POSITION DESCRIPTION: Teaching Fellow & Residential Advisor (Ethics & Leadership)

LOCATION: London, United Kingdom

About the Position

This full-time position represents an extraordinary chance to help shape a school that is changing the world. The Teaching Fellow and Residential Advisor position offers an opportunity for an early career teacher to work with outstanding students both inside and outside the classroom, and to take on meaningful administrative roles with mentorship from experienced SEGL faculty. This position will be responsible for co-teaching our flagship Ethics & Leadership course and working with the Residential Dean on residential life programming at our London campus.

About The School for Ethics and Global Leadership

The School for Ethics and Global Leadership (SEGL) is a semester-long residential program for a diverse group of intellectually motivated high school juniors from across the United States. SEGL has campuses in Johannesburg, South Africa; London, United Kingdom; and Washington, DC. Each campus serves approximately 24 students each term. The program selects students who have shown outstanding character, promise for leadership, and scholastic ability and provides them with a unique curriculum that emphasizes ethical thinking, leadership development, and international affairs. Mission Statement

To provide intellectually motivated high school juniors who represent the diversity of the United States with the best possible opportunity to shape themselves into ethical leaders who create positive change in our world.

Academic Responsibilities

- Work with the Ethics and Leadership team to design and implement the course. This includes classroom teaching and administrative preparation, including scheduling and coordinating guest speakers and field trips.
- Advise two or three students each semester
- Additional administrative responsibilities to support the School (for example, assistance with the food program, managing operations, etc.)

Residential Responsibilities

- Regular evening and weekend dormitory supervision
- Working with the Residential Team on student life programming
- Living in an on-campus apartment

Compensation

This position is compensated as a 10-month fellowship contract that includes a monthly stipend of \$1,850 in addition to room and board (approx. \$25,000 value). After completing the fellowship year, many fellows are invited back as full-time faculty members. The School also offers a generous benefits package including:

- Retirement plan with School matching contribution
- Professional development support and benefits
- Generous sick, personal, and paid family leave programs
- Financial assistance to travel home (if your country of domicile is outside the UK)
