#### **GAME SUMMARY**

#### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (2-0) at Carolina Panthers (2-0) Friday, Aug. 24, 2018 • Bank of America Stadium (73,778) • 7:30 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots and Carolina Panthers will meet in the preseason for the 10th time overall and the fourth time in the last five preseasons. In 2014, the Patriots hosted the Panthers at Gillette Stadium and pulled out a 30-7 victory. In 2015, the Patriots traveled to Carolina and eked out a 17-16 preseason win. Most recently in 2016, the Patriots ots beat the Panthers, 19-17, on the road.

The teams most recently met in the regular season last year at Gillette stadium with Carolina leaving with a 33-30 victory. New England holds a 7-2 edge over Carolina in the preseason, while Carolina has a 4-2 record against the Patriots in the regular season since the teams first squared off in 1995. The two clubs also met in Super Bowl XXXVIII, with the Patriots claiming a 32-29 victory following an Adam Vinatieri field goal in the waning moments.

New England enters Week 3 of the preseason with a 2-0 record, while Carolina also comes in unbeaten at 2-0 after wins at Buffalo and at home vs. Miami.

Former Patriots linebacker **Rob Ninkovich** will provide sideline analysis along with WBZ-TV's **Steve Burton**. *Patriots Football Weekly*'s beat writers **Paul Perillo** and **Andy Hart** will also provide insight and analysis.

#### PATRIOTS LOOK TO KICK OFF ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON

The 2018 New England Patriots have a chance to set or tie several NFL team records, including:

- The Patriots have made the playoffs for nine straight seasons (2009-17), tied with Dallas (1975-83) and Indianapolis (2002-10) for the most in NFL history.
- The New England Patriots enter the 2018 season with 34 postseason wins and need two more playoff victories to tie Pittsburgh for the most postseason wins all-time.
- The Patriots enter this season with 214 regular season wins since 2000. The NFL record for most regular season wins over two consecutive decades is 217 by the San Francisco 49ers (1970s/1980s). The Patriots need just four more wins to surpass the 49ers for the most regular season wins in two consecutive decades.



#### SERIES HISTORY



The New England Patriots and the Carolina Panthers will meet for the fourth time in the last five seasons in a preseason game when they travel to Charlotte. It will be the third time in the last four seasons that the Patriots will play at Carolina in the preseason. All of those games were played in the third week of the preseason.

In 2014, the Patriots hosted the Panthers at Gillette Stadium and pulled out a 30-7 victory. In 2015, the Patriots traveled to Carolina and eked out a 17-16 preseason win. Most recently in 2016, the Patriots beat the Panthers, 19-17, on the road.

The teams played in the regular season in 2017 at Gillette Stadium with Carolina leaving with a 33-30 victory.

New England leads the preseason matchup with a 7-2 advantage in the nine preseason games.

Carolina holds the edge in the regular season with a 4-2 margin.

The Patriots and Panthers met in Super Bowl XXXVIII on Feb. 2, 2004. The Patriots-Panthers Super Bowl is widely regarded among the most entertaining Super Bowls ever played, as the Panthers took a fourth-quarter lead only to see the Patriots came up with a game-winning field goal to clinch the see-saw battle in the waning moments.

The New England Patriots suffered their second home loss of the 2017 season when Carolina K Graham Gano drilled a 48-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Panthers to a 33-30 victory.

The Patriots defense forced two turnovers but failed to hold Carolina QB Cam Newton and his targets in check. Newton completed 22-of-29 passes for 316 yards and three touchdowns and also ran for a score. Carolina scored on six of their nine offensive drives and punted just once.

Carolina took a 30-16 lead early in the fourth quarter. New England scored on its next two drives to tie the game at 30-30. But, Carolina got the ball back with 3:09 to play and converted two third down plays to get in position for the game winning field goal.

Faced with a third-and-7 from their own 27-yard line, the Patriots defense appeared to rise to the occasion with an 11-yard sack by rookie DL Deatrich Wise, Jr. However, CB Stephon Gilmore was called for illegal use of the hands for an automatic first down. Then on third-and-3 from the New England 6-yard line, Newton completed a short pass to WR Devin Funchess for a first down.

With New England in front, 13-10 late in the first half, Carolina engineered a nine-play, 84-yard drive that was highlighted by a 43-yard pass to WR Kelvin Benjamin. That helped get in position for Newton's 10-yard touchdown pass to Funchess for a 17-13 lead with 31 seconds to play. That left enough time for Brady, who completed a 26-yard pass to WR Chris Hogan on third-and-one to get the Patriots to the Carolina 40-yard line where K Stephen Gostkowski connected on a team-record 58-yard field goal to make it 17-16 at the break.

Carolina fumbled on their first drive and then extended their lead to 23-16 on their next drive. After adding on to their lead early in the fourth with another touchdown to make it 30-16.

Facing a fourth-and-3, Brady converted on a 13-yard pass to TE Rob Gronkowski to keep a drive that was capped by an 8-yard touchdown run by RB Dion Lewis to make it 30-23. LB Dont'a Hightower had a third-down sack on the ensuing drive, and Brady took over and drove the Patriots to the Carolina 1-yard line where on fourth-and-1, connected with WR Danny Amendola for a touchdown to tie the game.

Brady finished the game 32-of-45 for 307 yards and two touchdowns.

The New England Patriots improved to a 3-0 start in the preseason following a 19-17 victory over the Carolina Panthers in Bank of America Stadium.

QB Jimmy Garoppolo started the game and played the first three series before QB Tom Brady entered the game for his 2016 preseason debut. Brady and Garoppolo both played in four series in the first half. Garoppolo played the first two series in the third quarter before rookie QB Jacoby Brissett finished the game.

Brady looked sharp in his return, leading the Patriots to nine points in his first two drives. On his first play from scrimmage, Brady completed a 37-yard pass to WR Aaron Dobson to help position the Patriots for a 33-yard field goal. The Patriots ensuing offensive drive began at the Carolina 48-yard line following an interception by S Devin McCourty. Three plays later, Brady fired a pass to WR Chris Hogan for a 15-yard touchdown pass for a 9-0 lead following a failed 2-point play.

It was a big first half for the Patriots three Rutgers players in the defensive backfield, with CB Logan Ryan, McCourty and S Duron Harmon all recording interceptions. Harmon picked off a Carolina pass at the New England 2-yard line to end a Panthers scoring threat.

A 60-yard punt return by rookie CB Cyrus Jones helped set up a 12-yard touchdown pass from Brissett to WR DeAndre Carter in the third quarter to give the Patriots a 16-3 lead. It was Brissett's first NFL touchdown. Brissett completed all of his pass attempts, finishing 9-of-9 for 85 yards.

Carolina scored 14 points in the fourth quarter, including a touchdown with 33 seconds to play, to make it a 19-17 final.

The New England Patriots improved to a 2-0 preseason record following a 37-20 victory over the Philadlephia Eagles at Gillette Stadium.

QB Tom Brady made his preseason debut and moved the ball with ease against the Eagles. Brady led the Patriots on four scoring drives during his six series in the first half for a 27-7 halftime lead. During his first offensive series, Brady was 5-for-5 for 27 yards before culminating a seven-play, 62-yard drive with a 4-yard touchdown pass to WR Chris Hogan. Brady had a 20-yard touchdown pass to RB James White in the second quarter. He finished the game 19-of-26 for 172 yards with two touchdowns.

The Patriots defense registered eight sacks.against the Eagles. After taking a 10-0 first quarter lead, DL Adrian Clayborn forced a fumble on an 8-yard sack of Philadelphia QB Nick Foles. 2018 fifth-round draft pick LB Ja'Whaun Bentley picked up the loose ball and returned it 54 yards for a touchdown to give the Patriots a 17-0 lead.

After the Eagles got on the board with a touchdown, the Patriots repsonded with two straight scoring drives with a 49-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski and then a drive that ended with the Brady to White touchdown connection.

Backup QB Brian Hoyer entered the game for the final play of the first half and then played into the fourth quarter. Following an interception by rookie LB Christian Sam, Hoyer was able to convert the tunrover into an 11-yard touchdown pass to WR Cordarrelle Patterson to give the Patriots a 34-7 lead.

White led the team with 6 receptions for 61 yards, while rookie DB Keion Crossen led the team on defense with eight total tackles.

#### FAST START IN PRESEASON

The Patriots improved to 2-0 preseason record for the eighth time under Bill Belichick (2000, 2001, 2003, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2016 and 2018).

#### FREQUENT OPPONENT

The Patriots and the Eagles met for the 23rd time in the preseason, the second most frequent preseason contests, behind the 27 meetings between the Patriots and the New York Giants. The Patriots will play the New York Giants in the 2018 preseason finale.

#### DEFENSE NETS EIGHT SACKS

The Patriots defense registered eight sacks against the Eagles. The last time the Patriots had eight sacks in a regular-season game was at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. DL Keionta Davis led the defense with  $1\frac{1}{2}$  sacks. Also adding sacks were: S Patrick Chung, DL Vincent Valentine, LB Kyle Van Noy, DL Adam Butler, DL Derek Rivers and DL Adrian Clayborn. DL Trent Harris also chipped in with a half-sack.

#### **BRADY MAKES 2018 DEBUT**

QB Tom Brady made his 2018 preseason debut and finished 19-of-26 for 172 yards with two touchdown passes. He played until the last series of the second quarter. Brady opened the game by going 5-of-5 for 27 yards before culminating a seven-play, 62-yard drive with a 4-yard touchdown pass to WR Chris Hogan. He added a second touchdown pass on a 20-yard pass to RB James White in the second quarter.

#### TWO DRAFT PICKS START ON D

2018 fifth-round draft pick LB Ja'Whaun Bentley and 2018 seventh-round draft pick DB Keion Crossen were in the starting lineup when the Patriots opened in a nickel defense against Philadelphia. Bentley finished with five tackles, one pass defensed and a fumble recovery that he returned 54 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. Crossen led the team with eight tackles.

#### **CHUNG SACKS FOLES**

S Patrick Chung was credited with an 8-yard sack of Eagles QB Nick Foles in the first quarter. He has four career sacks in the regular season with his last sack coming on Colin Kaepernick at San Francisco on Nov. 20, 2016.

#### WYNN CHECKS IN

2018 first-round draft pick OL Isaiah Wynn made his NFL debut when he entered the game at right tackle in the second offensive series of the game. Wynn did not play in the preseason opener vs. Washington.

#### J-MAC SEES ACTION

CB Jason McCourty made his Patriots debut after he did not play in the preseason opener vs. Washington.

#### HOLLISTER MAKES THE START

TE Jacob Hollister was in the starting lineup at tight end. As a rookie in 2017, he had one start at New Orleans on Sept. 17 when the Patriots opened in a multiple tight end formation.

#### CLAYBORN MAKES PRESENCE FELT

DL Adrian Clayborn forced a fumble on an 8-yard sack in the second quarter that was returned 54 yards for a touchdown by rookie LB Ja'Whaun Bentley. The last time the Patriots returned a fumble for a touchdown in the regular season was when LB Jamie Collins returned a fumble 14 yards for a touchdown at the New York Jets on Dec. 27, 2015.

#### GOSTKOWSKI GOES LONG

K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 49-yard field goal late in the second quarter. He connected on a 52-yard field goal in the preseason opener vs. Washington. He finished 3-for-3 after adding field goals of 37 and 29 yards.

#### SAM WITH THE PICK

Sixth-round draft pick LB Christian Sam picked off a third-quarter pass that deflected off Eagles RB Matt Jones and returned the ball 11 yards. The Patriots converted the turnover into a touchdown when QB Brian Hoyer connected with WR Cordarrelle Patterson on an 11-yard touchdown pass.

#### PATTERSON MAKES IMPACT

Newly acquired WR Cordarrelle Patterson scored on an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Brian Hoyer in the third quarter for his first touchdown as a member of the Patriots.

#### **CLOSING STRONG**

The Patriots have not allowed a fourth-quarter point in both preseason games so far in 2018. In 2017, the Patriots defense finished the year by not allowing a fourth quarter point in the final five games. The Patriots allowed eight points or fewer in 14-of-16 games in the fourth quarter last year.



# INDIVIDUAL TEAN NOTES





Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 25th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New

Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (17), conference crowns (9) and Super Bowl championships (5) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (21) and have the fewest losing seasons (2) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LII was the ninth Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a perod during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 24 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 19 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2017, Kraft earned his 21st winning season in 24 years of owning the franchise.

#### <u>WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018</u>

★ Since purchasing the team in 1994, Robert Kraft has 30 career postseason wins as an owner, third-most in NFL history behind the Rooney Family in Pittsburgh (36) and the Green Bay Packers (34). The Rooney Family founded the Steelers in 1933 while the Green Bay Packers were founded in 1919.

★ Under Robert Kraft's guidance, the 2000-09 Patriots set the NFL record for most wins in a decade in NFL history with 126 overall wins overall. With 11 wins overall in 2018, the Patriots will tie that record for the current decade.

#### PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 25 times in their 58-year history. Nineteen of those playoff berths have come in the 24 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 20 division crowns, including 15 in the last 17 seasons and 17 of which have come since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994.

#### 400-POINT SEASONS

The Patriots extended their NFL record to 11 straight seasons with at least 400 total points (2007-17) after finishing with 458 points in 2017. The San Diego Chargers previously held the record by scoring at least 400 points in eight straight seasons from 2004-11. The Patriots 458 points last year were second in the NFL to the 478 by the Los Angeles Rams.

#### **OPENING 2ND HALF STRONG**

The Patriots had an NFL-best 57 points on the first drive of the second half. In 2017, the most in the NFL, while the N.Y. Giants were last with 10 points on their first possession of the second half.

#### RUSH TO VICTORY

Since 2000, New England is 47-1 in the regular season when a Patriot eclipses 100 yards rushing. The only loss during the Bill Belichick era came at Miami on Dec. 20, 2004, when Corey Dillon rushed for 121 yards on 26 carries and the Patriots lost to the Dolphins, 29-28. Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win five Super Bowl titles. He won more regular season games (123) and more games overall (136) during a 10-year stretch (2002-11) than any other coach in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 44 consecutive years as an NFL coach are second in NFL history to 45 by Dick LeBeau.

Belichick guided the Patriots to the AFC East title in 2017. His 15 division titles are the most by a head coach in NFL history. Shula and Tom Landry are second with 13 titles.

#### MOST CONSEC. DIVISION TITLES

Belichick is the first NFL coach to lead his team to nine consecutive division titles after claiming the title in 2017. Paul Brown (1950-55), Tom Landry (1966-71), Bud Grant (1973-78) and Chuck Noll (1974-79) led their teams to six straight titles.

#### SUPER COMEBACK

Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games where a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 have recorded 2,647 wins, 7 losses and 2 ties, a winning percentage of .997.

#### PATRIOTS RENAISSANCE

Once head coach Bill Belichick implemented his coaching design on the Patriots, his approach has given him the best record of any NFL head coach who has coached over 40 games since 2001 (including the postseason).

#### 500+ FOR 3 STRAIGHT YEARS

Belichick is the first head coach in NFL history to lead a team to three straight 500-point seasons (2010-12) and four overall (2007-589, 2010-518, 2011-513 and 2012-557). St. Louis is the only other team to have done it three times (1999-526, 2000-540, 2001-503).








#### CAREER NOTES

Tom Brady has quarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 196 of his 251 career regular-season starts, compiling a .781 winning percentage and giving him the best record of any quarterback in the Super Bowl era (since 1966). Brady's 155 career wins in his first 200 starts are the most in NFL history. Peyton Manning is second with 136 wins in his first 200 career starts.





#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

- If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2018, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in eight seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (9).
- Brady is tied with Peyton Manning, Drew Brees and Aaron Rodgers with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2018 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns, for the most in NFL history.
- ★ Brady has passed for 4,000 yards nine times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2018, he will be the third player to reach ten seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (12).
- ★ Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in passing touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.
- ★ Brady has 223 career victories (regular season and postseason) and needs three wins in 2018 to move past Adam Vinatieri (225) for the most wins all-time by an NFL player.
- ★ Brady enters 2018 with 13 regular-season wins at age 40 or older, tied with Brett Favre for the NFL record.
- ★ Brady enters the 2018 season with 559 touchdowns overall (488 in the regular season and 71 in the postseason) and needs 21 touchdown passes in 2018 to move past Peyton Manning to become the all-time leader in touchdown passes.
- Brady has thrown touchdowns to 68 different players in his career, two behind Vinny Testaverde's NFL-record 70 different TD targets.
- ★ Brady enters the 2018 season tied with Drew Brees for third all-time with 488 regular season touchdowns and needs 12 touchdowns to become the third player to reach 500 touchdowns. He would join (Peyton Manning-539) and (Brett Favre-508).

The Patriots have reached 12 conference championship games in the Tom Brady - Bill Belichick era (since 2001 with Brady starting at QB). The Patriots have made 12 title games in the 16 seasons with Brady as the starter.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

- ★ Brady enters the 2018 season with 66,159 career passing yards. He needs 3,841 yards this season to become the fourth QB in NFL history with 70,000 career passing yards.
- ★ Brady has 82 300-yard games and needs eight more to become the third NFL player with 90 300-yard games, joining Drew Brees (109) and Peyton Manning [93].
- ★ Brady is tied with seven other NFL players with two games with six or more touchdowns and needs one 6-TD game to tie Peyton Manning, who had three games with six or more touchdowns.
- ★ Tom Brady has won 30 Player of the Week awards to set the NFL record for the most Player of the Week honors, and he also leads with 10 Player of the Month honors.
- ★ Brady leads the NFL with 55 career games with three touchdown passes and no interceptions.
- ★ Brady has started 251 regular season games at quarterback. If he starts all 16 games in 2018 he will move past Peyton Manning (265) and be second all-time with 267 starts, behind Brett Favre (298).
- ★ Brady has played in 253 regular season games entering the 2018 season, which is fifth all-time among NFL quarterbacks. If he plays in all 16 games in 2018 he will move into third place all-time with 269 games played among NFL quarterbacks, behind George Blanda (340) and Brett Favre (302).
- ★ Brady is entering his 19th season in 2018 with the Patriots. He joins Jim Marshall (19-Minnesota), Bruce Matthews (19-Houston/Tennessee), Darrell Green (20-Washington), Jackie Slater (20-LA Rams) and Jason Hanson (21-Detroit) as the only players with at least 19 seasons played with one NFL team.
- ★ Brady (13) needs one more Pro Bowl berth to join Tony Gonzalez (14), Peyton Manning (14), Bruce Matthews (14) and Merlin Olsen (14) as the only NFL players with at least 14 Pro Bowl berths.

Brady led the Patriots to their ninth win of the season in the victory over Miami on Nov. 26, 2017, the most ever by a 40-year old quarterback in the Super Bowl era. Brett Favre in 2009 turned 40 on Oct. 10 and led the Vikings to eight wins in their 12-win season after turning 40. Brady threw four touchdowns to push his 2017 total to 26 touchdowns, the most in a single season by a 40year old quarterback. He moved past Brett Favre (25 in 2009 after he turned 40 in October of that year with Minnesota) and Warren Moon (25 with Seattle in 1997).

Brady led the NFL with 4,577 yards passing in 2017 to become the oldest quarterback to lead the NFL.. #### A SELFLESS CAUSE

As a junior at the University of Nebraska. Rex formed a close bond with a 5-year old fan of his, Jack Hoffman, who had been diagnosed with brain cancer. During that 2011 season, Rex wore a wristband with the phrase "Team Jack - Pray" which helped bring pediatric brain cancer into the national spotlight. #### ANOTHER TEAM RECORD

Edelman had a 47-yard run in the fourth quarter vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12). It is the longest run ever by a Patriots receiver, topping Troy Brown's 35-yard run vs. Tampa Bay on (9/3/00).

#### FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State, where as a senior, he completed 56 percent of his passes (153-of-275 for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

#### FATHERLY ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald*. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

Gronkowski (1,176) reached 1,000 yards for the third time in 2015 and had 11 touchdowns in 2015 for his fifth season with 10 or more touchdowns. Gronkowski had 168 yards receiving in the win at Pittsburgh on Dec. 17, 2017 and now has seven career games with 140 or more yards, tied with Shannon Sharpe (7) for the most by a tight end in NFL history.

Gronkowski finished the 2011 season with 18 overall touchdowns (17 receiving, 1 rushing), passing Curtis Martin (17 overall in 1996) for the second highest single season total in Patriots history.

### WR CHRIS HOGAN

#### **UNCONVENTIONAL JOURNEY**

Despite a successful three year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked in the back of his mind, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth football team, and at the end of the season joined in on some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried.""

Chris did not get invited to compete in that year's Combine but turned heads during a Pro Day held at Fordham. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

### **G TED KARRAS**

#### SCHOOL'S NOT OUT

Although he already owns a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's degree in recreation, sport and tourism from his time at the University of Illinois, Ted Karras hasn't completely given up his notebook for an NFL playbook. Along with teammate Joe Thuney, Karras is pursuing his MBA from Indiana University thanks to an NFLPA program that provides tuition assistance for players while navigating a busy NFL schedule.

"It just seems to be that everyone keeps wanting to pay for my school, so I'm not going to turn it down," Karras told the Boston Globe.

Karras and Thuney began their MBA pursuit two weeks after the Patriots Super Bowl LI victory by taking online classes and Skyping with professors from Indiana University's Kelley School of Business up until training camp. They continued their classes in the 2018 offseason.

### OL SHAO MASON A FAMOUS NAMESAKE

A noted sports fan and basketball enthusiast, Shaq's mother, Alicia McGuire, named him Shaquille Olajuwon Mason in 1993 after her two favorite NBA stars at the time, Shaquille O'Neal and Hakeem Olajuwon. The Tennessee native had the opportunity to meet one of his namesakes at a Memphis Grizzlies game while O'Neal was a member of the Miami Heat, receiving a special meetand-greet and having his jersey signed.

Patriots WR Cordarrelle Patterson has six rushing touchdowns in his career, tied for the seventh-most in NFL history by a wide receiver. The Patriots have had four receivers rush for a touchdown in a team history.

#### ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to seven straight Pro Bowls (2011-17) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the seventh straight season in 2017.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe.* "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

#### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

### OL JOE THUNEY

#### THUNEY DOES HAVE THE SIZE

An Ohio native, Joe Thuney was told he may not have the size to play offensive line in the Big Ten conference for his hometown Ohio State Buckeyes. Settling on North Carolina State, Thuney went on to become a mainstay on the offensive line while also earning his bachelor's degree in accounting in just three years, added an international studies degree and also minored in Spanish.

#### **BACK TO SCHOOL**

Along with teammate Ted Karras, Joe Thuney has taken advantage of an NFL-PA program that assists its players in earning college degrees. After earning his degree in accounting while also studying international studies at N.C. State, Thuney is now pursuing his MBA through Indiana University's Kelley School of Business.

"Coach Franklin brought me into his office and he asked me what I wanted, and I wanted whatever was best for the team," Butler told *The Tennessean.* "Because we were so short on defensive linemen at that time, that's how it happened."

### LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER

#### WEARING BRUSCHI'S JERSEY #54

As a first round draft pick, Dont'a Hightower is used to high expectations. Hightower went to training camp with jersey #45 but was switched to jersey #54 prior to the start of his rookie year in 2012. Former LB Tedy Bruschi wore #54 for 13 seasons.

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear

this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

#### WINNER ON MULTIPLE LEVELS

Dont'a Hightower and Russell Maryland (2 national championships at University of Miami and three Super Bowl Championships with Dallas) are the only two players in NFL history with two national championships and two Super Bowl wins.

### **DB DEVIN MCCOURTY**

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

Devin McCourty enters 2018 tied with Ty Law for second-most Pro Bowls as a Patriots defensive back with four. Only CB Mike Haynes had more Pro Bowl invites as a Patriots DB with six.

#### DOUBLE TROUBLE

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. Mc-Courty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots this past offseason for his 10th NFL season. The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. They look to become the first set of twins to play together on the same team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louisville Colonels.

Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and was a year behind his brother in eligibility. Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

#### McCOURTY GOES LONG

McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

#### IN GOOD COMPANY

McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

# BROTHERS

Devin, along with twin brother Jason McCourty, has seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. Devin's work with the local Boston Children's Hospital has helped advance research of the disease with doctors now as close as they've ever been to a cure.

#### **KICKING A CAREER HIGH**

Gostkowski made five field goals vs. Cincinnati (10/5/14), setting a new single-game career high. Gostkowski's five field goals tied the second highest single-game total in Patriots history, trailing only Gino Cappelletti's six successful field goals on Oct. 4, 1964. The last time a Patriots player had five field goals in a game was on Nov.14, 2004, when Adam Vinatieri had five field goals vs. Buffalo.

#### **TWO FROM 50-PLUS**

Gostkowski drilled a 62-yard field goal and a 51-yarder in Mexico City against Oakland on Nov. 19, 2017. It is the third time that he has kicked two 50-yarders in a single game. He drilled a 51-yard field goal and a 53-yarder vs. Arizona (9/16/12) and connected on two 53-yard field goals at Houston (12/1/13). He is the first Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in the same game.

#### **SCORING FLURRY**

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

#### HOW THE PATRIOTS SCORED THREE TOUCHDOWNS IN 57 SECONDS:

- ★ Rob Gronkowski got the scoring started by hauling in a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.
- ★ After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.
- On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

#### A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).







#### **ALL-TIME PLAYOFF RESULTS**

#### PLAYOFF BERTHS UNDER KRAFT

New England has qualified for the playoffs 25 times in its 58-year history. The Patriots have earned 19 of those playoff berths in the 24 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 20 division crowns overall (19 AFC East crowns) and has gualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16team tournament following a players' strike.



#### ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT

The Patriots won more than half of their games for the 17th straight year in 2017. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 17 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993.

The Patriots are also the first team to win more than half of their games in 17 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, moving past the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-98) and the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85).

The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 21 of the 24 seasons Robert Kraft has owned the team.
