Other notable things:

We continued our free **Monthly Fun Runs** throughout the year primarily at McAllister Park, but we also branched out to other locations in the underserved areas of the city. We look to continue this in 2024.

Our **SARR Adopt-A-Park** program is going strong with a lot of trash picked up to keep our trails clean. We also held multiple shoe and clothing drives for Street2Feet, aiding those less fortunate.

Our free **Zoo Runs** were in action from April through October and that crew had to overcome challenges with extreme temperatures and construction in the Zoo area to keep that Wednesday run going safely.

We had a great **Global Running Day** event with a free 5K to encourage physical fitness in the community.

SARR was selected as one of the first ever running clubs to receive a coaching scholarship fund grant from the Road Runners Club of America (RRCA).

In July, we were so fortunate to have Al Becken, one of our founding members come out and accept an award "Celebrating our 50 years of running and building community in San Antonio" from the RRCA President, George Rehmet. He is very impressed with the San Antonio RoadRunners.

We made various donations to different local nonprofit organizations to ensure SARR remains a positive force in promoting physical fitness within the community.

December started off with the **San Antonio Rock n Roll** and I will say, what a great accomplishment for so many of our members. Hopefully all that training had you prepared. If you ran the RnR (any distance), I

offer you a big congratulations! We had so many people participate and had some great cheering squads out on the course. The Rock n Roll folks offer great support to our club, I sure enjoy our run club village. Once again, SARR served as the official Pace Team for the Rock n Roll, and we sure took care of business in our bright orange shirts!
