Refer to Daily Dose #2: Avraham is the paradigm of acting industriously. He ran to greet the angels and feed them and he also made sure to fulfill every step of the Akeidah himself and did it as soon as he could. What does this tell us about Avraham as a person? What could it do with the midda of ahava, love, that Avraham is also associated with?

• Do we display the same energy towards things we are less connected to as we do towards things we are excited about? We know right from wrong and still don't feel compelled to always do the right thing. How do we resolve that?

Daily Dose #3: The Gemara (in Kiddushin 29b) says that if one does not have enough money to provide education for himself and for his child, he should spend the money on his own education first. But, if he sees that his child is industrious, he should provide his child with an education. Why is this the case?

• When your child is energized towards their Jewish education, what could you do to capitalize on it? What's the difference in prioritizing yourself versus your child?

Daily Dose #28: The midda of zerizus instills the value of time and how precious it is. How could zerizus teach us how we spend our time in a more productive and meaningful way?

- Time is limited. How does being energetic help us reevaluate our time?
- For a brit milah, many people are careful to make sure that is is done with excitement first thing in the mroning. Why is this an important time to make sure to perform the mitzvah with excited energy?
