BIOGRAPHY

Dwayne Davis is a 30 year old German and African-American male born on February 27th, 1991. He was born in Stuttgart, Germany. His father, Roosevelt Davis, served in the U.S. Army as an infantry soldier. While stationed in Germany he met Dwayne's german mother, Michaela. After his 1st birthday Dwayne and his mother's family moved to his father's hometown in the US, Washington, Georgia.

Dwayne grew up in a trailer park for most of his childhood, and had some of his best childhood experiences there. He began playing football and baseball at the age of 7. And he continued playing sports throughout his life and academic career. His mother and family worked so hard to insure he had all that he needed. Dwayne is considered an exceptional individual to his family, classmates in school and more. He excelled in and outside of school, and was an honor student during his entire academic career. In addition to that Dwayne was also honored to become class president for all of his 4 years in high school. He won Prom Prince and Prom King his junior and senior year and he also won Homecoming King.

Dwayne had a few paths he could have taken in his life after high school. He thought of joining the military like his father, pursuing his childhood dream of becoming a NFL Football player, or attending medical school to become a doctor. However, something personal inspired the decision he made. His aunt, Tatjana, on his mother's side could not complete her matriculation at Georgia State University of becoming a doctor due to some unfortunate reasons. Family is huge to Dwayne so those occurrences inspired Dwayne to make the decision he made. He chose to pursue and finish what his aunt couldn't, and got accepted into college. That's where he majored in PreMed Biology at Fort Valley State University and made academics his main focus. But that didn't stop him from working on his personal goals and getting involved in extracurricular activities during college as well! His freshman year he decided that he wanted to lose weight and work on his fitness. He went from 242 to 164 within a years time.

His sophomore year he had an encounter with a football coach on campus. One thing led to another and Dwayne became the starting Long Snapper for Fort Valley State University. Dwayne had NFL qualifying times for snapping and his coach said if he wanted to continue playing football, then he could have scouts come look at him. Dwayne turned down that opportunity and decided to continue focusing on his academic career. He also auditioned and became a model for Royal Elite Modeling Troupe. He participated in many school organizations such as political science, Black Men With Initiative Inc, Student Counsel, Public Speaking, Music, Research, Art, etc. He completed college as a Cum Laude honor graduate. He continued his studies as a massage therapist after undergrad. That was until he received his acceptance into medical school in the Caribbean at Saint James School of Medicine.

On August 11th, 2014 Dwayne experienced a traumatic motorcycle accident where he had a stage 4 brain injury and flatlined 5 times. This event prevented him from attending medical school. He received so much support from his family and friends during his recovery. After recovery, he got accepted into the Doctor of Chiropractic program at Life University in Atlanta, Ga. Due to personal and financial complications he withdrew from school there and landed a career opportunity in the Middle East, Kuwait. He also worked as a Secret Clearance leveled logistics coordinator for MCT-AIR on Al Asad, Iraq military air base. He experienced and survived an Iranian ballistic missiles attack while contracting in Iraq which led to him demobilizing back to his home in America. Dwayne Davis currently resides in Atlanta, GA as a mental health assistant at a children and adolescent residential and acute psychiatric hospital. He is the father of a son, Cayden, and daughter, Ninah, both residing with their mothers in Miami, Florida and St. Louis, Missouri.
