

Peabody Award-winning producer, broadcaster, violist, and conductor

- This season, tours the Netherlands with harpist Lavinia Meijer — giving premieres by Nico Muhly and Philip Glass — and joins the Music Future Band to premiere a new work by Joe Hisaishi in Tokyo
- Has released four albums of commissioned music: first things first, Baroque, Keep In Touch, and Tessellatum

A member of the Orchestra since 1986 and The Mr. and Mrs. Timothy M. George Chair

- As a winner of the Philharmonic's Young Artists Competition in 1980, appeared as soloist under former NY Phil Music Director Zubin Mehta
- Has made solo appearances with the New Jersey Symphony, Louisiana Philharmonic, Ann Arbor Symphony, Bergen Philharmonic, Seoul Philharmonic, and Korea's KBS Symphony
- An active chamber musician, has performed throughout Europe, Korea, and the United States as part of New York Philharmonic Ensembles

JIN SUK YU, VIOLIN

Joined the Orchestra in January 2015

- Served as concertmaster as a fellow at the New World Symphony and, while at The Juilliard School, the Juilliard Orchestra and the Verbier Festival Orchestra
- An active chamber musician whose appearances have included a performance of Beethoven's Archduke Trio with pianist Yefim Bronfman at the New World Center
- A **native of Seoul, South Korea**, he began playing the violin at the age of five and later attended the Interlochen Arts Academy

CONG WU, VIOLA

Joined the Orchestra in September 2018 as Assistant Principal Viola, The Norma and Lloyd Chazen Chair

- Won the Chamber Music Prize in the 14th Primrose International Viola Competition, and the Special Prize in the 12th Tertis International Viola Competition
- Born in Jinan, China, he has appeared as soloist with the Santa Barbara Chamber Orchestra, Macau Youth Orchestra, and New York Classical Players
- A passionate teacher who is on the faculty of SUNY-Purchase College Conservatory of Music and has given masterclasses around the world

LEAH FERGUSON, VIOLA

Joined the Orchestra in October 2018

- Performed as a chamber musician at Music@Menlo, Ravinia's Steans Music Institute, the Verbier Festival, and the Perlman Music Program
- Guest appearances with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra as guest principal viola and with the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal as guest associate principal
- Has collaborated with Itzhak Perlman, Joshua Bell, and Miriam Fried

PETER KENOTE, VIOLA

A member of the Orchestra's viola section since 1983

- In the 2009–10 season played the premiere of a new viola concerto with the South Dakota Symphony, written for him by composer Neal Harnly

- Has appeared at venues and festivals throughout the US and Europe, including Weill Recital Hall, Alice Tully Hall, Disney Hall, Darmstadt Festival, Mostly Mozart Festival, Wien Modern, the Composers Conference, and many others
- An active educator who is a NY Phil Teaching Artist and has given classes and lectures at Harvard University, Peabody Conservatory, Sydney Conservatory, Cleveland Cello Society, Brooklyn College, and the Walnut Hill School for the Arts

Experienced cellist active throughout the New York City music scene

TIMOTHY COBB, BASS

Joined the Orchestra in 2014 as Principal Bass
