




Rock Quest

Strike Action

The schools in the region were part of industrial action by NZEI Te Riu Roa and PPTA (Post Primary Secondary Schools Association). Last Wednesday resulted in a combined strike day for Primary and Secondary schools and many of our local schools were closed.

The PPTA have announced more regional strike days from 17-24th June. There will also be partial strike days where teacher labour will be removed from year levels and this will effect Ruapehu College. The dates for this will be Tuesday 11th June-year 10, Tuesday 25th June-year 11, and Tuesday 2nd July- year 12. Parents can send their children to school on those days as the school will be open for instruction.

NZEI will continue negotiations for the Primary teachers and Principals collective agreement. Education Minister Chris Hipkins has called for an urgent forum this week between the NZEI Te Riu Roa and the PPTA to find agreement on the barriers to settlement and to seek a way forward.

Local schools will keep parents updated with developments through email and facebook notifications.

Knife Care & Safe Handling Course

During last week, level one Food and Technology students were privileged to learn some basic knife skills from Gary - owner/ operator of Angel Louise in Raetihi. Gary taught the students the parts of the knife, some honing skills, knife care and some basic cutting techniques. These are excellence skills for the industry.

Driver Learners Licence Course

Last week saw the beginning of Ruapehu College's first Learners Licence Course for students 16 years and over. The school is subsidising student costs to encourage all Senior Students to gain their Learners Licence prior to finishing high school.
