INTERESTING FACTS:

Through 2019, this event was considered an official Fiesta event.

ORIGINAL DISTANCE:

This race started out as a 5k. Based on race flyers (1984 – 2000), the distance varied between a 5k, 3miles, and 2.8 miles. The distance of the race depended on the route of the Fiesta Flambeau Parade. The race finally settled at a 2.6 mile run in 2000.

Per email from Walter Stoneham, March 22, 2011:

“Oh, how well I remember the first Fandango when Jerry McCurdy (SARR President 1983 – 1984) and I scoped out a 3-mile course; which, of course, came into disuse long ago. We also came up with a motto for the event – Fiesta Fandango – do it with thousands watching. I believe that was quickly modified to run with thousands watching.”

According to the 1982 SARR Newsletter, over 800 runners participated in the race.

NAME OF RACE:

Per race flyers and minutes:

Based on memory, name was changed at the request of either the Fiesta Commission or the Flambeau Commission; stated that the word “Flambeau” was copyrighted. No mention of this in printed minutes of SARR Board.

ORIGINAL LOCATION:

Race Route has always been downtown San Antonio, following the route of the Fiesta Flambeau Night parade and always before the Parade’s Van Guard (drill teams) and Parade. Start times varied from early afternoon, i.e. 1:30 p.m. and finally settling at any time between 6:30 p.m. and 6:45 p.m. or whenever the Police decided it should start.

Race was a logistical challenge for organizers since it was a "point-to-point" event. Shuttles were used to transport participants to/from the start/finish areas. Generally the very last shuttle, known as the "Spectator Bus," transported friends and family members that were not running to the finish area.

Volunteers were needed at both the Packet Pickup/Registration (PPU/Reg) site (early years, Ft. Sam Houston; later, Brackenridge Park and parking lot at Ashby and Belknap) as well as the finish, Columbus Park. At the PPU/Reg site, organizers arrived early in the afternoon to set up. All material/equipment that was needed for PPU/REG was left with a few organizers/volunteers. Then the SARR Trailer drove to the finish line to set up the clock, water stop, refreshments, etc.

Volunteers at the finish needed to arrive by 4 p.m. or earlier in order to have access to the Park. The city streets were usually "closed" by that time to allow the city to prepare for the night parade with its Van Guard (ROTC drill units). Parade passes, issued by the city, were needed to get past police and barricades.

MISCELLANEOUS INTERESTING FACTS:

Based on memory, the race was an "off-shoot" of the Rey Feo Parade. Per Rey Feo website, the "Rey Feo" started in 1974 with the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC). Purpose was to promote the transformative power of education for youth.

In 1980, Rey Feo was formally invited to be part of the Fiesta. The Rey Feo Consejo Educational Foundation was founded in 1982 by Logan Stewart, Rey Feo XXXII. Unfortunately, no mention of a parade or SARR was listed in the on-line Rey Feo history.

When the race was initially associated with the Rey Feo Parade, the race start time was 1:25 p.m. and was on the same day as the SARR Fiesta Mission 10k. In 1988, the race time changed to 6:55 p.m. and, while still retaining the name of Rey Feo Fandango, the race date and time changed to the date and time of the Fiesta Flambeau/El Rey Feo Night Parade. Per SARR Newsletter, Sally Rios, in the April 1990 Newsletter, states "9th Annual Fiesta Flambeau Fandango – What a way to close Fiesta! This race, formerly the Rey Feo Fandango, is scheduled for April 18 at 6:10 p.m."

Although the race route has not changed, the venue used for race day packet pickup/registration, has changed. In the 1980s, race day packet pickup/registration (PPU/Reg) was held in the parking lot of the Ft. Sam Quadrangle. Race participants would then walk to the start of the race at the corner of Grayson and Broadway.

PPU/Reg was relocated to the parking lot next to the Tuesday Music Club in Brackenridge Park on St. Mary's Street possibly after 9-11. PPU/REG was again relocated in either 2016 or 2017 to the parking lot across the street from the Agudas Achim Temple at the corner of Belknap and Dewey.

Although there was a finish line clock, awards were only given to the first male/female finisher. Early years of race may have had age group of awards.

Race start time was 6:30 p.m. – 6:40 p.m., always under the direction of the San Antonio Police.

A costume contest was added in 1988 with awards going to the top 3 best costumes. Participants were encouraged to wear and run in costume. At least four costume categories were added in later years. Participants could either enter as individuals or in a group. A group of four to five judges reviewed the costumes at the PPU/Reg site. Judges consisted of SARR Board Members and, occasionally, dignitaries such as the Bexar County Sheriff, representatives of San Antonio Police, a newspaper reporter, a district councilman. Winners of the costume contest were announced at the end of the race with winners receiving ribbons.

Also in the late 1900s or early 2000s, the SARR Banner (see attachments for photo) was carried behind the last runner. In the parade, banners announcing the upcoming band or float are carried BEFORE the band/float. Knowing that the runners carrying the SARR banner could not stay ahead of the lead runner, having the banner at the end would serve two purposes: (1) announce that the run was put on by the San Antonio Roadrunners (though it was often mistaken for UTSA Roadrunners) and (2) it would indicate the end of the race.

2007 – Joining in the Fiesta tradition, Fiesta Medals depicting the Fandango were given to all participants starting in 2007.

→ SAN ANTONIO ROADRUNNERS: MINUTES AUGUST 30, 1982

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Dick Eklund. There were 17 people present.

The minutes of the July 26, 1982 meeting were read and approved.

August Fun Run. This event was run on the 10K trail at McAllister and was very successful. Jerry McCurdy reported. Jerry added that we need to get more people actively involved in club activities. More members are needed to direct races. We need to try methods and approaches to get people more enthused about organizing and directing races.

Alamo Derby. Al Becken reported. There were 401 registration for the 2 mile run. 266 males and 135 females. There were a few minor logistical problems but overall it was a very successful run. Validation will be needed at the next (Sept 25) run and this will increase the work. Help if you can.

Sept. Fun Run. Robert Weaver, race director, was not present.

Fiesta Mission Run. This run needs a race director or possibly a co-director team to organize and direct it. Al Lanctot, past director of this race, has plenty of information to make the next director's job easier. This is an official Fiesta event.

→ Rey Feo Run. Ken Bashore and Jerry McCurdy will co-direct. Estimated cost will be \$1,500 if we go first class, i.e. banners, directors, T-shirts, ect. This is also an official Fiesta event. We do not have a sponsor yet. If we do not get a sponsor, we will need to go lean—no frills.

Artesia Sponsorship. This company is interested in getting involved in our runs. Their interest seems to be in supplying water rather than direct financial support.

Southern Suburu Sponsorship. No further information. Jerry Christianson not present.

RRCA. Dick Eklund reported. The insurance coverage limit is \$5,000,000. We need to pay the premium (.65 per member) in order to participate in the Dannon Running Series. Motion was made and carried to send RRCA the premium for the coverage. Ken Bashore organizing the Dannon Run. Will reserve the park.

Equipment. Clock and Chronomix. Defer further discussion until next meeting.

Other Business. Julia Lopez read a letter from University of Wisconsin.

RACE RESULTSREY FEO FANDANGO - 5K

The Rey Feo Fandango went very well. This was primarily due to the excellent direction of Jerry McCurdy and his many helpers. The overall winner was Roger Soler with a time of 14:21.0. The first woman finishing was Ann Livingston (who is also our Treasurer) with a time of 19:57.9. The course was flat and fast. Crowds were lined on both sides of the course which was also the parade course for the Rey Feo parade. Many street vendors were also on the course making some interesting traveling for the lead motorcycles and the lead truck.

The race started on time with a mad rush of the front runners. Roger Soler took the lead relatively early and after the one mile point started to lengthen his lead. Times were given at the one and two mile points. There were two finish chutes to avoid missing some of the female runners. In addition the female runners received finish place cards starting at 2001 (no significance attached).

The lead clock on the truck malfunctioned at about the two mile mark. However, the main finish line clock worked perfectly and the units listing the actual times also printed perfectly. Because of the large number of runners crossing the finish line at the same time there was no effort made to have the finishers put their names on the finish place card. Each runner can pick out their time by finding their finish place number and reading across to find the time.

A total of 860 official runners (608 men and 252 women) crossed the finish line. There were a number who ran that did not register, but showed their courtesy by not running across the finish line. We thank them for their consideration.

Following is a list of all finish places and the times. The finish place cards for the men started at 0001. The finish place numbers for the women started at 2001. If you were a woman finisher just disregard the 2xxx and you will see your place number listed.

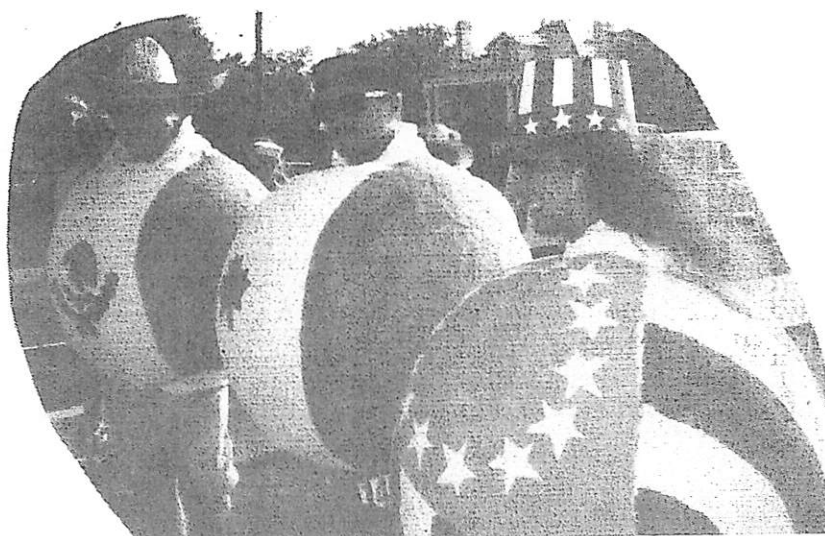

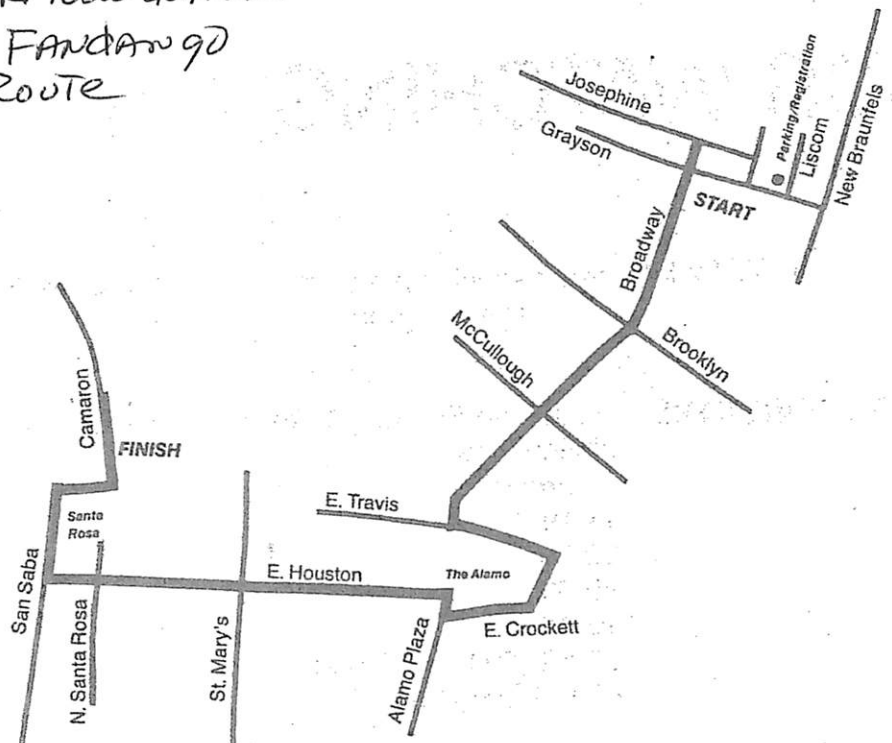
