Admission Requirements

Preference is given to 4-year baccalaureate degree candidates from a US accredited institution.

Prerequisites

The following pre-dental courses are required:

Additional Suggestions:

Applicants are encouraged to satisfactorily complete as many science courses as possible.

Recommendations include:

Biochemistry, microbiology, comparative anatomy, genetics, and histology.

Other recommended courses are computer information technology, business, finance, and accounting.

Dental Admissions Test

Official Dental Admissions Test (DAT)

Test scores must be submitted to AADSAS directly from the testing service and must be less than five years old.

Selection is based on the applicant's total attributes, accomplishments, and potential for growth in the field of dental medicine.

Intellectual ability is judged by grade point average and DAT scores.

Letters of recommendation and personal interviews are used to evaluate the applicant's non-cognitive traits.

Admission Timeline:

Applicants are encouraged to submit and complete application materials as early as possible. An application will not be considered until all required application materials are received by the Office of Enrollment Management.

1. Submit AADSAS Application Early June - December 15

The College of Dental Medicine participates in the American Association of Dental Schools Application Service (AADSAS) sponsored by the American Dental Education Association (ADEA). The AADSAS application is received by MUSC after transcripts are verified by AADSAS, which can take six to eight weeks after it is submitted.

2. Submit MUSC Supplemental Application July 1 - December 15

3. Applicant Interviews (Invitation Only) September through February

Applicants will be invited by email for interviews with College of Dental Medicine faculty from September to February. Interview spaces are limited.

4. Final Decision sent to Applicants (Early December through April)

Applicants will be notified of the Admissions Committee final decisions by mail or email.

5. All Accepted Dental Students Begin Classes The first Monday in June.
