קַדֶּשׁ לִי כָל בְּכוֹר פֶּטֶר כָּל רֶחֶם ... (שְׁמוֹת יג:ב)

Sanctify for Me every firstborn, those who open every womb...

The last and most spectacular of the plagues was מַבַּת קבורות, during which די bypassed every Jewish בְּכוֹר, firstborn, and slew every Egyptian בָּכוֹר. Because of this miracle, the בְּכוֹר of the Jewish people, human and animal, are forever sanctified. Originally, the were meant to be the בכורים who performed the עבודה in the בֵּית הַמְקְדֵשׁ; however, they lost this privilege when they sinned with the אֶגֵל הַזָּהָב. Nonetheless, despite their fall from grace, the עֵגֵל הַזָּהָב still remained sanctified regarding פְּדָיוֹן הַבֶּּן, firstborn animals and other observances.

R' Simcha Zissel צַּייל, the Alter of Kelm, wrote a letter to Baron Rothschild, praising him for his exertions on behalf of בַּלַל יִשׂרָאֵל. In this letter, he raises an interesting question. What did the Jewish do in Egypt to earn this high level of sanctification? True, they were involved in a great קדוש הַשֶּׁם, but did the בָּכוֹרִים do anything at all to make it happen? They did not contribute at all to their rescue during the plague. The בְּכוֹרִים also had nothing to do with their being born first. Their role was totally passive. Clearly, even passive participation in any type of קדוש הַשָּׁם is a very great opportunity. A person gains tremendous merit if הקב"ה chooses him to play a role in a קדושׁ הַשֶּׁם, even if it is only a passive role.

"If this is the reward for a person who has a passive role in a

קדושׁ הַשְּׁם," wrote R' Simcha Zissel, "how can we begin to imagine the reward of a person who is actively making a קדושׁ הַשֵּׁם every day? You, Baron Rothschild, considering who you are and what you have done for the Jewish nation, have actively and publicly sanctified the Name of די, and there is no limit to the honor, respect and gratitude you have earned."

There is a valuable lesson we must all draw from the מִצְנָה of בּּדְיוֹן הַבֵּן. If a passive contribution to a קַדּוֹשׁ הַשֵּׁם created such an everlasting reward for the בכוֹר, we can be quite sure that for an active contribution to a קדושׁ הַשָּׁם the true reward is an even greater one. There are always many opportunities for us to actively contribute towards קדוּשׁ הַשֵּׁם. We make a קדוּשׁ הַשֵּׁם in the way we conduct our daily lives: the way we walk, the way we talk, the way we do business and the way we treat others, both Jewish and non-Jewish.

If we say that extra "Good Morning," if we are consistently honest and we go the extra mile to make that קדושׁ הַשֶּׁם so that it will be said about us, "אַשֶּׁר בָּדְ אֵתְפָּאָר — You are My servant, Israel, through whom I will be glorified" [יָשַׁעְיָהוּ מט:ג]; that they can say about us, "How beautiful are the ways of a religious Jew," then, as the Alter of Kelm writes, our reward will be very great. It is within our power to cause people who observe us to remark, "Look at him! Look how beautifully a religious Jewish child behaves."

טי שבט R' Eliezer Silver זַצִּייל, born in Obeliai, Lithuania, to רי **5642 – 5728** מְלְכָּה and מְלְכָּה, learned in Dvinsk with the 188**2 – 1968** Rogatchover Gaon, רי מֵאִיר שִׁמְחָ רי מֵאִיר שָׁמֶחַ) and רי רי חַיִּים סוּלוֹביֵיצִייק. At the age of 24, he received סְמִיכָה from רי חַיִּים עוֹצֵר Grodzinski. In 1907, R' Silver immigrated to the USA with his wife of one year, Basya Wolk, taking a position as ב, first in New York, then in Harrisburg (PA), and later in Springfield (MA). In 1931, he accepted an offer to serve as בָּ in Cincinnati (OH) where he served until his פָּטִירָה. He founded the American branch of אֲגַדַּת יִשְׂרָאֵל and established the וַעַד הַצָּלָה. In 1949, he founded the Chofetz Chaim Day School in Cincinnati. He published עַנְפֵּי אֵרֶז in 1960. His son, R' David, published אֶרֶז in 1968.

to "please speak" to בְּנִי יִשְׁרָאֵל and ask them to approach their Egyptian neighbors for gold and silver before leaving מְצְרֵיִם. Speech is precious. One should not be stingy with words, because it is simply incredible what can be accomplished with a few words spoken from the heart.

A certain תלמיד חכם told R' Yitzchok Zilberstein that he himself could not have believed what his words would achieve. He then related:

The בני ברק was in a shul in בני ברק where he met an old friend who had learned together with him in ישיבה when they were young. At the end of davening, the תַּלְמִיד חָכָם heard his friend reciting קדיש. He was surprised, because he knew that his friend's parents had passed away a long time ago, and neither of them had passed away around this time of year.

After davening, the תַּלְמִיד חַכֶּם went over to his friend and asked him for whom he was saying קַּדִּישׁ.

His friend replied, "My aunt, my mother's sister, passed away recently. She was not observant, and her children do not say for her. After the funeral, I undertook to say קַּדִּישׁ for her for the entire year."

"Did someone ask you to do this?" the תַּלְמִיד חַכָּם asked.

"No," answered his friend, who was already sitting in his car, rushing to work.

Even though he had already started his car, the תַּלְמִיד חַכָּם began telling him how impressed he was by his decision. "Your זְּכוּת is enviable. You should know that if we hear that a terror attack was

foiled, you have a big part in it. There are מֵלְאָכִים in Heaven who see your devotion to this מָצְנָה, and come to די with words of defense, begging Him to save the Jewish people. And '7 listens, measure for measure, saying that as there are people on earth who do not have to be asked to perform מצוֹת, but take the initiative to do מצוֹת on their own, He will do favors for them and repay them for their good deeds."

The תַּלְמִיד חַכֶּם went on to encourage his friend to keep up with this great מְצֵוָה until the end of the year. "You may not appreciate what a great thing you are doing, but you should know that in Heaven, they do."

On that note, the friends parted.

The next day, the תַּלְמִיד חַכֵּם's friend called, and it was immediately obvious that he was very agitated. "I want you to know," he said, "that just before you encouraged me to continue saying קַּדָּישׁ for my aunt, I felt that I was about to give up. People think that it is not so difficult to say קדיש, but what is difficult is to be committed to saying it all year. It came to a point where I was thinking, No one asked me to do this; what will happen if I stop? Then the יֵצֶר הַרָע began telling me that perhaps there is another relative somewhere in the world who is saying קַדְישׁ for my aunt — even though I knew very well that it was impossible — but I was about to give up and forget the whole thing.

"Just then, you came to me and stressed the importance of what I am doing. Your words gave me the momentum to continue saying קדיש until the end of the year."

His friend's voice became choked up, and he began to cry. So did the תַּלְמִיד חָכָם.

R' Eliezer Silver גַדוֹל was a גַדוֹל whose אָהָבָת יִשְׂרָאֵל, love for his fellow Jew, knew no bounds. He helped save tens of thousands of Jews during the WWII era. In 1939, he founded and was president of the וַעָד הַצֶּלָה. He raised over \$5,000,000 to buy not just the freedom, but the lives of many thousands of Jews who were trapped behind enemy lines. [Editor's note: \$5,000,000 during 1939-1945 is worth more than \$300,000,000 by today's standards. In 1939, a loaf of bread cost 8¢, a NY subway ride was 5¢, and an average house cost under \$4,000.]

After the war, he traveled to Europe to visit the DP camps filled with Holocaust survivors. On one such visit, he was encountered by a man who defiantly said, "Rabbi, I will never be a religious Jew!"

"What makes you say that?" asked R' Silver softly.

'I saw something in the camp that I will never forget," he grumbled. "There was a so-called 'religious' man who had smuggled a into the camp. He had the sole סְדּוֹר in the barracks and only agreed to lend it to an inmate on one condition: in return for half a day's ration of bread!

"And what happened?" asked R' Silver curiously.

"Many gave half their bread so that they could use the man's יסדור!" he answered in an angry tone. "I want nothing to do with a religion where a religious person robs starving people of their bread!"

Understanding the young man's pain,

R' Silver addressed him as would a loving father. "My dear son, why do you focus on that one individual who made such a difficult demand? Why not look at the beautiful devotion of all those who gave up their bread just to pray from that יסדור?" The man thought

for a long time and then smiled.

My תַּלְמִיד, this broken man and R' Silver considered the same situation. Yet, they each viewed it very differently! R' Silver saw a side to the story that the man had missed in his anger. If you are hurt, you will often not see the whole picture! Share your frustration with a רֶבִּי or a close friend. Someone else's view of the picture may surprise you.


