Fire/Evacuation / Venue Incidents	Burns, injuries, fatalities	Participants, staff	<p>Camp Lead to provide briefing at the beginning of the event for all the staff and participants with regards to protocol to follow:</p> <p>In the events of a fire / emergency we will follow the direction / lead of the Camp Lead and Premises H&amp;S Lead</p> <p>Camp Lead is responsible for ensuring that all participants and other staff are safe and well at the meeting point. If they have any concerns, then they should be raised with the premises H&amp;S lead immediately.</p>	M	Camp Lead to get venue information to share at the start of each camp day
Injuries during Easter Camp	Injury to participants	Participants	<p>The nature of sporting camp means that injuries such as falls, sprains, strains and collisions are likely to occur.</p> <p>Camp Lead and other staff should ensure that participants are fit and well to engage in each session/day. If a participant identifies any injuries, then they should not take part until First Aid assessment has taken place.</p>	M	No further action required



			<p>down – before being permitted to join back in.</p> <p>Participants asked to wear suitable attire for activity prior to the event at the time of booking.</p> <p>Sharp objects such as jewellery to be removed prior to participation, checked by the parents/guardians and coaches</p>		
Equipment and playing area	Injury caused by equipment or playing area	Participants, Staff	<p>Camp Lead to ensure that equipment is set-up safely and remains safe throughout the day. The Camp Lead should also check for any additional hazards before the commencement of play and ensure that the playing area is safe for activity</p> <p>Any equipment such as tables and chairs, and belongings such as bags or clothing should be clear of the playing area ideally at least 2 metres from the playing area.</p> <p>Any spillages or debris on the playing surface should be cleared immediately before play resumes.</p> <p>Equipment used is appropriate for age &amp; size of participants and for the activity being delivered.</p> <p>Checking the equipment before use making sure it is put up properly, dismantled correctly and then stored safely either at the event or back in the van.</p>	M	<p>Sports Centre/Premises staff to check facilities regularly as part of their own risk assessment.</p> <p>Camp Lead to do the same prior to the participants arrival. .</p>

			<p>Ensure that it is in full working order.</p> <p>PAT testing – Ensure all electrical equipment is fully PAT tested and in full working order.</p> <p>Advise participants &amp; staff to take care using equipment. Where equipment is to be used that has been individually risk assessed, all staff must be provided relevant guidance for using this equipment.</p>		
Crowd management	Injuries to spectators	Spectators	<p>No capacity for spectators and not allowed. This is in line with our safeguarding policy. Parents/guardians can only attend to drop off and pick up. They are not permitted to stay on site</p>	M	Camp Lead/ Spor-t learning Ltd to share code of conduct with parents/guardians at time of booking
Safeguarding	Safeguarding incidents at events	Participants, Staff	<p>Spor-T Learning Netball camp will follow Spor-t Learning Ltd.'s Safeguarding policy</p> <p>The Camp Lead will ensure that the camp is run safely and in line with the Spor-T Learning Ltd safeguarding policy</p> <p>Parents/Guardians who do not wish for their participant to be photographed can request this at the time of booking.</p> <p>There may be other people / events on site who are not linked to the easter Netball Camp. Parents/guardians and participants will be made aware of this at booking/on the day. Participants will always remain with netball camp staff and will</p>	M	Parents/Guardians to be reminded of photography policies

			<p>be advised/escorted to toilet facilities that they can use.</p> <p>Staff need to be vigilant regarding suspicious looking behaviour and let camp Lead know of any suspicious behaviour.</p> <p>Camp Lead is responsible for the dismissal of all participants from site to parent / carers /guardians</p>		
Weather	The weather causing injuries or a negative experience for participants	Participants, staff	<p>Weather conditions, and where appropriate forecasts, to be monitored prior to the sessions and during the event. Where the camp lead deems the weather will make participants unsafe or unenjoyable, they will cancel or reallocate the session. Camp Lead to assess weather conditions in terms of health and safety to participants and adjust or cancel the session if necessary.</p> <p>If area becomes wet following rain, activities may have to be cancelled / adapted.</p> <p>Participants will be asked to check their shoes are fit for purpose – ie slips in wet weather</p> <p>Advise participants to drink &amp; have water with them /wear sun hats / use sun cream.</p>	M	No further action required
