



Jason Robards Award for Excellence in Theatre

The Jason Robards Award for Excellence in Theatre is given to individuals and organizations who have made an indelible impact on the theatre world. It is named to honor his lifelong commitment to theatre and his incredible support of Roundabout both on stage and off. In 1994, Jason Robards made his Roundabout debut in the first New York revival of Harold Pinter's No Man's Land with his dear friend. Christopher Plummer. Soon after, he and Chris joined Roundabout's Board of Directors and worked tirelessly to support Artistic Director Haimes's idea to create a second, Off-Broadway stage that would be a home to new plays by today's greatest writers. He became our distinguished Artist-in-Residence during the inaugural 1995-96 season at the Laura Pels Theatre with performances in Pinter's Moonlight and Brian Friel's Molly Sweeney and served as a member of Roundabout's Board until his death in 2000.

THE RUDIN FAMILY

Ovation Award for Excellence in Philanthropy

The Ovation Award for Excellence in Philanthropy is awarded to those who are committed to promoting the essential work of a cultural not-for-profit like Roundabout: spotlighting classics from the past, cultivating new works of the present, and educating minds for the future. The Ovation Award, introduced in 2017 to recipient Dr. Leonard Tow, honors individuals who have committed to growing New York City arts and culture with their philanthropy to Roundabout and the theatre community.

The award was designed by sculptor Arthur Carter, whose bronze and steel sculptures have been exhibited in New York, Paris, and around the globe.



"UNLEASHING BEAUTY"

KENNY LEON SHEDS LIGHT ON THE DIRECTOR'S ART

WHEN Kenny Leon lights a fire under a great play, the canon roars. As one of the most sought-after directors on Broadway and beyond, he counts among his credits a stunning array of past productions.

He made his directorial debut on Broadway in 2004 with a stellar revival of Lorraine Hansberry's *A Raisin in the Sun*, featuring Audra McDonald, Phylicia Rashad, and Sean "Diddy" Combs. One success after another followed, a progression that propelled him to the helm of plays by August Wilson, Suzan-Lori Parks, Lydia Diamond, Adrienne Kennedy, Mark Medoff, and Katori Hall

Leon's affiliation with Roundabout Theatre Company began in 2020 with Charles Fuller's A Soldier's Play, which was nominated for seven Tony Awards, and won two, including Best Revival of a Play. His Broadway work continues to accelerate: his production of Parks's Topdog/Underdog garnered the 2023 Tony for Best Revival of a Play, and he was represented this season by the first-ever Broadway remounting of Ossie Davis's Purlie Victorious, a Non-Confederate Romp Through the Cotton Patch, starring Leslie Odom Jr. Next season, he moves on to Thornton Wilder, and a Broadway revival of a seminal American play, Our Town.

Who might more aptly be honored by Roundabout, where Leon now serves as Senior Resident Director? I recently had the opportunity to talk to the Florida-born director about his wide-ranging career, as he took a few minutes to catch his breath and reflect on his achievements and aspirations.

I GREW UP POOR, YOU KNOW, THAT'S WHO I AM. I CAN'T RUN AWAY FROM THAT.

From Adrienne Kennedy to *Topdog* to *Purlie*, Kenny, you're revealing the amazing variety of voices that we should be hearing on big stages.

Thank you so much, Peter. I'm just listening more, and with more confidence and more appreciation for those writers. I love that connection between the writer and the director. The basket has just seemed really big in the last four or five years. So I'm like, okay, let me keep riding that.

How do you tailor yourself to those different voices? What resources do you use to find your way?

They all speak to each other. I'm trying to speak to human beings who are on the planet today. I'm never trying to do a museum piece. I'm trying to say, for example, how can you get *Topdog* to touch multigenerational audiences today? And how can I make it easy for my fellow human beings to feel what I feel?

It's interesting to hear the amount of experience you've acquired and the way that has bolstered you. Over time, I get a broader sense of what intrigues you. Each time is a surprise to me. You can't put your work in a box.

We're unique and specific to our own DNA. And the more we dig into who we are — I'm a country boy from Tallahassee, Florida. I grew up poor, you know, that's who I am. I can't run away from that. So when

approach Shakespeare, say, I have a code word in rehearsal. If I say 'Leroy,' that means I don't understand what [an actor] is talking about. Leroy was my biological father, who

never went anyplace. So I am always like, "You've got to make it plain for Leroy."

Now we've got to talk about where Kenny Leon came from.

My mom was 15 when I was born. And then she was pregnant with my brother. And my sister was 2 years old. And then my mother, Annie Ruth, left Tallahassee to go to St. Petersburg, Florida, to make a better life for us. She left me with my grandmother who had thirteen children. My grandmother raised me in the early part of my life. Then in third grade I came down to join my mother and my stepfather in St. Petersburg.

Where did you get the artistic inspiration?

In ninth grade, I got into a program called Upward Bound. Angela Bassett was there — we're still friends. I had to take college [preparatory] classes. And in the summertime we did sports and we studied. I didn't have a chance of going to college without that program. When I graduated high school, I said one thing I want to do is go to a historically Black school, to learn more about my own culture. I ended up going

to Clark College in Atlanta and I met [Atlanta Mayor] Maynard Jackson, who became a mentor.

And then during that time I met my other mentor, Samuel L. Jackson. I saw him and LaTanya [Richardson, Jackson's future wife] in a play when they were 17 years old.

What was the play?

You're gonna laugh. It was Home.

By Samm-Art Williams? And you're about to direct it!

So I majored in poli sci undergrad; theatre was my minor. And then, I went to law school.

Law school? How long did you last?

About half a year. [He laughs.]

When I left law school, I had to decide how I was going to eat. In Atlanta, I auditioned for the Academy of Music and Theater, and I got in. And so then I was doing things like this homeless project where

we recruited homeless people, taught them acting skills. I learned a lot. So I was acting, doing plays. I was a pretty good actor; I did a lot of TV in Atlanta, and then I got an opportunity to direct a play for that same company, a play called *The Wishing Place* by Beverly Trader Austin. It's a great play. And I had a great experience with it. I was like, "Oh my God, I've never felt like this before." Up to this point, I've just been acting. And I told the artistic director, who was a



I know you got into prestigious directing programs, and worked in theatres on both coasts. But what kind of theatre experiences helped define you as a director?

In 1987, I went with a group to New York, to see this play by this new writer. And we take a bus, and I go there, and it was Fences. Yes, it's Fences. I meet August Wilson! And seeing the play — it's about Pittsburgh, but it's also about Tallahassee: I know what it feels like when you put a straightening comb on a hot iron, and I know what it feels when my brother stands at the door, eating a piece of watermelon, looking out the screen door. So all the cultural things — I'm getting chills, because I realized, "My God, theatre can be more than just a play."

So you spent time directing in San Jose and around the country, and then when did New York happen for you?

George C. Wolfe brought me to New York in 1999, to direct *Everybody's Ruby* with Viola Davis at The Public. That was my first, and so I did that and then commercial theatre. I think God really blessed me to, to tell these stories.


The point at which I met up with you, in a sense, was when you brought your Atlanta company, True Colors Theatre, to D.C. several years later. At the time, that was a pioneering venture.

People said I should start a national Black theatre company. I didn't want to do that. But I did want [a company] that would do African American work at the center, and do Anglo-European plays on the edges.

Franklin Because most regional theatres, they did Anglo-European work, and they diversified on the edges. And so it will be a different kind of company. And it needs to be in three cities. It'll be Atlanta, D.C., and New York. Now, they're focused on Atlanta, and going into year 20. They've got a great artistic director, Jamil Jude.

What really propelled you onto Broadway?

What got me in and onto Broadway was the play that I did there twice, and

I won the Tony the second time I did it: A Raisin in the Sun. Even though the first time I did it required more skill. The estate demanded that the person that will bring A Raisin in the Sun back to Broadway had to be a person of color. And it took 50 years for that to happen.

Whose idea was it to cast Sean Combs, Diddy, in the 2004 version, as Walter Younger Jr.?

Susan Batson [the actress and acting coach] called and said "What about Sean Combs? I've been giving him classes. He's never acted before, but I think he might have what you need." And I said, "Look at this point, if he's willing to audition..." And he auditioned and I told him the truth. I said, "You have honesty, but

no technique. Where you can get that technique, is by tying yourself to me." And he allowed me to teach him on the spot. And what I loved about that company was that you had Audra McDonald and Sanaa Lathan and Phylicia Rashad and Bill Nunn, from their various backgrounds, all together. I thought it was a testament actually, to Lorraine Hansberry.

And the range of her talent.

Yes. I always attacked all plays. And revivals, I attack them as if they're new plays. So I'm not just thinking about like, the time we're living in. I'm also thinking about who's in the [rehearsal] room. Directing 101 is know who's in the room. So if you're in the room with Denzel Washington [Walter Younger Jr. in Leon's 2014 revival], one of the most amazing actors on the planet, you have to just create access for him to flow into the space so that you are creating with what's in the room.

There's something you do to bring out some magnetic quality in an actor, like a David Alan Grier or a Corey Hawkins. What is that? Is it intuitive? Is it technical?

My job is to unleash their beauty and give them a safe space to create. And sometimes you have to unapologetically tell them the truth and push them. Sometimes you have to laugh with them. And it's what I tell every cast. I say, "I'm interested in your next job. More than I'm interested in this job."

What do you mean?

"I want you to be a better actor with this job. I want you to discover something about yourself." I promise all actors. I say, "You got me 24/7. You got me until this play closes." So Yahya Mateen and Corey Hawkins

[the stars of Leon's 2022 *Topdog/Underdog*] they had that permission. And they did call me at 3 a.m. to say, "Hey, man, I'm up. I'm thinking about this..."

In *Purlie Victorious*, a satire about racism in America that's both raw and funny, you decided to start it in a refreshingly new way.

I said, "I'm going to put the clothes rack [with all the characters' costumes] on the stage. I'm going to have all the [Black and White] actors come out and kiss each other." You know, we gave the audience permission to laugh.

I saw it with an audience that was almost 50-50 Black and White. And, you know, that moment, the way you set it up, did feel as if we were all giving each other permission to laugh.

The play is so close to what ails America. You know, I mean, he wrote this 62 years ago.

So soon enough, you'll be doing *Our Town* on Broadway. And you're casting it now?

Yeah, I can't say anything about it, but it's good. I had mentioned *Our Town* to Todd [Haimes] before he passed away, and he said, "I want to be involved!" He was a person who gave an artist space. He took chances. He always told you the truth, and in our business, we don't run into that many people who tell you the truth, even when it's tough news. So I think about him every day.

Part of me is doing *Our Town* in memory of Todd, and for his believing in me as an artist. And now this particular artist gets to do an *Our Town* for our time.

Excellence in Philanthropy believe fighting for the arts and for the city to be two parts of one mission. "Theatre is an enormous economic driver for the city of course," says Rudin Co-Chairman Bill Rudin, "but it is so much more than that. It is a magnet for talent. We cannot underestimate the creativity the theatre brings to New York, and that is vital, which is why we believe supporting theatre, and attending it, is critical." Samantha Rudin Earls, Roundabout Board Member, agrees. "People see New York as one of the greatest melting pots in the world, and theatre is a symbol of that. It is the promise that whether you are performing on stage or are in the audience, this art allows you

to be whoever you want to be. New York is about building a dream— that is also the foundation of great theatre."

There is a long Rudin family tradition of investing in New York — the legendary power breakfast Lew Rudin held at the Regency that saved New York from bankruptcy in the 1970s and led to the

establishment of the Association for A Better New York is but one example, the founding of the New York Marathon another. "We are devoted to this city that is about transformation and change," says Bill Rudin. "Theatre is about that, but also allows us all to have an experience all together as one. It is simple, but it is revolutionary too." Samantha points to history to underline the importance of the arts, and, true to Rudin real estate form, urban planning: "Theatre is medicine. In ancient Greece, theatres were built next to the hospitals because the Greeks understood the ability for theatre to heal." It is a fact that reflects the driving force behind all the family's philanthropy. "Yes," she adds, "this is about supporting the arts, but it's also about supporting one another."

Is the philanthropy gene inherited? It would seem to be. Evidence of the Rudin legacy of giving is present all over New York, but this family trait is one that is passed down

and consistently nurtured. If you have ever questioned the value of taking your children to the theatre, take note. "When Samantha and Michael were around 5 or 6 years old," says Bill, "Ophelia and I took them to see Jerome Robbins' Broadway. There were people around us who could not believe these young children were there, completely absorbed in this show. But exposure from a young age is key," he says, "it's like getting them on skis early. My mother, Gladyce, and father, Lew, had done the same thing for my sister, Beth, and myself growing up," he says, "They exposed us to theatre and art and taught us what an important part it played in being a true New Yorker. My father was on the Board of Lincoln Center Theater and worked with a group of other members to revive it. He was a major force in the redevelopment of Times Square. He was so happy to be a part of that, and now this theatre tradition continues with Samantha and David taking our granddaughter Elle to shows. She's seen it all: Phantom, Six. & Juliet. How to Dance in Ohio, and Back to the Future to name a few. Our whole family believes in championing theatre and the arts: Beth was a long-time Board Member of the Brooklyn Academy of Music, our cousin Fiona is a Broadway producer and Chair of the New Victory Theater, and David is on the Board of the Perelman Performing Arts Center."

For Samantha, that early family exposure led to the theatre equivalent of skiing black diamonds. Now Co-Chief Executive Officer of Rudin, she studied and trained in theatre at NYU and seriously contemplated a life performing in it. She had experienced the power of theatre profoundly. "I remember so vividly seeing Long Day's Journey Into Night with Brian Dennehy and Vanessa Redgrave in 2003 with my grandmother. During the intermission something happened to me, and I just started to sob. The actors' performances went directly into my system, and it's what theatre, at its best, can do. It can impact and change your outlook. You come out of it, and you want to change the world. It is a huge honor to be on the Board of Roundabout and exposed to so many talented artists, and to have known the legendary Todd Haimes." She cites other highlights of her lifetime love of theatre: "Jeffrey Wright in Topdog/Underdog. Alan Cumming and Natasha Richardson in Cabaret in 1998. I went to see Cabaret with my friends for my 14th birthday. Watching Alan in that production was another pivotal moment in my life; his performance was transcendent." The influence of the arts is clear not only in her continued patronage but in her approach to the family business. How is a real estate project like a play? "I thought about this when we were developing the Greenwich Lane," says Samantha, "and real estate sometimes reminds me of a production. There is the collaboration between different teams, and the ethos of creating something together, and then there is the "opening," or the unveiling, and the audience, or the people, come to see what you have created."

"People who love the theatre really fight for it," says Bill Rudin, "and it requires powerful moves to survive but it is something we must protect. Roundabout has such a strong structure and foundation to do just that. Being a part of this allows our family to know and to be connected with such a deep part of us. The mission continues."

Congratulations to the Rudin Family on this incredibly deserved honor and thank you for continuing always to fight for the theatre, and for New York.


