reat Scott! After 40 years we find ourselves being sent *Back* to the Future. This time the re-entry is in the concert hall, bringing a new sense of excitement through gifted musicians all around the world. Unlike Doc Brown, I could never have dreamed that I would have the opportunity to set the time circuits back to 1985 and have the chance to relive the excitement of the arrival of Back to the Future.

"Where we're going, we don't need roads..." With a timeless film, and a timeless machine known as an orchestra, we can go anywhere.

About the Composer

n his ongoing, decades-long career as a composer, Alan Silvestri has blazed an innovative trail with his exciting and melodic scores, winning the applause of Hollywood and movie audiences the world over. With a credit list of well over 90 films, Silvestri has composed some of the most recognizable and beloved themes in movie history. His efforts have been recognized with two Oscar and Golden Globe nominations, three Grammy awards, two Emmy awards, as well as numerous International Film Music Critics Awards, Saturn Awards, and Hollywood Music in Media Awards.

Born in New York City and raised in Teaneck, New Jersey, Silvestri first thought of becoming a bebop jazz guitar player. After spending two years at the Berklee College of Music in Boston, he hit the road as a performer and arranger. Landing in Hollywood at the age of 22, he found himself successfully composing the music for 1972's The Doberman Gang, which established his place in the world of film composing. The 1970s witnessed the rise of energetic synthpop scores, establishing Silvestri as the

action rhythmist for TV's highway-patrol hit Chips. This action-driven score caught the ear of budding filmmaker Robert Zemeckis, whose hit 1984 film Romancing the Stone was the perfect first date for the composer and director, and its success became the basis of decades-long collaboration between the filmmaker and composer that continues to the current day. Their numerous collaborations have taken them through many fascinating landscapes and stylistic variations, from the Back to the Future trilogy to the jazzy world of Toontown in Who Framed Roger Rabbit?, to the tension-filled rooms of What Lies Beneath and Death Becomes Her, from the cosmic wonder of Contact to the emotional isolation of Castaway, to the magic of the Polar Express. But perhaps no film partnership defines their creative relationship better than Zemeckis's 1994 Best Picture winner Forrest Gumb, for which Silvestri's gift for melodically beautiful themes earned him Oscar and Golden Globe nominations and the affection of film music lovers everywhere. In 2022 Zemeckis and Silvestri completed Disney's *Pinocchio*, the live-action retelling of the classic tale.

Silvestri's energy has also brought excitement and emotion to the hard-hitting orchestral scores of Steven Spielberg's Ready Player One and James Cameron's The Abvss. as well as Predator and The Mummy Returns. His diversity is on full display in family entertainment films like Father of the Bride 1 and 2. The Parent Trab. Stuart Little 1 and 2. Disnev's Lilo and Stitch, The Croods, and Night at the Museum 1. 2. and 3. while his passion for melody fuels the romantic emotion of films like The Bodyguard and What Women Want. In 2019 Silvestri composed the music for Marvel's Avenaers: Endgame, a culmination of a partnership with Marvel that began in 2011 with his dynamically heroic score for Captain America: The First Avenger. Since 2011 his collaboration with Marvel helped propel *The Avengers* and *Avengers: Infinity War* to spectacular worldwide success.

Silvestri's success has crossed into the world of songwriting. His partnership with six-time Grammy Award winner Glen Ballard has produced hits such as the Grammy-winning and Oscar-nominated song "Believe" (Josh Groban) for The Polar Express, "Butterfly Fly Away" (Miley Cyrus) for Hannah Montana the Movie, "God Bless Us Everyone" (Andrea Bocelli) for A Christmas Carol, and "A Hero Comes Home" (Idina Menzel) for Beowulf. The duo's most recent project is Back to the Future – The Musical. which opened on London's West End in the summer of 2021, and for which they were nominated for Britain's Olivier Award for Best Original Score or New Orchestrations.

The Artist



David Newman is an accomplished conductor and creator of music for flm. In his 30-year career he has scored more than 110 flms, ranging from War of the Roses, Matilda, Bowfnger, and Heathers to Girls Trip, Night School,

and Serenity. His music has brought to life the critically acclaimed dramas Brokedown Palace and Hoffa; comedies Galaxy Quest and Throw Momma from the Train; and award-winning animated flms Ice Age, The Brave Little Toaster, and his Academy Award-nominated score to Anastasia.

After a decade of conducting live music-to-film concerts for the classic *West Side Story* film, Newman arranged the score for Steven Spielberg's bold new reimagining of the legendary Bernstein and Sondheim musical, earning him a Grammy nomination in 2022.

A highly sought-after conductor, Newman appears with leading orchestras throughout the world, including the New York, Los Angeles and Royal philharmonic orchestras; Deutsches Symphonie-Orchester Berlin and Schleswig-Holstein

Festival Orchestra; San Diego, Boston, San Francisco, and Chicago symphony orchestras; and The Philadelphia and Cleveland Orchestras. In 2017 Newman conducted the world premieres of John Williams's *Star Wars Episodes IV, V, VI*, and *VII* with the New York Philharmonic. In 2020 he conducted the world premiere of his score for the film *Galaxy Quest* live with the San Diego Symphony during Comic–Con, and in 2021 he was invited by the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures in Los Angeles to conduct their inaugural concerts of *The Wizard of Oz*, live to picture, with the American Youth Symphony.

The son of nine-time Oscar-winning composer Alfred Newman, David Newman has composed works for the concert hall that have been performed by the Los Angeles Philharmonic and Indianapolis and Long Beach Symphony Orchestras, and at the Ravinia, Spoleto USA, and Chicago's Grant Park festivals. He composed a violin-orchestra suite for Korean American violinist Sarah Chang based on songs from West Side Story. In 2024 Newman collaborated with pianist Sebastian Knauer to release Hollywood (Warner Classics), a tribute to 20th-century American film music highlighting Alfred Newman's pivotal role in shaping the sound of Hollywood.

New York Philharmonic

Founded in 1842, the New York Philharmonic plays a leading cultural role in New York City, the United States, and the world, connecting with millions of music lovers through live concerts in New York and beyond, as well as broadcasts, recordings, and education programs. Gustavo Dudamel becomes the NY Phil's Oscar L. Tang and H.M. Agnes Hsu-Tang Music and Artistic Director Designate in September 2025, before beginning his tenure as Music and Artistic Director in September 2026.

The New York Philharmonic's legacy of commissioning and / or premiering works by leading composers runs from Dvořák's New World Symphony to two Pulitzer Prize winners: John Adams's On the Transmigration of Souls and Tania León's Stride, composed for Project 19, the NY Phil's all-women commissioning initiative. The Philharmonic has released more than 2,000

recordings since 1917, and in 2023 announced a partnership with Apple Music Classical. Performances can be heard on the nationally syndicated radio program *The New York Philharmonic This Week*, and its history is available free online through the New York Philharmonic Shelby White & Leon Levy Digital Archives.

Annual free concerts are complemented with the Phil for All: Ticket Access Program and impactful education projects including the Young People's Concerts and the New York Philharmonic Very Young Composers Program. The Orchestra has appeared in 436 cities in 63 countries. The New York Philharmonic is the oldest symphony orchestra in the United States and one of the oldest orchestras in the world; distinguished conductors who have served as Music Director include Bernstein, Toscanini, and Mahler.
