Bright, career-oriented and high-achieving students can complete the coursework for a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts in three years by taking an accelerated schedule that includes courses during the fall, spring and summer semesters, and then moving immediately into the full-time graduate program. Interested students must first select the Degree in Three program and indicate interest in the Get More in Four program on the application for admission. Admittance into the Get More in Four program includes preadmission to the gradute program and allows you to waive all graduate program entrance exams (e.g., GMAT, GRE). Students must apply for full admission to the graduate degree program following the regular deadlines. Other admission criteria specific to each program (e.g., minimum undergradute GPA) apply.


