The field trip involved collecting the perspectives of different stakeholders - RAL, DOC, Iwi, locals and recreational users - in terms of how sustainability looks on Mount Ruapehu. Taking a trip to the ski field before the season helped the students to visualise first-hand the impacts and efforts of RAL to preserve and protect the unique environmental characteristics of Mount Ruapehu.
