This race requires unbelievable coordination between multiple military, police, park, city, county, and government agencies since the race runs through multiple jurisdictions. The race is thirty minutes away from starting and he gets a call from one of the police departments.

"What?!! I have 40,000 people lined up here getting ready to run!", the race director replies.

"Sorry. There looks to be a large bundle propped up against the bridge and it might be a bomb."

"Well, go check it out!"
