During the 2019-2020 season, we served more than 24,000 students, educators, community members, and patrons in our theatres and through virtual programs. Our goal is to use theatre to promote social equity through three core program areas.

## **TEACHING AND LEARNING**

We partner with schools and educators throughout the five boroughs of New York City to enrich students' social and emotional learning and bring new dimensions to how teachers teach.



created tailored residencies and programming in 21 NYC public schools reaching 3,250 STUDENTS.



#### **THEATRE ACCESS**

supplied free and discounted tickets and wraparound programming for thousands of **STUDENTS** and **EDUCATORS** across NYC, the United States, and internationally.

# **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

provided skill-building workshops exploring theatrical teaching tools across all subject areas for 861 EDUCATORS.



#### **ROUNDABOUT YOUTH ENSEMBLE (RYE)**

developed collaborative and leadership skills through a student-led theatre company for **119 STUDENTS** representing all five NYC boroughs.

# **DURING THE SHUTDOWN**

In addition to continued service in remote classrooms to students and teachers, RYE participants from across NYC met online to create *Hidden Truths,* a world-premiere play inspired by Shakespeare's Othello, that brings to light injustices experienced by the Black community. Students wrote and produced every aspect of the show that premiered digitally in August 2020.



# **CAREER TRAINING**

We foster the next generation of theatre professionals through career and workforce development programs.



#### HIDDEN CAREER PATH DAYS

introduced theatre careers and provided skill-building opportunities for **179 YOUNG PEOPLE**.



## CAREER DEVELOPMENT

employed and trained 14 FULL-TIME APPRENTICES and **INTERNS**, beginning their careers in arts administration.



# THEATRICAL WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (TWDP)

provided over 1,380 HOURS of hands-on and remote technical training to a new cohort of 20 FELLOWS.

# **DURING THE SHUTDOWN**

TWDP Cohort 4 took part in remote training and assembled a digital sharing of their at-home learning in May 2020. Fellows' work included home improvement carpentry projects, DIY wardrobe repair, explorations in scenic painting, and more.
