Kistler Vineyards is a privately owned and operated winery dedicated to the vinification of world class site specific Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. We currently produce two vineyard designated Pinot Noirs. Each of these wines is crafted from the same clonal material, two small clustered low yielding clones that were imported from a Grand Cru vineyard in Burgundy which we began propagating over 20 years ago.

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A to Z Wineworks’ “The Essence of Oregon” Pinot Noir opens with succulent aromas of red and dark fruit. Cherry, plum, currant, cranberry, cassis, black raspberry and fig mingle with secondary dried herb and spice notes like thyme, vanilla, clove and cacao. This wine is a blend of the most select fruit from ten different Oregon vineyards and tended as 15 different fermentations. Aged in small French oak barrels, the result is a single cuvee crafted to show an Oregon vintage at its best.
