NEW YORK PHILHARMONIC 2023–24 SEASON OPENING CONCERTS

Jaap van Zweden's Farewell Season Subscription Concerts Begin Plus Additional Premieres and Conducting Debuts

In late September through October 2023, the New York Philharmonic presents six orchestral programs at the Wu Tsai Theater, David Geffen Hall — five subscription programs and one *Sound On* presentation. Music Director Jaap van Zweden, in his farewell season, conducts the first two subscription programs, each featuring a premiere. The rest of October presents notable conducting debuts and premieres of works by composers from a variety of cultural traditions.

After leading the NY Phil's Opening Gala, <u>September 27, 2023</u>, **Jaap van Zweden** conducts the Orchestra in the following two programs:

- The US Premiere of *The Elements*, September 29—October 1, 2023. The piece, a collection of movements by five of today's leading composers Kevin Puts (Earth), Edgar Meyer (Water), Jake Heggie (Fire), Jennifer Higdon (Air), and Jessie Montgomery (Space) was commissioned by violinist Joshua Bell, who performs as soloist. The program concludes with Copland's Symphony No. 3.
- The World Premiere of Steve Reich's *Jacob's Ladder*, October 5–7, 2023. The premiere part of van Zweden's season-long spotlighting of composers past and present whom he has championed at the Philharmonic was co-commissioned by the NY Phil, and features the ensemble Synergy Vocals. The Reich is complemented by Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 5, *Emperor*, featuring Leif Ove Andsnes as soloist, and Schubert's Symphony in B minor, *Unfinished*.

Following those concerts, the New York Philharmonic presents four programs that each feature notable **debuts or premieres:**

Lithuanian conductor Mirga Gražinytė-Tyla, who previously served as music director of the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, makes her NY Phil debut, October 11—14, 2023, leading the Orchestra in Raminta Šerkšnytė's De profundis, R. Schumann's Piano Concerto — with Daniil Trifonov as soloist — and selections from Sibelius's Lemminkäinen Suite.

- Yefim Bronfman returns as soloist for the New York Premiere of Elena Firsova's Piano Concerto, October 19–21, 2023, a work composed for him and which he premiered with the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra in June 2022. David Robertson conducts the program, which also begins the NY Phil's celebration of the centennial of György Ligeti with two of the composer's works: Mifiso la sodo (in its US Premiere) and Concert Românesc. The concerts conclude with Brahms's Serenade No. 1.
- **Jeannette Sorrell** marks her NY Phil subscription debut conducting her own version of Handel's *Israel in Egypt*, October 25 and 26, 2023. The soloists are sopranos Amanda Forsythe and, in their NY Phil debuts, soprano Sonya Headlam, countertenor Cody Bowers, tenor Jacob Perry, and baritone Edward Vogel. The choir is Apollo's Singers (Chorus of Apollo's Fire), making their subscription debut with Sorrell, who serves as their artistic director.
- Brad Lubman makes his NY Phil debut in Sound On, October 27, 2023, conducting the New York Premiere of Kinan Azmeh and Layale Chaker's Dawning for improvising musicians and orchestra, an NY Phil co-commission in which Azmeh (clarinet) and Chaker (violin, NY Phil debut) also feature as soloists. The concerts also include for your eyes only by John Zorn, who is celebrating his 70th birthday this year, and Gougalōn by Unsuk Chin, winner of The Marie-Josée Kravis Prize for New Music.
