FAQS ABOUT COLLEGE IN ISRAEL

1) How much does it cost to study in Israel?

Tuition at Israeli universities will cost anywhere from \$5,000 to 18,000 US dollars a year, a fraction of the cost of U.S. tuition.

For university-specific tuition, housing, and fee schedules visit the FAQs on each university's page on our site (collegeinisrael.org, where we have links to the most up-to-date information from each university) to see the tuition cost as well as housing and other expected costs for each school.

Did you know?

New Israeli citizens are entitled to various benefits including educational scholarships from the Israel Student Authority.



2) How many years can I expect an undergraduate degree to take in Israel?

Most undergraduate programs take three years to complete. Engineering and science-based programs may take 4 years. It is worth inquiring with each individual school.

3) What do I need to know about housing?

At each campus, you'll find dorm options and the ability to rent an apartment near campus and close to the JLIC community. Also, many of the JLIC communities are close to one another. This gives you the option to live in one city and commute to another for school where necessary.



4) When should I apply?

Applications open anytime from early to late fall and can remain open until the summer or even September before the school year. Admissions are generally rolling. It is worth inquiring with the specific schools to which you plan to apply.

5) How do I apply to college in Israel?

Each program has its own application process and timeline. Visit collegeinisrael.org, you can browse the Q&A section written by each university. We advise speaking directly with the university about the specific admissions requirements for your program of interest.

6) Do I need to take SATs or ACTs? What other application requirements are there?

Some of the universities are test-optional at this point, but many do require applicants to send in SAT or ACT scores. Taking a standardized test can often open doors.

You can also expect to send a high school diploma, transcript, and any AP scores you may have. You'll often have to pass an English proficiency exam for English-language degree programs as well. In some cases, an interview and personal essay may be required.

7) Can I defer admissions for a gap-year program?

Most schools will allow deferrals for a gap year, but not all, so please check with the relevant school.

8) Do credits transfer from US colleges or gap year programs?

In most cases, Jewish studies courses taken on a gap year are not accepted for credit unless that is the focus of the degree. Whether credits taken at another university will transfer to an Israeli university will depend on what was studied and to what program the student is applying.
