RAIDERS RETURN TO NAPA

The Oakland Raiders will begin their 2017 campaign at the team's summer training camp home, the Napa Valley Marriott in Napa, Calif. The 2017 season marks the 22nd consecutive season that the team has trained in Napa, with the Silver and Black making the trip every year since 1996.

The Raiders enter 2017 with **Head Coach Jack Del Rio** now in his third year at the helm. Last season, Del Rio led the Raiders to their first postseason berth since 2002 and the team's first 12-win season since 2000.

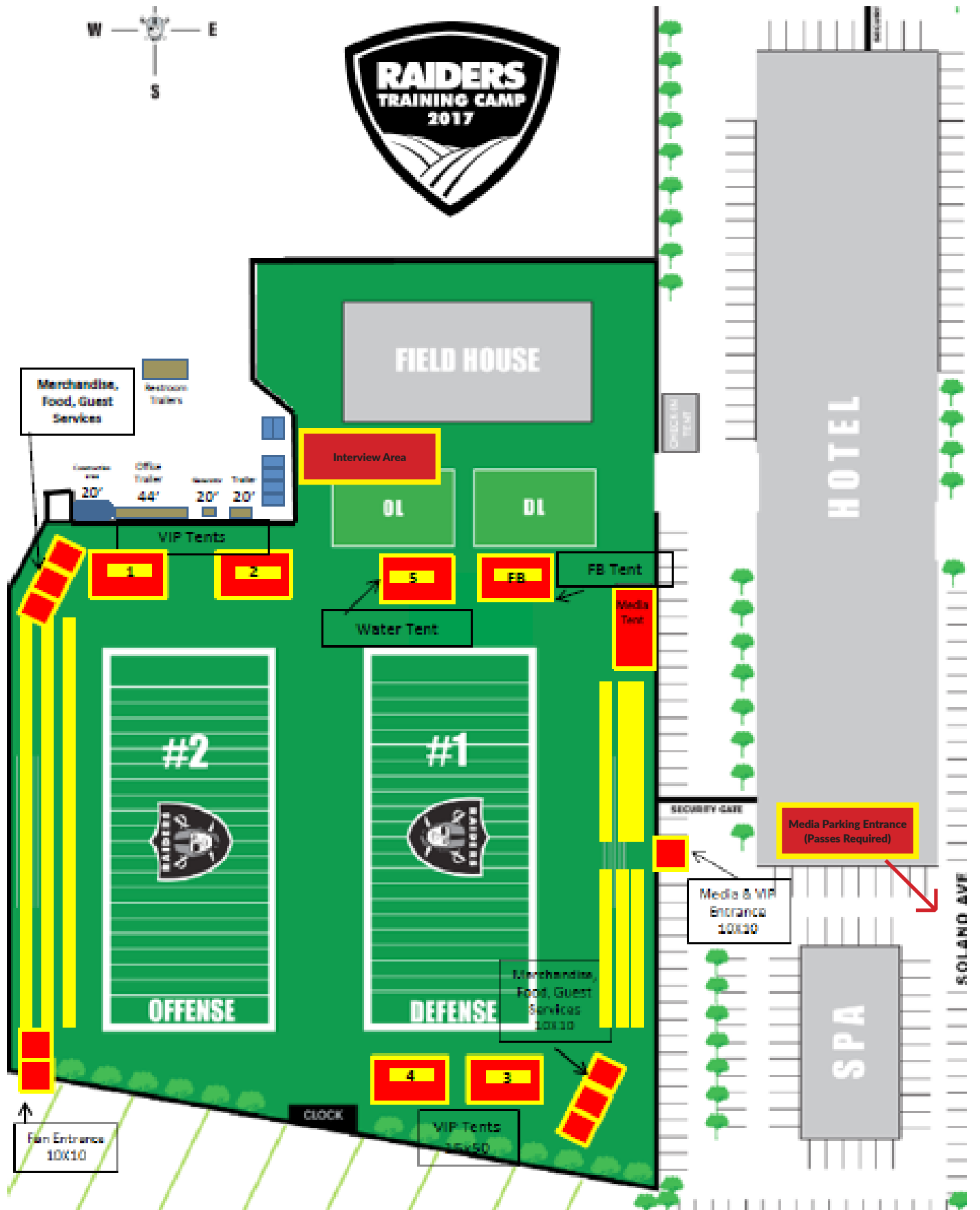
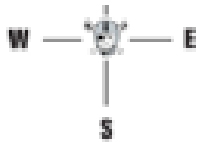

TRAINING CAMP MEDIA ACCESS & POLICY

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

Members of the media are encouraged to carefully review the following procedures, reminded that these are subject to change.

PRACTICE ACCESS & PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY GUIDELINES: Accredited members of the media are welcome to attend the entirety of all training camp practices in Napa. Approximately the first 30 minutes, or until the “team” portion of the practice are open to photography and videography. The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods due to competitive-advantage reasons. Media should stand at a safe distance and hold all belongings, including bags and video cameras. Tripods are not allowed on the field during practice, for safety reasons.

PRACTICE REPORTING POLICY: Blogging and tweeting from practice is permitted for all practices that are open to the public. For all practices that are closed to the public, blogging and tweeting are permitted only within the designated viewing window. Consistent with Super Bowl reporting protocol for practices, the following are general reporting policies for all media, including blogging and tweeting:

- Media may note which players are practicing as well as those who are not.
- Media may report non-strategy and non-game plan observations (e.g. “Wide receiver made a nice catch on the sideline.”)
- Not permitted is any reference to plays run or game strategy. This includes describing formations, personnel groupings (i.e. composition of offensive line) or non-conventional (i.e. “trick”) plays.
- Not permitted is the reporting of which players are practicing with individual units (goal line offense, nickel/dime defense, etc.)
- Not permitted is the reporting of practice injuries until the team has provided an official update.
- Access to the head coach following practice will be provided for comments and injury updates.
- Not permitted is quoting, paraphrasing or reporting comments made by coaches, players or team personnel during a practice session.
- Not permitted are any photo/video transmissions after the designated shooting period has closed.
- Not permitted are wide-view photos/videos of formations and/or personnel groupings (shots must be tightly focused on the player/ball.)
- Not permitted is any audio of quarterback cadence, keywords, audibles, etc.
- All cell phones must be turned to “silent” or “vibrate” mode for practice and all post-practice press conferences.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS: Credential requests for practice will be honored only for working media on specific assignment for a recognized news or sports organization. Credentials will not be issued to freelance writers or photographers. All credential requests for training camp practices should be made at least 48 hours in advance to Erin Exum (eexum@raiders.com) of the Raiders’ media relations office.

PARKING: Every effort will be made to accommodate requests for parking passes, but due to limited space, parking cannot be provided for all credentialed media. Please contact Erin Exum (eexum@raiders.com) of the Raiders’ media relations office for parking passes. Media members without parking passes should park at nearby Redwood Middle School.

MEDIA WORKROOM: The primary media workroom is located in Room 2029 of the Napa Valley Marriott next to the Raiders’ media relations office. There is an auxiliary media workroom located in hotel’s boardroom, located on the first floor just off the main lobby.

MEDIA CHECK-IN/ENTRANCE: Check-in for all media is located on the East side of the property and will be staffed by a member of the media relations department. Check-in and access to the field is available 30 minutes prior to the start of practice. Each media member must pick up his/her own individual credential and present corresponding photo identification.

LIVE BROADCASTING POLICY: Media are not permitted to live broadcast any Raiders practices or media availabilities without prior approval by a member of the media relations staff. Social media applications with live streaming functionality - Facebook, Instagram, Periscope, etc. - are included in this policy.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS: The Raiders respectfully ask that all interview requests, for any member of the organization, be submitted through the team’s media relations office. Players, coaches or staff should not be contacted by media directly by telephone, e-mail, or via social media, including Twitter.

GENERAL MANAGER REGGIE MCKENZIE INTERVIEWS: Media wishing to request interviews with the Raiders’ general manager should contact Will Kiss (wkiss@raiders.com). Interviews are scheduled as time allows.

HEAD COACH JACK DEL RIO INTERVIEWS: Jack Del Rio is available periodically after practices throughout training camp. See the training camp calendar for a full schedule of availability (dates and times subject to change). Those requesting individual interviews should contact Will Kiss (wkiss@raiders.com).

QB DEREK CARR INTERVIEWS: Derek Carr is available to the media during training camp on select days, which are designated on the media schedule. Media wishing to request interviews with Carr should contact Billy Jones (bjones@raiders.com). Interviews are scheduled as time allows.

ASSISTANT COACH INTERVIEWS: Assistant coaches are available by request, provided the request is made at least 24 hours in advance to Erin Exum (eexum@raiders.com). During training camp, coordinators are available at the podium when scheduled.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS: Players are available after practice and all one-on-one requests should be made through the media relations office. See the training camp calendar for a full schedule of pre-scheduled availability (dates and times subject to change). Weekly schedules with particular player availability will be distributed closer to the date.

- The Raiders have faced the Chargers 114 times, the most of any opponent. They have faced the Broncos and Chiefs each 113 times, as they only played each team once during the strike-shortened 1982 season.

DEL RIO VS. 2017 OPPONENTS

Raiders Head Coach Jack Del Rio enters his third season at the helm in 2017, and brings a 90-85 career record into the season after spending nearly nine seasons as the head coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars from 2003-11. Del Rio posted a 12-4 record last year, returning the Raiders to the playoffs for the first time since 2002, and posted a 7-9 record in 2015, his first season in charge of the Silver and Black. Over his career, Del Rio has posted a .500 record or better against nine of the Raider's 2017 opponents. Below is a look at Del Rio's records:

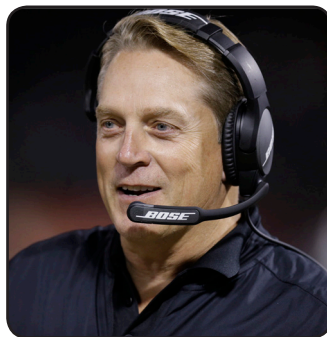

DIVISIONAL BREAKDOWN

AFC WEST: Denver Broncos, Kansas City Chiefs, Los Angeles Chargers

- The Chiefs finished 12-4 and won the AFC West title in 2016, snapping the Broncos' five-year division winning streak.
- The Raiders finished 3-3 against the AFC West for the second consecutive season, the first time finishing .500-or-better in the division in back-to-back seasons since 2010-11.
- Since divisional realignment in 2002, the Raiders have posted a winning record in the AFC West twice: 4-2 in 2002 and 6-0 in 2010.

AFC EAST: Buffalo Bills, Miami Dolphins, New England Patriots, New York Jets

- The Raiders hold a 73-66-4 (.524) record against AFC East opposition.
- The Silver and Black last played the division in 2014, finishing 1-3, but have not lost in Oakland to an opponent from the AFC East since Oct. 2, 2011 against New England.

AFC NORTH: Baltimore Ravens

- Oakland owns a 44-36 (.550) combined all-time advantage against AFC North opponents, and will face the Ravens for the third consecutive year after winning the last two.

AFC SOUTH: Tennessee Titans

- The Raiders are 41-35 (.539) all-time against the AFC South, with the team's best mark coming against the Titans (25-20), and will play them for the third consecutive year, winning the last two.

NFC EAST: Dallas Cowboys, New York Giants, Philadelphia Eagles, Washington Redskins

- The NFC East features two 2016 playoff teams in Dallas and New York, as the Cowboys also posted the best record in the NFC at 13-3. The Raiders are a combined 25-21 (.543) against NFC East teams.

2017 Key Acquisitions

TE Jared Cook

NFL Career: Versatile tight end enters his ninth NFL season and first with the Silver and Black...Career totals include 117 games played with 47 starts, 303 receptions for 3,880 yards (12.8 avg.) and 17 TDs...Has posted at least 30 receptions in each of the last six seasons (2011-16), one of only five active tight ends in the NFL to do so...Ranks second among NFL tight ends with a 13.0-yard receiving average since 2011...Ranked second on the team in both receptions and receiving yards (39 for 481) in 2015 with the Rams...Caught a career-high 52 passes for St. Louis in 2014, the third most by a tight end in a season in team annals...Set a single-season franchise record with 671 receiving yards in his first year with the Rams in 2013...Registered a career-high 759 yards receiving in 2011, the second most by a tight end in a season in Titans franchise history.

LB Jelani Jenkins

NFL Career: Versatile linebacker enters his fifth NFL season and first with the Raiders...Career totals include 53 games played with 34 starts, 219 tackles (156 solo), 3.5 sacks, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and five passes defended...Has made eight career special teams tackles...Was limited to nine games in 2016 due to injury...Started all 13 games in which he appeared in 2015 and set a career high with three passes defended...Led the team and set a career high with 108 tackles (81) in 2014...Was one of three players in the league to record at least 100 total tackles, 3.5 sacks and two forced fumbles...Appeared in all 16 games as a rookie.

RB Marshawn Lynch

NFL Career: Powerful back enters his 10th NFL season and first with the Raiders...Joins the team after a trade with the Seattle Seahawks in the offseason...Was drafted by the Buffalo Bills in the first round of the 2007 NFL Draft...Career totals include 127 games played with 114 starts, 9,112 rushing yards on 2,144 carries (4.3 avg.) with 74 TDs...Has 252 receptions for 1,979 yards (7.9 avg.) and nine TDs as a receiver...Postseason totals include 11 games played with 10 starts, 193 rushes for 937 yards and nine TDs, and 12 receptions for 126 yards...Is a five-time Pro Bowler, having been named to the team in four straight seasons from 2011-14, with his first selection coming in 2008...Named to the Associated Press All-Pro First Team in 2012 and Second Team in 2014...Owns 31 career 100-yard rushing games...Enters the season with the most rushing TDs since 2011, despite missing all of the 2016 season...Set a career high with 17 total TDs in 2014 and added 1,306 rushing yards...Recorded 14 total TDs and 1,257 rushing yards in 2013, helping the Seahawks capture their first Super Bowl...Had a career year in 2012, setting career highs in carries (315), rushing yards (1,590), 100-yard games (10) and added 12 total TDs.

QB EJ Manuel

NFL Career: Veteran quarterback enters his fifth NFL season, first with the Raiders...A former first-round pick, career totals include 28 games played with 17 starts, 3,502 passing yards on 319-of-547 passing with 19 TDs, 15 INTs and a 77.5 quarterback rating...Started all 10 games in which he played as a rookie, winning the job out of training camp...Set Bills franchise rookie records for most passing TDs (11) and completions (180) in a season...Was just the third quarterback selected by Buffalo in the first round of an NFL Draft.

T Marshall Newhouse

NFL Career: Experienced and versatile offensive lineman enters his first season with the Silver and Black after seven seasons with the Green Bay Packers, Cincinnati Bengals and New York Giants...Signed with the team as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason...Helped the Packers to four straight playoff berths from 2010-13, and was with the team as they won the Super Bowl in 2010...Has appeared in six postseason games with three starts...Has played in 86 career regular season games with 56 starts...Played in all 32 games from 2011-12, making 29 starts over that time...Started all 14 games that he played in for the Giants in 2015.

WR Cordarrelle Patterson

NFL Career: Explosive return man and receiver enters his first season with the Raiders and fifth in the NFL after four seasons with the Minnesota Vikings...Career totals include 64 games played with 22 starts, 132 receptions for 1,316 yards and seven TDs, 31 rushes for 333 yards and four TDs on offense...As a returner, has 134 career kickoff returns for 4,075 yards (30.4 avg.) and five TDs...His 30.4 kickoff return average ranks first in the NFL since he entered the league in 2013 and ranks only behind Gale Sayers (30.6) in NFL history...Is a two-time Pro Bowler, having been selected in 2013 and 2016...Also has earned a spot on the Associated Press All-Pro First Team two times (2013 and 2016) as a return specialist...Tied an NFL record with a 109-yard kickoff return in 2013.

- Played in 42 games over three seasons at Ohio State, helping the Buckeyes win the 2014 National Championship and make the College Football Playoff in 2016.
- Named to the All-Big Ten Second Team by the coaches and a third-team selection by the media as a senior.
- Named a team captain in 2016.
- Totaled 91 tackles, six INTs and 15 passes defended over his career.

Connecticut
Second Round (56th overall)

- Played in 48 games in his four-year career at Connecticut, finishing with 351 tackles (224 solo), eight INTs, 16 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.
- Earned All-AAC First Team honors as a senior.
- Ranked second in the AAC with 118 tackles and tied for sixth with four INTs in 2016.
