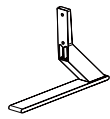
Pedestal stand Assembling (for 43/49/55U775 *Series)

CAUTION: Before beginning pedestal assembly, carefully lay the front of the LCD Panel face down on a flat, cushioned surface such as a quilt or blanket. Leave the bottom of the unit protruding over the edge of the surface and assemble as indicated.

NOTE:

Extreme care should always be used when attaching the pedestal stand to avoid damage to the LCD panel.

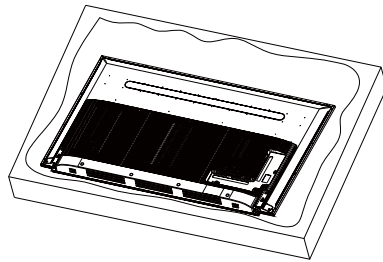

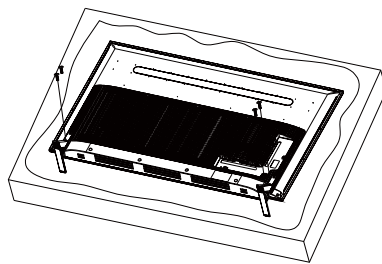

Warning:

- Ensure the power cable is not pinched when attaching the pedestal stand as this could cause an electric shock.
- If the pedestal stand does not hold tight when tightening screw, it may fall off and cause an injury.

Important Safety Instructions

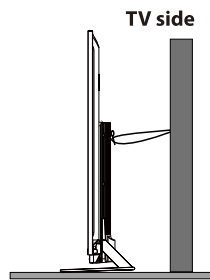
Be sure to observe the following instructions and precautions to ensure safe use of this TV.

Installation

- 1) WARNING: To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to a stable surface/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.**

Install the TV in a horizontal, stable location.

- If the TV is not installed securely, it may lean or fall over and cause an injury.
- To prevent injury, use the exclusive optional stand or wall-hanging bracket to install this TV on a stable surface or wall securely in accordance with a qualified technician.
- To secure the TV, use a sturdy strap from the hook(s) on the rear of the TV to a wall stud, pillar, or other immovable structure. Make sure the strap is tight, secure, and parallel to the floor.

- 2) Never place the TV in an unstabilized location such as on a shaky table, incline or location subject to vibration.**

- Only use cabinets or stands recommended by the TV manufacturer.
- Only use furniture that can safely support the TV.
- Ensure that the TV is not hanging over the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Never place the TV on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the TV to a suitable support.
- Never stand the TV on cloth or other material placed between the TV and supporting furniture.

The TV may drop or fall off, which may cause an injury or damage.

- 3) Never stand or climb on the TV.**

- Educate children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the TV or its controls.

Be especially careful in households with children to prevent them through climbing on top of the TV. It may move, fall over, break, become damaged or cause an injury.

- 4) Always connect the power plug to an appropriate electrical outlet equipped with 100-240V AC, 50/60Hz.**

Never use the TV outside the specified voltage range. It may cause a fire or an electric shock.

About the fuse

In a three pin earthing-type, the fuse fitted in this plug is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362. It should only be replaced by a correctly rated and approved type and the fuse cover must be refitted.

About the use

- Make sure to insert the plugs firmly, when plugging the AC power cord into the TV set end and wall outlet end.
- Make sure to hold the plug, when unplugging the AC power cord.
- Never use other cord except for supplied AC power cord, and never use the supplied power cord for any other purpose.

- 5) Never insert or remove the power plug with wet hands.**

This may cause an electric shock.

- 6) Never block or cover the slots and openings in the cabinet.**

- Never place the TV screen upward or leaning it.
- Never place the TV in a closet, bookcase or other similar area where the ventilation is poor.
- Never drape a newspaper, tablecloth or curtain on the TV.
- When installing the TV against a wall, always keep the TV at least 10 cm away from the wall.
- Never place the TV on a soft unstable surface, such as a carpet, or a cushion.

The inside of this TV will overheat if the ventilation holes are covered, blocked or sealed, which may result in a fire.

7) Never place the TV near a heater or in direct sunlight.

The surface of the cabinet or power cord may melt and result in a fire or an electric shock.

8) Never place the TV in an area exposed to high humidity levels, such as in a bathroom or close to a humidifier.

This may cause a fire or an electric shock.

9) Never place the TV next to a stove where it will be exposed to oil, smoke, or steam, or in a location where there is a large quantity of dust.

This may cause a fire or an electric shock.

10) Precautions for moving the TV

- When moving the TV, be sure to remove the plug from the wall outlet and disconnect the aerial cable and audio/video cables, any steady ties and mounting screw. A fire or an electric shock may result if the power cord is damaged.
- When carrying the TV, at least two people are needed. Be sure to carry it upright.
- Never carry the TV with the screen facing up or down.

11) Precautions for installing on outdoor aerial

An outside aerial system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines, or other electric light or power circuits.

If the aerial falls down or drops, it may cause an injury or an electric shock.

Use

1) Never place hot objects or open flame sources, such as lighted candles or nightlights, on or close to the TV.

High temperatures can melt plastic and lead to fires.

2) The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and that no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

When liquids are spilled or small items are dropped inside the TV, this may cause a fire or an electric shock.

If small objects drop inside the TV, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately and contact a service technician.

3) Never insert objects (metal or paper) or pour water inside the TV through ventilation holes and other openings.

These items may cause a fire or an electric shock.

If these objects are inserted inside the TV, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately and contact a service technician. Be especially careful that children do not insert objects in the TV.

4) When the TV will not be used for a long period of time, such as during vacation or travel, remove the power plug from the wall outlet for safety.

- The TV is not completely disconnected from the power supply line, as minute current is consumed even when the \odot Power switch is turned off.
- The Mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as the disconnect device, therefore the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

5) Never pull on the power cord when removing the plug from the wall outlet.

Always hold the plug firmly when removing it. If the power cord is yanked, the cord may become damaged and a fire or an electric shock may occur.

6) Never cut, break, modify, twist, bunch up or bent the cord or apply excessive force or tension to it.

Never place heavy objects on the cord or allow it to overheat as this may cause damage, a fire or an electric shock. Contact a service technician if the power cord is damaged.

7) If there is thunder or lightning, never touch the aerial cable or other connected cables.

You may suffer an electric shock.

8) Turn off the TV before unplugging the power cord.

Failure to do so, may cause a malfunction.

9) Listening to music at high volume levels and for extended durations can damage one's hearing.

In order to reduce the risk of damage to hearing, one should lower the volume to a safe, comfortable level, and reduce the amount of time listening at high levels.

10) In dry environment due to static electricity, the product may be restart and return to the main OSD interface, USB player interface or the previous source mode.

You can continue to use the TV when appear this phenomenon.

Service

- 1) Never repair, modify or disassemble the TV by yourself.**
It may cause a fire or an electric shock.
Consult a service technician for inspection and repairs.
- 2) When a malfunction occurs, or if smoke or an unusual odor comes from the TV, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately.**
Make sure that the smoke or smell has stopped, then contact a service technician. If the TV is still used in this condition, it may cause a fire or an electric shock.
- 3) If the TV is dropped or the cabinet is broken, turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the outlet immediately.**
If the TV has power in this condition, it may cause a fire or an electric shock. If the cabinet is broken, be careful when handling the TV to prevent an injury.
Contact a service technician for inspection and repair.
- 4) When the TV reaches the end of its useful life, ask a qualified service technician to properly dispose of the TV.**

Cleaning

CAUTION: Avoid using chemicals (such as air refreshers, cleaning agents, etc.) on or near the TV pedestal. Studies indicate that plastics may weaken and crack over time from the combination effects of chemical agents and mechanical stress (such as weight of TV). Failure to follow these instructions could result in serious injury and/or permanent damage to TV and TV pedestal.

- 1) Remove the power plug before cleaning.**
Never use solvents such as benzine or thinner to clean the TV.
 - These solvents may distort the cabinet or damage its finish.
 - If rubber or vinyl products remain in contact with the TV for a long time, a stain may result.If the cabinet becomes dirty, clean it with a soft, dry cloth.
When cleaning the surface of the LCD display, wipe the panel surface gently with a soft, dry cloth.
- 2) Periodically disconnect the power plug from the outlet and check it.**
If dust has collected on the power plug connectors, clean off the dust with a dry cloth.
This dust may cause a fire due to reduced insulation on the plug.

Important information

- 1) About LCD screen**
 - If you have the LCD screen facing to the sun, the LCD screen will be damaged. Be aware of locating the TV close to a window or outdoors.
 - Never press the LCD screen strongly or scratch it, and never put anything on it. These actions will damage the LCD screen.
- 2) About cabinet and LCD screen**
Never spray volatile compounds such as insecticide on the cabinet and LCD screen. This may cause a discoloration or damage the cabinet and LCD screen.
- 3) About afterimage**
If a still picture is displayed, an afterimage may remain on the screen, however it will disappear. This is not a sign of malfunction.
- 4) Some pixels of the screen do not light up**
The LCD display panel is manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology, however sometimes some pixels of the screen may be missing picture elements or have luminous spots. This is not sign of malfunction.
- 5) About Interference**
The LCD display may cause interference in image, sound, etc. of other electronic equipment that receives electromagnetic waves (e.g. AM radios and video equipment).
- 6) About using under the low temperature places**
If you use the TV in the room of 0°C or less, the picture brightness may vary until the LCD monitor warms up. This is not a sign of malfunction.
- 7) When disposing of or transferring ownership of the TV**
Before disposing of or transferring ownership of the TV, perform "Resetting the TV".

When using a wireless network

CAUTION:

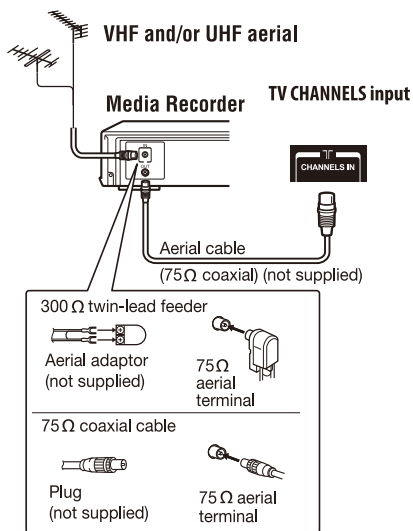

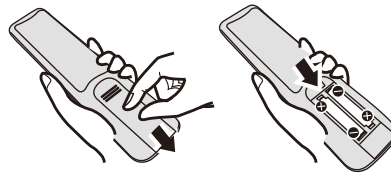

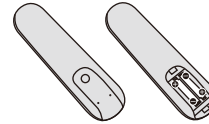
Installing the remote control batteries

Remove the battery cover.

Insert two R03 (AAA) batteries matching the -/+ polarities of the battery to the -/+ marks inside the battery compartment.

Cautions:

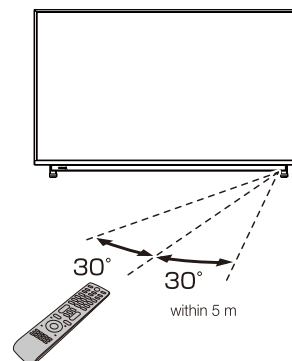
- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Batteries must not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.
- Attention should be drawn to the environmental aspects of battery disposal.
- Never mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.

NOTE:

- If the remote control does not operate correctly, or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace both batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or if you will not use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- Batteries should be limited to alkaline batteries.

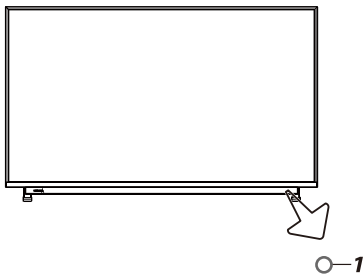

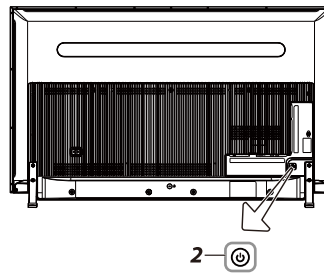

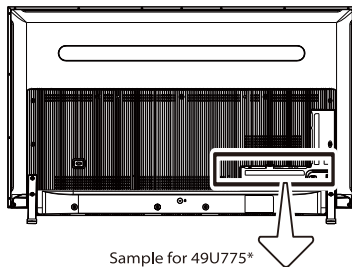

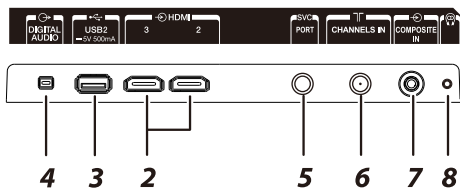


Sample for 49U775*

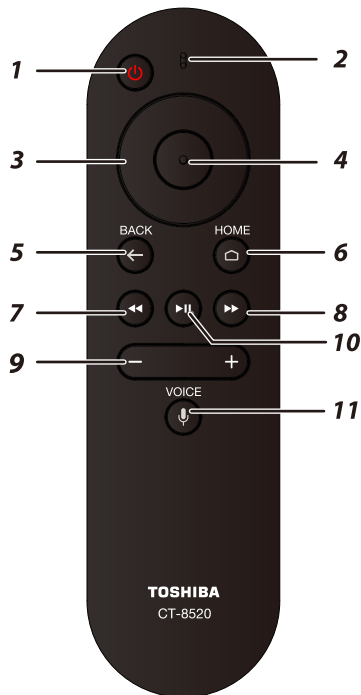

- 1 **LAN IN:** Network port.
- 2 **HDMI1 (MHL/ARC)/HDMI2/HDMI3:** Connect HDMI input signal from signal source such as DVD player. HDMI1 supports MHL&ARC function.
- 3 **USB1/2:** Connect your USB storage device (photo, video and music).
- 4 **DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT:** Connect the digital audio devices such as Digital Power Amplifier to the TV. The supported format is PCM and DD.
- 5 **SVC PORT:** Debug for only service.
- 6 **CHANNELS IN:** Connect a coaxial terminal with cable to receive signal from the antenna.
- 7 **COMPOSITE IN:** Connect video and audio input signal from signal source such as DVD. (Need the adaptor cable.)
- 8 **HEADPHONE:** Speakers will be muted when headphone plugged in.

Bluetooth Remote Control



1. POWER

Press to turn the TV on or standby.

2. Microphone

Voice searching, after pressing the "VOICE" button speech the voice input.

3. Up/Down/Left/Right

Navigate the menu.

4. OK

Confirm the selection.

5. BACK

Exit the current menu.

6. HOME

Press this button to access the home page, you can use the network apps, Media Player, and so on.

7. Fast Backward Button (◀◀)

Press to fast reverse.

8. Fast Forward (▶▶)

Press to fast forward.

9. Volume Up/Down (+/-)

Adjust the volume up or down.

10. Play & Pause (▶||)

Press to pause playback, press again to continue playback.

11. VOICE

Press to open the voice searching function.

You can click it to search for your favorite content easily and fastly just by speaking to the TV what you want through the microphone of Remote Control.

How to Pair the Bluetooth Remote with Your TV

Before using the bluetooth remote, you need to pair it with the TV firstly.

Please prepare the user Remote Control and the Bluetooth Remote Control.

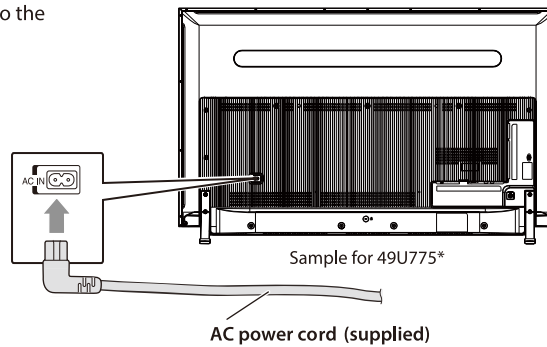
The following steps are for your reference :

- Use the user Remote Control to enter the pairing menu, press the **HOME** button to enter the home page.
- Press the "▼" button to select the "Settings" at the home page.
- Enter "Settings" to select "Remote & accessories";
- Select "Add accessories" to enter the interface of "Searching for accessories";
- Use the Bluetooth Remote Control, press the **HOME** and Left button together for 3 seconds until the "beep" sound.
- Check and select your Bluetooth Remote Control name on the TV searching interface; the default name is "TV BLE Remote".
- Press **OK** button on user remote control to start pairing the remote.
The screen will display "PAIRING....".
- Then the screen will display "CONNECTING...".
- The screen will display "PAIRED" if the pairing successful. After pairing, the Bluetooth Remote Control has been connected successfully for your usage right now.
- If you waiting more than 2 minutes can't pairing or the screen displayed "COULDN'T PAIR"; repeat the above step for pair again.

Connecting the AC power cord to your TV

- 1 Push the AC power cord plug firmly into the AC IN connector on the back of the TV.

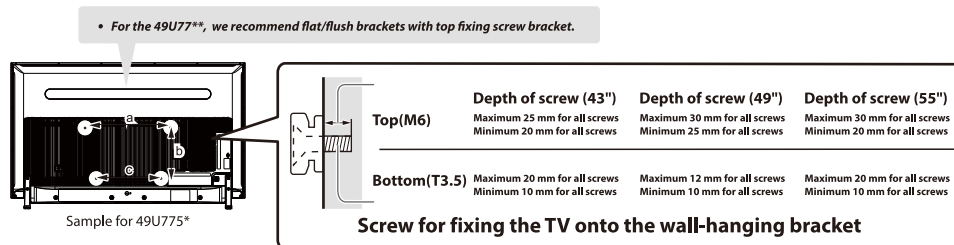

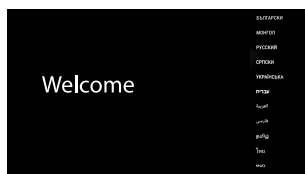

Incorrect fitting may cause equipment to fall, resulting in injury and product damage. Any damage resulting from not having a professional installer mount, your unit will void your warranty.
- When any optional accessories or wall hanging brackets are used, always ensure that the instructions provided are followed fully.
- Do not mount the unit directly below ceiling lights (such as spotlights or halogen lights) which typically give off high heat. Doing so may warp or damage plastic cabinet parts.
- Take care when fixing wall brackets to the wall. Wall mounted equipment shall not be grounded by metal within the wall. Always ensure that there are no electrical cables or pipes in the wall before hanging bracket.
- To prevent fall and injury, remove the TV from its fixed wall position when it is no longer in use.

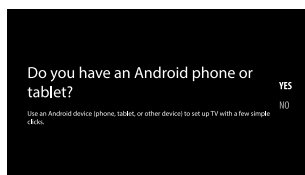
Tuning the TV for the first time

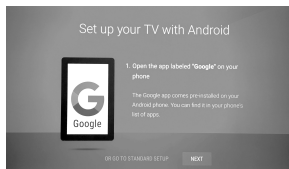
- 1 Press the **⏻** button. The **Welcome** interface will appear, you can press **▲** or **▼** to select the language you want.

Using the Manual OAD Download

From the **Menu Options** menu, press ◀ or ▶ to select the **Manual OAD Download** and press **OK**. Manually download and upgrade software by the air.



NOTE:

- To return to the previous menu, press **BACK**.
- **Audio Language** will be changed by different country settings.
- **Postal Code** is only available for Indonesia.
- **TV menu** is only available for **DTV & ATV** source.
- **Standby Auto Tuning** is only for Malaysia in **DVB-T** input.
- **Country Region** is only for Australia.
- **5V Antenna Power** is only for Thailand.
- The options of **Tuner Mode** and **Audio Language** depend on the settings when you turn your TV for the first time.
- **Manual OAD Download** is only for **DTV** Source.

Selecting the external input source to view

- 1 Press **Source** on the remote control until the external input mode list appears on the screen, then press **▲**, **▼** to select appropriate input source.
- 2 Press **OK**.



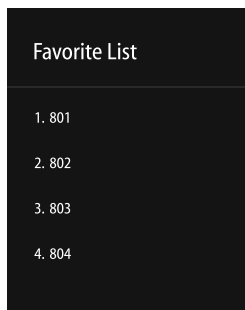

- It will appear the Google Play Movies source when you update the TV system; connected the network; or log in Google account.

Using the Favorite menu

- 1 Press **FAVORITE** button on remote control to display the favorite menu.
- 2 Press **▲** or **▼** to select the space, then press **OK** to add current program in the favorite list. Press **OK** again to cancel your selection.



Video adjustment

Activating the Picture Mode

This TV offers the choice of personalizing the picture style. User, Cinema, Sport, Vivid, Hi-Bright are prepared.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press **▲** or **▼** to select **Picture Mode** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press **▲** or **▼** to select your desired **Picture Mode**.

Using the Active Backlight

In order to improve screen visibility, the Active Backlight sets the screen brightness automatically during dark scenes.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press **▲** or **▼** to select **Active Backlight** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press **▲** or **▼** to select **Off** or **On**.

Adjusting the Back Light

In order to improve screen visibility, the Back Light sets the screen brightness during dark scenes.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press **▲** or **▼** to select **Back Light** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select the options (0~100).

Adjusting the Brightness

Adjusts the brightness of the picture, and usually is adjusted together with Contrast.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press **▲** or **▼** to select **Brightness** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select the options (0~100).

Adjusting the Contrast

Adjusts the difference between the light and dark areas of the picture. To get better picture value, Contrast should be adjusted to the proper value.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press **▲** or **▼** to select **Contrast** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press **◀** or **▶** to select the options (0~100).

Adjusting the Saturation

Adjusts the richness of color.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Saturation** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to select the options (0~100).

Adjusting the HUE

Adjust the color orientation of the picture.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select **HUE** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to select the options (0~100).

Adjusting the Sharpness

Adjusts the crispness of the edges in the picture.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Sharpness** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to select the options (0~100).

Adjusting the Gamma function

Adjust the primary color intensity.

- 1 From the **Video** menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select **Gamma** and press **OK**.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Dark, Middle, Bright**.

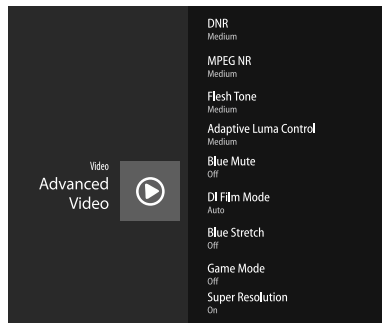
Adjusting the Color Temperature

Color Temperature increases the warmth or coolness of the picture by setting the Cool, Standard, or Warm.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select Setting and press OK to access the network interface.



Selecting the input source

You can press ◀ or ▶ to select the input source you want.



If you want to back to channels, you can select the channels input source.



Settings

Device

You can use the device shortcut functions.

- **Network:** You can select the network connections.
- **Inputs:** You can select the input source.
- **Google Cast:** This function can easily cast your contents from your mobile device to your TV. You can use your mobile phone with Google Home APP or your computer with Google Chrome browser to cast contents to your TV.
 - Make your device in the same network. (Need your device to download the Google Home APP or Google Chrome browser.)
 - Select the  icon on your device and click it, it will display a device list, check if your TV set is in this list and then connect them.
 - When you play a video in your device, the TV will be synchronized to play the same video and your mobile device can do other operations separately.
 - When your TV is standby, you can click your TV set in your device, the TV will from standby to turn on and play the last played video. (The Fast Boot should set On.)
 - If you want to stop the Google Cast, you can click the  icon in your device and stop cast.

NOTE:

Not all devices are supported.

Some third-party APPs probably cannot be perfectly cast if they are not installed on TV.

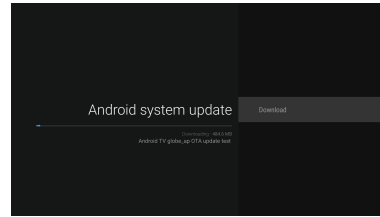
- **System Sounds:** You can set the system sound.
- **Apps:** Display the apps installed on your Android TV.

- **Daydream:** Set the screen protection setting, when to daydream, and when to sleep.

NOTE:

For a period of time with no operation, it will enter the screen protection interface

- **Storage & reset:** You can check your device storage, storage distribution and do factory data reset.
- **About:** Show some detailed information of the TV set such as Legal information, Serial number and so on. You can also select "System Update" to download and update the Android system of TV.



Preference

You can do some personal settings such as Date&Time, Language, Keyboard, Home screen, Speech, Accessibility, Search.

Note:

In If you want to turn on/turn off the Talkback function, Accessibility settings, please also turn on/turn off the Talkback Assistant function together with it.

Remote & accessories

- **TV BLE Remote:** You can relieve you Bluetooth remote and the TV device by this function.
- *This function may appear when you have connected the Bluetooth Remote.*
- **Add accessory:** Use the BLE remote and press the "HOME" button and "left" button 3s, it will appear the remote model at screen and select this function to do pairing. You can see the detail on page 12.

Personal

You can set some personal information like Location, Security&Restrictions, or Add account.

Network Settings

You can set your network in Home screen.

Live TV Settings

You can access the **Live TV Settings** menu from Home screen.

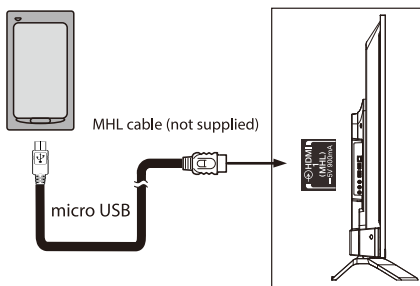

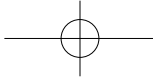

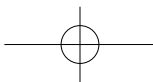

Troubleshooting

Symptom and solution


TV will not turn on

- Make sure the power cord is plugged in, and then press .
- The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.

No picture, no sound

- Check the aerial connections.

No sound, picture OK

- The sound may be muted. Press VOL +, – or .
- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- If the problem happens when DVD is connected to HDMI 1 or HDMI 2 terminal, please change the setting of "Signal Format" to be "4K@60Hz 4:2:0" (MENU->SETUP->HDMI 2.0 Setting->Signal Format), or directly switch to connect DVD with HDMI 3 terminal.

Poor sound, picture OK

- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.

Poor picture, sound OK

- Check the aerial connections.
- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Adjust the **PICTURE** menu.

Poor reception of broadcast channels

- Check the aerial connections.
- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Make sure the **Color System** is properly set.

Teletext problems

- Check the aerial connections.
- Good performance of text depends on a good strong broadcast signal.

Some pixels of the screen do not light up

- The LCD display panel is manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology, however, sometimes some pixels of the screen may be missing picture elements or have luminous spots. This is not a sign of a malfunction.

The picture brightness varies when you display switch the TV on.

- If you switch the TV on at 0°C and under, wait until the warms up.

Multiple images

- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Aerial reception may be poor. Use a high directional outdoor aerial.
- Check if the direction of the aerial has changed.

Poor color or no color

- The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
- Adjust the **Tint** and/or **Color** in the **PICTURE** menu.

The remote control does not operate

- Remove all obstructions between the remote control and the remote control sensor on the TV.
The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.
