The New York Philharmonic announces the 2023–24 season activities for violinist **Hilary Hahn**, the season's **Mary and James G. Wallach Artist-in-Residence**. Her residency comprises appearances in two orchestral programs, an interdisciplinary presentation on the Kravis *Nightcap* series, and a solo recital as part of the *Artist Spotlight* series. All concerts take place in the Wu Tsai Theater, David Geffen Hall.

Hilary Hahn will perform the following orchestral works:

- Prokofiev's Violin Concerto No. 1, conducted by Jakub Hrůša, on concerts that also feature Coleridge-Taylor's Ballade for Orchestra and Bartók's Concerto for Orchestra; <u>January 11–13, 2024.</u>
- Ginastera's Violin Concerto (the NY Phil's first performances of the work since 1963, which it commissioned and premiered for the opening of Lincoln Center) and Sarasate's *Carmen Fantasy*, conducted by Juanjo Mena, on concerts that also include Ravel's *Rapsodie espagnole*, Debussy's *Ibéria* from *Images pour orchestra*, and Ravel's *Boléro*; April 25–27, 2024.

Hahn will also make the following **non-orchestral appearances:** 

- Kravis *Nightcap*, <u>January 13, 2024</u>, which features a program Hahn curated exploring connections between music and dance with works by Bartók, Copland, J.S. Bach, and Steven Banks. She is joined by New York City Ballet principal dancer Tiler Peck and New York Philharmonic musicians.
- Artist Spotlight, March 2, 2024, on which Hahn performs J.S. Bach's Violin Sonatas Nos. 2 and 3 and his Partita No. 3, completing the cycle of Bach's Violin Sonatas and Partitas that she began in an Artist Spotlight recital in March 2023.

The three-time Grammy Award winner Hilary Hahn has a longstanding association with the New York Philharmonic, beginning with her debut in October 1994, at age 14, when she performed Bruch's Violin Concerto No. 1. She has since appeared with the NY Phil more than 20 times, most recently joining the Orchestra on its 2023 Tour to Taiwan & Hong Kong, as soloist in Brahms's Violin Concerto.
