
FRANKLIN AND ELEANOR TIMELINE



November 4, 1928 Elected Governor of New York State

March 4, 1933 Inaugerated as 32nd President of the United States



April 15, 1945 FDR died in Warm Springs, Georgia and is buried in Hyde Park, NY. November 8, 1932 FDR is elected President of the United States

March 5, 1933 Begins First Hundred Days of landmark New Deal legislation

November 3, 1936 Re-elected President

1940s November 5, 1940 Re-elected for unprecedented third-term as President

December 7, 1941 America enters World War II

November 7, 1944 Re-elected President

November 10, 1962 Eleanor Roosevelt dies in New York City from aplastic anemia, tuberculosis and heart

March 6, 1933 Become the 1st First Lady to hold a press conference where only female reporters are admitted

Accepts President Truman's offer to serve as a US delegate to the United States

ER resigns from the delegation after the election of Republican President Eisenhower

1961 President Kennedy reappoints ER to the UN and appoints her as the first chairperson of the President's Commision on the Status of Women
