

Lech Lecha: Isaiah 40:27-41:16¹

After the first of the "Seven of Consolation", "Nachamu", which this Haftarah immediately follows in the book of Isaiah, Jewish exiles remain skeptical about whether God cares for them at all. God states that since His dominion as Creator extends to the

ends of the Earth, He controls human history and will surely redeem them.

To demonstrate that control, Isaiah notes God's role in bringing a righteous "conqueror" from the East. The conqueror's identity is disputed. Ibn Ezra and others identify him as Cyrus the Great of Persia, who conquered the ancient Near East and later facilitated the Jews' return from exile to Zion. Malbim identifies the conqueror as the future Messiah. The Talmud, Rashi, and Radak identify the conqueror as Abraham. Born in Ur (in modern-day Iraq), he and his message of righteousness traveled westward to Canaan, which his descendants later conquered physically.²

Regardless, this conqueror advances God's plan for humanity, which other nations unify to oppose. God reassures the vulnerable Jewish exiles scattered around the world that He chose them among the nations because they are descendants of Abraham, whom He loves and who loved Him. God will forever support and protect them, and will strengthen them to defeat their enemies. They, in turn, will praise God.

Haftarah Breakdown

Verse 40:27: Exiled Israel despairs that God no longer cares for them. Perhaps He won't redeem them?

Verses 40:28-31: No! God created the entire Earth, and His power never wanes. God energizes the powerless and those who look to Him. God will easily bring faithful exiles to the Land from afar.

Verses 41:1-4: As Creator, God exists outside of time and human history, directing it with an eternal plan and assembling nations before Him. At God's behest, a righteous conqueror arises from the East.

Verses 41:5-7: Terrified nations and islands assemble, working jointly and mustering their material strength and craftsmanship⁴ to oppose the conqueror.

Isaiah 41:5	ישעיהו מ״א:ו

Verses 41:8-13: God reassures the fearful exiles that as His chosen people and as descendants of His beloved Abraham, He will forever protect them and destroy their enemies.

Verses 41:14-16: Though the exiles may be vulnerable as worms, God will make them powerful so they can easily destroy their enemies. After this destruction, the exiles will rejoice in and praise God.

Connections

A daily morning blessing includes the phrase, הַנּוֹתֵן לַיָּעֵף כְּהַ ("Who gives strength to the weary"), from verse 40:29.

R. Jacob ben Asher's Code of Jewish Law concludes with "Choshen Mishpat," codifying laws relating to judges, courts, and monetary matters. Its opening declares that God loves Abraham's descendants when they devote themselves to God's path of *tzekakah u'mishpat* (righteous justice).

The judge who breaks the high arms of the wicked, taking unjustly held property from them and returning it to its proper owners, sustains the world and completes the will of the Creator who created it to [continue] existing. [Such a judge] becomes, as it were, a partner with [God] in Creation.
