# Haftarah Helper 5780: Eikev

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## Isaiah 49:14-51:3

In this second of the seven haftarot of consolation (Aramaic: שבע דנחמתא), Isaiah calls out to and comforts God's exiled people more intensely than in the first. He states that God has not rejected them and will redeem them even from powerful nations seeking to prevent their return. Conversing with a forlorn Zion (Jerusalem), God reassures "her" that her "children" (the Jewish people) will return to her in large numbers and that her ruins shall be rebuilt. He reassures the minority of exiles who heed his word and return that they will multiply. The prophet also describes the courage God gives him to speak despite powerful opposition.

## Haftarah Breakdown

Verses 49:14-16: God has not forgotten Zion and not abandoned her.

### Verses 50:10-11: ... and God will reject those who do not heed his words.

Verses 51:1-3: As He did for Abraham, God will multiply the small number of returnees.

## **Important Themes**

Zion: A major character in the Haftarah is Zion, who represents Jerusalem and the land of Israel. She is depicted as a mother who has lost her children. However, God promises that he will remember Zion, and return her "children". See verses 49:14-21, 51:3.

## **Other Connections**

The Talmud elaborates on one of the main themes of the Haftarah, the feeling of abandonment by God.

Sanhedrin 105a	סנהדרין ק״ה עמוד א
Shmuel said: Ten people came and sat before the prophet Ezekiel. He said to them: "Repent." They said to Ezekiel: "[In the case of] a slave sold by his owner, or a woman divorced by her husband, does this person have any claim upon that person?" [When God sold or divorced the Jewish people by exiling them, He terminated their mutual covenant.] The Holy One, Blessed be He, said to the prophet: "Go say to them: 'Where is your mother's scroll of severance, with which I sent her away? Or to which of My creditors have I sold you?
