Golden Boy by Clifford Odets – Joe

"You don't know me – I see you once a year on my birthday. What do you know about me? Nobody takes me seriously here. I want to be able to do what I want to do. I'm good I proved it tonight – I went out to earn some money and I earned! I had a professional fight tonight, and maybe I'll have some more. No! I don't want to be criticized anymore, and I don't want to sit. Every birthday I ever had I had to sit around, now is the time for me to stand. Do you think I like this feeling of no possessions, of learning about the world from Carp's Encyclopedia? Frank doesn't know what it means, he travels around, and he gets to see the world!
