




Mrs Campbell returned to the staff after heading Sport Ruapehu. It is great to see her back as she is always so full of energy.

Smaller numbers of students in the senior school, has meant an increase in students enrolled with the Correspondence School.

In 2000 there was an upsurge in the number of students wishing to learn a language and Ruapehu College had students enrolled in Japanese, German, French, Chinese, Senior Maori and Spanish. Students with motivation and good study skills, generally progressed well to the stage that they could hold a basic conversation in the particular language studied. Year 12 Graphics and Year 13 Classical Studies were also taught by Correspondence.

English Department 2000

We welcomed Mrs Watt's replacement into the department in March, and quickly recognised that we had a good young teacher in Ms Anne-Marie Bullock. She is hardworking, innovative and shows concern for her Year 9, 11 and 12 students. Remember what Mr Gilmore said in his first assembly? If teachers are on your case they care!

Twenty seven Ruapehu Students agreed to put their reputations on the line and have their language skills tested internationally against nearly half a million other students in the Australian English Competition this year. Congratulations go to Peter Chapman who won a Distinction (International) award in year 10. Jenna Termaat and Josh Campbell received Credit (international) awards in Years 9 and 11 respectively. Achievement (school awards) were earned by Jackie Laurenson (year 9), Joel Corbett (year 10), Serena Keast and Holly Wilson (year 11) and by Alice Mastrovich (year 12). Nineteen students received certificates of participation. All students received a certificate and full analysis of their test results. They had little or no familiarity with the format of the test until the actual day and should do even better next year once they have this familiarity.

Debating was taught in all the junior classes this year with the year 9 students in particular showing that they have what it takes. Good debating, research and co-operative group learning skills were also demonstrated by School Certificate students this year.

One of the English Department's goals this year was to improve interpersonal listening and speaking skills around the school. Let us say that awareness of certain deficiencies in these areas has been heightened. The campaign will continue until such time as putting ours EARS ON becomes second nature. At the heart of improving these oral skills is, of course, respect for the other person.

Weka people showed the highest levels of exploring language skills in this year's English Quiz followed by Huia and Tui, who were second equal, followed by Kiwi

The experience of live theatre means that the audience has a responsibility for the success of the show. This year most students showed that they are beginning to respond to live shows in positive, affirming ways and find that they actually enjoy the experience. A few, unfortunately, talk throughout a performance, or respond in negative, super-critical ways.

Later in the year the Ugly Shakespare Company entertained us with alternative images of woman in *Hamlet*, *Romeo and Juliet* and *Othello*.

Textiles Technology

The themes for classes in 2000 was Mai I te Maunga ki te Moana (from the mountain to the sea) and 2001 Nga kainga (homes). Every person's assignments drew inspiration from these things.

Year 9 is an option of six months. The first class did surface decoration and printed fabric, designed an article and then a garment. It was a great group and even when stencil cutting was in progress and there were 30 scalpels being used, the class was focussed and churning out great creations.

The second group also had the opportunity to use the Bernina B Bag designing the pattern for the flap as the technology process assessment component. This group has shown great creativity using the sewing machine to make textured fabric.

Year 10 students each year have the opportunity to sit School Certificate Design Technology and some students took up the challenge. Great School Certificate marks were gained in 2000.

Year 11 and 12 have worked through projects for School Certificate and Sixth Form Certificate, including tops with surface decoration, wearable art, recycled garment, wall hangings and three dimensional figures, and in 2001 we also entered the Auckland Schools External Examination at 6 FC level. It is not uncommon to find students hard at work at lunchtime and after school, as well as the odd 'late nighter' to get the planned work done.

We are making good use of the updated equipment bought this year and are grateful for the donation of extra machine feet by Bernina New Zealand. Our department acknowledges all parents and friends donations of fabric scraps and garments for recycling.





Central North Island Wearable Art and Young Designer Award

What a thrill it was for me to see our students garments being modelled in this very competitive event again in 2000 Taupo nui a Tia College's Wearable Arts Extravaganza and Young Designer Award was even more amazing than the previous year. It was professional, racy and entertaining.














Office Report - Last Words From Lyn Fetzer



Property Report





There was a large amount of building work undertaken over the 2000 year, which was the finishing off of the 'Tomorrow Schools' deferred work. Local builders Eves construction did most of the work. The moving of the Art room, the new Lab A, the addition to the Library now known as the Information Resource Centre and the Social Sciences department were major parts. The move had been planned several years ago with the siting of the existing kiln originally done to eventually line up with the art room. The new dark room facilities enable the modernisation of the administration area had been awaited for some time. The offices were only finished at the very end of the summer break.

We have had a complete exterior repaint of the whole school in new colours.

2000 saw Ruapehu College join the Ministry of Education's new Property Maintenance Programme. We were the first school in the central region to join the scheme, acting as a trial school with three others. The new scheme took into account historical spending over the last 25 years, and also worked out how much should have been spent on a facility of our size and calculated an entitlement for he next ten years. Our entitlement is just under \$1,000,000 for the next ten years 2000-2010. We had to plan out how we will spend the money and submit a ten year plan to the Ministry. Most of the

projects that occurred last year and this year were part of that plan. Obvious examples of the projects recently completed are the new boundary fences on the Tainui Street border and the new paving behind the Technical block up to the Senior Studies Block and Art Room area. Always with a view to maximising the benefits for students, the boundary fence has had a cricket practice wing included. Some of the 2001 projects are only just happening. The modernisation of the groundsman's shed and corridor redecorating are examples of these.

The vandalism to the corridor ceiling outside Lab B down to the Computer room is a very disappointing area. The ceiling is being replaced during the holidays but it is really money we could have better spent on new facilities for students.

As part of the corridor work currently happening is a complete replacement of all the existing lockers. This is due to be completed over the summer holidays before the 2002 start. A new Year 10 locker area is included and all lockers will be metal with individual key locks.

• The biggest single project on our 10 year plan is the extension of the Gymnasium to include a viewing gallery, lounges and purpose built weights room. Work is progressing on this with the plans going to tender at the beginning of 2002. This project will be around \$200.000.
