Must-See Alexandria

First-time visitor? Here for 24 hours or less? These are the top things you must see.

Located minutes from Washington, D.C. on the Potomac River waterfront, Alexandria is nationally recognized for its acclaimed chef-driven restaurants, bustling boutiques and dynamic arts set against a backdrop of 18th- and 19thcentury architecture still intact from the city's days as George Washington's hometown. Whether you're here for business or pleasure or are taking a detour from your D.C. getaway, here are the top experiences you must try.

STROLL KING STREET— Centuries-old architecture, brick-lined streets, cobblestone alleys and a canopy of twinkling lights during the holidays make strolling King Street the #1 thing to do in Alexandria. Explore dozens of independently owned restaurants and boutiques, or take a ride on the free King Street Trolley.



2 EXPLORE THE WATERFRONT— Take in stunning views of the Potomac River and D.C. monuments, people watch, hop on a Potomac Riverboat Company cruise, or dine at one of our many waterfront restaurants. Coming in the spring of 2017 is Alexandria's first waterfront hotel, Hotel Indigo.

3 DISCOVER GEORGE WASHINGTON'S MOUNT VERNON—Only eight miles south of Alexandria lies the most visited historic estate in America: **George Washington's Mount Vernon**. Step back in time at the first president's beautiful riverside estate, and explore the mansion, working farm, tomb, visitor facilities with 25 galleries and theaters, and more.

VISIT THE TORPEDO FACTORY ART CENTER—

See art in progress at the **Torpedo Factory Art Center**, the nation's largest collection of working-artists' open studios under one roof. A fully operational munitions plant during WWII, the center is now home to 82 artists' studios, seven galleries, two workshops, the **Alexandria Archaeology Museum** and **The Art League School**. *Free admission!*

5 TOUR MARKET SQUARE MUSEUMS—Purchase a Key to the City museum pass for just \$15 at the





Alexandria Visitor Center for access to 12 historic sites, then explore three nearby museums all within one block of Market Square: **Carlyle House, Gadsby's Tavern Museum** and the **Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum**.

DINE IN HISTORIC BUILDINGS— With more than 20 new restaurants opened in 2016, Alexandria is a dining destination. The city is filled with restaurants housed in repurposed buildings, from Columbia Firehouse, once the 1871 Columbia Steam Engine Fire Company, to Virtue Feed & Grain, a former feed house that is now one of the hottest spots in Old Town. Enjoy award-winning cuisine in a can't-beat historic atmosphere.

SHOP IN OUR BOUTIQUES— Alexandria is the D.C. region's Shop Small headquarters, where visitors find independent boutiques run by owners who are behind the counter offering their expert advice and creating a community with special events.

Reck out The old Town FARMERS' MARKET—Visit the oldest farmers market in the country each Saturday morning year-round for gifts to take home, a quick breakfast or a taste of living like a local. George Washington sold his produce here, and today you'll find everything from fruits and vegetables to fresh pasta.

GRAB A PINT OF PORT CITY BEER—Whether you head to the brewery and tap room or find the beer on the menu of local restaurants, trying a pint from Alexandria's award-winning local brewery is a must. Named the Best Small Brewery in the U.S. in 2015, at only 6 years old, **Port City Brewing Co.** is the oldest craft brewery in the D.C. region.



Exploring the Region

Located just five miles from Washington, D.C. on the Potomac River waterfront and minutes from the Ronald Reagan National Airport, Alexandria is the perfect launchpad for your next vacation.

Staying in Alexandria makes it easy to also explore nearby attractions during your visit. Follow in George Washington's footsteps and survey the region. Here are some must-see sites just minutes away.

WASHINGTON, D.C. Awe-inducing museums and monuments on the National Mall. The sense that things happen here. A trip to D.C. pairs with an Alexandria vacation like democracy and America. Leave the car behind and go via water taxi or Metro and explore our nation's capital.

NATIONAL HARBOR All aboard! Cruise on a Potomac Riverboat Company water taxi to National Harbor, where you'll find a carousel, the Capital Wheel and Tanger Outlets.

MGM NATIONAL HARBOR Accesible via water taxi or the NH2 shuttle, the new MGM National Harbor features restaurants led by celebrity chefs such as Marcus Samuelsson, José Andrés and the Voltaggio brothers, a casino and a 3,000-seat theater already bringing in acts such as Bruno Mars, Sting and Kings of Leon.

WINE COUNTRY Clink! Find delicious blends and picturesque views at nearby wineries. You won't even need a designated driver with Fleet Transportation's tour that leaves from Alexandria, taking visitors to Blue Valley Vineyard and Winery in Delaplane, Virginia. Or, hit the road to "D.C.'s wine country" in Loudoun County, where you'll find more than 35 wineries.

ARLINGTON, VA. Visit Arlington House and pay your respects to America's bravest at the

Arlington National Cemetery, only a few Metro stops away from Alexandria.





Neighborhoods

Most known for its colonial heritage, the timeline of Alexandria's history is filled with events that helped shape the United States. Founded by Scottish merchants in 1749, Alexandria was a vital seaport during colonial times, is George Washington's hometown and was part of the original Washington, D.C. Here's a look at the neighborhoods waiting to be discovered in Alexandria today.

» OLD TOWN

On the Potomac River waterfront, Old Town Alexandria is the heart of the city, filled with beautifully-preserved 18th- and 19th-century architecture and picturesque cobblestone alleys. The brick-lined sidewalks hum with an energy that attracts everyone from presidents to pet lovers, who enjoy the city's best restaurants, arts and live music, events, shopping and historic attractions. Walkable King Street stretches one mile from the waterfront marina and the world-class Torpedo Factory Art Center toward the iconic George Washington Masonic National Memorial. Dine, shop and stroll at dozens of independent boutiques and restaurants. Here you'll find seasonal parades and festivals year round, from Scottish Christmas Walk Weekend to the King Street Art Festival. On Saturday mornings, stop by Market Square, just in front of City Hall, and visit the Old Town Farmers' Market-one of the longest operating farmers markets in the country and where George Washington once traded goods. Need a break? Hop on the free King Street Trolley and let it take you to your next destination.

"Where Main Street still exists," Del Ray is an off-the-beaten-path neighborhood featuring the made-for-strolling Mount Vernon Avenue lined with independent stores, health and wellness boutiques and hot new restaurants. Eclectic shops, extensive murals and signature events like Art on the Avenue lend an artsy vibe to the area. During "First Thursday" (April-September), a new festival takes to the streets each month, attracting visitors and locals alike in search of family fun and a splash of culture. Any day of the week, visitors can play a game of architectural "I Spy" by looking for authentic Art Deco buildings and details.

WEST END ¥

Alexandria's West End is home to the acclaimed Port City Brewing Company, which offers tours and tastings, plus events like Joggers and Lagers, Beer Yoga and Pedals and Pints. New to the neigh-brew-hood is Portner Brewhouse, a brewery, restaurant and Craft Beer Test Kitchen[™] from sisters Catherine and Margaret Portner. The duo is reviving the past by honoring the legacy of their great-great grandfather, Robert Portner, who once operated the largest pre-Prohibition brewery in the South.

Here you'll also find hidden gems and mouth-watering international dining, including some of the best Thai, Vietnamese and Ethiopian food in the region and more at the Van Dorn Station shopping center and other locales. Alexandria's West End is also home to open spaces like the Fort Ward Museum & Historic Site, a 45acre park that includes a museum, a Civil War historic site and a picnic area.

CARLYLE & EISENHOWER >>

In the southwestern part of the city, Carlyle and the Eisenhower Valley is Alexandria's contemporary counterpoint to historic Old Town. Known as the "economic engine of Alexandria," with scores of businesses taking root here, the neighborhood celebrates the spirit of American innovation. The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office is located in Carlyle, along with the newly updated National Inventors Hall of Fame and the forthcoming National Science Foundation.

Residents and visitors find a distinctive mix of history and contemporary comforts, including the captivating African American Heritage Park and the Edmonson Sisters sculpture. Outdoor spaces host community events and pop-up shops, and the dining scene keeps the mix of old and new fresh, with local favorites like Trademark Drink and Eat and Sweet Fire Donna's anchoring new spots like Whiskey & Oyster.

From creative comfort food to decadent desserts, foodies have endless options in Alexandria.

CREATIVE COMFORT FOOD Craving your favorite home-cooked comfort food? We've got you covered. In Old Town, celebrity pitmaster Myron Mixon recently opened **Myron Mixon's Pitmaster Barbecue**, while nearby **Hen Quarter** puts a creative twist on chicken and waffles by adding compressed watermelon, honey pearl butter and Tennessee bourbon maple syrup.

Hank's Pasta Bar in North Old Town, named one of the 10 best new restaurants in the D.C. area by The Washington Post, takes classic Italian comfort food and gives it a modern twist. On the same street, Haute Dogs & Fries serves hot dogs and other American classics in style. Sugar Shack Donuts takes creative comfort food to another level with flavors such as Bacon Maple, Sea Salt Caramel and Tastes Like a Samoa.

In Del Ray, new restaurants **Live Oak** and **Junction Bakery & Bistro** serve up dishes like head-on shrimp & grits and short rib grilled cheese, respectively, while mainstays **Stomping Ground** and **Cheesetique** keep visitors coming back for favorites like Stomping Ground's creative breakfast biscuit sandwiches and Cheesetique's mac 'n cheesetique, named one of the best mac n' cheeses in the U.S. by Food & Wine. If it's French comfort food you're craving, head to **Del Ray Café** for authentic French country cuisine served in a cozy 1925 home away from home.

LIQUID ASSETS In quiet lounges and lively sports bars, enjoy artfully crafted cocktails or local brews. Beer lovers will want to check out both of Alexandria's craft breweries-Portner Brewhouse and Port City Brewing Company. The new Portner Brewhouse was opened by Catherine and Margaret Portner to honor the legacy of their great-great grandfather, Robert Portner, who operated the largest pre-Prohibition brewery in the South. Visitors enjoy historic sips, classic German pub food and the one-of-a-kind Craft Beer Test Kitchen. Later, enjoy an award-winning pint at Alexandria's beloved Port City Brewing Company. The Green Dragon Pub at Bilbo Baggins claims one of

the city's largest beer selections with 12 taps and more than 100 bottled brews—plus seasonal cocktails and international wines. **Magnolia's on King** serves classic cocktails with creative twists, including an Old Fashioned with pineapple syrup. Find creative cocktails at Alexandria's speakeasies, including **Captain Gregory's**, a 22-seater hidden inside Sugar Shack Donuts, or **PX**, which is open only when the blue light glows around the corner from **Eamonn's, A Dublin Chipper.**

HISTORIC SETTINGS In local restaurants, visionaries give new life to buildings with storied pasts. Virtue Feed & Grain is aptly named, with a nod to its former function as an 18th-century granary. Today, chefs there source meat from local farms and produce from the Old Town Farmers' Market. Built in 1883 to house the Columbia Steam Engine Company, the well-preserved Columbia Firehouse is a four-story brasserie and barroom that evokes a 19th-century members-only club.

The Wharf serves up seafood in a building dating back to the 1790s with wood columns and beams charred black from a Civil War fire. The Warehouse Bar & Grill, housed in a historic warehouse as the name implies, is also known for its seafood offerings as well as prime aged steaks. Built as early as 1790, the Union Street Public House was once home to a warehouse on the thriving seaport, where George Washington reportedly met with associates.

LIVE MUSIC Whether you're looking for a place to see big names in music, enjoy a drink with friends or hit the dance floor, Alexandria has everything from **The Birchmere**, named "the best listening club in America" by The Washington Post, to intimate outdoor acoustic sets.

You can plan ahead or catch a set spontaneously with live music happening throughout the week at restaurants and other venues, many without a cover charge. **Murphy's Irish Pub** features traditional Gaelic music nightly, while **219 Restaurant** offers blues bands, a DJ spinning downstairs and a cigar room upstairs. Catch live music most nights



(and karaoke on Sundays) at **The Light Horse Restaurant**, where locals gather for pool, shuffleboard and to watch football. Four nights a week, **Blackwall Hitch** showcases the talent of local or touring musicians from a range of genres. Hidden gems offer cozy settings perfect for date night, like the **No. 9 Lounge** at Evening Star Café in Del Ray and the intimate outdoor patio at **Sonoma Cellar**.

SUGAR RUSH Sweet-toothed visitors can get their fix at Alexandria candy shops, ice cream parlors, bakeries and chocolatiers. Cool off at family-owned Casa Rosada Artisan Gelato, and indulge in homemade flavors from Argentina like dulce de leche and crema rusa, a rich walnut and marsala wine base studded with walnuts. Dolci Gelati is a regional favorite serving classic Italian gelato in fun flavors that change daily. If you're craving cupcakes, head to Lavender Moon Cupcakery or Alexandria Cupcake.

At **Bluprint Chocolatiers**, design meets decadence in flavors like Thai curry and passion fruit. Artfully crafted in-house, the chocolates are displayed like fine jewelry in a chic and colorful storefront on King Street. The scent of fresh doughnuts fills the air around **Sugar Shack Donuts**. Facebook fans can complete a "task of the day" to score free doughnuts in flavors like maple bacon and glazed cinnamon roll. **Nicecream**, coming soon, features ice cream madeto-order using liquid nitrogen.

DINING In Alexandria outdoor dining abounds with street-side tables perfect for people-watching and patios with scenic views. New restaurant Vola's **Dockside Grill and Hi-Tide Lounge** joins mainstays Blackwall Hitch and the Chart House on the waterfront where guests take in the picturesque Potomac River. Daniel O'Connell's offers a nearly-hidden vantage point of King Street from its upstairs patio, while Taverna Cretekou has its own secret garden where you can indulge in calamari and grape leaves. If you're there on a Thursday evening, you'll catch dancing and Greek plate-breaking.

CAPTAIN'S ROW

This iconic cobblestone block got its name from Captain John Harper, who was very successful in overseas trade and owned a lot of property on Prince Street. 100 block of Prince St., between S. Union St. and S. Lee St.

JONES POINT PARK

Right by the Potomac River, this is a favorite spot for sunrise photography and is the location of the southern D.C. boundary stone. The 1855 lighthouse located here is the last remaining riverine lighthouse in Virginia. 1 Jones Point Dr.







SPITE HOUSE

Built in 1830 to prevent loiterers in the alley, this is the skinniest historic house in America at only 7 feet wide and 325 square feet! 3 523 Queen St. (private residence)

WILKES STREET TUNNEL

One of only two historic railroad structures still standing in the city, it's now a trail for runners and cyclists, and well-known for engagement photos. 398 Wilkes St.

GEORGE WASHINGTON MASONIC NATIONAL MEMORIAL

This iconic National Historic Landmark dates to 1922 when construction began on what is now an active Masonic temple as well as a memorial and museum. Use our Key to the City museum pass to take aerial photos of Alexandria from the observation deck. **>>** 101 Callahan Dr.

The City That Inspired the Show

As PBS' "Mercy Street" shines a light on Civil War Alexandria, fans uncover the real sites and stories at dozens of new events, tours and exhibitions.

It's the Civil War, and Alexandria is a border town between North and South and the longest Union-occupied city of the war. That is the setting of "Mercy Street," PBS' first original American drama in a decade, which is inspired by real events of Civil War Alexandria.

The city celebrates the national spotlight on its history by presenting 35 visitor experiences, including 25 new tours, exhibits, events and lectures launching with season two in January 2017. Visit the city's historic sites and learn about the real people behind the characters, the realities of Civil War medicine, the changing roles for women and the breakthrough experience of enslaved African-Americans claiming their freedom.



TOP "MERCY STREET"-INSPIRED EXPERIENCES:

- Visit the real-life Green family home, Carlyle House (121 N. Fairfax Street), and view a special exhibit, Who These Wounded Are: The Extraordinary Stories of the Mansion House Hospital, which features an interpretation of period hospital rooms and doctor/ officer housing, plus stories of nurse Mary Phinney and spy Frank Stringfellow Green.
- Step back in time at the Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum (107 S. Fairfax Street) and view the *This Terrible Disease* exhibit that features prescriptions and remedies sold to the Union Commissary Department and to the contraband population and civilian residents in Alexandria during the Civil War.
- Located at 1001 S. Washington Street at the corner of Church Street, the Contrabands and Freedmen Cemetery Memorial was the burial place for approximately 1,800 African-Americans who fled to Alexandria to escape bondage. Feel the power of "The Path of Thorns and Roses," an allegorical sculpture depicting

the struggle for freedom, and the memorial's bas-reliefs depicting the flight to freedom.

- At the Alexandria Black History Museum, view a special exhibit, *Before the Spirits Are Swept Away: African American Historic Site Paintings by Sherry Z. Sanabria*, through May 2017. Over 20 paintings are on display honoring the lives of African-Americans who survived slavery and years of racial injustice, but whose presence defined the American landscape.
- Visit Fort Ward Museum & Historic Site (4301 W. Braddock Rd.) for Medical Care for the Civil War Soldier, an exhibition that explores the surgical procedures and medical equipment featured on the show and displays a variety of tools, instruments and images from the museum's medical collection.

Self-Guided Tour

Uncover the city's colorful past by treading the same cobblestone paths as citizens did centuries ago.



Begin your tour at the **Alexandria Visitor Center**, 221 King Street at the corner of Fairfax Street, a re-creation of the circa 1724 home of Scottish merchant and city co-founder William Ramsay.

■ Walk two blocks east on King Street toward the Potomac River to Union Street. Turn right onto Union and right onto Prince. Welcome to **Captain's Row**, one of two preserved cobblestone blocks in the city. It got its name from Captain John Harper, who was very successful in overseas trade and owned a lot of property on Prince Street.

■ Continue up Prince Street to the 200 block, known as Gentry Row. On the corner of Prince and Lee, find the Athenaeum. Built in 1851, this antebellum Greek Revival building originally housed the Bank of the Old Dominion. Today, the Athenaeum is an art gallery and the home of the Northern Virginia Fine Arts Association.

■ Turn right on S. Fairfax Street. Find the Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum, 105-107 S. Fairfax Street, where Edward Stabler began his pharmacy business in 1792, serving customers like Martha Washington and Robert E. Lee. The family business operated continuously until 1933 when the Depression forced its closure. Today, the museum exhibits herbal botanicals and medical equipment, much preserved in its original form.

Turn left onto King Street and right into Market Square. City Hall, 301 King Street, is home to Alexandria's city government. Its structure was built in 1871 as a courthouse, atop a site first used as a market space frequented by George Washington. Today, its steeple tower is a landmark on the Alexandria horizon, and the farmers market tradition continues each Saturday throughout the year.

Return to Fairfax Street, and turn left. Carlyle House, 121 N. Fairfax Street, was built in 1753 by wealthy Scottish merchant and city co-founder John Carlyle. This handsome stone mansion was later the home of the Green family, featured in the PBS drama "Mercy Street."

■ Turn left onto Cameron Street, and walk one block to Gadsby's Tavern Museum, 134 N. Royal Street. Businessman John Wise built this two-building complex: the 1785 Georgian-style City Tavern and the 1792 Federal-style City Hotel famous for its great ballroom. Ideally situated on the main stage coach route between Boston and Williamsburg, the tavern became an important political and social center, whose notable patrons included George Washington, Thomas Jefferson and Robert E. Lee.

■ Walk up Cameron Street to George Washington's Townhouse, 508 Cameron Street. This structure re-creates a modest 18th-century dwelling built in 1769 by Washington to provide convenient quarters when business or inclement weather prevented his return to Mount Vernon. Continue on Cameron, and cross over N. Washington Street.

Christ Church, 118 N. Washington Street, was built in 1773 and is an excellent example of a small rectangular Georgian church. The three-story tower with belfry topped by a cupola was completed in 1818. George Washington played a part in building the church and was an original pew-holder (number 60). Robert E. Lee was also a member of the congregation.

■ Turn left on N. Washington Street toward King Street, which turns into S. Washington. The Lyceum: Alexandria's History Museum sits at 201 S. Washington Street. Since its beginnings in 1839, the building has been used as a Civil

War hospital, a private home, an office building and the nation's first Bicentennial Center. Today, The Lyceum displays exhibits on Alexandria's story through more than 1,500 historical objects.

Turn right on Prince Street, then right on S. Alfred Street.

Friendship Firehouse Museum, 107 S. Alfred Street, built in 1855, is the headquarters of the Friendship Fire Company, Alexandria's first volunteer firefighting squad. The stories of those who protected Alexandria's citizens from fire—an overwhelming concern in the days of mostly wooden buildings—are preserved in the Friendship Firehouse Museum.

Window to the Past

Find more than 20 historic sites in Alexandria, D.C.'s original Old Town. History buffs find that the Colonial-era Carlyle House, Stabler-Leadbeater Apothecary Museum and Gadsby's Tavern, where the Founding Fathers dined, are all within walking distance. The George Washington Masonic National Memorial offers stunning views of Alexandria and artifacts of the first president, whose Mount Vernon estate lies just eight miles south of the city. At the Contrabands and Freedmen Cemetery, a moving memorial honors African-Americans interred on the grounds. Alexandria also offers a range of unique tours, including ones for aspiring photographers, spirit seekers and history lovers.

Alexandria's popular free King Street Trolley runs every 10-15 minutes between N. Union Street and the King St-Old Town Metrorail station, with 20 stops for hopping on and off to explore Old Town's main thoroughfare. Operates daily. See VisitAlexandriaVA.com/Trolley.

Metrorail

The Metrorail system consists of six color-coded rail lines: red, blue, green, orange, yellow and silver. Alexandria is serviced by four convenient Metrorail stations named for their closest streets: King St-Old Town (blue and yellow lines), Braddock Road (blue and yellow), Eisenhower Avenue (yellow) and Van Dorn Street (blue). 




