**About the Position**

The Part-Time Mathematics Teacher position offers an opportunity to instruct outstanding high school students and to work at a school that is changing the world. The need is to teach Precalculus to two sections of 10 students or less for most of the 15-week fall 2025 semester, from mid-September to mid-December, 2025. The schedule can be arranged to accommodate teaching responsibilities at other local schools.

**About The School for Ethics and Global Leadership**

The School for Ethics and Global Leadership (SEGL) is a semester-long residential program for a diverse group of intellectually motivated high school juniors from across the United States. SEGL has campuses in Johannesburg, South Africa; London, United Kingdom; and Washington, DC. Each campus serves approximately 24 students each term. The program selects students who have shown outstanding character, promise for leadership, and scholastic ability and provides them with a unique curriculum that emphasizes ethical thinking, leadership development, and international affairs. **Responsibilities**

- Teach two sections of high school Precalculus in three periods per week—two single 50-minute blocks and one 100-minute block
- Differentiated curriculum that has students working independently in alignment with their sending schools' Precalculus syllabi
- Meet with students for individual help when requested
- Write mid-term and final comments for each student, highlighting successes as well as areas for improvement

**Qualifications**

- Bachelor's Degree in Mathematics or related field required, advanced degree preferred;
- Experience teaching Precalculus at the high school or collegiate level preferred;
- Willingness to work as part of a passionate, collegial, mission-driven team that celebrates diversity.
