DANNY DEVITO

Jason Robards Award for Excellence in Theatre

The Jason Robards Award for Excellence in Theatre is given to individuals and organizations who have made an indelible impact on the theatre world. It is named to honor his lifelong commitment to theatre and his incredible support of Roundabout both on stage and off. In 1994, Jason Robards made his Roundabout debut in the first New York revival of Harold Pinter's No Man's Land with his dear friend, Christopher Plummer. Soon after, he and Chris joined Roundabout's Board of Directors and worked tirelessly to support Artistic Director Haimes's idea to create a second, Off-Broadway stage that would be a home to new plays by today's greatest writers. He became our distinguished Artist-in-Residence during the inaugural 1995-96 season at the Laura Pels Theatre with performances in Pinter's Moonlight and Brian Friel's Molly Sweeney and served as a member of Roundabout's Board until his death in 2000.

The award was designed by sculptor Arthur Carter, whose bronze and steel sculptures have been exhibited in New York, Paris, and around the globe.



"Being on stage is miraculous," Danny DeVito says, and he'd know. DeVito began his career in the 1960s working Off-Broadway and has never given up his taste for live theatre; he's been on Broadway twice—earning a Tony nomination in 2017 for his role in the Roundabout Theatre Company production of *The Price*—and appeared in Neil Simon's The Sunshine Boys in 2012 on the West End. Most recently, DeVito starred in another Roundabout play, the 2023 production of Theresa Rebeck's I Need That opposite his daughter, Lucy DeVito.

He's made movies like Ruthless People and One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, which began as an Off-Broadway play in which he also had a role. He's been a television star across five decades, with unforgettable parts in series like Taxi and

TAXI WAS SHOT ON A FRIDAY NIGHT IN FRONT OF 300 PEOPLE, SO IT WAS LIKE DOING AN OFF-BROADWAY PLAY EVERY WEEK.



It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia. And he's produced projects for both film and TV, including Pulp Fiction, Garden State, and Reno 911!, as well as earning an Oscar nomination for his work behind the scenes on Erin Brockovich. Still, this year's winner of The Jason Robards Award for Excellence in Theatre has an undeniable passion for theatre, and recently reminisced about how that's informed his long, prolific career.

What are your first memories of the theatre?

I wasn't that kid who had the mom or dad who took him to Broadway shows. We lived in Asbury Park, New Jersey, where I saw a few rock 'n' roll shows; I saw Stevie Wonder when I was a kid. The only theatre I saw was when a tent once came to town, and they did a production of *Mr. Rogers*. My father got tickets, but I didn't really stay in the theatre; I was hanging out with my friends. I didn't go to a Broadway or Off-Broadway play until I was in my twenties.

How did you first know you wanted to perform?

My first experience on stage was a school play, and I loved it. Getting up in front of people was always exciting to me, and I got bit by the acting bug in a theatre class at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts. I enjoyed my two years there, and I always liked getting up in front of the audience. I did a play called The Contrast that was written by Royall Tyler and directed by Worthington Miner, who was married to Frances Fuller, director of the Academy at that time. We did it on tour in Connecticut at the Goodspeed Opera House and a couple of other venues, and we wound up opening the Eugene O'Neill Foundation Festival that year. It was a joyous experience. After that, I did children's theatre at the Dennis Playhouse in Massachusetts, which was amazing because I played a wicked wizard-I was dastardly and acting badly toward Rapunzel, but everybody liked the wicked wizard. I don't know why.

When did you first land on the stage in New York?

I had a whole bunch of friends, and we mostly met up making the rounds on auditions. I went on anything; it didn't matter what the description was, and because this was before I had an Equity card, you were always seen last. Most of my auditions were at five or six o'clock. At one, I walked in at the tail end of the thing, and there was nobody there.



I stuck my head in the door and the director and producers were in there having a confab with an actor named Allen Garfield; they were trying to talk him into doing a part. I said, 'Are you still seeing people?' And Garfield turned around and said, 'There's the guy who should play that part.' So, I went in and I read, and I got the part. It was called Shoot Anything with Hair That Moves, and I played a drug dealer. We were paid, I think, \$69 dollars a

week—a windfall! But I had found my path, and this was what I was going to do.

What were formative roles for you early on?

I got a job at Theatre of Living Arts in Philadelphia, and I worked; that was the first time I worked with Judd Hirsch in a play by Rosalyn Drexler called The Line of Least Existence. I did that for a few months and made a little bit more money, and then I came back into town and did Three Plays by Luigi Pirandello at the Sheridan Square Playhouse. I got little parts, and then one of the big things that happened was David Margulies was going to direct a play called The Shrinking Bride, and Bill Devane, who was very hot in the theatre at that time, was going to do it. David said to me, 'I've got

this part that I'd like you to read for the backers;" Devane wasn't in town, but could I read it as a favor. I said of course. I went to somebody's apartment, we read the play, and Margulies said he was sorry he couldn't give me the part. Sure enough, Devane got a lead part and moved on, and they gave it to me. The Shrinking Bride started rehearsals, and we went through an actors' strike—I met Geraldine Page and Robert De Niro on the picket line—and when the strike was over, the play opened and closed immediately. Then, the general manager said to me, 'Danny, you're out of a job, but these guys are casting one more part in an Off-Broadway show, and you ought to go up and read.' I said, 'Damn right,' and I got on the subway, I went up to some theatre uptown, and I read. That was Cuckoo's Nest.

They didn't have much of a part written for Martini, but I got on stage and did improv, and they cast me. Here's the irony: Guess who's playing the lead in that play? Bill Devane. He left *The Shrinking Bride* to go do *Cuckoo's Nest*. Of course you'd leave to play McMurphy, for crying out loud. Meanwhile, I met Rhea [Perlman, my wife] during *The Shrinking Bride* because her friend was playing opposite me. My life changed big time; it was like I was blessed by the theatre gods.

Was making it to Broadway important?

I didn't think that. I did audition for things like Man of La Mancha when it was downtown, and they liked me at The Public Theater. I auditioned once for Richard Foreman when he did Threepenny Opera. I had prepared a four- or five-line monologue, and I laid down on the floor and rolled into the room saying my lines. He was nice to me, but I did blow that one.

What's been different about working on stage and screen?

If you've never been on stage, you've got to try it; it's the best. I was lucky when I came to California; I got *Taxi*. *Taxi* was shot on a Friday night in front of 300 people, so it was like doing an Off-Broadway play every week. It was all about giving it to the audience and being there with them. The next significant theatre role I did was *The Sunshine Boys* in London, and that was off the charts-Neil Simon, come on! You've got material that you can rely on and could do every which way—and it works because it's such good writing.

The next thing you did on stage was *The Price*. Did making your Broadway debut feel monumental?

Absolutely. It gives you so much. It informs you, enlightens you, inspires you, and challenges you. It does all these things.


Your next Broadway role was in I Need That, playing a father opposite your own daughter playing his daughter. What was that like?

Ray Anthony Thomas, Lucy, and I would get together before the show and go over how we're going to deal with certain beats. The director, Moritz von Stuelpnagel, would, in the early days, pitch in, but as we went along it was just the three of us. Every night, no matter what, Lucy would come down and have a cup of tea with me about 45 minutes before the curtain and we would talk about everything. One night in the middle of then run, Lucy came down and sat in her spot, and we were talking when she said, 'Dad, I've got something to tell you.' I said, 'What, honey,' and she said, 'I'm pregnant.'

I got so emotional. Now, every night in the play, there's a line I say to her—and her character has given up a lot of opportunities to stay with mine—where I tell her to take a job she was offered in another city, to go and meet someone nice and have kids and take care of them. I got to say that every night for the rest of the run. How great is that?

Is there anything you want to do on stage that you haven't done yet?

None that I haven't been able to, but perhaps that I haven't discovered yet. Roundabout is my home now, so I feel like I want to discover those things with them, to find things to do together. When you have a good experience with people you respect, you want to continue that.



For over 25 years, Education at Roundabout has enriched the lives of over 912,500 students, educators, community members, and patrons in New York City and beyond. Through a robust portfolio of programs that promote academic achievement, personal growth, and civic engagement, Roundabout helps young people meet the challenges of an ever-changing world. Our school partnerships serve over 4,000 public school students in the classroom each year at 20 partner schools in all five boroughs. Our afterschool Roundabout Youth Ensemble teaches students to think critically and creatively as they work with their peers to create original theatre pieces. And our professional development programs, including the Theatrical Teaching Institute, help teachers develop social emotional learning competencies and increase student engagement.

The impact of our Education programs extends far beyond the classroom. In 2016, Roundabout established the Theatrical Workforce Development Program, a three-year vocational training fellowship that connects young New Yorkers to careers in technical theatre. And our Community Partnerships build relationships with not-for-profit organizations in neighborhoods around the city, in keeping with our commitment to equity and access for all New Yorkers.


