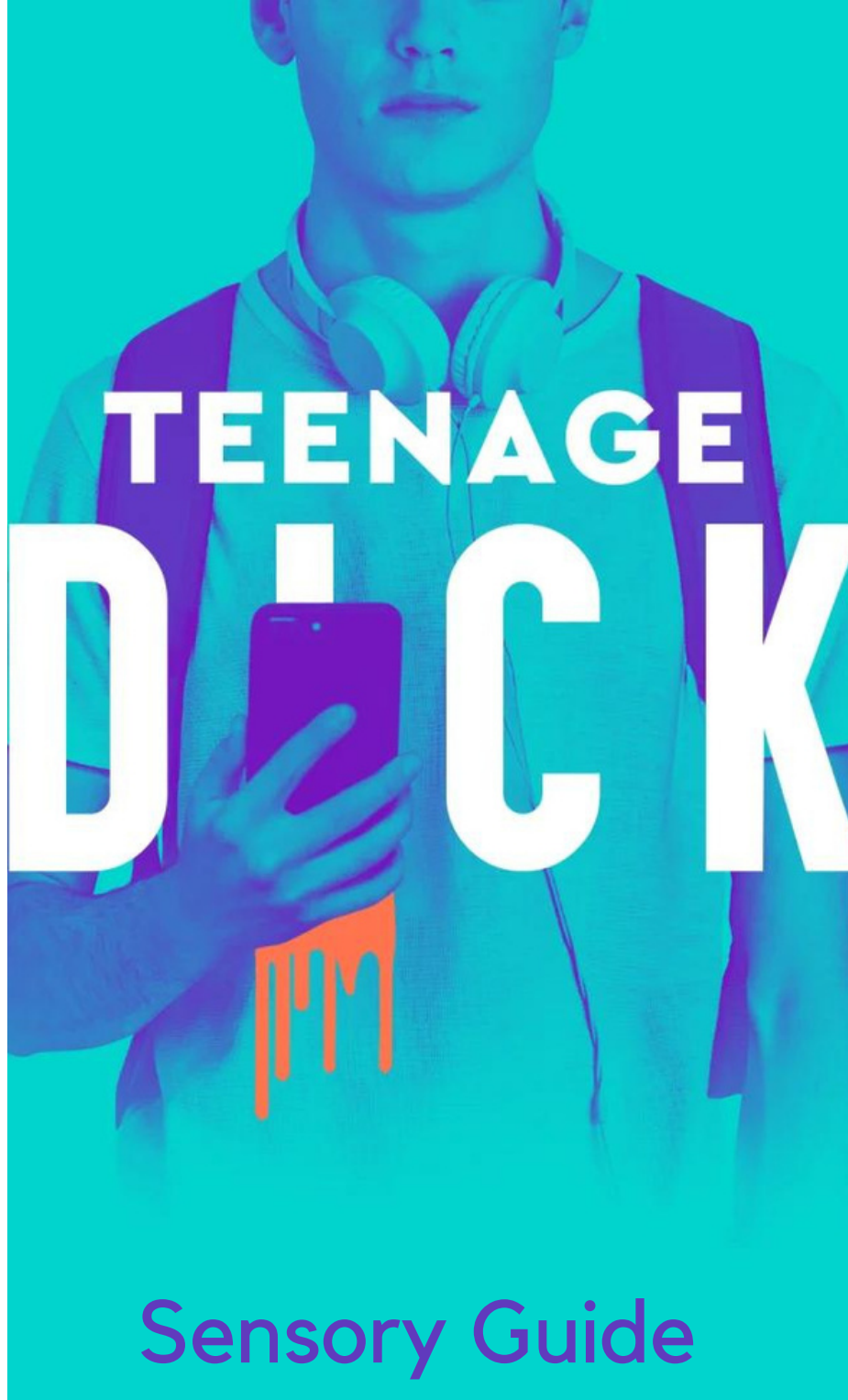

Details

The performance takes place at Seattle Rep's Leo K. Theater in Seattle, WA. This theatre is located at the rear of Seattle Rep.

There are two side aisles, a loge and a balcony.

Run Time: The show has one act and no intermission. Overall time is approximately one hour and 45 minutes.

Content Considerations

This production contains mild strobe lighting, a loud bang, depictions of violence, blood, loss of life and ableism.

- Big bang sound
- Echoing sound
- End of Life/Blood
- Multiple depictions of violence
- Yelling
