

Deliverance Ministry FAQ

If you are experiencing a psychiatric emergency or are at risk of harming yourself or others, please call 911 immediately or go to the nearest emergency room. Deliverance Ministry is not a substitute for emergency services or professional medical care.

What is Deliverance Ministry?

Deliverance Ministry is a prayer-based ministry focused on helping individuals find freedom from spiritual strongholds, lies, and oppression through the power of Jesus Christ. Deliverance Ministry is intentional, scheduled, and Spirit-led, inviting deeper healing and freedom in Christ.

Does Deliverance Ministry provide counseling or other care resources?

Deliverance is not the same as professional counseling or therapy. ONE&ALL also offers counseling and other care resources such as support groups, community groups, and life coaching, which you can learn more about at oneandall.church/care.

Is Deliverance confidential?

Yes. All sessions are confidential unless someone presents a risk of harm to themselves or others.

What is the process like? Is it scary?

No. It's gentle and Spirit-led. There is an application to fill out, followed by a 1:1 meeting with one of our team members. From there, prayer sessions or other appropriate referrals are scheduled with the team. The process is thoughtful, prayerful, and scheduled.

What level of commitment is expected?

Commitment from the participant means coming with a surrendered heart, ready to partner with God for healing, freedom, and transformation. It isn't a one-time quick fix but a step into deeper intimacy with Jesus. The length of commitment varies for each person.

Do I need to attend ONE&ALL to apply for Deliverance?

Yes. Deliverance Ministry is offered to ONE&ALL attendees.

Do I need a referral?

No. Applicants can apply on their own and do not need a referral.

Can I refer someone else to the Deliverance Ministry?

No. Individuals must apply for themselves.

Is Deliverance Ministry available for kids, youth, or families?

Yes. We offer Deliverance Ministry for all ONE&ALL attendees and families—with parental consent and involvement for minors and guidance as essential components.

Where is the Deliverance Team located?

Deliverance Ministry is available across all campuses. Typically, there is one lead per campus. The team does not serve together during weekend services; instead, they come together as needed for scheduled sessions.

Are deliverance sessions offered virtually or in people's homes?

Deliverance sessions are not held in private homes. We ask that you come to the campus you attend to meet with the team.

Does it cost anything?

No. Deliverance Ministry is offered free of charge.

Who can I talk to if I need immediate prayer?
