1. The Gemara discusses the Mitzva of כבוד אב ואם, when the father asks his son to do something which is an עבירה, for example a כהן asking his son to go into a cemetery. Rashi says that his request was to fetch an אבידה. Why is this necessary for understanding the Gemara, can't we say that the father wanted him to go in and do something for the father? (Pick a flower)?
2. Further to the above, if the father's request was to do a Mitzva of השבת אבידה, wouldn't there now be 2 Mitzvos, listening to a father AND השבת אבידה? Even if one is not דוחה the לאו maybe the Mitzva of השבת אבידה would?
3. When one picks up a lost item his Mitzva isn't done until he delivers the item to its rightful owner. How can we say that the Mitzva of returning an אבידה, should supersede the עבירה for a כהן to become טמא? They are not happening at the same time, since he will not fulfill the Mitzva until sometime in the future, and we have a rule that they must be concurrent.
4. Some ראשונים maintain that the only time that there is a Mitzva of כבוד אב ואם is when a parent requests food, clothing, or similar physical needs, but just listening to them is not included. How would they explain the Gemara in גמרא in דף לא: אמרו, "מכבדו בחייו ומכבדו במותו"?
5. רש"י explains מצוה הכשר as something that can't be performed any other way, he can't fulfill כבוד אב ואם, if he doesn't listen. This is different from יבום where Rashi says it can be fulfilled via חליצה. How does רש"י understand מילה בשבת, the Mitzva of מילה can be fulfilled on Sunday?
6. The way Rashi explains the option of doing חליצה when the יבמה is an ערוה, such as his wife's sister, why wasn't he bothered by this possibility back when we started this discussion on ע"ב דף ג?
7. The Gemara says that בית המקדש is not בן בית. Because both we and the מקדש are obligated in respecting הקב"ה. Isn't the whole purpose of the בית המקדש honoring 'ד'?
