Year 10 Camp Information

Year 10 camp will run from Tuesday 29 November until Thursday 1 December. This is the first camp since Covid and we are excited to be able to provide the opportunity for all year 10 students staying at Raketepauma Marae near Irirangi.

Part of the Year 10 Camp initiative by embracing Mātauranga Māori is to introduce students to the natural environment and to encourage them to reflect on their place in the wider world.

This will involve giving students a better understanding of themselves, other people and the wider natural

environment.
Understanding this connectedness to the taiao/resource, we will be learning and setting foundations in preparation for NCEA Level One.



Over the 3 days

students will take part in making haangi, hunting, weaving/mahi toi, haka, learning history, visiting Rotokura and Tokaanu hot pools, a hikoi/tramp around koro and star gazing. All of this will be delivered by local people and iwi.

Leadership Camp

There will be 20 senior students attending a leadership camp on Great Barrier Island from 26 November until the 2 of December. The cost of the camp has increased over the years but, with the help of the Hillary Step Scholarship and the Laurenson Trust we have been able to keep costs low for our students.

Students will be participating in a variety of activities including coasteering, snorkelling, sea kayaking, surf kayaking, raft building and much more.

There will also be a hike and an overnight stay during the week.

Being a leadership camp, all activities are designed so that students acquire leadership skills and qualities so they can confidently step up and lead by example.



Business Week

Weeks 7 and 8 will see the inaugural Business Industry programme for Year 9 and 10 students respectively. In each of these weeks students will have the opportunity to learn more about potential Career pathways.

The week will include various practical activities, outdoor education, and interactive careers sessions with businesses and professionals. This is an opportunity for students to find out more about different types of jobs and careers they may be interested in.

The Careers sessions will allow for Q&A interaction so students can find out exactly what a job is like day to day as well as what subjects or experience may be required to help them get a foot in the door. The College is appreciative of the community support for this venture.
