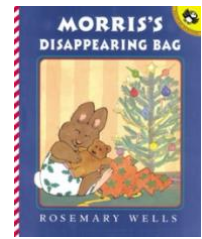


# Morris's Disappearing Bag

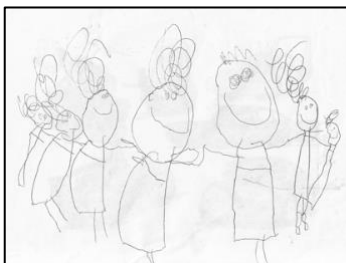


## Play Guess the Object!



1. Place objects you find around the house into separate paper or gift bags so your kids cannot see them. Objects can include:
  - Paper clips
  - Flashlight
  - Kitchen spoon
  - Napkins
  - Books
  - Sunglasses
  - Stuffed toy
  - Wire hanger
  - Pencil
  - TV remote
  - Socks
  - Apple
  - Toothbrush
  
2. Have children ask questions about the contents of each bag and see if children can identify the objects inside the packages by listening to your answers to their questions.
  - Helpful questions:
    - Is this object used in the kitchen?
    - Does it make a sound?
    - Is it soft? Is it hard?
    - Have I used this object today?
  
3. For younger children, you can play this game by letting your kids close their eyes, reach into the bag, and feel the object to try and guess what it is.

## Draw a Family Picture



In the story, Morris has a lot of siblings in his family. What does your family look like? Have your child draw a picture of your family playing together. Ask questions like:

- What is your favorite thing we do as a family?
- Why is that your favorite?
- How do you practice sharing when we play together, like Morris and his siblings did?
