

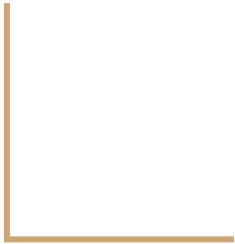

Cultural diversity


Linguistic diversity

Very soft type of coordination between players

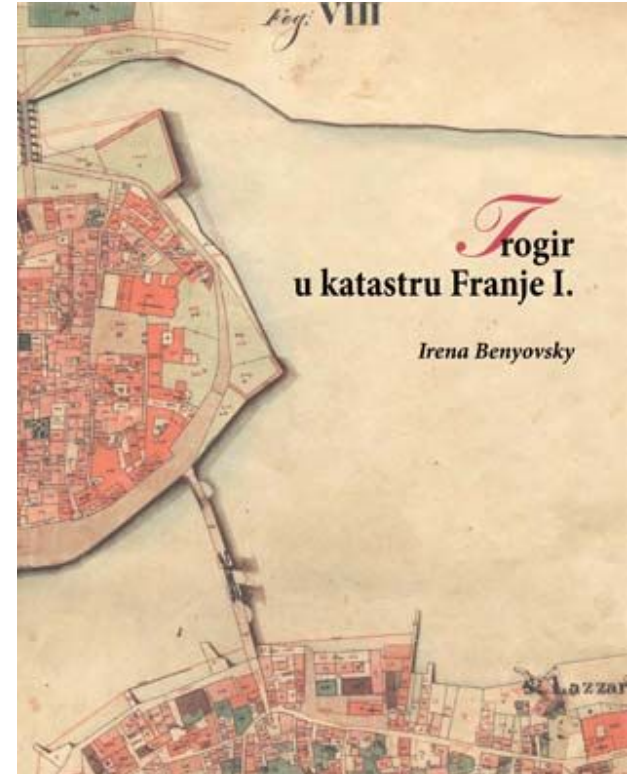
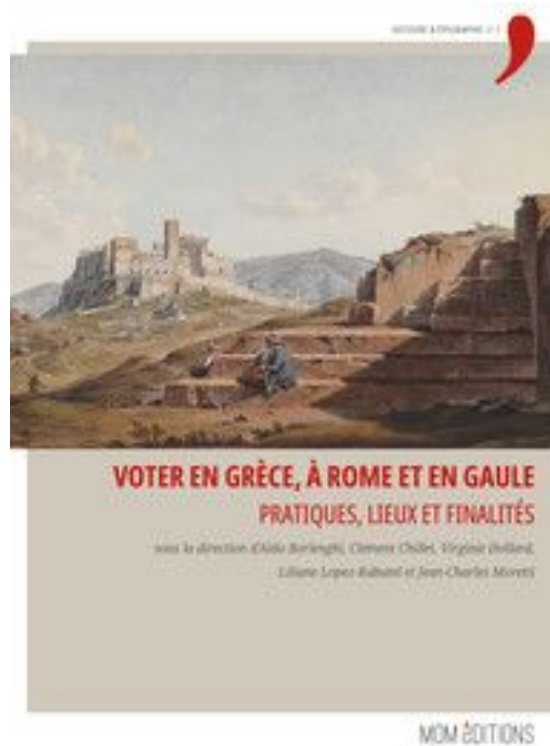
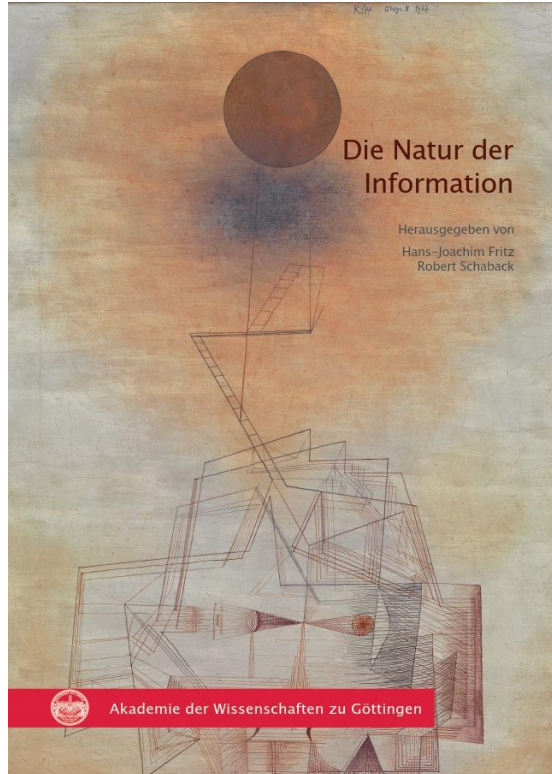

T4.1 Common access point to services (M5-M11) [Task leader: UNITO; Participants: Lexis, OC, EGI]

The main objective of this task is to help researchers in their selection of an appropriate publishing venue and, generally, of a scholarly communication strategy. To this end, the task will proceed in listing the relevant services provided by the OPERAS infrastructure nodes in a central directory, and will design a portal to allow researchers select and access the service that best corresponds to their needs. In addition, the task will design a wizard and a series of guiding questions based on the outputs of the OPERAS Design Study regarding services dedicated to open scholarly communication. As the OPERAS Design Study highlighted the necessity to build a web of services relying on complementary and interconnected tools, the proposed portal will serve as a component of a comprehensive toolbox and will interoperate with the 3 central platforms of the OPERAS RI, thus ensuring trans-national access to the inclusive scholarly communication ecosystem of the RI.

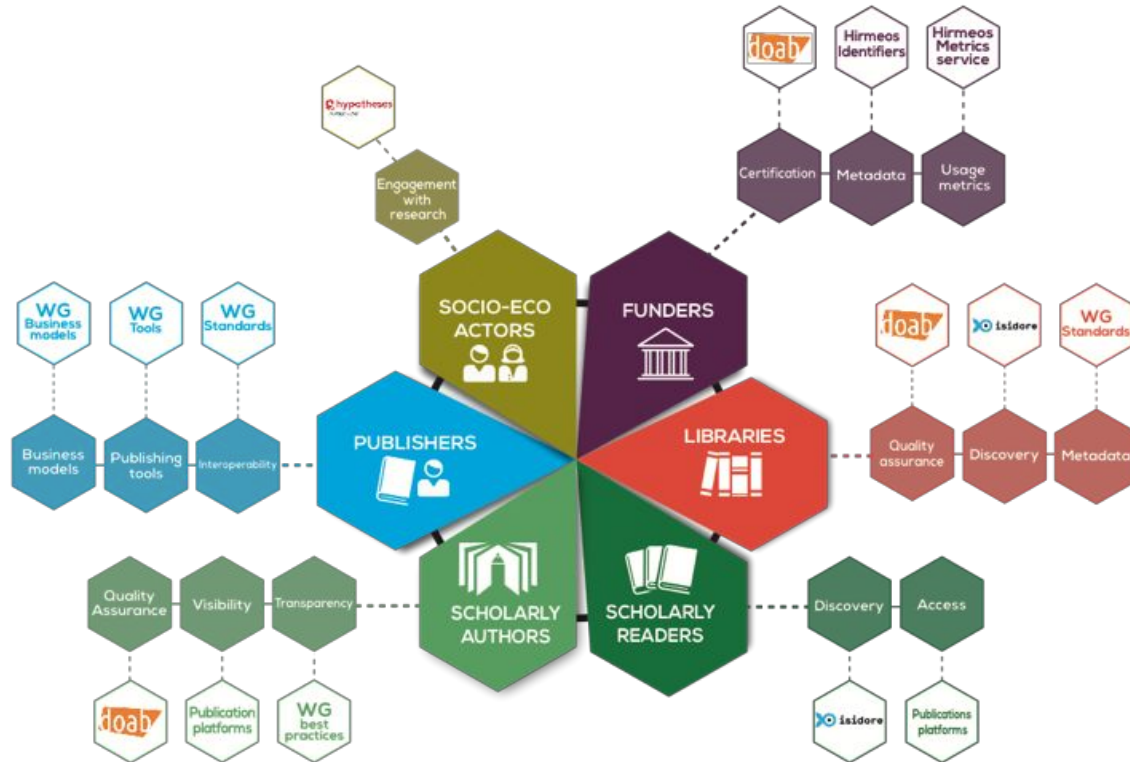

Discovery Platform



A European discovery platform for SSH resources

- Increasing the access, reuse of SSH data, profiles and projects by providing a co-designed adaptive solution to connect together researchers, resources and society
- Based on Isidore service developed by Huma-Num (CNRS)
- Developed in project H2020 TRIPLE (2019-2023)

Certification

A certification service for peer review procedures and open licenses, at the level of publishers, books, and book chapters

- Development within HIRMEOS project
- Pilot implementation for HIRMEOS platforms

DOAB has certified the Peer Review Process for 1 Peer Review type(s):

- **What** - What is being reviewed?: Book proposal & Full manuscript
- **Who** - Who conducts the peer review? Multiple peer reviewers & Editorial board
- **How** - What is the level of openness? Double blind peer review
- **When** - At what stage is the peer review being conducted? After submission
- Peer review is overseen by: Editorial board or committee

Metrics

Giving a better representation of usage on books by delivering three complementary types of measures (downloads, citations and alternative metrics)

- An Altmetrics Service capable of extracting references to DOIs made via Twitter, Hypothes.is and Wikipedia
- A Citations Service capable of querying CrossRef's Cited-by service, and store the relevant citations to DOIs;
- An OA Metrics Service capable of collecting readership and downloads statistics from Google Analytics, Google Books, World Reader, OAPEN, the Classics Library, Wikimedia, Unglue.it, OpenEdition, and Web Server Logs
- A widget that displays the metrics collected and provides a consistent and reliable visual reference for metrics

- 1 En 2010, le quotidien suisse *Le Temps*¹ publia un appel en vue de préparer, pour 2013, le centenaire de la mort du linguiste Ferdinand de Saussure. La présidente du cercle Ferdinand de Saussure demanda aux Genevois de fouiller dans leur « grenier » pour trouver des notes d'étudiants qui auraient assisté, entre 1906 et 1911, aux cours du linguiste. Une demande qui s'explique par le fait que l'œuvre de Saussure, et plus particulièrement son cours de linguistique général, résulte d'un montage réalisé par deux auditeurs, les linguistes Charles Bally et Albert Sechehaye qui, en comparant plusieurs cahiers d'étudiants, ont pu réaliser une première synthèse de ses enseignements. La découverte d'autres cahiers conservés au département des manuscrits de la Bibliothèque de Genève a permis de préciser des points de théorie controversés².
- 2 C'est en 2013 qu'un autre « dossier » d'archives défraya la chronique³ : la vente des documents et des manuscrits inédits de Michel Foucault à la BNF (quatre-vingt-dix boîtes, soit un volume de trente-sept mille feuillets d'archives personnelles). L'institution possédait déjà deux manuscrits du philosophe : la première version de *l'Archéologie du savoir* et plusieurs

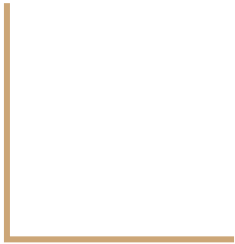


Research for Society service

An integrated and innovative framework to host, support and develop Citizen Science practices in the SSH

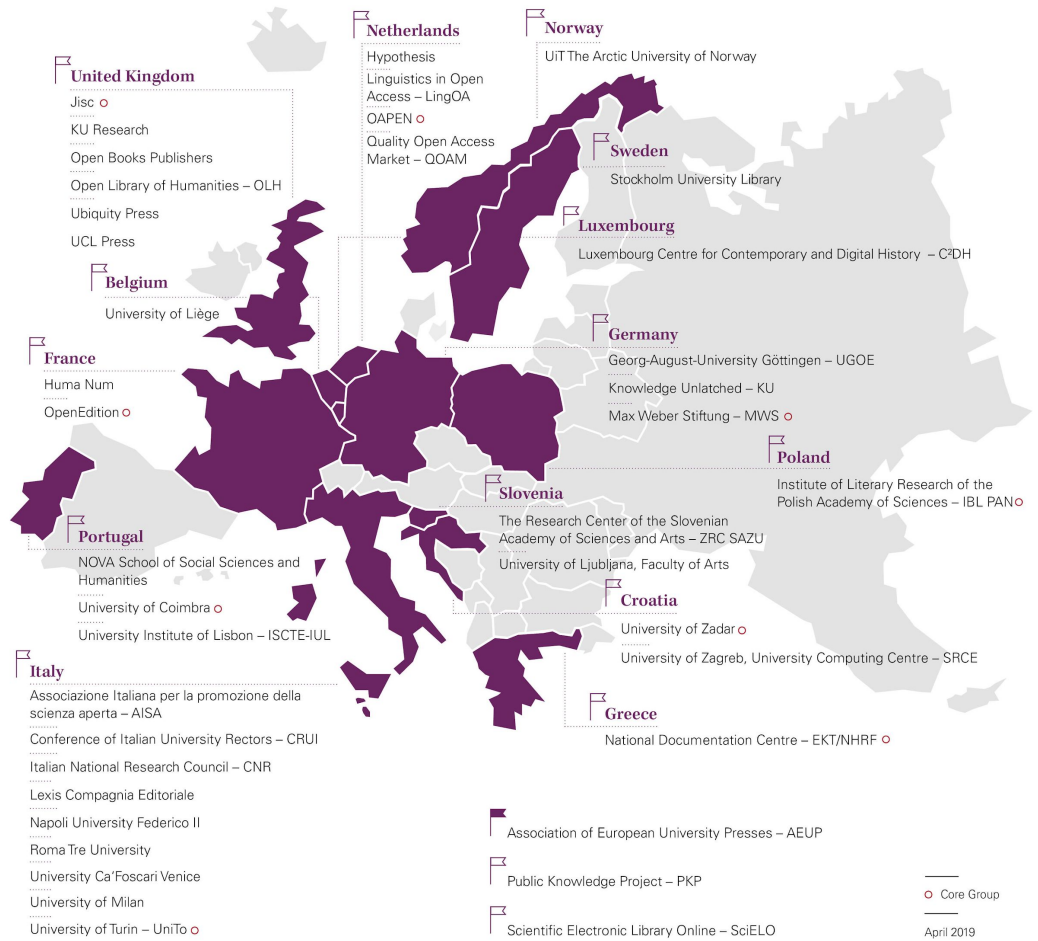
- Providing collaborative tools through a specific virtual ecosystem

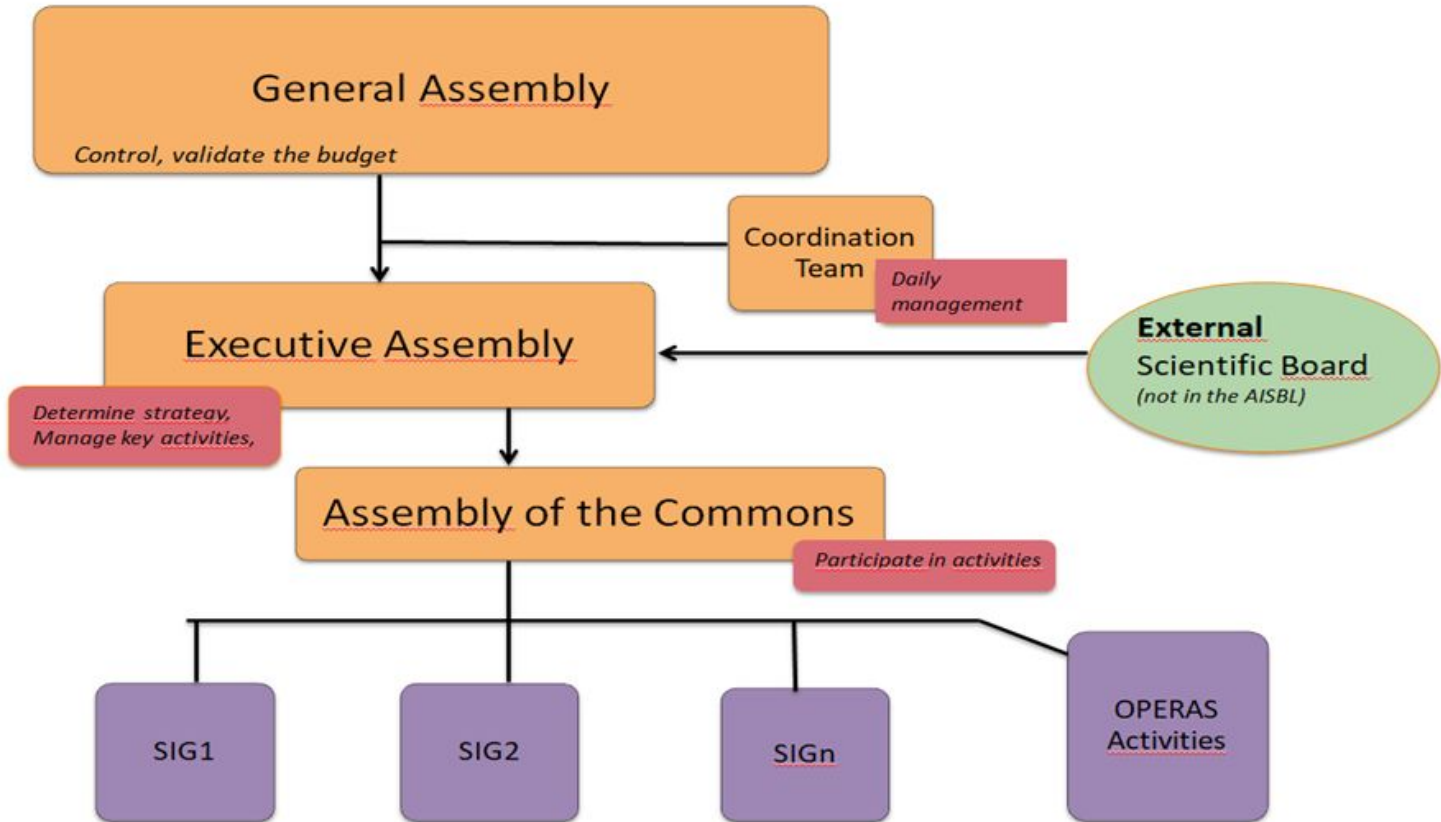

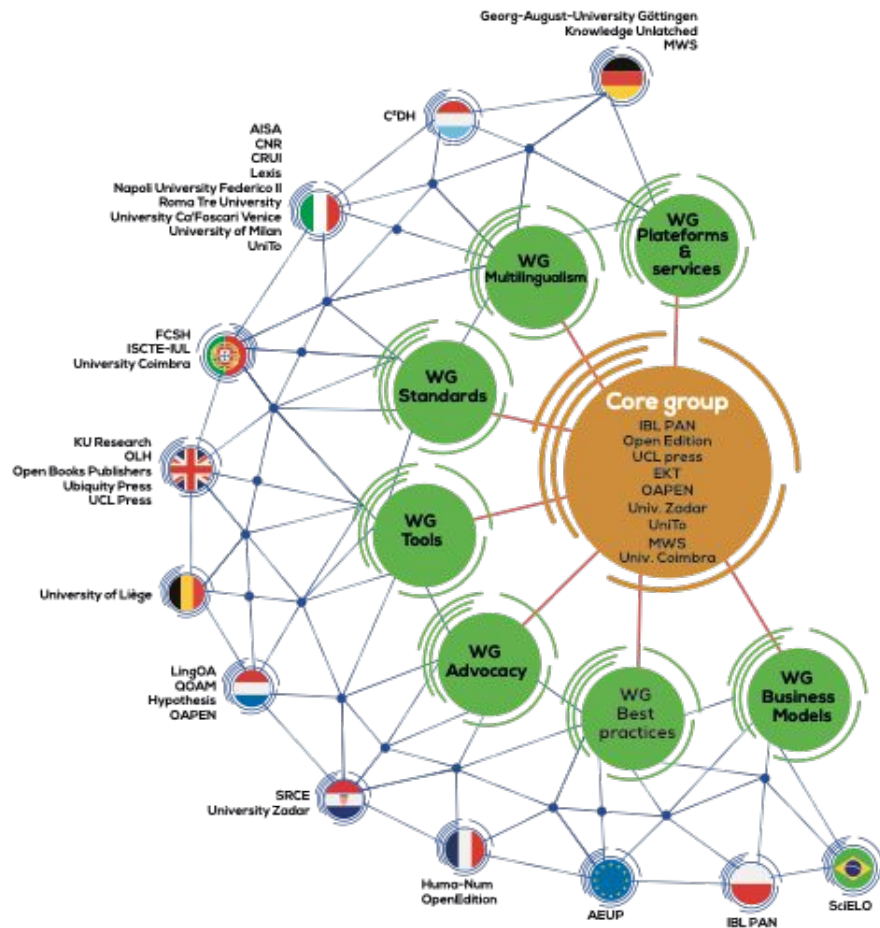
OPERAS future entity and its stakeholders
