# **Meeting Rules of Engagement**

- 1. Be present
- 2. Commit to creating a safe space for shared learning
- 3. Perspective taking
- 4. Speak from lived experience with "I" statements
- 5. Step up and step back
- 6. Assume positive intent and be responsible for attending to the impact of your words
- 7. Willingness to be held accountable
- 8. You decide what to share
- 9. Do your work

## Continuum on Becoming an Anti-Racist, Multicultural Institution

## **Engaging in Discussions about Race**

- 1. Awareness of your own racial/cultural identity & social positioning in the system of racism.
- 2. Acknowledgement and willingness to admit or explore racial biases & triggers (known and revealed).
- 3. Delve into and validate the feelings/emotions that surface during the discussions (self and other participants).
- 4. **Clear strategy or framework** to contain the process or flow of the discussion, not the content (i.e. focused topics, rules of engagement, transition to action steps, etc.).
- 5. **Encouragement and verbal recognition** to participants who speak up or share when it could be perceived as unsafe or when a person makes themselves emotionally vulnerable by sharing personal experiences.

- a. What reactions am I having to this demand and why? (If needed, use the How am I feeling? handout)
- b. What information do I need to have a different perspective on the lived experiences of BIPOC Artists to change the reactions that I am having? How do I seek or obtain it?
- c. Prepare a 2-minute summary of the group discussion for report out to the plenary group.
