DES Report – Wade Pelham

- Discover Wild NH Day was well attended and things went well for DES. Wade reported that South Berwick waste facility increased their grease fee a little bit by a few cents.
- Work continues of the Grease draft report, collecting from grease information in S. Berwick and Allenstown to develop a good protocol to process grease – along with cost estimates to build, maintain and what tipping fees could be expected. Hoping if DES has a cookie cutter development program, it may be more incentive for other plants to consider the process at their plants. Wade can send draft along before finalized.
- DES pushes for electronic reporting for septage reports for haulers and waste water plants for the end of this year. Working through online bugs; let them know if you have any so they can fix them. Training sessions developed for later in the year, as well as office hours if you need help filling out the forms or filling them out.- established times where people can come with data and they will help them navigate the system to input data.
- Dan Knox from Lebanon, NH wastewater treatment plant is taking over the Concord Plant- and has been know to be strict with permits. Concord received over 11million gallons of septage last year.

Tank Track Guest Speakers

Tank Track is a database management program specifically designed for septic and grease tank operations. The software integrates scheduling, reminders, billing, and customer communication into one system.

Users can collect and store photos for their records or share them directly with customers. The program allows you to send appointment reminders, schedule future appointments, and automate recurring appointments.

Tank Track also provides automated invoicing and collections, enabling customers to make payments electronically. Scheduling tools include routing maps that allow you to build routes, make changes with a few clicks, assign jobs to field drivers, and incorporate trips to disposal sites.

Additionally, the system can generate custom manifests required for state disposal reports and create revenue reports by billable item, service category, town, or driver. It does not offer any inventory options for portable toilet providers at this time, but it is being developed.
