for the first time against Minnesota on 11/23, completing 27 of 45 passes for 317 yards. He is the fourth quarterback in franchise history to have two 300-yard passing games in a single season (Mark Brunell, Byron Leftwich, Quinn Gray).

DUAL THREAT: David Garrard set a career-high for rushing in 2008 with 322 yards on 73 rushes. His previous highs were 250 yards in 2006 and 49 rushes in 2007. The 73 rushes were the second-most by a Jaguars quarterback in team history (80, Mark Brunell, 1996). He had at least four rushes in 10 of 16 games.

DAVID GARRARD TIDBITS

Quarterback David Garrard completed his second season as the starter in 2008. Garrard has career totals of 856 for 1,399 for 9,672 yards with 51 TDs/29 INTs for a 85.4 passer rating. Garrard, a fourth-round pick in 2002, has played in 56 games with 46 starts over seven seasons and owns a 24-22 career record. Here are additional notes:

■ Recorded career-best passing numbers in 2008 with 335 completions on 535 attempts for 3,620 yards with 15 touchdowns and 13 interceptions. Garrard ranked third on the team with a career-high 73 rushes for 322 yards and two touchdowns. Garrard had a 60-plus completion percentage or higher in 11 of the 16 games including five games with a 70-plus completion percentage.

■ Garrard led the club to a 9-3 mark in 12 starts in 2007 and helped the club earn its first postseason win since 1999.

■ Has thrown for multiple touchdowns in 14 career games including four games in 2008. The Jaguars own a 11-3 record in those games.

■ Moved into third place in franchise history for attempts (535) in a single season, second in completions (335) and third in passing yards (3,620).

■ Recorded 30 or more attempts in 11 of the last 13 games.

■ Is the first Jaguars quarterback since Mark Brunell in 2000 to start all 16 games in a season. Garrard has played against 26 different NFL teams. The only teams Garrard has never played against are Dallas, New Orleans, St. Louis, Seattle and Washington.

■ Ranks second in franchise history in completions (856) and passing yards (9,672) and is tied for second in touchdown passes (51).

■ Led the Jaguars to two comeback wins in 2008. Garrard engineered the offense twice to set up game-winning field goals by Josh Scobee in both games.

■ Set the franchise single-season record for highest passer rating (102.2) and highest completion percentage (64.0) in 2007.

■ Finished with the second lowest interception percentage in a season in 2007 for any quarterback in NFL history with 300+ attempts at 0.92 (3 interceptions in 325 attempts). The lowest was 0.90 by Steve DeBerg in 1990 (4 interceptions in 444 attempts).

■ Holds the team record at eight consecutive games without throwing an interception.

■ Recorded a 100-plus rating in a career-high seven games in 2007.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Fred Taylor finished with 12 carries for 55 yards on 12/7 at Chicago and moved into 16th place in NFL history for most rushing yards with 11,271. Taylor surpassed O.J. Simpson (11,236) in 17th place and Corey Dillon (11,241) in 16th place. Taylor needs 82 yards to surpass John Riggins (11,352) in 15th place.

THE SKINNY ON FRED TAYLOR:

- First round pick (9th overall) of the Jaguars in 1998. He is the only player who remains on the Jaguars roster from 1998. He has played in seven of the club's 11 playoff games. Jaguars own a 76-64 record with Taylor in the lineup.
- Played against all 31 NFL teams and recorded a 100-yard rushing game against 24 different NFL teams.
- Started the first 13 games in 2008 for the sixth time in the last seven seasons. Was placed on injured reserve for the first time in his career after injuring his thumb on 12/7 at Chicago.
- Ranks 16th in NFL history for most rushing yards with career totals of 2,428 carries for 11,271 yards and 62 rushing touchdowns in 140 games. He has led the Jaguars in rushing in eight of the last 10 seasons.
- Jaguars career, single-season and single-game rushing leader. Owns the top seven single-season club marks for rushing yards.
- Taylor scored his 70th career touchdown at Houston on 12/1 to set a franchise record, surpassing Jimmy Smith (69 TDs). Taylor became the 78th player in NFL history with 70-plus career touchdowns and only the 14th active player.
- Holds the franchise record for yards from scrimmage (13,632) and all-purpose yards and ranks 27th in NFL history. Needs 67 yards to surpass Andre Reed (13,698) in 26th place.
- Has started 136 of 140 games in 11 seasons, the second-most in team history in both categories.
- Averages 111.3 rushing yards per game when he has 20 or more carries (7,237 total in 65 games).
- Jaguars are 15-5 when Taylor has 25-plus attempts.
- Taylor surpassed 11,000 career rushing yards at Detroit on 11/9. Taylor finished with 80 yards on 18 carries and added one reception for 17 yards. He accomplished the feat in his 136th career game.
- Has recorded 22 of his last 24 100-yard rushing games on October 24 or later and 37 of his 48 career 100-yard games have been recorded on October 24 or later. In 2007, Taylor had five 100-yard rushing games and they came in consecutive weeks from Nov. 25 to Dec. 23.
- Averages 95.6 rushing yards in 36 career December games with a 5.3 average per rush.
- Averages 102.6 average in 15 career games played indoors.

2008 ROOKIE REVIEW: The Jaguars had five total selections in the 2008 draft, the fewest in franchise history, and four of the players finished the season on the roster. The Jaguars concluded the season with nine rookies on their roster. The Jaguars moved up via trade in the first two rounds and selected Florida defensive end Derrick Harvey and Auburn defensive end Quentin Groves. The Jaguars traded their first round pick (26th), two third round picks (71st, 89th) and a fourth round pick (125th) to Baltimore to select Harvey at eighth overall. It was the second time in franchise history and second consecutive year the Jaguars traded their original first round pick. Here's a look at the nine rookies on the club's roster:

■ DE Derrick Harvey (1st round, 8th pick) — Played in all 16 games with nine starts, the most by a rookie defensive end in franchise history and the most by a Jaguars defensive lineman since John Henderson started 13 games in 2002. Led the team with 29 quarterback pressures along with 35 tackles, 3.5 sacks, one interception and three tackles for loss. Recorded his first career sacks at Detroit on 11/9 as he split a sack with Daryl Smith in the third quarter and recorded a sack of Drew Stanton in the fourth quarter. Registered two sacks in season finale at Baltimore along with season-high nine tackles.

■ DE Quentin Groves (2nd round, 52nd pick) — Played in all 16 games and finished with 17 tackles, 2.5 sacks, 11 quarterback pressures, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble. Registered first career sack on 9/14 vs. Buffalo and forced a fumble that was recovered by the Jaguars.

■ LB Thomas Williams (5th round, 155th pick) — Spent the entire season on the active roster and played in six games. Saw action on special teams and finished with three tackles and one forced fumble.

■ RB Chauncey Washington (7th round, 213th pick) — Played in six games and saw action as running back and on special teams. Finished with four rushes for nine yards along with one reception for nine yards. Added three special teams tackles.

■ CB Brian Witherspoon (Undrafted) — Saw action in 15 games as the club's primary returner and served as the club's nickel back for the final four games. Set the franchise single-season record for kickoff returns (52) and kickoff return yards (1,250). Finished with a 11.3 punt return average and a 24.0 kickoff return average. Had seven tackles along with two special teams tackles.

■ C/G Drew Miller (Undrafted) — Spent the first eight weeks on the practice squad before being activated to the active roster on October 30. Did not see action in a regular season game. Played in all four preseason games at center and guard.

■ QB Paul Smith (Undrafted) — Spent the first 16 weeks on the practice squad before being activated to the active roster for the season-finale at Baltimore. Was inactive as the third quarterback against the Ravens.

■ DB Kennard Cox (Practice squad-Green Bay) — Signed with the Jaguars on December 8 off of the Green Bay Packers practice squad. Originally selected by Buffalo in the seventh round of the 2008 draft and was waived after the preseason. Played in final two games for the Jaguars on special teams.

■ WR Nate Hughes (Free agent) — Spent five weeks on the practice squad before being signed to the active roster on December 22. Originally signed by Cleveland as an undrafted free agent out of Alcorn State. Was inactive for season-finale at Baltimore.

UNDRAFTED FREE AGENT MAKES MARK WITH JAGUARS: Rookie free agent Brian Witherspoon, known to his teammates as 'Spoony,' was the club's primary returner in 2008. Witherspoon, 5-10, 175, was one of only two undrafted free agents to make the club's opening day roster. He was a first-team All-America selection in football and track at Stillman and also lettered on the baseball team. He was named the Southern Intercollegiate Conference Male Track Athlete of the Year as a senior. Witherspoon set the club's single-season record for kickoff returns and kickoff return yards. Here's the list:

MARCEDES LEWIS POSTS CAREER-HIGH NUMBERS: Tight end Mercedes Lewis finished with a career-high 41 receptions for 489 yards and two touchdowns. Lewis was the first Jaguars tight end since Kyle Brady (43, 2002) to have 40-plus receptions in a season and had the most receiving yards by a tight end since 2000 (Brady, 729). Additional notes on Lewis include:

■ Recorded a career-high six receptions for 55 yards on 12/18 against Indianapolis, his fifth game in 2008 with four-plus receptions.

■ Finished with four receptions for 43 yards at Chicago on 12/7 with a long of 27 yards.

■ Tied his career-high with 64 receiving yards on four receptions at Detroit on 11/9. He hooked up with David Garrard for a 29-yard reception in the third quarter, the third-longest reception of his career.

■ Set his career-high of 64 yards earlier this season at Denver on 10/12 which included a career-long 30-yard touchdown reception. The 30-yard reception at Denver was tied for the longest scoring reception by a Jaguar this season.

■ Had a reception of 19-plus yards in eight of the last 12 games.

NORTHCUTT POSTS BACK-TO-BACK 100-YARD GAMES: Dennis Northcutt ranked third on the team with 44 receptions for 545 yards and two touchdowns. Northcutt finished the season with 18 receptions for 263 yards (14.6 avg.) and two touchdowns in the last three games. Northcutt recorded 100-plus receiving yards in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. Both of his touchdowns came on the opening drive of the game. The Jaguars had only four receivers active the last three games due to injuries.

- Was inserted into the starting lineup for the first time in 2008 against Green Bay on 12/14 and finished with five receptions for 127 yards and one touchdown. The 127 yards were the second-most of his career (165, 10/6/02 vs. Baltimore) and most by a Jaguar this season.
- Had three receptions of 30-plus yards against the Packers including a 30-yard touchdown reception on the club's opening drive. He hooked up with David Garrard on a 41-yard reception in the fourth quarter, the longest pass play by the Jaguars this season.
- Registered eight receptions for 101 yards and one touchdown against Indianapolis on 12/18 including receptions of 28 and 24 yards.
- For the second consecutive game, he scored on the club's opening drive as he hooked up with Garrard for a 28-yard scoring play against the Colts.
- His eight receptions tied for the second-most of his career and were the most since he had nine on September 26, 2004 at the New York Giants as a member of the Cleveland Browns.

JAGUARS LOOK FOR WALKER TO PRODUCE: Second-year pro Mike Walker saw the first action of his NFL career in 2008 as he played in nine games with one start. Walker, a third-round pick in 2007, missed his entire rookie season with a knee injury. Walker finished with 16 receptions for 217 yards. He produced career-high receiving numbers against Pittsburgh on 10/5 as he led the team with six receptions for 107 yards, the first 100-yard receiving game of the season for the Jaguars. Walker had receptions of 32, 18, 18, 16, 14 and 9 yards against the Steelers and finished with a 17.8 average per reception. Walker had five receptions for 46 yards against Houston on 9/28. Walker, 6-2, 208, played four seasons at Central Florida with Denver's Brandon Marshall. He played in all four preseason games in 2007 and finished with four receptions for 33 yards before re-aggravating a knee injury in the preseason finale against Washington.

SENSABAUGH LEADS DEFENSE WITH FOUR INTERCEPTIONS: Safety Gerald Sensabaugh recorded career-high numbers in 2008 with 82 tackles (70 solo) and four interceptions. The four interceptions were tied with Rashean Mathis for the team-lead. Additional notes include:

- Returned to action in 2008 after missing the final 14 games of 2007 with a shoulder injury.
- Has started 24 of 50 games in four seasons including a career-high 13 starts in 2008. Was fifth-round pick in 2005 draft.
- Intercepted Vince Young in the season-opener at Tennessee in the second quarter and returned it 23 yards to the Titans five-yard line to set up the Jaguars' only touchdown. In the third quarter, he partially blocked a Craig Hentrich punt.
- On 10/12 at Denver, he picked off Jay Cutler on a deep pass intended for Brandon Marshall in the first quarter.
- Blocked a Jason Hanson field goal at Detroit on 11/9, the first blocked field goal by the Jaguars since 2005.
- Recorded his fourth interception of the season at Chicago on 12/7.

JAGUARS LOSE RASHEAN MATHIS FOR THE SEASON Jaguars cornerback and team captain Rashean Mathis was placed on injured reserve on 12/5 after suffering a knee injury at Houston on 12/1. Mathis tied for the team-lead with four interceptions and also recovered a fumble in 12 games. Mathis returned two of the four interceptions for touchdowns, one of six NFL players to have two or more interception returns for touchdowns in 2008.

- Mathis, who became the first Jaguars cornerback to be voted to the Pro Bowl in 2006, holds the franchise records with 25 career interceptions and three interceptions returned for touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the NFL from 2004-08 with 23 interceptions and tied for seventh with three returned for touchdowns.
- Stepped in front of a Sage Rosenfels pass at Houston in the first quarter for his first career interception against the Texans.
- Picked off Peyton Manning on 9/21 at Indianapolis and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown, then intercepted Ben Roethlisberger against Pittsburgh on 10/5 on the opening possession and returned it 72 yards for the second-longest return in team history.
- Recovered a fumble in week six at Denver for his franchise-record 26th career takeaway.
- Picked off Daunte Culpepper on his first pass at Detroit on 11/9.

DARYL SMITH HAS SOLID SEASON; PLACED ON IR: Daryl Smith suffered a groin injury on 12/14 against Green Bay and was placed on injured reserve two days later. Smith ranked second on the team with 130 tackles along with 2.5 sacks. Smith added one forced fumble, four tackles for loss, seven quarterback pressures and four passes defensed.

- The 2004 second round pick has started 74 of 76 games and surpassed 100 tackles in four straight seasons. Has 612 career tackles (386 solo), 13 sacks, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, three interceptions, 27 tackles for loss and 20 passes defensed.
- Assumed the middle linebacker job the last two seasons with injuries to Mike Peterson and started in the middle again in 2008.
- Led the team with 12 tackles at Chicago on 12/7 including one for a loss. On 11/9 at Detroit, he led the team with 13 tackles, 1.5 sacks and two tackles for loss.
- Finished with 16 tackles, one pass defensed and one forced fumble against Houston on 9/28, the third-most tackles of his career.

SMALL SCHOOL SUCCESS

Four of the Jaguars' top defensive players along with rookie Brian Witherspoon arrived in the NFL via small schools and not the traditional Division I powerhouses.

Cornerback Rashean Mathis intercepted 31 passes in four seasons at Bethune-Cookman, and was selected in the second round of the 2003 draft. Drayton Florence, a 2008 unrestricted free agent signee, was also drafted in the second round in 2003 after earning unanimous All-America honors at Tuskegee. Defensive end Paul Spicer was named Conference Player of the Year as a senior at Saginaw Valley State before working his way to a starting role for the Jaguars via Seattle and Detroit. Linebacker Justin Durant was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year for three consecutive seasons at Hampton and was a second round pick by the Jaguars in 2007. Witherspoon played football, baseball and track at Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

JOSH SCOBEE LEADS KICKING GAME: Josh Scobee made 19 of 25 field goals (76.0 pct.), including two game-winners, and led the team with 90 points. In addition, he made a career-high four field goals from 50-plus yards and tied for 12th in the NFL with 10 touchbacks.

- Hit 11 consecutive field goals before having one blocked against Cleveland on 10/26.
- Tied the franchise-record with a 53-yard field goal against the Browns on 10/26 in the fourth quarter.
- Connected from 37 yards in overtime against Houston on 9/28 and hit from 51 yards at Indianapolis in week three with four seconds remaining.
- Had a 50-yard field goal against Buffalo in week two.
- Has been successful on 79.4 percent (104 of 131) of his career field goal attempts. Ranks second in franchise history with 471 points.

WILLIAMS FILLS MULTIPLE ROLES IN SECONDARY: Brian Williams showed his versatility in 2008 as he started the first five games at strong safety and the last 11 games at left cornerback. Williams led the secondary with 89 tackles (78 solo) and tied for third on the team with two interceptions. Williams picked off Ryan Fitzpatrick in the third quarter at Cincinnati on 11/2 and recorded his first interception of the season in week three at Indianapolis against Peyton Manning. He was signed as an unrestricted free agent from Minnesota in 2006 and has played in 107 career games with 93 starts in seven seasons. He has 18 career interceptions, six as a Jaguar, and 94 career passes defended.

“BIG HEN” CLOGS UP THE MIDDLE: Defensive tackle John Henderson started 14 games in 2008, missing two games with a knee injury. Henderson has recorded 503 tackles (386 solo), 26.0 sacks, 137 quarterback pressures, 37 tackles for loss, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 109 games. Additional notes on Henderson include:

- Henderson, the ninth overall pick in 2002, earned his first Pro Bowl appearance in 2004 and returned in 2006. He was the highest-drafted defensive lineman ever by the Jaguars and second defensive tackle drafted overall in 2002.
- In 2004, Henderson posted a career-high 98 tackles and 40 quarterback pressures along with 5.5 sacks.
- Ranks fifth in team history with 26.0 sacks in 109 career games including two sacks in 2008. Has three career multi-sack games. Has registered at least two sacks in all seven seasons.
- Missed a game for the first time in his career at Denver on 9/16/07 with a head injury, snapping a streak of 82 consecutive games played.

SPICER TAKES LONG ROUTE TO THE NFL: DE Paul Spicer completed his ninth NFL season, but his NFL career started as an undrafted rookie with the Seattle Seahawks in 1998. Spicer was released by Seattle in training camp and spent portions of the 1998 season with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League.

- Played two games with Detroit in 1999 before signing with the Jaguars prior to the 2000 regular season.
- Has started 63 of 115 games with the Jaguars and ranks tied for third in team history with 28.5 career sacks.
- Tied for second on the team in 2008 with 3.5 sacks and ranked third on the team with 21 quarterback pressures.
- Recorded a sack/forced fumble against Cleveland on 10/26 and had a sack on 11/23 against Minnesota.
- Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2007 and finished the regular season with a sack in three of the last five games. The 7.5 sacks tied for the most of his career (7.5, 2005) and ranked tied for ninth in the AFC.

PETERSON LEADS CLUB IN TACKLES: Linebacker Mike Peterson led the team with 139 tackles, including 15 in the season-finale at Baltimore, and ranks second in franchise history with 837 tackles. Peterson has registered 100-plus tackles in five of six seasons with the Jaguars and eight of 10 NFL seasons. Peterson missed 17 games from 2006-07 with injuries, but started 10 of 15 games in 2008. Peterson recorded a season-high 16 tackles (12 solo) against Cleveland on 10/26 and had 15 tackles against Buffalo in week two. Peterson, who has started 127 games in nine NFL seasons, missed six regular season games and two postseason games in 2007 with a broken hand. He started the first five games in 2006 before suffering a torn pectoral muscle and was placed on injured reserve. He has career totals of 1,365 tackles, 19.5 sacks, 15 interceptions, five forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries.

HAYWARD LEADS CLUB WITH 4.5 SACKS: DE Reggie Hayward led the club with 4.5 sacks and ranked second with 22 quarterback pressures as he played in all 16 games for the first time since 2004. Hayward missed 19 games from 2006-07 with injuries. Hayward recorded a sack of Aaron Rodgers on 12/14 against Green Bay and also had a sack/forced fumble that was recovered by the Packers. Hayward finished his eighth NFL season and has 38.5 career sacks, the most of any Jaguar. He signed with the Jaguars in 2005 as an unrestricted free agent after spending four seasons with Denver where he recorded 22.0 sacks. He registered a team-leading 8.5 sacks in his first season with the Jaguars in 2005.

SPECIAL TEAMS HIGHLIGHTS

- Josh Scobee hit game-winning field goals in back-to-back games. Scobee connected from 37 yards in overtime against Houston on 9/28 and hit from 51 yards at Indianapolis in week three with four seconds remaining. Scobee has connected on 15 of 17 field goals including a career-high four of four from 50-plus yards.
- Scobee executed a successful onside kick in the third quarter against Buffalo in week two.
- Third-year pro Montell Owens ranked second on the team with 18 special teams tackles and scored two touchdowns on special teams. Owens took a direct snap against Houston on 9/28 on fourth down and raced 41 yards for his first career touchdown. On 11/2 at Cincinnati, Chad Nkang forced a fumble on Glenn Holt on a kickoff and Owens recovered and scored the Jaguars' first touchdown on an 18-yard return.
- Gerald Sensabaugh blocked a Jason Hanson field goal in the second quarter at Detroit on 11/9. It was the first blocked field goal by the Jaguars since Rashean Mathis did it on October 2, 2005 against Denver. Sensabaugh partially blocked a Craig Hentrich punt in the season-opener at Tennessee.
- Pierson Prioleau led the team with 22 special teams tackles (16 solo).

5 STRAIGHT WINS AGAINST AFC WEST: The Jaguars own a 14-7 mark against AFC West opponents including a winning record against all four teams in the division. The Jaguars have won five consecutive games against AFC West opponents including a 24-17 win at Denver on 10/12.

JAGUARS IMPROVED TO 4-2 BEFORE BYE WEEK UNDER DEL RIO The Jaguars own an 9-5 mark in the game before the open date in 14 seasons, including a 4-2 mark under head coach Jack Del Rio. For the second consecutive season, the Jaguars had their open date the week after playing at Denver as they won 24-17 on 10/12 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

JAGUARS OPENED WITH AFC HEAVY SCHEDULE: The Jaguars opened the season with eight consecutive games against AFC opponents including three of the first four against AFC South opponents. The Jaguars finished 3-5 in the first half of the season before beating Detroit, 38-14, in their first NFC game on 11/9.

2008 POSITION ANALYSIS: Here is a position-by-position breakdown of the Jaguars on their roster following the season finale:

QUARTERBACKS (3) — **David Garrard**, a fourth-round pick in 2002, completed his second season as the starter after emerging as one of the NFL's top signal-callers in 2007. Garrard owns a 24-22 record as a starter with 51 touchdown passes and an 85.4 career passer rating. He threw for a career-high 3,620 yards in 2008, the third-most in franchise history. **Cleo Lemon** signed as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason after spending the last two seasons in Miami. Lemon started seven of nine games for the Dolphins in 2007 and saw his first action as a Jaguar on 11/9 at Detroit. Undrafted rookie **Paul Smith** was activated from the practice squad prior to the season-finale at Baltimore.

RUNNING BACKS (4) — The Jaguars lost their starting running back (**Fred Taylor**) and starting fullback (**Greg Jones**) to injuries in 2008. Taylor was placed on injured reserve for the first time in his career after injuring his thumb at Chicago on 12/7. Taylor has the third-most rushing yards (11,271) by an active NFL running back and ranks 16th all-time. He is the only player who remains on the Jaguars roster from 1998. He led the team in 2007 with 223 carries for 1,202 yards and was the only NFL player to have 100-plus rushing yards in five consecutive games as he played in his first Pro Bowl. Jones was placed on injured reserve on 12/10 after injuring his ankle on 12/1 at Houston. Third-year pro **Maurice Jones-Drew**, who also serves as kickoff returner, ranks second in the NFL with 40 touchdowns (34 rushing, 4 receiving, 2 returns) the last three seasons. Jones-Drew led the team in rushing yards (824), rushes (197), touchdowns (14), yards from scrimmage (1,389) and all-purpose yards (1,739) in 2008. **Montell Owens** stepped in during Jones' absence. Owens also excels on special teams, earning a roster spot as an undrafted free agent in 2006 from Maine. Owens had two touchdowns on special teams and scored on a two-yard run on 12/18 against Indianapolis. Seventh-round pick **Chauncey Washington** earned a roster spot after leading the team in rushing in the preseason with 39 carries for 115 yards. The Jaguars re-signed **Alvin Pearman** on December 11, a former fourth round pick of the club in the 2005 draft.

WIDE RECEIVERS (5) — Nine-year veteran **Dennis Northcutt** completed his second season in Jacksonville after signing as an unrestricted free agent from Cleveland. Northcutt, who also sees action as a punt returner, ranked third on the team with 44 receptions for 545 yards along with two touchdowns. Northcutt recorded 100-plus receiving yards in back-to-back games. The Jaguars used their 2005 first-round pick to select **Matt Jones** and he has recorded 166 career receptions for 2,153 yards (13.0 avg.) with 15 touchdowns in four seasons. Jones led the team with 65 receptions for 761 yards in the first 13 games (missed 11/16 Tennessee with thigh injury), but he missed the final three games of the season after being suspended for violating the NFL Substance Abuse Policy. Former first-round pick **Reggie Williams** had a franchise single-season record 10 touchdown receptions in 2007, surpassing the previous high of eight set by Jimmy Smith in three different seasons (1998, 2000, 2001). Williams led the club with three receiving touchdowns in 2008. The Jaguars drafted **Mike Walker** (3rd round) in 2007 and he missed his entire rookie season with a knee injury. Walker finished with 16 receptions for 217 yards in nine games including his first career 100-yard receiving game against Pittsburgh on 10/5. Walker started against Tennessee on 11/16 after missing four games with a knee injury. **Troy Williamson**, the seventh overall pick in 2005, was acquired via a trade with Minnesota on February 29. He started 22 games with the Vikings and has 84 career receptions for 1,097 yards and four touchdowns. Rookie **Nate Hughes** was activated from the practice squad prior to the season-finale at Baltimore.

TIGHT ENDS (4) — Former first-round pick **Mercedes Lewis** emerged as a threat in the passing game in 2007 and he ranked fourth on the team in 2008 with a career-high 41 receptions for 489 yards and two touchdowns. Lewis was the 28th overall pick in 2006 but was hampered by injuries throughout his rookie season. Second-year pro **Greg Estandia** and fifth-year pro **Richard Angulo** returned after seeing significant action in 2007. Sixth-year pro **George Wrihster III** was activated off PUP and saw action in the last four games. He has career totals of 96 receptions for 885 yards and nine touchdowns.

ROSTER TIDBITS

- Rookie free agent Brian Witherspoon was coached by former Buffalo Bills 1985 first-round pick Derrick Burroughs in 2007 at Stillman College. Burroughs suffered a career-ending spinal cord injury in 1989 and was paralyzed for 24 hours. Burroughs is currently an assistant coach at Alabama State.
- CB Drayton Florence played five seasons in San Diego after being selected in the second round of the 2003 draft out of Tuskegee. Florence grew up in Ocala, Fla., and his parents reside in Jacksonville.
- The Jaguars have six team captains and each player wore a 'C' on his jersey. QB David Garrard, RB Fred Taylor, LB Daryl Smith, DE Paul Spicer, CB Rashean Mathis and LB Mike Peterson were named captains. Head coach Jack Del Rio also announced the formation of a Player Leadership Council that meets with him and serves a leadership role on the team. C Brad Meester, OT Tony Pashos, RB/KR Maurice Jones-Drew, TE Mercedes Lewis and RB Montell Owens along with the six captains were named to the Player Leadership Council. The captains' initiative originated with the NFL Player Advisory Council that was established in 2007 by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell in conjunction with the NFL Players Association.
- DT John Henderson owns and operates a clothing store in Jacksonville, For Big Men by Big Hen. Henderson also owns an AAU basketball team in his hometown of Nashville, Tenn.
- RB/KR Maurice Jones-Drew has worn a Superman tee-shirt underneath his jersey since he was 10-years old playing Pop Warner football in Pinole, California and now has a Superman logo on the sole of his cleats. A lady watching one of his games said, 'he looked like Superman the way he ran past the defenders.' Jones-Drew's late grandfather, Maurice Jones, bought him a shirt and he has continued the ritual in the NFL.
- Head Coach Jack Del Rio played catcher on the USC baseball team and was teammates with Randy Johnson and Mark McGwire. He also grew up with Seattle Mariners manager Don Wakamatsu.
- OT Tony Pashos speaks three languages: Greek, English and German. His parents were Greek immigrants.
- DT Derek Landri was teammates with RB/KR Maurice Jones-Drew at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. The duo never lost a game as Landri played defensive tackle and blocked for Jones-Drew as an offensive tackle.
- De La Salle High School in Concord, California has five former players on NFL rosters including two with the Jaguars in Landri and Jones-Drew. Other NFL players from De La Salle include Amani Toomer (New York Giants), Demetrius Williams (Baltimore), D.J. Williams (Denver) and Matt Gutierrez (New England). Dillard High School (Ft. Lauderdale) and Tustin (California) lead all high schools with six former players currently in the NFL.
- The Jaguars have eight players from California on their current roster, the most of any state. RB Maurice Jones-Drew (Antioch), OT Khalif Barnes (Spring Valley), TE Greg Estandia (Moorpark), DT Derek Landri (Huntington Beach), TE Mercedes Lewis (Lakewood), WR/KR Dennis Northcutt (Los Angeles), RB Chauncey Washington (Torrance) and LB Thomas Williams (Vacaville) all hail from California.
- RB Montell Owens earned a roster spot as a rookie free agent in 2006 from Maine, becoming only the fifth NFL player to play at Maine. Owens sent a highlight tape to Boston College, but the coaches thought he would be better off playing Division I-AA. Boston College sent the tape to Maine where they gave Owens his only scholarship offer. Owens is a musician in his spare time and is an accomplished trumpet player. Resigned in January 2009.
- DL Rob Meier was the number one overall pick of the 2000 CFL Draft by British Columbia. Meier is one of two foreign born players on the roster (Reggie Williams, Landstuhl, Germany).

OFFENSIVE LINE (9) — The Jaguars offensive line had a different look in 2008. Eight-year veteran **Dennis Norman** and second-year pro **Uche Nwaneri** were inserted into the lineup at the guard positions to replace injured veterans Vince Manuwai, Maurice Williams and Chris Naeole (hand). Both Manuwai (knee) and Williams (biceps) suffered season-ending injuries in the season-opener at Tennessee and were placed on injured reserve. Naeole injured his hand in pregame warmups prior to the Cleveland game on 10/26 and was placed on injured reserve. Norman has started at least one game for the Jaguars the last three seasons including the first six games at center this season. Center **Brad Meester** returned to the starting lineup the last 10 games after missing the first six games with a biceps injury suffered in training camp. **Tony Pashos** anchored the right tackle spot where he started 31 games in two seasons in Jacksonville after signing as an unrestricted free agent from Baltimore in 2007. **Khalif Barnes** started 57 games at left tackle since being drafted in the second round of the 2005 draft. The Jaguars activated rookie free agent guard/center **Drew Miller** from the practice squad on October 30. Third-year pro **Stefan Rodgers** and was activated from the practice squad prior to the season-finale at Baltimore. The Jaguars signed **OT Jordan Black** and **G Cameron Stephenson** during the final week of the regular season.

DEFENSIVE LINE (10) — Ted Monachino was promoted to defensive line coach in 2008 after spending previous two seasons as assistant defensive line coach. The defensive line was anchored by seventh-year pro and two-time Pro Bowl selection **John Henderson** who has 26 career sacks in 109 games. **Rob Meier** has the ability to play every position on the line and he started 15 games at tackle alongside Henderson. Meier ranks third in franchise history with 138 games played and has 21.5 career sacks. Defensive end **Paul Spicer** has produced 21.5 sacks the last four seasons, including a team-leading 7.5 sacks along with 41 quarterback pressures in 2007. **Reggie Hayward** has 38.5 career sacks including a team-high 4.5 sacks in 2008. He recorded a team-leading 8.5 sacks in his first season with the Jaguars in 2005. The Jaguars added speed off the edge in the 2008 draft with first-round pick **Derrick Harvey** and second-round pick **Quentin Groves**. Harvey, the eighth overall pick, had 20.5 sacks in three seasons at Florida and finished with 3.5 sacks as a rookie including two sacks in the season-finale at Baltimore. Groves recorded 26 sacks in four seasons at Auburn and recorded a sack/forced fumble against Buffalo on 9/14 and split a sack against Pittsburgh 10/5. **Derek Landri**, who played in 13 games as a rookie at tackle, saw action in the defensive tackle rotation and recorded two sacks. **Jeremy Mincey** was activated off the PUP list on 11/25 and registered a sack in the season-finale at Baltimore. First-year pro **Mkristo Bruce** was activated off the practice squad on 12/5. The Jaguars signed third-year pro **DT Atiyah Ellison** off San Francisco's practice squad on December 10.

LINEBACKERS (6) — The Jaguars lost their leading tackler Daryl Smith to a groin injury suffered in the Green Bay game on 12/14 and he was placed on injured reserve two days later. Smith ranked second on the team with 130 tackles and tied for third with 2.5 sacks. Second-year pro **Justin Durant** finished with a career-high 113 tackles and he started on the outside with third-year pro **Clint Ingram**. Ingram has started 34 games since being selected in the third round of the 2006 draft. **Mike Peterson** returned from back-to-back season-ending injuries and started in the middle for the final two games. Peterson suffered a torn pectoral muscle in 2006 and missed the final six games in 2007 with a broken hand. He led the team with 139 tackles (88 solo). Third-year pro **Brian Iwuh** excels on special teams and added depth in the middle. The Jaguars selected USC linebacker **Thomas Williams** in the fifth round of last year's draft and he saw extensive time on special teams. Second-year pro **Tim Shaw** was signed on November 26.

DEFENSIVE BACKS (8) — Sixth-year pro **Rashean Mathis**, regarded as one of the NFL's top cornerbacks, was placed on injured reserve on 12/5 after suffering a knee injury at Houston on 12/1. Mathis holds the franchise record with 25 career interceptions including two interceptions returned for touchdowns in 2008. **Drayton Florence**, an Ocala native, moved into the starting lineup the last four games to replace Mathis. Florence signed with the Jaguars in the offseason as an unrestricted free agent from San Diego. **Brian Williams**, who started opposite Florence, has started 92 games in seven seasons and registered 18 career interceptions. 2007 first-round pick **Reggie Nelson** has emerged as one of the NFL's top young safeties, setting a team rookie record with five interceptions as he started 15 of 16 games. **Gerald Sensabaugh** returned from a season-ending shoulder injury in 2007 that forced him to miss the final 14 regular season games and both post-season games. Sensabaugh has made 24 starts at strong safety in four seasons including the last 13 games. Depth at safety was provided by veteran **Pierson Prioleau**. Prioleau completed his 10th NFL season and has played in 129 games with 48 starts including at Denver on 10/12. The club added **Brian Witherspoon** as a rookie free agent and he also saw time as a returner. Eighth-year veteran **William James** signed as a backup cornerback. The Jaguars signed **DB Kennard Cox** off the Green Bay practice squad.

KICKERS/SPECIALISTS (3) — **Josh Scobee**, a fifth-round pick by the Jaguars in 2004, finished his fifth season as the placekicker. Scobee connected on 19 of 25 field goals in 16 games for a team-high 90 points. Scobee hit game-winning field goals in consecutive weeks as he connected from 37 yards against Houston in overtime on 9/28 and 51 yards at Indianapolis on 9/21. He missed eight games in 2007 after suffering a quad injury in the pregame warmups prior to the season-opener against Tennessee. **Adam Podlesh**, a fourth-round pick in 2007, injured his knee against Minnesota on 11/23 and was placed on injured reserve. The Jaguars signed **Steve Weatherford** to replace Podlesh. Weatherford has played in 46 career games, seeing action with Kansas City and New Orleans. **Joe Zelenka** handled the long snapping duties for the seventh consecutive season.

TOM WILLIAMS NAMED YALE HEAD COACH

Jaguars defensive assistant Tom Williams was named head coach at Yale on January 7, 2009. Williams served two seasons on the Jaguars coaching staff. He joined the Jaguars in 2007 as assistant special teams coach after spending the previous 11 seasons as an assistant on the collegiate level. In 2008, Williams served the role of defensive assistant.

CAREER MARKS: Fred Taylor (1st round, 1998 draft) is the only player who has been with the club more than nine seasons in Jacksonville. Taylor holds a prominent place in the Jaguars career record books as he holds every career rushing mark and surpassed Jimmy Smith (12,285) for the most yards from scrimmage and most all-purpose yards in 2007 and for most touchdowns in 2008.
