## Cal OSHA Proposed ETS revisions

- May 7, 2021- Proposed revisions were published and were up for a vote by the Standards Board on May 20th
- May 20, 2020 The Standards Board held over the critical vote at the request of the Division of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH) because they want to redo the revisions in accord with the Center for Disease Control (CDC)
- May 28, 2021-Board will post the updated revisions for public comment
- June 3, 2021 Emergency Session, Board will vote on updated revisions
- June 15, 2021-The new emergency language will be in place for the State of California re-opening without masks
- The new ETS are expected to be limited to the vaccination issue

## Safely Cleaning and Disinfecting Facilities

## **Definitions: (According to the CDC)**

- Cleaning The removal of dirt and impurities, including germs, from surfaces.
- Disinfecting –works by using chemicals to kill germs on surfaces.





## Safely Cleaning and Disinfecting Facilities

#### **Cleaning**

- Clean surfaces using soap and water
- Daily sanitizing of surfaces and frequently touched items.
- If surfaces and/or objects are visibly soiled.
- Remove trash.
- Wipe heat and air conditioning vents.
- Dust and wet mop floors.
- Clean windows.
- Clean and either sweep or vacuum the Floors at least once each day.






## Safely Cleaning and Disinfecting Facilities

#### **Disinfecting**

- Use of <u>EPA Registered</u> disinfectants
  - Contact time
  - Ventilation
- Read Labels, Follow Directions for Use
  - Pre-clean dirty surfaces
  - Contact (Dwell) Time
  - PPE
  - Wash hands
  - Lock it up
- Be aware of state specific Pesticide registrations, application rules





## Suggested COVID19 Cleaning and Disinfection Process



#### **GET READY**

1 person to spray/mist

2-3 staff to detail disinfect

Misting machine (options below)

Spray bottles and disposable cloths

Mix disinfectant according to manufacturers' recommendations

Pay attention to mixing instructions and "cure" times



#### DON PPE

Spray teams: Goggles, mask, gloves

Wipe teams: Gloves and goggles (for splash protection)

Always follow MSDS and manufacturer's recommendation PLUS local/organizational rules



#### **SPRAY**

Spray technician/teams mist both high touch and general areas

Mist only - don't drown surfaces

Use forms, checklists, or timekeepers to make sure correct dwell time is reached



#### WIPE

AFTER dwell time has been reached

Wiping teams begin spray and wipe of high touch areas (door knobs, light switches, marker boards, pencil sharpeners, learning areas, etc.)



#### SPRAY?

Second spray completely optional

Done in the same manner as first spray
