

2023–24 SEASON ADDENDUM

Education and Engagement

- Young People's Concerts (YPCs), for ages 6–12 and their families: interactive performances introducing young audiences to the orchestra; four concerts in the Wu Tsai Theater, David Geffen Hall, preceded by YPC Overtures which takes place in spaces throughout David Geffen Hall which offer the opportunity to try out orchestral instruments and engage in crafting and interactive workshops. The 2023–24 YPCs are *Time Capsule*, November 18; Fantasy and Imagination, January 20; Composing Inclusion, April 20; and Celebration, May 4.
- Young People's Concerts for Schools (YPCs for Schools), for grades 3–12, <u>January 17–19, 2024</u>: Young People's Concerts at David Geffen Hall adapted for classroom audiences, with supplemental digital activities prepared by Philharmonic Teaching Artists.
- Very Young People's Concerts (VYPCs), for ages 3–6: events created to introduce music and concertgoing to the youngest audiences through performance, games, active listening, and handson music-making. Hosted by Associate Principal Viola Rebecca Young, the concerts feature Musicians from the New York Philharmonic. Performances take place at Merkin Hall. Dates to be announced.
- Philharmonic Schools, serving grades 3–5: in-school program in which Philharmonic Teaching Artists activate classical and contemporary music by guiding students in how to listen, perform, and compose music.
- New York Philharmonic Very Young Composers Program (VYC), for grades 4–9: school program in which students in New York and in affiliate programs around the world learn to create their own music.
- *The Unanswered Questions:* a discussion series in partnership with Macaulay Honors College at CUNY that uses Philharmonic programming as a lens through which to explore broader social issues. Details to be announced.
- New York Philharmonic Youth Mentorship Program (pre-college): training for middle-and high-school students by Philharmonic musicians and Teaching Artists in partnership with institutions committed to music and instrumental instruction. Programs include The All-City High School Music Program, Bloomingdale School of Music, Casita Maria Center for Arts and Education, Corona Youth Music Project, Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and Performing Arts, Harmony Program, Noel Pointer Foundation, Susan E. Wagner High School, Talent Unlimited, and UpBeat NYC.
- College Partnerships: collaborations with New York City—based institutions of higher education providing pre-concert talks, internship opportunities, and access to select NY Phil

concerts. Programs include The Cooper Union for the Advancement of Science and Art and CUNY-affiliated programs at Macaulay Honors College, Queens College, Medgar Evers College, Guttman Community College, John Jay College of Criminal Justice, and Hunter College.

Chamber Music

- New York Philharmonic Ensembles: performances by Philharmonic musicians at Merkin Hall, November 19; December 10; January 14; February 4; April 7; and April 21; artists and repertoire to be announced.
- Co-Presentations with The 92nd Street Y, New York: performances by Musicians from the New York Philharmonic and guest artists; artists, repertoire, and schedule to be announced.

NY Phil Presentations

- *Artist Spotlight:* performances in which leading artists express their musical interests; in the Wu Tsai Theater at David Geffen Hall, including Pierre-Laurent Aimard performing Ligeti's complete Études complemented by works from the cultures that inspired them, November 7, and The Mary and James G. Wallach Artist-in-Residence Hilary Hahn performing works by J.S. Bach, March 2. Additional events to be announced.
- **Kravis** *Nightcap:* immersive events, which feature performance, reflecting on sounds and themes explored during the season.
- **NY Phil** @ **Noon:** hour-long performances that look at the common historical and cultural threads between the season's repertoire and music of other genres; held in the Kenneth C. Griffin Sidewalk Studio at David Geffen Hall.

Access

- **Phil for All: Ticket Access Program:** provides \$10 tickets to 2023–24 NY Phil subscription concerts to <u>qualified applicants</u>; made possible through the support of the Anna-Maria and Stephen Kellen Foundation.
- Free Concerts for New York City: Concerts in the Parks and the Free Indoor Concert, both Presented by Didi and Oscar Schafer, bring free concerts to all five boroughs of New York City, June 11–14 and 16; Music Director Jaap van Zweden conducts the Free Memorial Day Concert at The Cathedral Church of Saint John the Divine, Presented by the Anna-Maria and Stephen Kellen Foundation, May 27.
- Community Partners: The New York Philharmonic partners with organizations for *The Unanswered Questions* series and for community-based performances; partners include Mother AME Zion Church, Weeksville Heritage Center, El Puente, National Black Theatre, and Bronx Arts Ensemble.

- **Rush Tickets:** Student Rush Tickets are available for select concerts up to ten days before the concert; Same Day Rush tickets are available for select concerts the day of the performance in the David Geffen Hall Welcome Center.
- *The New York Philharmonic This Week:* award-winning series syndicated nationally 52 weeks per year, returning for its 20th season.

The Archives

- New York Philharmonic Archives: one of the world's most important orchestral research collections; a comprehensive repository and resource center for the New York Philharmonic's 180-year history and curator of archival exhibits throughout the season. The 2023–24 season includes the following exhibits, presented in David Geffen Hall:
 - o NY Phil Young People's Concerts @ 100: Inspiring Generations of Music Lovers, a history of the NY Phil YPCs in honor of their centennial, autumn 2023
 - o Ligeti and His World, in honor of the composer's centennial, autumn 2023
 - o *Emigration and Music at the Philharmonic*, in conjunction with the US Premiere of Aaron Zigman and Mark Campbell's *Émigré*, winter–spring 2024
- New York Philharmonic Shelby White & Leon Levy Digital Archives (archives.nyphil.org): grows every year and contains nearly every document in the New York Philharmonic Archives from 1842 through 1970, and all public documents from 1970 through today.
