

## **NOTICE TO BUSINESS OWNERS**

In compliance with Utah State Law, section 59-2-306 U.C.A., it is mandatory that every business owner file an annual Signed Statement of Business Personal Property and pay taxes on all furniture, fixtures, equipment, etc. used to operate business, regardless of ownership. The tax is figured by using the item's cost, less depreciation, multiplied by the tax rate. The Assessor's Office will send a packet with detail instructions on how to file and calculate the tax around March of every year. If your business opened after the lien date of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year, the filing and taxes will not be due until May 15<sup>th</sup> of the following year.

If the total market value is less than the exemption amount for that year, you are still required to file by May 15<sup>th</sup>, but you may be exempt from paying the taxes. If the total market value of the items exceeds the exemption amount, you are required to calculate the tax due. You will then need to send the payment along with the list of your equipment and the signed statement by the May 15<sup>th</sup> deadline.

Short term or Nightly Rentals are considered a business and as such will need to complete the signed statement. This is a change that Summit County is implementing beginning 2024. *Primary Residence Exemption* <u>MAY</u> be removed from a property that is being used as a Short Term Rental. You must contact the Assessor's Office to provide us with proof of occupancy for the 183 consecutive days to maintain that exemption.

There is a new requirement for 2023 as part of the Senate Bill 200 that requires the business owner to provide us with their NAICS code. This is a code that is used to classify business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data. This code can be found on your federal tax filing, or you can Google NAICS code and be able to locate it.
